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Findings of Fact

- 1. On February 7, 2022, DONNA BOYER filed an application to change the character of use under Certificate 73838. The Department assigned the application number T-13916.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on February 15, 2022, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 3. On May 15, 2023, the Department sent a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13916 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of June 15, 2023, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 4. On December 6, 2023, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13916 and sent a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published in the Department's weekly notice on December 14, 2023, and in the Forest Grove Times

Conclusions of Law

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The change in character of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13916 is approved.

- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 73838 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificate 73838 is cancelled.
- 4. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before October 1, 2025. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- 5. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
