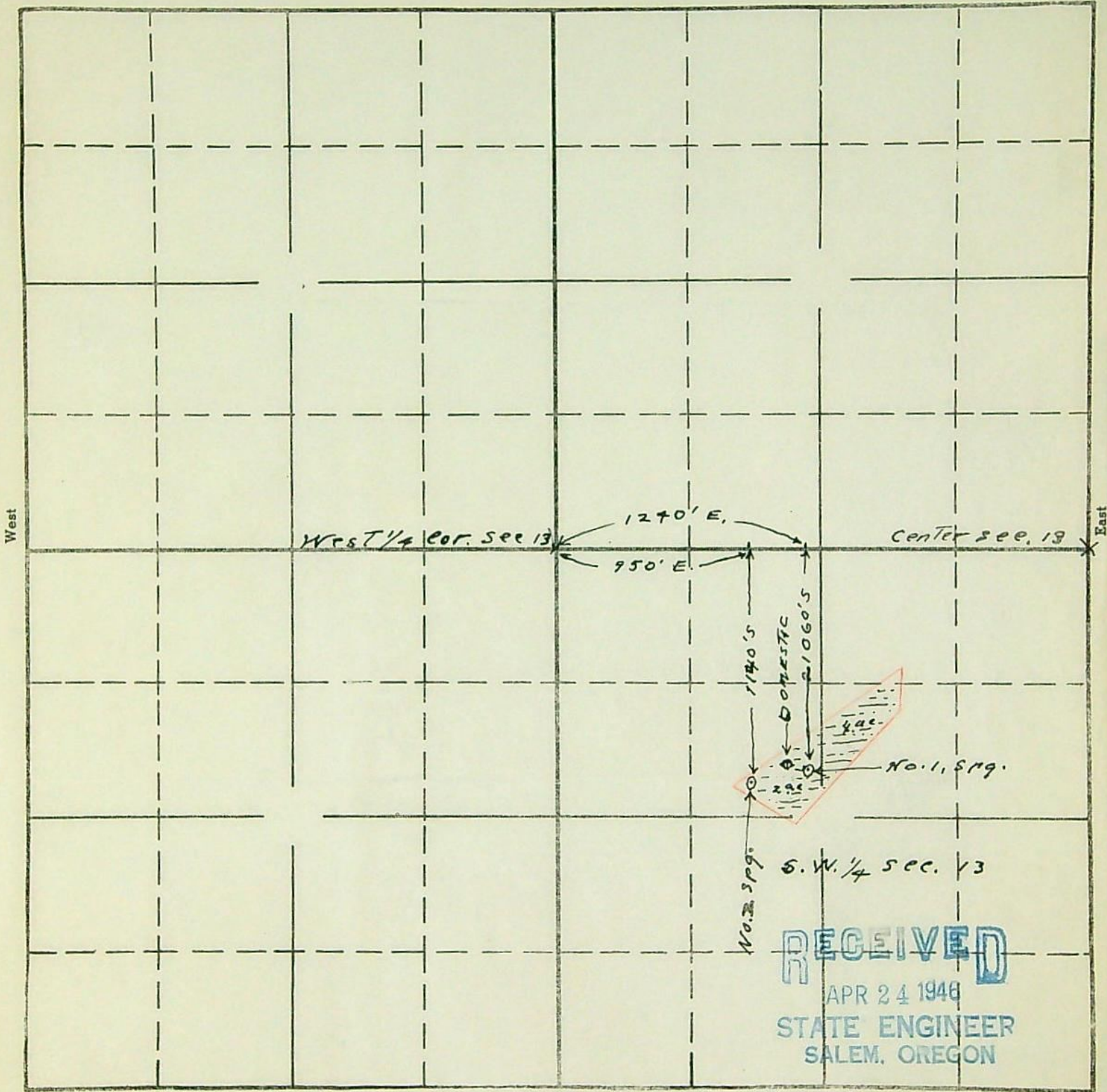

Gentlemen:

In reply to your letter of April 11, this will advise you that Permit No. 16956, granting a right to the use of water from two springs, in the name of Robert O. Boyd, was assigned by Mr. Boyd to Mr. Karl Townsend, and a certificate was issued to Mr. Townsend and recorded on Page 15681, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirming a right to the use of 0.03 cubic foot of water per second from two springs for domestic use and irrigation.

Boyd.


