



The Water Rights Section received your written progress report for Permit R-12290. Receipt of the progress report was published on the Department's weekly Public Notice, dated June 14, 2011. The Department did not receive any public comment on the progress report.

After reviewing your Diligence Progress Report, the Department determined that diligence toward completion of the project and compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit and extension is questionable. The terms and conditions of the permit required a measuring device to be installed <u>before</u> water use may begin, and to date a measuring device is not yet installed. The permit also requires the installation of an outlet pipe or other means to evacuate the water form the reservoir.

Please be aware that the deadline for completion of construction is October 1, 2011, and the deadline for full beneficial use of water under Permit R-12290 is October 1, 2011. Because diligence is questionable, and illegal use of water has been occurring (use of water with no measuring device), an additional extension of time for Permit R-12290 will likely not be approved by the Department unless a suitable measuring device and outlet pipe are installed by October 1, 2011.

ORS 537.230(2) provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall, for good cause shown, order an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

ORS 539.010(5) provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Director, for good cause shown, may extend the time within which the full amount of the water appropriated shall be applied to a beneficial use. This statute instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefore; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

OAR 690-315-0040 provides in pertinent part that the Water Resources Department shall make findings to determine if an extension of time may be approved to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use.

OAR 690-315-0050(6) allows the Department, for extensions exceeding five years, to establish checkpoints to determine if diligence is being exercised in the development and perfection of the water use permit. Intervals between checkpoints will not exceed five year periods.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Background

 Permit #R-12290 was granted by the Water Resources Department on October 17, 1997. The permit authorizes storage of up to 25.6 acre-feet of water from two reservoirs, being 21.0 acre-feet in Reservoir #1 and 4.6

acre-feet in Reservoir #2 15.0 acre-feet of stored water only from a reservoir, appropriated under Permit #S-53267 for Cranberry Operations. The permit specified complete application of water was to be made on or before October 1, 2001.

- 2. The permit holder submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" to the Department on January 2, 2002, requesting the time in which to accomplish beneficial use of water to the full extent under the terms of Permit #R-12290 be extended from October 1, 2001, to October 1, 2005. This is the first permit extension requested for Permit #R-12290.
- Notification of the permit holder's extension of time requst for Permit #R-12290 was published in the Department's Public Notice dated January 8, 2002. No public comment on the extension application was received.
- On February 19, 2002, the permit holder revised the time requested to complete application of water to beneficial use under Permit #R-12290 to October 1, 2011.

Review Criteria (OAR 690-315-0040(1)(2))

As set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(2), the time limits to complete construction or to apply the water to a beneficial use may be extended upon showing of good cause for the untimely completion. This determination shall consider the applicable requirements of ORS 537.230, 537.248¹, 537.630 and 539.010(5).

Other Governmental Requirements [ORS 537.230(2)]

 Delay in the development of this project was not caused by any other governmental requirements.

Start of Construction [ORS 537,230]

Construction of the water system began within the time specified in the permit, being October 17, 1998.

Proposed Final Order: Permit #R-12290

ORS 537.248 applies to reservoir permits only.

Financial Investment (ORS 539.010(5))

7. As of January 2, 2002, a total of \$220,000 has been invested into the project (including Permits #G-13233 and #S-53267), consisting of development of 11 acres of cranberry bogs, construction of two reservoirs, construction of a well, pumphouse, irrigation system and three phase power. An additional \$10,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.

Reasonable Diligence and Good Faith of the Appropriator (ORS 537.230(1) and 539.010(5))

Reasonable diligence during the permit period constitutes a continuing test of whether and under what conditions to grant an extension [ORS 537.260, OAR 690-315-0040(3)].

In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(3), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining whether the applicant has demonstrated reasonable diligence in previous performance under the permit:

Amount of Construction

- 8. The following construction was completed within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension:
 - a. Construction of the water system began within the time specified in the permit, being October 17, 1997. The work thus far consists of development of 11 acres of cranberry bogs, construction of two reservoirs, construction of a well, pumphouse, irrigation system and three phase power.

