





- 3. The well log ID numbers are Lane 11118 (I-5 #1) and Lane 11119 (I-5 #2).
- 4. The methodology for obtaining water level measurements will be an electric tape marked in 5-foot increments and a tape measure marked in feet and inches (or better), or from a 4-20 mA continuously recording pressure transducer signal calibrated to tenths of a foot (or better).
- 5. The measurements will be reported in feet and inches below the level of the sounder port used as a reference elevation. See table above.
- The wellfield will not be pumped for at least 12 hours prior to taking the measurements.
- 7. The person obtaining the measurements will be either a full-time employee trained in using the equipment or other qualified person (per OWRD guidelines) of our choice.
- Annual reports will be sent to the Measurements and Reporting Section of OWRD by April 30 of each year.

The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Use of any or all water under this permit is only allowed if an Intergovernmental Agreement is in place between the Rainbow Water District and the Springfield Utility Board that addresses injury issues with senior users.

The water user shall develop a plan to monitor and report the impact of water use under this permit on water levels within the aquifer that provides water to the permitted well(s). The plan shall be submitted to the Department within one year of the date the permit is issued and shall be subject to the approval of the Department. At a minimum, the plan shall include a program to periodically measure static water levels within the permitted well(s) or an adequate substitute such as water levels in nearby wells. The plan shall also stipulate a reference water level against which any water-level declines will be compared. If a well listed on this permit (or replacement well) displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the water user shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the well(s). Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the water user's and/or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The water user shall in no instance allow excessive decline, as defined in Commission rules, to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this permit.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

If the number, location, source, or construction of any well deviates from that proposed in the permit application or required by permit conditions, this permit may not be valid, unless the Department authorizes the change in writing.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the

schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate interference. The Department encourages junior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The well(s) shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.







Thanks for pointing out the geographical error, the location I inspected is T 17S, R 3 W sec 15, I do believe I was in the right place.

Note that Certificate 28437 lists three PODs with the source for all three being identified as the McKenzie River.

What remains there now is a geographical feature, I would call a disconnected historic river channel which no longer channels any water.

I went back out recently and walked from what is called Maple I Farm (on the quad map) and the bridge over the channel, from there I walked West and Northwest along the channel's banks, beyond the place where the SW POD from Cert 28437 is on this channel. I did find some old shot up steel pipe, but no evidence of a diversion nor of a well associated with a GW in the same vacinity.

At the Northern end of this old channel, we crossed no sloughs, though we did find a bank armored with rip rap and rail road rails, bolted and welded into some kind of flood fence, above a dry channel with the river 200 feet away.

On the East of the wells, the only surface water to be found is the McKenzie River.

Feel free to let me know if this is not clear or if I did not answer something.





- (1) Use of water from either well, as allowed herein, shall be controlled or shut off if the well displays:

 - (e) The permittee/appropriator shall submit a record of the measurements to the Department on a form available from the Department. The record of measurements shall include both measurements and calculations, shall include a certification as to their accuracy signed by the individual making the measurements. The permittee/appropriator shall submit to the Department one year of monthly measurements (Dec Nov.) by December 1st. The Department shall determine when any of the declines cited in section (1) are evidenced by the well measurement required in section (3).

GENERALIZED GEOLOGY

The Willamette Lowland in Oregon and Washington encompasses 3,700 square mile and includes the low-lying parts of the Willamette Valley in Oregon and most of Clark county in Washington. About 70% of the population of Oregon and Clark County reside in the lowlands. The lowland is 145 miles long and averages 10 to 15 miles in width. Water is recharged to the Willamette Lowland aquifer system primarily through the direct infiltration of precipitation on the lowland. The regional water-table map shows an overall pattern of ground-water flow to the major streams, indicating that the base flow of these streams is sustained by ground water discharge. This ground-water discharge fully supports the base flow of streams that head in the lowland and partially support the base flow of the other streams.

HYDROGEOLOGIC UNITS

The aquifer system is composed of five hydrogeologic units, from oldest to youngest:

- 1) the basement confining unit,
- 2) the Columbia River basalt aquifer,
- 3) the Willamette confining unit,
- 4) the Willamette aquifer, and
- 5) the Willamette silt unit.

The basement-confining unit forms the lateral and basal boundary to the Willamette aquifer system. The basement-confining unit includes all the stratigraphic units that underlie either the Columbia River Basalt Group in the northern part of the basin or the basin-fill deposits in the southern part. The unit is composed of marine sedimentary rocks and volcanic rocks of the Coast and Cascade ranges. The basement-confining unit is generally a low yielding aquifer where wells develop water primarily from fractures in the rock. Ground water can be found under unconfined conditions in the highlands and under confined conditions with greater depth and lower elevations. Yields are

generally less than 10 gpm and usually decrease over time. The deeper the well, the greater the chance of brackish water being encountered.

