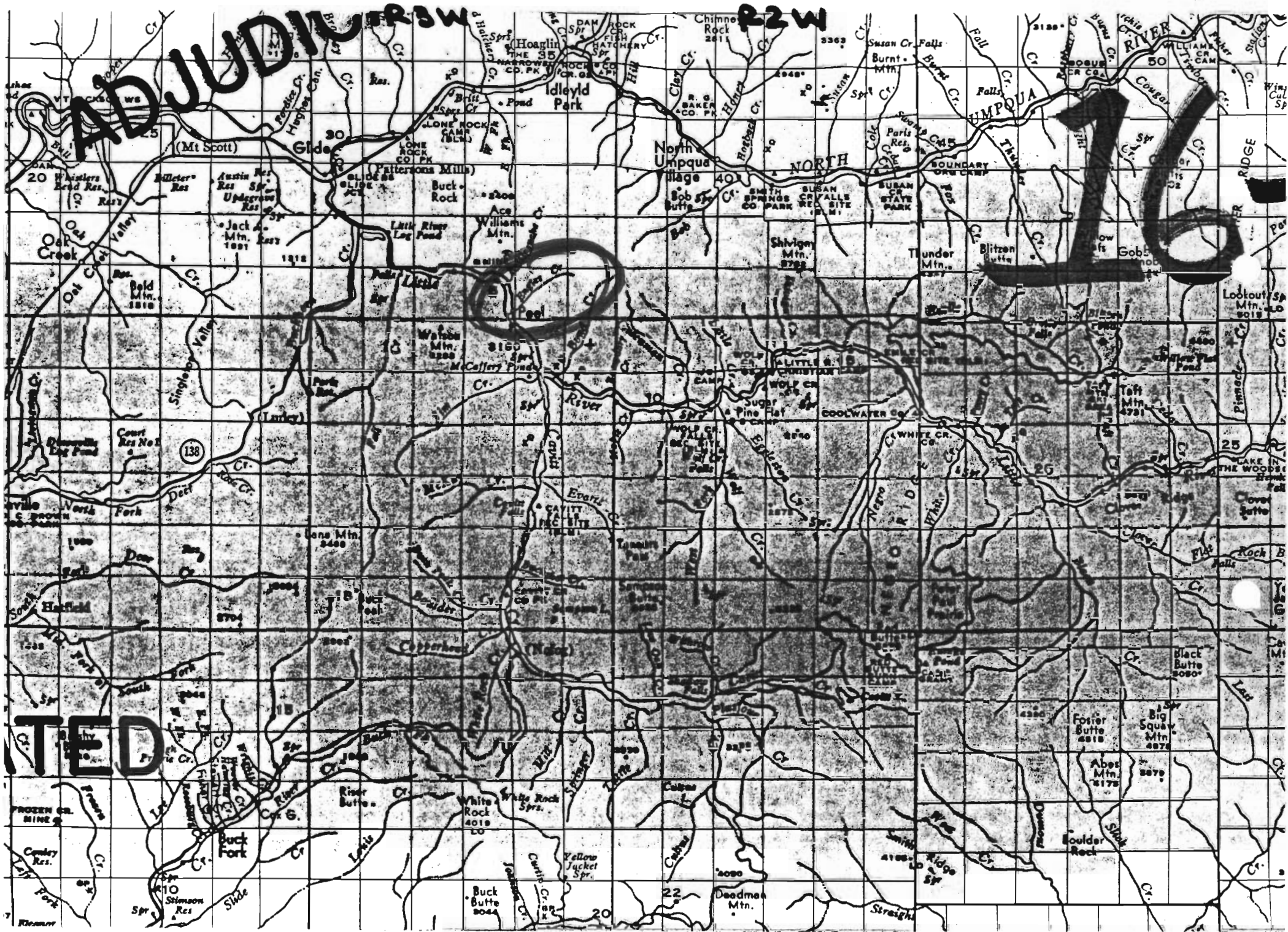

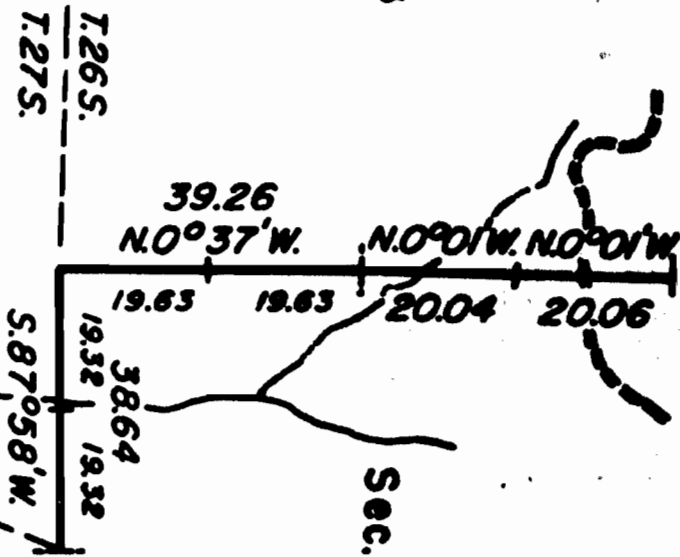


Dear Mr. Gibson,

Dear Mr. Gibson,

This will acknowledge your surface water registration. I have reviewed the form and map you submitted. I have also reviewed file # 19912 in the name of Arthur W. Palmer (as originally submitted.) And I have reviewed file # T-6623 in the name of Marvin H. Gibson.

There are fees required by statute to be paid at the time you submit a surface water registration. The fee for a domestic use is \$ 200.00. ORS 539.081 (3) allows for a credit for money paid for an "application for a permit" but not for a transfer application. In your case I find examination fees and recording fees for application # 19912 in a total of \$ 10.00. Therefore, the fees necessary to submit your surface water registration statement are \$ 190.00.

I am returning your form and refer you to question # 5. You have answered the question with 20 gpm. This is a large amount of water for a single domestic use. You should answer the question stating an amount that was used prior to 1909 and continued to date. Generally, 4.5 gpm is the maximum allowed for a single domestic claim.

I am returning your map with a "checklist" that I use to review maps. It appears you have submitted a copy of a map prepared for the purpose of applying for a water right transfer. The requirements between the two maps are different. I suggest you contact your Water Right Examiner and show them the checklist. The map you submit must adhere to the requirements on the checklist.