Beneficial Use of Water

- 9. The following beneficial use was made of the water during the permit or previous extension time limits:
 - a. Since the issuance of Permit #R-12290 on October 17, 1997, approximately 0.75 acre-feet of stored water has been stored in Reservoir #1, and approximately 16 acre-feet of water has been stored in Reservoir #2.
 - b. Delay of full beneficial use of water under Permit #R-11691 was due to an unforseen drop in the cranberry market and subsequent cash flow problems of the permit holder.

Compliance of Conditions

- 10. The water right permit holder's conformance with the permit conditions.
 - a. The record does raise concerns about the permit holder's compliance with conditions. The permit holder has not installed a suitable measuring device and has not installed drains on the reservoirs.

Financial Investments

- 11. Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial water use.
 - a. As of January 2, 2002, a total of \$220,000 has been invested into the project (including Permits #G-13233 and #S-53267), consisting of development of 11 acres of cranberry bogs, construction of two reservoirs, construction of a well, pumphouse, irrigation system and three phase power. An additional \$10,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.

The Market and Present Demands for Water (ORS 539.010(5) and OAR 690-315-0040(4))

In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

- 12. The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows.
 - a. The permitted reservoirs authorized under Permit #R-12290, are not located within or above the designated boundaries of a scenic waterway.
- 13. Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d).
 - a. The permitted reservoirs, authorized under Permit #R-12290, are located within a stream segment that has been identified by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife as a "highest" needs ranking area for streamflow restoration for fish.
 - b. The permitted reservoirs, authorized under Permit #R-12290, are not located within the designated reach of a federal wild and scenic river.

Proposed Final Order: Permit #R-12290

- 14. The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
 - a. The permitted reservoirs are not located within a designated sensitive, threatened or endangered species area for aquatic species utilizing surface water resources, as identified by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- 15. Economic investment in the project to date.
 - a. As of January 2, 2002, a total of \$220,000 has been invested into the project (including Permits #G-13233 and #S-53267), consisting of development of 11 acres of cranberry bogs, construction of two reservoirs, construction of a well, pumphouse, irrigation system and three phase power. An additional \$10,000 investment is anticipated for the completion of this project.
- 16. Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project.
 - a. None have been identified.
- 17. Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power.
 - a. None have been identified.

Fair Return Upon Investment (ORS 539.010(5))

- 18. The use of water from the permitted water development will result in reasonable returns against the investment made in the project to date.
 - a. Income from the permitted water development will result in reasonable returns against the investment made to date, provided that the cranberry market returns to normal.

Duration of Extension (OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), ORS 539.010(5))

As set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), time extensions granted shall be for the reasonable time period necessary to complete construction and application of water to beneficial use.

- 19. As of January 2, 2002, the remaining work to be completed consists of complete application of water to beneficial use.
- 20. Unforseen events extended the length of time needed to fully develop and perfect the permit, caused mainly by an unforseen drop in the cranberry market and subsequent cash flow problems of the permit holder.
- 21. Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permittee's request to have until October 1, 2011, to complete the application of water to beneficial use under the terms of Permit #R-12290 is both reasonable and necessary.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The applicant is entitled to apply for an extension of time to complete construction and/or completely apply water to the full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230.
- 2. The applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee required by ORS 536.050(1)(k).
- The applicant has demonstrated that actual construction of the project began within the time specified in the permit, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b).
- 4. Full application of water to beneficial use can be completed by October 1, 2011.²
- 5. The Department has considered the requirements of other governmental agencies, the financial investment made, the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the market and present demands for water and the fair return upon the investment, and has determined that the applicant has shown good cause exists for an extension to complete construction and apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230(2).

Proposed Final Order: Permit #R-12290

Pursuant to ORS 537.630(3), upon the completion of beneficial use of water allowed under the permit, the permittee shall hire a certified water rights examiner to survey the appropriation. Within one year after the complete application of water to a beneficial use (or by the date allowed for the complete application of water to a beneficial use), the permittee shall submit a map of the survey and the claim of beneficial use.

6. In order to ensure future diligence is exercised in the development and perfection of Permit #R-12290, the Department shall establish progress checkpoints in accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(6). (See Item #1 of the "Conditions" section contained in this Proposed Final Order for an Extension of Time.)