The Columbia River basalt aquifer overlies the basement-confining unit and consists of layers of basalt flows of the Columbia River Basalt Group. The thickness of the aquifer generally is several hundred feet but locally is as much as 1000 feet. Ground water in the basalts is generally under confined conditions except in the foot-hills where they may be unconfined. Well yields vary from tens to hundreds of gallons per minutes. Brackish water has been encountered in several areas, particularly with depth.

The Willamette confining unit consists primarily of fine-grained, distal alluvial fan and low-gradient stream deposits. The fine-grained deposits are considered a regional confining unit because of their wide spread occurrence and low permeability. Ground water in the Willamette confining unit is generally under confined conditions and well yields are very low to "dry".

The Willamette aquifer consists primarily of coarse-grained proximal alluvial-fan and braided-stream deposits. The greatest thickness, and coarsest materials of the Willamette aquifer outside of the Portland Basin occur in six major alluvial fans that were deposited where major streams from the Cascade Range enter the Willamette Lowland. Ground water in the Willamette aquifer unit varies from unconfined to confined conditions, depending on location and depth. Vertical gradients are usually downward except near major streams. Deposits of lower permeable material can act as a confining layer but are generally of limited aerial extent.

The Willamette silt unit is deposited throughout much of the Willamette Lowland by glacial-outburst floods. The deposits range in thickness from 0 to 130 feet. They consist primarily of silt and fine sand of relatively uniform lithology. Ground water in the Willamette silt unit is generally under unconfined conditions and well yields are low, less than 5 to 10 gpm.

STRUCTURAL BASINS

Outcrops of folded and faulted basalt within the Willamette Valley divide the lowland into four separate areas or structural basins — from north to south, the Portland Basin, the Tualatin Basin, the central Willamette Valley, and the southern Willamette valley. Each of these areas has decidedly different hydrologic and hydrogeologic properties. The aquifer system in each basin, although hydraulically connected through a series of restrictive water gaps, is distinctive.

<u>Tualatin Basin</u>. The Columbia River basalt aquifer and the Willamette confining unit are the only regional hydrogeologic units above the basement-confining unit in the Tualatin Basin. The Columbia River basalt aquifer underlies the entire basin, and its upper surface forms a sediment-filled bowl-like depression.

The Central Willamette Valley All five of the hydrogeologic units occur in the central Willamette Valley. The Columbia River basalt aquifer underlies the entire central Willamette Valley, except for small areas along the far eastern margin. A number of faults have been mapped in the central Willamette Valley, some of which offset the aquifer, and numerous other faults have been mapped in the uplands surrounding the basin where the aquifer crops out. The Willamette aquifer in the central Willamette Valley contains three major alluvial fans -- the Salem fan, the Molalla fan, and the Canby fan. The Willamette Silt unit overlies most of the central valley

with a maximum thickness of about 130 feet near the center and thins towards the south and near the margins of the basin.

The Southern Willamette Valley In the southern Willamette Valley, all of the regional hydrogeologic units are present; however, the Columbia River basalt aquifer occurs only in the Stayton area. The Willamette confining unit is thinner in the southern Willamette Valley than elsewhere in the Willamette Lowland. The Willamette aquifer contains the Lebanon fan and the Stayton fan. The Willamette aquifer is much thinner (averaging only about 20 to 40 feet thick) between the alluvial fans of the southern Willamette Valley. The Willamette Silt unit covers most of the southern Willamette Valley and generally thin towards the south.

GROUND WATER MODEL PARAMETERS

The version of the Hunt model being used has been modified to account for different units for each parameter. Values for most of the parameters used are taken from the application file. Hydrogeologic conditions at the site are based on the Applicant's and other nearby Water Well Reports. Some of the parameters are discussed below:

Net Steady Pumping Rate: Calculated discharge rate so as to not exceed allocation for season or

year (Examples: 2.5 AF for irrigation, 5.0 AF for Ag use).

Aquifer hydraulic conductivity: Unless there is site-specific information, use values, based on geologic

material, from a table such as Freeze & Cherry, Page 29.

Aquifer storativity or specific yield: Use the following values unless there is site-specific data:

Unconfined = 0.02 and Confined = 0.0001.

Streambed hydraulic conductivity: Generally use a value that is 2 orders of magnitude less than the





Transient Stream Depletion (Jenkins, 1970; Hunt, 1999)







Marc determined that the proposed ground water use will have the potential for substantial interference (PSI) with surface water, namely McKenzie River. Surface water from McKenzie River (WID 528) is available year round at 80% exceedance.

