

**MODIFIED WARRANTY DEED  
CONVEYING PROPERTY TO REVOCABLE TRUST**

BLAKE D. SPOTTEN, Grantor, hereby conveys and warrants to BLAKE DELON SPOTTEN, as trustee of BLAKE D. SPOTTEN REVOCABLE LIVING TRUST u/t/a dated September 25, 2015, Grantee, free of encumbrances except for matters of public record, the real property described as:

Part of the Southwest one-quarter of the Northwest one-quarter and part of Government Lot 3 of Section 5 and part of Government Lot 2 of Section 6, Township 5 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, described as:

Beginning at a Stake 343.12 feet South of the Southwest corner of the Northeast one-quarter of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 6, Township 5 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South 996.90 feet to a stake on the North boundary of the Wingfield Donation Land Claim; thence South 82° 00' East 1386 feet to the center of the County Road; thence North 19°00' East 913.40 feet along said road to a stake; thence North 78° 30' West 1707.73 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.
