



The Oregon Supreme Court found that the irrigation season on Silver Creek begins on or about the first day of April each year. Circuit Court Decrees for the Silver Creek and Bridge Creek Adjudications (March 25, 1935 and March 31, 1971, respectively) fixed the beginning of the irrigation season at April 1 of each year. It has been our policy to use the irrigation seasons set by the courts throughout the state as a basis for determining the irrigation season for a permit right. For your area, the season begins on April 1, as set by the Silver Creek Decree.

The date of priority of a water right is generally established when an application for a permit is received in a form which can be filed by this office. Any application received since your filing on April 28, 1960, would be junior to your right evidenced by Certificate 35643; therefore, your right to the use of water during the irrigation season should not be injured.

We never get any water after April 1 - it all flows before that date -


Can a person go above us and build a dam and hold all this flood water so we never will get any when this channel is flowing? Wanted the person who is building this dam have to file for water rights also?

Thank you for your letter regarding the use of water in your area.

I was unable to find a copy of Chris Wheeler's letter dated November 19, 1954; however, it could not have referred to your Permit 26746 because we did not receive your application for the permit until April 28, 1960. Your request was approved on July 13, 1960 and certificate of water right issued on January 31, 1969. The certificate evidenced the right to the use of 1.92 cubic feet of water per second from Murdock Creek for the irrigation of 76.7 acres.


We would accept an application and issue a permit for a beneficial use of water for any project upstream from yours. If the project is within the boundaries of Silver Lake Irrigation District, it would be necessary for the applicant to obtain and submit a certified copy of an excerpt from the minutes of a meeting of the Board of Directors of the district stating that the district had no objection to the proposed project. A permit from this agency would be required for any beneficial use of surface water.







under Permit No. **26746** of the State Engineer, and that the use of said waters has been completed under the terms of said permit; that the priority of the right dates from **April 28, 1960**

that the amount of water for the purposes aforesaid, has been actually beneficially used in the amount of
1.92 cubic feet per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the **NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 19, T. 28 S., R. 15 E., W. M.** Diversion point located: **580 feet South and 40 feet West from SW Corner, Section 17.**

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to **one-fortieth** of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed **3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;**

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