Proposed Order

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Department proposes to issue an order to:

Extend the time for complete application of water to beneficial use under Permit #R-12290 from October 1, 2001, to October 1, 2011.

Subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

- 1. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(6), the permittee must submit a written progress report to the Department by October 1, 2009. The report must be received by the Department not sooner than 90 days prior to the due date. The permittee's report must describe in detail the work done each year since the last extension was granted or the last progress report submitted. The report shall include:
 - a) The amount of construction completed;
 - b) The amount of beneficial use of water being made, including the total volume of water used, water used relative to the specific authorizations (types of use, acres irrigated, etc.) contained in the permit, and the percent of the total allowable water use that this represents;
 - A review of the permittee's compliance with terms and conditions of the permit and/or previous extension; and
 - d) Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial water use. The Department will review the progress report to determine whether the permittee is exercising diligence towards completion of the project and complying with the terms and conditions of the permit and extension.

Failure to submit a progress report by the due date above may jeopardize continued development under the permit.

The Department will take into consideration annual reports submitted under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 or ORS 537.099, and any other report that demonstrates diligence.

Other reports, however, are not a substitute for the progress reports and anything submitted must clearly show that diligence towards perfecting the water right permit is being attempted.

If the Department finds that diligence is questionable, the Department may:

- a) request the permittee to submit additional information with which to evaluate diligence; or
- apply additional conditions and performance criteria for perfection of the right; or
- c) cancel the undeveloped portion of the permit pursuant to ORS 537.260 or 537.410 to 537.450. The Department will grant the permittee a hearing on the cancellation, if one is requested.

In determining whether the permittee has been diligent, the Department will consider any information submitted to the Department by the permittee and any information submitted during the 30-day public comment period following public notice of submittal of the progress report.

If information is received through the public notice process indicating that the applicant has not been diligent toward completing the project, and if the director determines there are significant disputes related to the use of water, the Department will conduct a hearing.

Extensions are granted based on a showing of reasonable diligence in pursuing the development of the water right under the permit conditions, unforeseen events which prevented completion by the permit deadlines, and whether denial of the extension will result in undue hardship to the applicant because of a lack of other reasonable alternatives for meeting water use needs.

Some of the factors you should document would include the amount of construction completed and the dates of completion of certain actions or phases, itemization of money spent so far on the project and your plan and time line for completing the project and putting water to beneficial use.



Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Application History

On April 29, 1996, PHILLIP L. LENT submitted an application to the Department for the following water use permit:

- Amount of Water: 28.4 ACRE-FEET (AF), BEING 15.1 AF IN RESERVOIR 1, 4.6 AF IN RESERVOIR 2, AND 8.7 AF IN RESERVOIR 3
- Use of Water: CRANBERRY OPERATIONS
- Source of Water: SURFACE WATER RUNOFF, TRIBUTARY TO THE SIXES RIVER
- Area of Proposed Use: CURRY County within SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 31 SOUTH, RANGE 15 WEST, W.M.
- Water Delivery System: All three reservoirs are off channel and are to be filled from surface water runoff from a 22 acre impervious surface.

On OCTOBER 4, 1996, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that water may be appropriated for Storage of 28.4 AF in three reservoirs (sumps), being 15.1 AF, 8.7 AF, and 4.6 AF, from surface run-off from a 22-acre impervious surface, tributary to Sixes River, for Cranberry Use form November 1 through April 30 and from July 1 through July 31. The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.

On OCTOBER 22, 1996, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the proposed final order.

No written comments were received within 30 days.

On May 1, 1997, the application was amended to remove two of the sump reservoirs and add a separate additional reservoir, Reservoir 1. The amendment also reduced the total amount of water stored to 25.6 AF, being

21.0 AF in Reservoir 1 and 4.6 AF in Reservoir 2. Reservoir 1 will be filled primarily with surface water but will also be partially filled from groundwater.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- comments by or consultation with another state agency
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record
- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The South Coast Basin Program allows the following uses: STORAGE OF WATER FOR CRANBERRY OPERATIONS.

Senior water rights exist on SURFACE WATER RUNOFF, TRIBUTARY TO THE SIXES RIVER, or on downstream waters.

SURFACE WATER RUNOFF, TRIBUTARY TO THE SIXES RIVER, is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.