I found in the file for application T-6623 a number of documents which I believe should accompany a surface water registration statement. I have copied these and will put them in your file once you return the form, map and required fees.

1943 - Initiation of water right application #19912, and subsequent permit and certificate granting right to divert 0.01 for domestic, 0.01 for .7 acres irrigation and 0.01 for stock and poultry.

Nov. 1, 1991 - T-6623 is filed requesting a transfer of the 0.01 for stock and poultry be added to the domestic use to provide water to 10 mobile homes. The transfer map indicates that there has also been a change in POD. The change moves the POD to a neighboring 1/4 1/4 in a different section.

Dec. 30, 1991 - A surface water registration statement claiming an 1856 priority date with 20 gpm for domestic use arrives in the name of Marvin H. Gibson (A SWR# has not been assigned) with a copy of the transfer map (T-6623) and no fees. He answered SWR question #9 (Total fees submitted) "See File T-6623 (\$305.00)".

ORS 539.081 (3) allows for a credit on fees paid for application for a permit, not a transfer.

I looked in T-6623 and found no check to cover the fees. I did find that T-6623 is a transfer involving A#19912. The person filing application 19912 paid \$14.60 in total fees. The fee required for filing a domestic use application in 1943 = \$10.00.

There are many issues involved with this SWR: Fees, mapping requirements, a change in POD, and 20 gpm (0.04) looks to be an enlargement from there use in 1943.

Fees due appear to be \$190.00.