Apparently, you and Debbie Colbert (per Dwight) determined that since water is available year round, a re-review by Marc using the revised Division 9 form would not be necessary.

However, based on recent comments from ODFW regarding nearby applications, anticipated ODFW comments for this application may limit the proposed use. Therefore, please re-review this application to determine if the finding of PSI will change using the new Division 9 form.





(1) Surface water classification:

The McKenzie River and tributaries above Paradise Campground near river mile 73 (Sec 9, T16S, R6E) are classified only for domestic, commercial use for customarily domestic purposes not to exceed 0.01 cfs, livestock and public instream uses;
- (b) The South Fork McKenzie River from the Three Sisters Wilderness boundary downstream to Cougar Reservoir and from Cougar Dam downstream to the confluence with the McKenzie River is designated a state scenic waterway. The South Fork McKenzie River and its tributaries are classified only for domestic, commercial use for customarily domestic purposes not to exceed 0.01 cfs, livestock and public instream uses;
- (c) Blue River upstream from its confluence with the McKenzie River and tributaries are classified year-round only for domestic, commercial use for customarily domestic purposes not to exceed 0.01 cfs, livestock and public instream uses;
- (d) Except as specified in subsections (a), (b), and (c) of this section, all tributaries to the McKenzie River are classified for domestic, livestock, municipal, industrial, irrigation, agri-cultural, commercial, power, mining, fish life, wildlife, recreation, pollution abatement, wetland enhancement and public instream uses from October 1 through June 30, and only for domestic, commercial use for customarily domestic purposes not to exceed 0.01 cfs, livestock and public instream uses from July 1 through September 30;



This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This statement of judicial review rights does not create a right to judicial review of this order, if judicial review is otherwise precluded by law. Where no changes have been made to a Proposed Final Order on a water right application and no protests have been filed during the protest period, the final order is not subject to judicial review.

Application History

On September 18, 2002, Rainbow Water District submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on March 18, 2008. The protest period closed May 2, 2008, and no protest was filed.

On April 30, 2008, the Department received a Request for Standing from Springfield Utility Board that indicated it's support of the Proposed Final Order as issued.

The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Order

Application G-15840 is therefore approved. Upon payment of outstanding fees in the amount of \$300.00, a permit shall be issued authorizing the proposed water use.

Failure to meet this requirement within 60 days from the date of this Final Order may result in the proposed rejection of the application.

If you need to request additional time, your written request should be received in the Salem office of the Department within 60 days of this Final Order. The Department will evaluate the request and determine whether or not the request may be approved.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee Α. shall install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each point of appropriation. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit

a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Use of any or all water under this permit is only allowed if an Intergovernmental Agreement is in place between the Rainbow Water District and the Springfield Utility Board that addresses injury issues with senior users.

The water user shall develop a plan to monitor and report the impact of water use under this permit on water levels within the aquifer that provides water to the permitted well(s). The plan shall be submitted to the Department within one year of the date the permit is issued and shall be subject to the approval of the Department. At a minimum, the plan shall include a program to periodically measure static water levels within the permitted well(s) or an adequate substitute such as water levels in nearby wells. The plan shall also stipulate a reference water level against which any water-level declines will be compared. If a well listed on this permit (or replacement well) displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the water user shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the well(s). Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the water user's and/or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The water user shall in no instance allow excessive decline, as defined in Commission rules, to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this permit.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

If the number, location, source, or construction of any well deviates from that proposed in the permit application or required by permit conditions, this permit may not be valid, unless the Department authorizes the change in writing.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to

withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The well(s) shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The permit holder shall commence and complete the construction of any proposed works within 20 years from the date of permit issuance. The Department may order and allow an extension of time to complete construction or to perfect a water right beyond 20 years from the date of permit issuance.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).

Proposed Final Order

Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Application History

On September 18, 2002, Rainbow Water District submitted an application to the Department for the following water use permit:

- Amount of Water: 7.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 3.05 CFS FROM WELL 1 (LANE 11118) AND 3.95 CFS FROM WELL 2 (LANE 11119)
- Use of Water: MUNICIPAL USE
- Source of Water: WELL 1 (LANE 11118) AND WELL 2 (LANE 11119) IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN
- Area of Proposed Use: LANE COUNTY WITHIN THE SERVICE AREA OF RAINBOW WATER DISTRICT

On April 23, 2004, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that "the use of water at a rate of 7.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, BEING 3.05 CFS FROM WELL 1 AND 3.95 CFS FROM WELL 2 IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN for MUNICIPAL USE is not allowable, and it appears unlikely that you will be issued a permit." The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.

On April 27, 2004, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the proposed final order.

No written comments were received within 30 days.

