



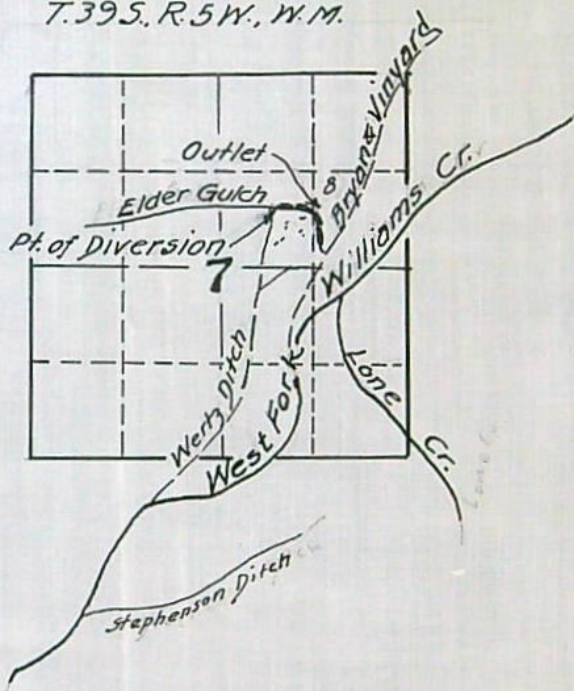

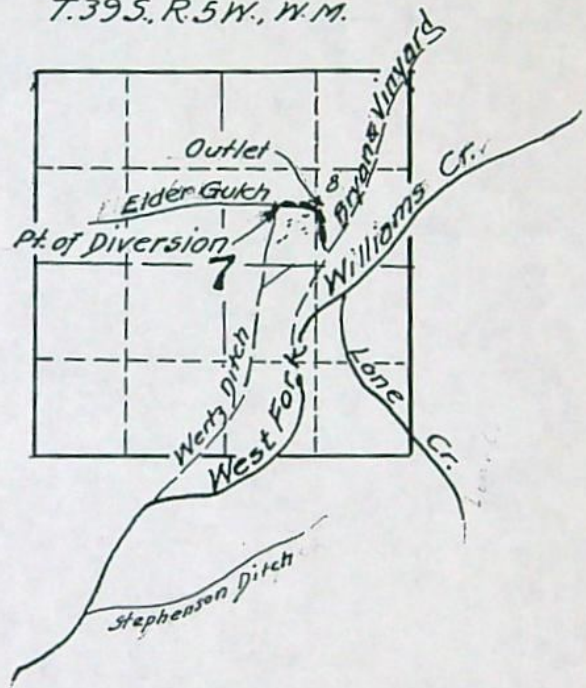

Dear Sir:

This is in reply to your letter dated February 1st inquiring about the completion of your proof in connection with Permit No. 7913.

We mailed a blank for making this proof to your watermaster Mr. Pearce on July 6, 1928. In such cases the watermaster does not usually make an inspection until it becomes convenient for him to make a trip into the locality in which the water right is situated.

Your right is shown to be in good standing on our records and unless there is some particular reason for desiring your certificate immediately, I would not think it necessary to rush the matter of making your proof. A copy of this letter is being sent to Mr. Pearce and we will request that he advise you when the inspection will probably be made.

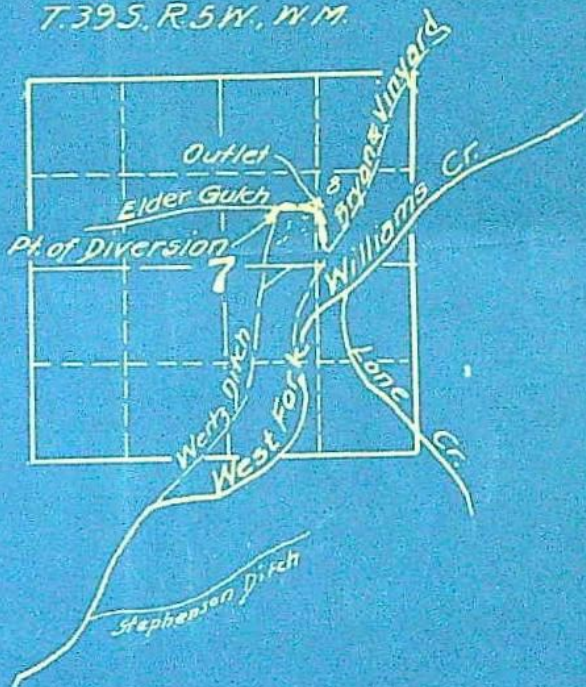