Certificate No. 5124. WHEREAS Abram A. Engels, of Douglas County, Oregon has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Roseburg, Oregon whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Abram A. Engels according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1920, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South half of the South-east quarter of Section thirty-four in township twenty six south of range three west of Willamette Meridian in Oregon, containing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Abram A. Engels

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Abram A. Engels and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Chester A. Arthur President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

WITNESSETH, that whereas, at a public sale of real estate held on the 22nd day of November, A.D. 1919, pursuant to a real estate tax judgment and decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Douglas, duly made and entered on the 6th day of November, 1919, and after having first given due notice of the time and place of said sale; and whereas, in pursuance of said order of the said Court and of the laws of the State of Oregon, and for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-eight & 12/100 (\$368.12) Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, to me in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, I have this day sold to R. H. Coshun the following described real estate, and

is particularly described as follows, to-wit: Lots Numbered One (1), Eight (8) and Nine (9)

A. A. Engels and his small son Lafe came to Little River approximately 1856. A. A. Engels built a small lean to cabin of bark. Lafe lived in the lean to cabin while his father went to the Willamette Valley and worked for two years. When A. A. Engels returned, he was able to buy some livestock and a team of horses. A. A. Engels obtained a patent on the land in 1883. This patent was recorded at the Douglas County Courthouse in 1919. A. A. and Lafe Engels built the combination Post Office, first store and living quarters in 1888, and named it Peel. This building was located near where the present Peel Country Store is now. The building was closer to Engels Creek and Little River and behind where the present store is. Water was first carried from Engels Creek in wooden buckets, later a wooden trough using gravity flow supplied water to the Post Office, store and home all from Engels Creek. This small building and business was used until 1922. There have been three store buildings at Peel since 1888, however, the exact year the second store was built is unknown and the exact location uncertain. It is believed the second store was located near where the present store is. There has been a store at Peel in continual operation since 1888 except for two years approximately 1950-1952. The present and third store was built in 1942 by Lee and Ray Engels, son and grandson of Lafe. There has been someone living and using water from Engels Creek continually since 1856 at this location. The present home at Peel was built in 1931. It is located next to the store. The Peel Trailer Court was built approximately 1953. Over the years the water system from Engels Creek has been updated. Water now used from Engels Creek is supplied through a modern water treatment plant to the store and residents of Peel, which consists of approximately twenty residents.