On July 24, 2006, J. Timothy Hanley submitted comments on behalf of Rainbow Water District regarding the following:

- The potential for substantial interference with an unnamed tributary of the McKenzie River and the McKenzie River;
- 2) Potential injury to existing water rights;
- 3) Cooperative agreement among the applicant, Eugene Water and Electric Board, and Springfield Utility Board

On August 7, 2007 the Ground Water Section issued a memo addressing J. Timothy Hanley's comments.

The application has been on administrative hold since the Initial Review.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- recommendations by other state agencies
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record
- designations of any critical groundwater areas
- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any general basin-wide standard for flow rate and duty of water allowed
- the need for a flow rate and duty higher than the general standard
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The Willamette Basin Program allows MUNICIPAL USE.

Senior water rights exist on WELL 1 (LANE 11118) AND WELL 2 (11119) IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN, or on downstream waters.

WELL 1 (LANE 11118) AND WELL 2 (11119) IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN are not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.

The Public Interest Review completed on January 14, 2004 described well 1 (LANE 11118) AND well 2 (LANE 11119) as having the potential for substantial interference with an unnamed tributary to McKenzie River. Upon further review, the Department determined the unnamed tributary to the McKenzie River is an abandoned channel. Therefore, the proposed ground water use will not have the potential for substantial interference with an unnamed tributary to McKenzie River.

The attached draft permit is conditioned to address potential injury to prior water rights and the cooperative agreement among the applicant, Eugene Water and Electric Board, and Springfield Utility Board.

On August 10, 2007 the Ground Water Section issued a memo that updated determinations to the January 14, 2004 Public Interest Review regarding ground water/surface water interference and ground water availability. Updates are reflected in attached draft permit.

Groundwater Findings Under OAR 690-09

The Department determined, consistent with OAR $690-09-0040\,(4)$, that the proposed ground water use will not have the potential for substantial interference with nearby surface water source(s), namely McKenzie River.

In making this determination, the Department considered whether:

- (a) There is a hydraulic connection from the proposed well(s) to any surface water sources.
- (b) The point of appropriation is a horizontal distance less than one-fourth mile from the surface water source;
- (c) The rate of appropriation is greater than five cubic feet per second, if the point of appropriation is a horizontal distance less than one mile from the surface water source;
- (d) The rate of appropriation is greater than one percent of the pertinent adopted minimum perennial streamflow or instream water right with a senior priority date, if one is applicable, or of the discharge that is equaled or exceeded 80 percent of time, as determined or estimated by the Department, and if the point of appropriation is a horizontal distance less than one mile from the surface water source;
- (e) The ground water appropriation, if continued for a period of 30 days, would result in stream depletion greater than 25 percent of the rate of appropriation, if the point of appropriation is a horizontal distance less than one mile from the surface water source.

For this application, the Department determined that there is not a potential for substantial.

An assessment of groundwater availability has been completed by the Department's Groundwater/Hydrology section. A copy of this assessment is in the file. Water will, if properly conditioned, avoid injury to existing rights and the resource.

The Department finds that the amount of water requested, 7.0 CFS, is an acceptable amount.

The proposed wells are not within a designated critical ground water area.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.621, the Department must presume that a proposed use will ensure the preservation of the public welfare, safety and health if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program

established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the Willamette Basin Program, or a preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water is available for the proposed use.

The proposed use will not injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with other rules of the Water Resources Commission not otherwise described above.

The proposed use complies with the State Agency Agreement for land use.

No proposed flow rate and duty of water higher than the general basin-wide standard is needed.

For these reasons, the required presumption has been established.

Under the provisions of ORS 537.621, once the presumption has been established, it may be overcome by a preponderance of evidence that either:

- (a) One or more of the criteria for establishing the presumption are not satisfied; or
- (b) The proposed use would not ensure the preservation of the public welfare, safety and health as demonstrated in comments, in a protest . . . or in a finding of the department that shows:
 - (A) The specific aspect of the public welfare, safety and health under ORS 537.525 that would be impaired or detrimentally affected; and
 - (B) Specifically how the identified aspect of the public welfare, safety and health under ORS 537.525 would be impaired or be adversely affected.

In this application, all criteria for establishing the presumption have been satisfied, as noted above. The presumption has not been overcome by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed use would impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The Department therefore concludes that water is available in the amount necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use will not result in injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use would ensure the preservation of the public welfare, safety and health as described in ORS 537.525.