Water is available for further appropriation (at a 50 percent exceedance probability) for the period NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL AND JULY 1 THROUGH JULY 31.

The Department finds that no more than 25.6 AF would be necessary for the proposed use. The amount of water requested, 25.6 AF, BEING 21.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 1 AND 4.6 AF IN RESERVOIR 2, is allowable.

One of the requested reservoirs, Reservoir 2, is a sump reservoir. According to additional information from the applicant's CWRE, both reservoirs will be lined with clay to prevent groundwater flow from entering the reservoirs.

There is no evidence in the record of the presence of game fish at the described point of diversion.

In accordance with OAR 690-33-330, an interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on sensitive, threatened and endangered fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff.

The interagency team did not recommend that any additional conditions of use be imposed on this application.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the South Coast Basin Plan.

No preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water is available for the proposed use.

The proposed use will not injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use complies with the State Agency Agreement for land use.

For these reasons, the required presumption has been established.

Once the required presumption has been established, under the provisions of ORS 537.153(2) it may be overcome by a preponderance of evidence that either:

- (a) One or more of the criteria for establishing the presumption are not satisfied; or
- (b) The proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as demonstrated in comments, in a protest . . . or in a finding of the department that shows:
 - A) The specific public interest under ORS 537.170(8) that would be impaired or detrimentally affected; and
 - (B) Specifically how the identified public interest would be impaired or detrimentally affected.

In this application, all criteria for establishing the presumption have been satisfied, as noted above. The presumption has not been overcome by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The Department therefore concludes that water is available in the amount of water necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use will not result in injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

Recommendation

This letter is to inform you of the potential limitations to your proposed use of water and to describe some of your options. Based on the information you have supplied, the Water Resources Department has reached the following conclusions:

Initial Review Determinations:

- 1. Your application is complete and not defective.
- 2. The proposed use is not prohibited by law or rule.
- 3. The use of water for CRANBERRY USE is allowed under OAR 517, the South Coast Basin Program (OAR 690-517-001(8)).
- 4. Water to be appropriated for STORAGE of 28.4 ACRE-FEET (AF) in three reservoirs (sumps), being 15.1 AF, 8.7 AF, and 4.6 AF, from surface run-off from a 22-acre impervious surface, tributary to Sixes River for CRANBERRY USE is not available May 1 through June 30 and August 1 through October 31.

Summary of Initial Determinations

At this time, you must decide whether to proceed or to withdraw your application as described below.

Withdrawal Refunds:

Also, Reservoir #1, as shown on the revised application map, is a new reservoir. Information regarding this new reservoir is necessary in order to complete your application. Please describe, as identified on the enclosed reservoir application, the maximum height of the dam, the dam construction material (earthfill, concrete, flashboard, other (if other give description)), and the location, description, and dimensions of the outlet conduit (if any). If in channel, a description of the spillway (location and dimensions), including whether it is over or around the dam, also needs to be submitted.



Classifications

690-517-001

- (1) Ground water resources in sections or the portions of Sections 13, 14, 22, 23, 26, 27, 32, 33 and 34 of Township 23 South, Range 13 West; 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 20, 21, 22, 27, 28, 29, 31, 32, 33 and 34 of Township 24 South, Range 13 West; and 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Township 25 South, Range 13 West, bounded on the north by Tenmile Creek, on the west by the Pacific Ocean, on the south by Coos Bay and on the east by Highway 101 are hereby classified for single or group domestic, livestock, irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area and any single industrial or commercial use not exceeding 5,000 gallons per day.
- (2) The waters of the following lakes are classified only for domestic, livestock, municipal, irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area and in-lake use for recreation, fish life and wildlife. The Director of the Water Resources Department may place specific limits on municipal appropriations from the lakes or require outlet control structures to protect recreation, fish life and wildlife uses:
 - (a) Bradley Lake
 - (b) Eel Lake
 - (c) Garrison Lake
- (3) All other natural lakes are classified only for domestic and livestock uses, irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area and in-lake use for recreation, fish life and wildlife.
- (4) Waters of the following streams and all tributaries are classified only for domestic and livestock uses, irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area, fire control and instream use for recreation, fish life and wildlife.
 - (a) Glenn Creek (tributary to the East Fork Millicoma River)
 - (b) Brush Creek
- (5) The waters of the Middle Fork of the Coquille River and tributaries upstream from the confluence with Holmes Creek are classified only for domestic, livestock and irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area and instream use for recreation, fish life and wildlife during the period from July 1 to September 30 of every year. Water stored between October 1 and June 30 may be used at any time for purposes specified in section (8).
- (6) The waters of the West Fork Millicoma River and tributaries above Stall Falls are classified for municipal, domestic and livestock uses, irrigation of lawns and noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area and instream use for recreation, fish life and wildlife.