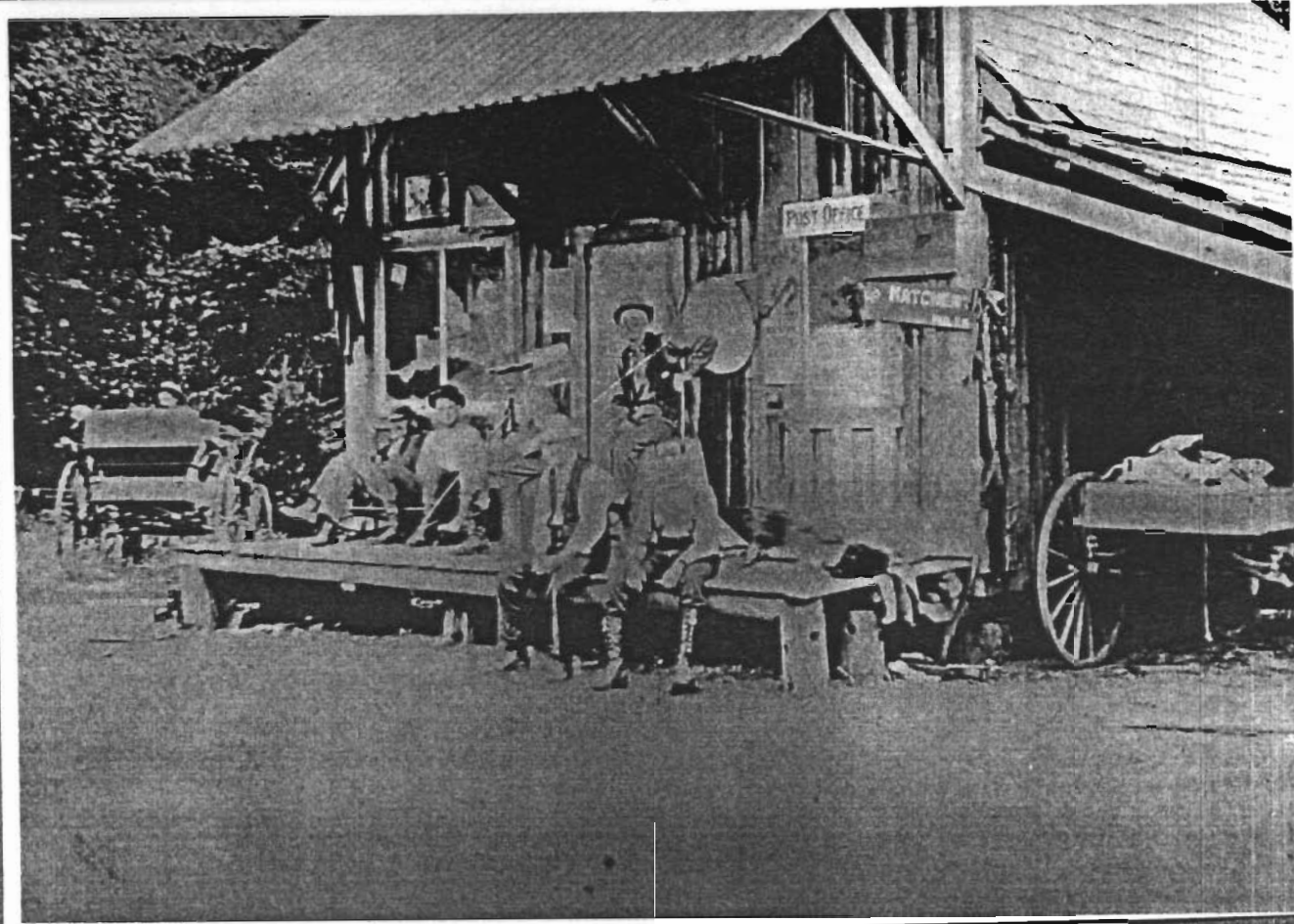

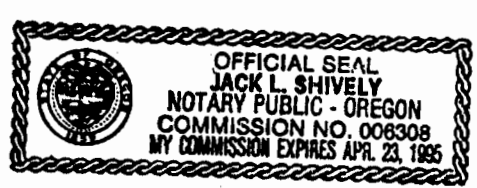

Old-time pride

To The Editor:

Recently you asked if there was an old-timer who prided himself on being an Oregon old-timer.

I lived at Peel from 1926 through 1927 and, again, from 1929 through 1930. Peel needed a school teacher with children. I was a widow with four young children and a brand new teaching certificate.

When I was cooking my way through college, I worked on an 8,000-acre ranch, the Mt. Alto ranch near Glide. That was when I first visited Peel, several miles east of Glide on Little River Road.

I went with a young cowboy to a home dance at Peel. We traveled by horseback.

I was attending what is now Northwest Christian College in Eugene. I was almost kicked out of school for attending a dance.

During that summer, 1909, I met and learned to love a six-foot, four-inch, handsome cowboy. We were married in 1914. We lived in the log cabin he built on his homestead. We had four children. Our house burned, so we built a new home in Glide so the children could attend school. My husband died in 1924.

With the five of us to support, I returned to college, this time to Monmouth Normal to get my teacher's certificate. With my advanced work from NCC, I graduated in one year.

My plans to have an orphanage in South Africa were now changed. I had my "orphanage" in southern Oregon. There were more teachers that year than there were schools. But small, struggling schools that lacked children needed teachers with children. Peel had only three children. The law required five children for a recognized school. So, they were happy to hire me with my four. In 1927-28 I had my first school. They raised the salary from \$80 to \$90 per month for me.

We lived in the old building which had been used for store and post office. It had been abandoned but we were permitted to use it rent free. We also got free water when it rained. There wasn't even a bathroom.

It was a bright September day when I arrived at Peel with my four children and furniture. I didn't mind the drab building but in a few days one of Oregon's drenching rainstorms came. It seemed to rain more inside than outside. Our "new" house needed a new roof. We used oil cloth and umbrellas over our beds.

Next day I drove 22 miles to Roseburg and got rolls of tar paper. So, with two sons and a couple of friendly bachelors we repaired the roof. The schoolhouse, like the store building was weathered, rough lumber, with a wood stove, a water bucket and a dipper. The kids carried water from the river. There were two small buildings behind the schoolhouse. There was no U.S. Flag. A young forester gave us a five-foot flag and blasted a hole in the hillside and put up a flag pole.