When issuing permits, ORS 537.628(1) authorizes the Department to include limitations and conditions which have been determined necessary to protect the public welfare, safety, and health. The attached draft permit is conditioned accordingly.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Protests

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7) (for surface water) or ORS 537.621(8) (for ground water), you can protest this proposed final order. Protests must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than May 2, 2008. Protests must be in writing, and must include the following:

- Your name, address, and telephone number;
- A description of your interest in the proposed final order, and, if you claim to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
- A detailed description of how the action proposed in this proposed final order would impair or be detrimental to your interest;
- A detailed description of how the proposed final order is in error or deficient, and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;

- Any citation of legal authority to support your protest, if known; and
- If you are not the applicant, the protest fee of \$350 required by ORS 536.050 and proof of service of the protest upon the applicant.
- If you are the applicant, a statement of whether or not you are requesting a contested case hearing. If you do not request a hearing, the Department will presume that you do not wish to contest the findings of the proposed final order.
- If you do not protest this Proposed Final Order and if no substantive changes are made in the final order, you will not have an opportunity for judicial review, protest or appeal of the final order when it is issued.

Requests for Standing

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7) (for surface water) or ORS 537.621(8) (for ground water), persons other than the applicant who support a proposed final order can request standing for purposes of participating in any contested case proceeding on the proposed final order or for judicial review of a final order.

Requests for standing must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than May 2, 2008. Requests for standing must be in writing, and must include the following:

- The requester's name, mailing address and telephone number;
- If the requester is representing a group, association or other organization, the name, address and telephone number of the represented group;
- A statement that the requester supports the proposed final order as issued;
- A detailed statement of how the requester would be harmed if the proposed final order is modified; and
- A standing fee of \$100.00. If a hearing is scheduled, an additional fee of \$250.00 must be submitted along with a request for intervention.

After the protest period has ended, the Director will either issue a final order or schedule a contested case hearing. The contested case hearing will be scheduled only if a protest has been submitted and either:

- upon review of the issues, the director finds that there are significant disputes related to the proposed use of water, or
- the applicant requests a contested case hearing within 30 days after the close of the protest period.





THIS IS NOT A PERMIT AND IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT THE NEXT PHASE OF PROCESSING.

This letter is to inform you of the preliminary analysis of your water use permit application and to describe your options. In determining whether a water use permit application may be approved, the Department must consider the factors listed below, all of which must be favorable to the proposed use if it is to be allowed. Based on the information you have supplied, the Water Resources Department has made the following preliminary determinations:

Initial Review Determinations:

- 1. The proposed use is not prohibited by law or rule except where otherwise noted below.
- 2. The Department has determined, based upon OAR 690-09, that the proposed groundwater use will have the potential for substantial interference with an unnamed tributary to McKenzie River and McKenzie River. Therefore limitations to the surface water sources must be applied to this application also.
- 3. The use of water from TWO WELLS IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN for MUNICIPAL purposes is a classified use during the period October 1 through June 30 only under OAR 690-502-0080(1)(d), the Willamette Basin Program.
- 4. Ground water in the amount of 7.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, BEING 3.05 CFS FROM WELL 1 AND 3.95 CFS FROM WELL 2 for MUNICIPAL USE will not likely be available in the amount requested without injury to prior rights.
- 5. Surface water in the amount of 7.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, BEING 3.05 CFS FROM WELL 1 AND 3.95 CFS FROM WELL 2 for MUNICIPAL USE is available year round.

Summary of Allowable Water Use

Because items #3 and #4 above are unfavorable, the use of water at a rate of 7.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, BEING 3.05 CFS FROM WELL 1 AND 3.95 CFS FROM WELL 2 IN MCKENZIE RIVER BASIN for MUNICIPAL USE is not allowable, and it appears unlikely that you will be issued a permit. At this time, you must decide whether to proceed or to withdraw your application as described below.

Please reference the application number when sending any correspondence regarding the conclusions of this initial review. Comments received within the comment period will be evaluated at the next phase of the process.

Withdrawal Refunds:

If you choose not to proceed, you may withdraw your application and receive a refund (minus a \$50 processing charge per application.) To accomplish this you must notify the Department in writing by Friday, May 7, 2004. For your convenience you may use the enclosed "STOP PROCESSING" form.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.
- 5. (1) Use of water from the well, as allowed herein, shall be controlled or shut off if the well displays:
 - (a) An average water level decline of three or more feet per year for five consecutive years; or
 - (b) A total water level decline of fifteen or more feet; or
 - (c) A hydraulic interference decline of fifteen or more feet in any neighboring well providing water for senior exempt uses or wells covered by prior rights.