- (7) The waters of Pony Creek above lower Pony Creek Dam and Ferry and Geiger Creeks above the Ferry Creek Geiger Creek confluence are classified for municipal use.
- (8) All other surface and ground water resources are hereby classified for domestic, livestock, municipal, industrial, fire control, irrigation, agricultural use, mining, power development, recreation, wildlife and fish life uses.
- (9) Applications for the use of water for any purposes contrary to classifications specified in the basin program shall not be accepted or granted except as provided by law. The Director shall notify the Board and other interested individuals or agencies of the intent to accept an application for use in conflict with the adopted program in accordance with ORS 536.380 if the proposed use will not have a significant impact on any other water use as provided in sections (1) through (8) of OAR 690-517-001 and in 690-517-002 through 690-517-003.
- (10) The planning, construction and operation of any structures or works for the utilization of water in accordance with the aforementioned classifications are to conform with the applicable provisions of ORS 536.310, including but not restricted to the recommendation of the multiple-purpose concept.

- (1) Chetco River three cfs, downstream from the confluence with the North Fork Chetco River

- (1) For the purpose of maintaining a minimum perennial streamflow sufficient to support aquatic life, no appropriations of water except for domestic or livestock uses and irrigation of noncommercial gardens not exceeding one-half acre in area shall be allowed for the waters of the streams and tributaries listed in Table 1 when flows are below the specified levels.
- (2) The Water Policy Review Board requests the opportunity to review applications for an allowed beneficial use that has traditionally been identified as nonconsumptive or take-and-put, such as fish hatcheries, hydroelectric facilities, municipal or water process industries that could potentially impact, in an adverse way, the Board's minimum flow regime or the public interest. The Water Policy Review Board intends to continue to protect, in its entirety, that portion of the stream system on which any minimum streamflow has been established. Permitting procedures and water use regulation should reflect that objective as far as possible under the law. The Board solicits the advice or complaints of any party who is aware that the objectives are not being met.
- (3) Minimum flows established in the Water Resource Program for the South Coast Basin dated May 22, 1964 (Table 3), shall remain in full force and effect except as follows:
 - (a) The minimum perennial streamflow for the Elk River above U.S. Highway 101 crossing (45 cfs) is rescinded.

As you may know, we have a backlog of several thousand applications. Senate Bill 674, passed in the 1995 Legislature, gives the Department staffing and administrative tools to work through that backlog. The bill also sets up an expedited application review process for both pending and new applications. We have until October 31, 1996, to complete work on applications filed through June 30, 1995.

This application, and all applications filed between July 1, 1995, and October 31, 1996, must be processed by April 29, 1997. By that date, the Department must have reached a decision on your request or have scheduled a contested case hearing to settle any unresolved dispute related to your application.

If a permit is approved, the use allowed will be subject to existing Basin Program Rules, instream flow requirements, the demands of prior right holders and other limitations as needed to protect the resource. It may also be subject to new criteria or restrictions deemed necessary by the Oregon Water Resources Commission (a citizen body which oversees the agency's activities) to respond to water resource issues, including current and future Endangered Species Act fish listings.

The filing of an application does not allow you to use water. By law, an applicant may not legally store, divert or use water until the Department issues a final order approving a water right permit. Please bear in mind that the issuance of a permit is not guaranteed; therefore, the Department advises against investments in storage or delivery systems until you receive a permit.

Waste will be prevented by terracing the bogs, and having a settling recovery sump located at the southern portion of the property. No metering has been considered at this time. 