Each child brought his own lunch. A first grade boy walked three miles with his Airedale dog. There were no houses along his way. One child lived across the bridge, where the mail boxes were. One little girl walked a half-mile to school. The teacher did the janitor work.

We had programs on each holiday with pupils and parents. At one program I was told a lady, a newcomer to Peel, could

play the organ. I asked her if she played. She replied, "I can but I won't."

We had everything we needed to live like most of the others there. We got fresh eggs from a ranch for 5¢ per dozen. Yes, 5¢ per dozen! Milk was 25¢ a gallon. There was lots of fresh fruit free. Peaches were 25¢ per bushel. There were lots of wild berries to pick. We could go to an orchard and pick any kind of cherries for 2¢ a pound. There were lots of fresh vegetables available.

I would take my eldest daughter to Roseburg each week for violin lessons.

We had wonderful neighbors. I have a warm place in my heart for Peel. My last year there I married a most gracious rancher Tony Erlebach. I still have him. He is 91. I'm 88. We are both great lovers of the beautiful green hills of Douglas County. We now live in the beautiful Senior Residence in Canyonville.

Thank you for the picture page you printed some time ago about Peel.

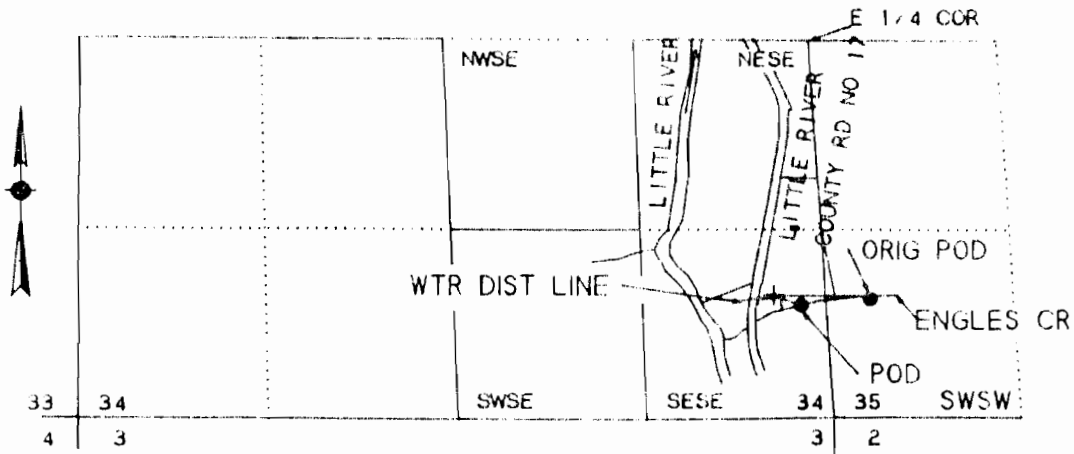

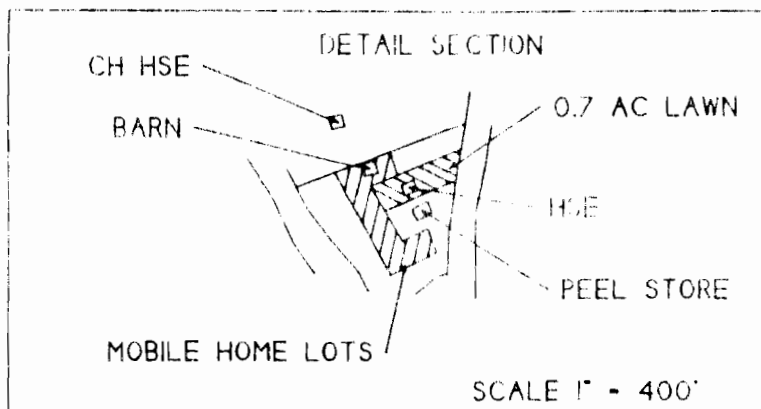

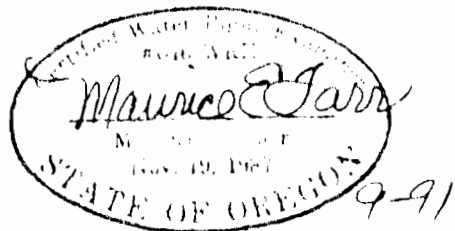