- (2) The water user shall install a meter or other measuring device suitable to the Director, and shall submit an annual report of water used to the Department by December 1 of each year.
- (3) The permittee/appropriator shall be responsible for complying with each of the following requirements for measuring water levels in the well.
 - (a) Use of water from a new well shall not begin until an initial static water level in the well has been measured and submitted to the Department.
 - (b) In addition to the measurement required in subsection (a) of this section, a water level measurement shall be made each month between the 1st and 5th of each month.
 - (c) All water level measurements shall be made by a qualified individual. Qualified individuals are certified water rights examiners, registered geologists, registered professional engineers, licensed land surveyors, licensed water well constructors, licensed pump installers, or the permittee/appropriator.
 - (d) Any qualified individual measuring a well shall use standard methods of procedure and equipment designed for the purpose of well measurement. The equipment used shall be well suited to the conditions of construction at the well. A list of standard methods of procedure and suitable equipment shall be available from the Department.
 - (e) The permittee/appropriator shall submit a record of the measurements to the Department on a form available from the Department. The record of measurements shall include both measurements and calculations, and shall include a certification as to their accuracy signed by the individual making the measurements. The permittee/appropriator shall submit to the Department one year of monthly measurements (December November) by December 1st. The Department shall determine when any of the declines cited in section (1) are evidenced by the well measurement required in section (3).
- 6. The use may be restricted if the quality of hydraulically connected surface waters or downstream waters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

7. Within two years of permit issuance, the permittee shall submit a Water Management and Conservation Plan consistent with OAR Chapter 690, Division 86. The Director may approve an extension of this time line to complete the required Water Management and Conservation Plan. The time line for submittal of a plan under this permit does not alter the time lines for submittal of a plan under any other order of the Department.

Pursuant to OAR 690-086-0140(1) and (7), the required plan must include descriptions of connections with other municipal water suppliers including Springfield Utility Board, as wells as exchange and intergovernmental cooperation agreements. You are encouraged to submit the required plan jointly with Springfield Utility Board as described in OAR 690-086-0010(6).

WARNING: This initial review does not attempt to address various public interest issues such as sensitive, threatened, or endangered fish species. These issues will be addressed as the Department reviews public comments and prepares a proposed final order. You should be aware that, if significant public interest issues are found to exist, such a finding could have an impact on the eventual outcome of your application.

The water source identified in your application may be affected by an Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan. These plans are developed by the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) with the cooperation of local landowners and other interested stakeholders, and help to ensure that current and new appropriations of water are done in a way that does not adversely harm the environment. On March 18, 2008, your office issued a Proposed Final Order (the "PFO") concerning Rainbow Water District's ("RWD") water right Application G-15840 (RWD's "Application"), recommending a draft permit be issued with conditions (the "Draft Permit"). The Draft Permit would, if issued, allow a significant new appropriation from the alluvial aquifers adjacent to the Willamette River. Pursuant to ORS 537.621(6), any party who supports a proposed final order may request standing for the purposes of participating in any contested case proceeding. Please consider this letter a request for standing on behalf of the Springfield Utility Board. The following outlines the information required by OAR 690-310-0160(3).

The Springfield Utility Board ("SUB") is a municipal water and electric utility serving over 56,000 water consumers in and around Springfield, Oregon. SUB appropriates water primarily from seven well fields and multiple diversions from the Middle Fork of the Willamette River. Given their close proximity, the wells contemplated by RWD's Application could substantially interfere with SUB's appropriations and diversions.

While SUB is willing to accommodate the new appropriations contemplated by Application G-15840, it is critical that RWD and SUB enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (an "IGA") that would address injury issues with senior users. The Draft Permit included with the PFO includes a condition that reads as follows:

"Use of any or all water under this permit is only allowed if an Intergovernmental Agreement is in place between the Rainbow Water District and the Springfield Utility Board that addresses injury issues with senior users."

If effect, as a condition of water withdrawal, the Draft Permit requires the major water users in the area to reach some form of agreement concerning shared groundwater resources. Without such a condition, the terms of the permit would be inadequate to protect SUB's senior water rights. For this reason, SUB would not support a Final Order issued to RWD pursuant to RWD's Application without the foregoing condition.

Furthermore, because SUB is a major water buyer from RWD, SUB supports RWD's efforts to secure additional water supplies.

Again, SUB supports the PFO, and the Draft Permit, as issued, and respectfully requests standing to participate in any contested case proceeding regarding the PFO.

Enclosed are several pages from a study which we performed at our I-5 Wellfield which is the subject of water right application # G15840 under review by your department.

For an eleven month period beginning on August 12, 1993 and ending on July 21, 1994 we monitored temperature, pH and conductivity weekly in the McKenzie River and in the water from one or both wells which are the subject of this application. The purpose of the study was to determine if these wells are influenced by the McKenzie River. The procedures followed were those provided by the Drinking Water Section of the Department of Human Resources, formerly known as the Oregon Health Division. Dennis Nelson, the Drinking Water Section's hydrogeologist was the project manager.