The spring would lie in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 13,

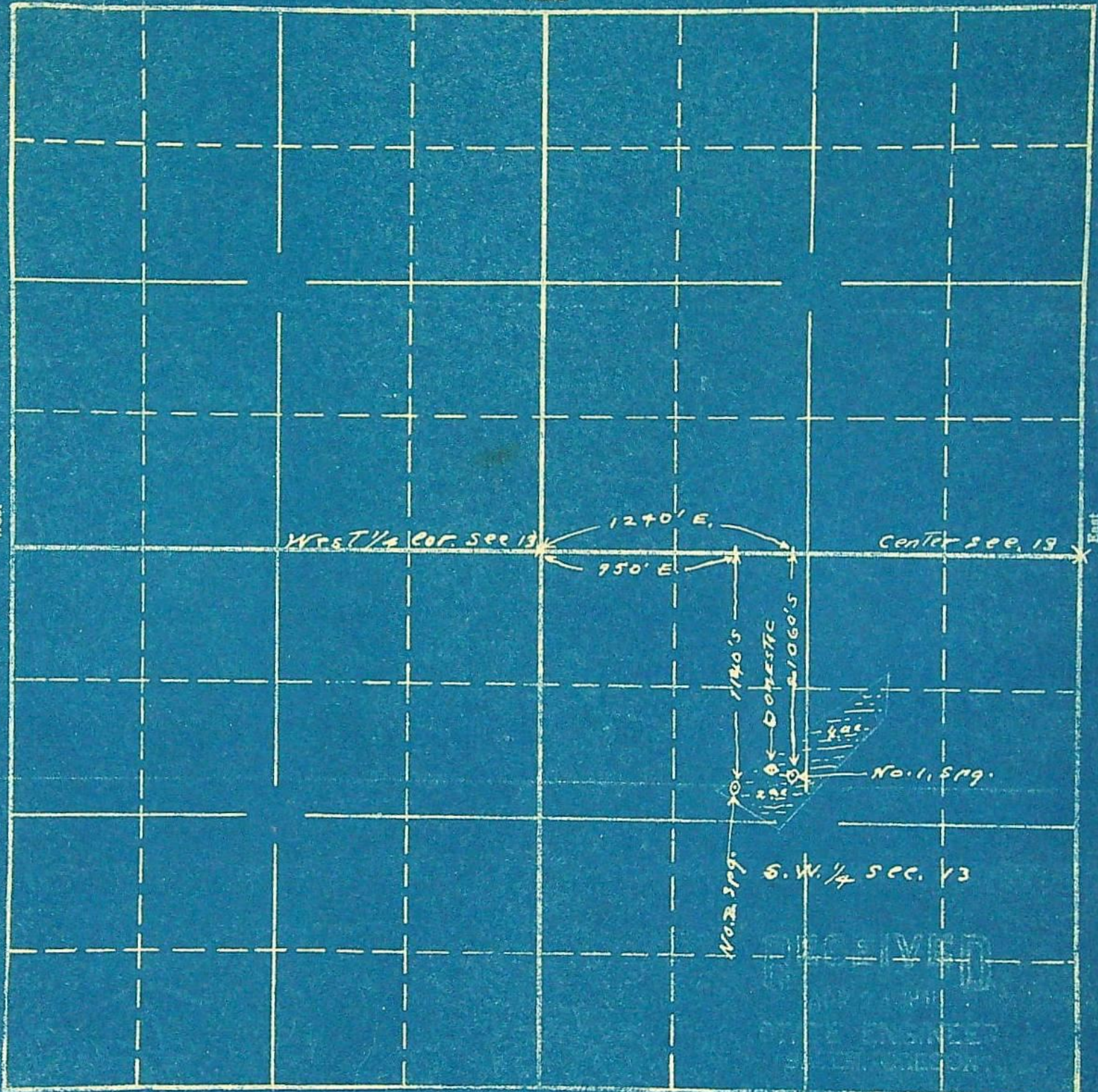





The assignment has been corrected and given the above permit and the mistake occurred in not noticing that the form carried the word application number instead of permit number. We are glad to receive your new form which we will use from now on. The old form has been in use in this office for a number of years and I have wondered at its commission of permits several times. In fact, you will find that I have added this number on several occasions.

In the checking of such errors, it is very difficult in this office, for the reason that we have received no abstract for permits since February 21, 1945 and this brought us up to permit 16053 as the latest abstract. This has put us so far behind in our administrative work that I have assumed permits were granted without having legal evidence to administer such waters, and I believe it would be advisable that the office be kept informed of the issuance of permits to as late a date as is possible.

Dear Mr. Humphrey:

In order to get the facts for Application No. 21578 in the name of Robert O. Boyd of Ashland, Oregon, I made an investigation in this locality yesterday with the following results:

There is no doubt but what you are right regarding the location of Tolman Creek which runs through Mr. Boyd's property, and Tolman Creek is a tributary of Neil Creek which is a tributary of Bear Creek. In fact, at the junction of Neil Creek with Bear Creek the Government records and other proof that has been submitted to your office show that Emigrant Creek junctions with Bear Creek. The mistake was made by using our County road map which shows Tolman Creek a mile north of its actual location, and as Mr. Boyd is new in this locality, he called the stream an unnamed draw as far as he could determine in the neighborhood. I made the mistake of not searching further.

The two springs that he has filed on are in no way connected with this stream; No. 1 spring issuing on a knoll without any definite channel and No. 2 spring sinking within fifty feet of its source. Neither one becomes the water of any stream during any time of the year as far as I could determine.

As your maps are no doubt correct, I will not bother to send you in a sketch of that locality. The quadrangle maps and forest service map are sufficiently accurate.

The spring description has been sent to Mr. Boyd for his signature which will then be forwarded to you.