Enclosed are the following documents from that study:

- 1. A table of results showing sampling dates, parameters recorded at the wells and in the McKenzie River, and notes about well operations. The table shows that the wells did not run between the February 3 and April 21 sampling dates.
- 2. Plot of temperatures in the McKenzie River and our I-5 #1 well based on the data from the table described in item #1 above. Please note that the X axis labels refer to the number of days since August 1, 1993.
- 3. Plot of water conductivities similar to item #2 above.
- 4. Map showing the location of the wells and the river sampling point approximately 2 river miles upstream.

I hope that this information is helpful in evaluating our application.

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


I-5 #1 v. McKenzie River


Temperature in Degrees Centigrade



We request that the Rainbow Water District's (Rainbow's) application for groundwater rights in the amount of 7.0 cubic feet per second (cfs), Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD) File G-15840, be removed from administrative hold status and that processing by OWRD resume.

This letter and the materials enclosed with it address the primary concerns raised in OWRD's April 23, 2004 initial review of the application: (1.) potential for substantial interference with an unnamed tributary of McKenzie River and McKenzie River, and (2.) potential for injury to senior water right holders in the area of these wells.

A. Potential for Interference with an Unnamed Tributary of McKenzie River and McKenzie River -

The unnamed tributary of the McKenzie River appears to be the dashed-and-dotted blue line shown on the "Eugene East Quadrangle" of the 7.5 Minute Series topographic map published by the USGS. As shown on the USGS map, this tributary lies east within 1/4 mile of the two wells (I-5 #1 and #2) which are the subject of this application.

On November 18, 2004, OWRD District 2 Water Master Michael Mattick visited the area and determined that this is not a tributary to the McKenzie River. Mr. Mattick described this as an old meander channel, that the channel is blocked off from the McKenzie River and experiences flows only during extreme high levels. Mr. Mattick also stated that the McKenzie River appears to have down cut and is significantly below the bottom of this meander channel. Copies of two e-mail correspondences from Mr. Mattick which contain these comments are included as Appendices 1. and 2. to this letter.

We believe that this finding addresses item numbers 2. and 3. in OWRD's Initial Review Determinations (IRD) of April 23, 2004.

B. Potential Injury to Prior Water Rights -

The two wells which are the subject of this application (I-5 #1 and I-5 #2) were drilled in 1974 and 1975 and placed into municipal/quasi-municipal service shortly thereafter. Appendix 3. shows the history of the annual amount of water produced from these wells for each year from 1978 through 2005. There are a number of significant facts related to this information:

- 1. A review of records for the period from 1980 to the present found that Rainbow received no complaints concerning interference to other pumping wells in the area. Appendix 1 from OWRD District 2 Water Master Michael Mattick indicates that during his tenure as District 2 Water Master, he has not received any complaints of ground water interference from the operation of these wells. Mr. Mattick adds in the same correspondence that he is not aware of any complaints prior to his arrival in the position.
- 2. Appendix 3. shows that during the time period in which these wells have operated, the annual amount of water produced from them has trended upward. This reflects the increasing urbanization of the area, particularly to the south and west of the wells. This urbanization has generally tended to eliminate or significantly reduce the amounts of water pumped from senior users. A significant portion of the farm land that was formerly irrigated by these rights is within the Springfield or Eugene urban growth boundaries and much of this land has become residential and commercial subdivisions, typically irrigated with municipal water from Rainbow or the Springfield Utility Board (SUB) on the east side of I-5 and EWEB on the west side. Rainbow's experience with these developments is that the water supply well is typically abandoned and the water right no longer exercised. The rate of urbanization in this area is accelerating due to a number of new developments in the area, led by the construction of a new 350 bed hospital and related medical clinics, scheduled to open in 2008.
- 3. Appendix 4. contains a series of aerial photographs showing the subject wells and an area of approximately one mile around them. EWEB has graciously provided these maps and added the locations of potential senior users in the area. Within a radius of one mile from the wells, the following totals of potential users are shown:

4. There are also a number of potential exempt users within a one mile radius of this application. As stated in 1. above, Rainbow has not received any complaints of well interference from any residents of the area since 1980 nor has Mr. Mattick's office. Since the two I-5 wells have operated since 1975 at the pumping rates requested in the application, it is very unlikely that approving this application will affect these potential exempt users.

- 5. In 1982 Rainbow and the Springfield Utility Board agreed on a scheduled transfer of water service facilities to SUB for those customers annexed to the City of Springfield. The agreement called for Rainbow to continue to serve water customers annexed to the City of Springfield for a period of ten years. In 1992, Rainbow and Springfield Utility Board (SUB) recognized the increased urbanization of the area and executed a replacement agreement. The 1992 agreement provided that Rainbow customers whose properties had been previously annexed to the City of Springfield and withdrawn from Rainbow were transferred in May, 1992 to SUB. Annexations and withdrawals which occur subsequent to 1992 continue to be transferred on June 30 each year in accordance with ORS 222.465. An essential part of this 1992 agreement is that Rainbow will continue to provide water to these transferred customers through a wholesale cost arrangement with SUB. The majority of this water supply is from the two wells which are the subject of this application. Implementation of this agreement has been very smooth from its beginning fourteen years ago and has lead to a high degree of coordination in water operation between Rainbow and SUB. SUB fully supports this water right application, G-15840.
- 6. Rainbow lies entirely within the Springfield urban growth boundary (UGB). The Eugene-Springfield area comprehensive land use plan (Metro Plan) provides that SUB will be the ultimate water service provider in the Springfield UGB. At such time in the future when Rainbow is not able to remain viable, the 1992 Agreement and a supplemental 1996 agreement provide that Rainbow will dissolve in accordance with state law and transfer all water service to SUB. This transfer also envisions transferring Rainbow's water rights, water supply, transmission and distribution facilities to SUB to ensure a smooth transition of water service for all Springfield area water customers. The staffs of both utilities are very aware of this future transition and coordinate water system planning and construction .
- 7. As part of its responsibility to provide adequate water source for new development and water needs within the historical Rainbow service area which arise subsequent to the transfer of Rainbow customers, SUB developed a groundwater source in the 1990's, OWRD permit number 12845. The 1,998 GPM of this permit represents the major senior water right in the area, as shown in the table in section 3. above. This well was constructed in coordination with Rainbow and supplements water supply from Rainbow's I-5 #1 and I-5 #2 wells to the combined area served by Rainbow and SUB through both SUB and Rainbow owned facilities. Both utilities realize the important role of this well plus Rainbow's I-5#1 and #2 wells in Springfield's water supply and closely coordinate their operation, testing and maintenance.

C. Other Information Relevant to this Application

1. The coordination of the Eugene-Springfield regional water supply has been a focus of attention by EWEB, SUB and Rainbow in recent years. After thoughtful deliberations, the three utilities have executed a Cooperative Agreement for Water System Interties which has recently been approved by the boards of directors of the three utilities. This agreement provides the institutional framework for the design, construction, operation, maintenance and administration of water system interties among the three utilities. The purpose of this agreement is to ensure the three utilities have the capability to provide and receive significant quantities of water for unusual operational as well as emergency assistance and represents an important milestone in ensuring the reliability of the regional water supply.

2. Other important steps in utilizing the regional aspects of water supply include agreement in concept to draft an intergovernmental agreement among the three water providers concerning EWEB's water right application G-15857, for EWEB's proposed confluence wellfield, if approved by ODWR. It also includes unified support of SUB's application for an exemption under the Willamette Basin Plan for water right application, S-28213.

We believe our long, historical cooperation with SUB and more recently with EWEB, set a high standard for supportive cooperation among water utilities. The vision of addressing the water supply needs of the region in a timely, economical and proactive manner is being realized at the planning, construction and operational levels. The water right application which is the subject of this letter plays an integral and vital role in the Eugene-Springfield regional water supply. Furthermore, we hope that we have shown that in the nearly thirty years of the wellfield's operation, no interference has been reported from senior users in the area. The largest senior user in the area by a very large margin (SUB), fully understands the importance of Rainbow's I-5 #1 and #2 wells and strongly supports this application

In closing, we thank you and the department for meeting with us, answering our questions and for granting administrative holds on this water right application. Your department's valuable input and patience has allowed us the opportunity to fully address the issues raised in the IRD and to grow the significant support from both EWEB and SUB which underlie this application.

We look forward to your favorable review of this application and welcome any questions which may arise.

We are presently assembling supporting information for the subject water right application which relates to two existing wells located north of the Boyal Caribbean Cruise Lines call center and just east of I-5, approximately one mile north of the Beltline Road interchange with I-5. I am writing you to request your assistance on following two items:

1. Tributary to the McKenzie River - In November, 2004, you accompanied me on a visit to an ancestral oxbow west of the McKenzie River and east of these two wells. After inspecting the oxbow channel, you confirmed that it is not considered a tributary of the McKenzie River since it does not contain water during normal river flows. Will you please confirm this in your response to this request?

2. Injury to Senior Water Right Holders - These two wells were drilled and placed into production in the 1970's and one or both have operated nearly continually since then. Here are my notes and thoughts about the ditches and streams in the vicinity of the well sites identified in application G-15857. Followed by my notes regarding the Slough potentially affecting the Rainbow application.

I visited the area on April 14th.

In T 17 S, R 3 W, sec 16, I did not see any remnants of the intermittent channel, shown on the USGS map,running roughly from the SE to the central West of the section.

In Section 17, there is a ditch in the SE corner of the section, about 160 feet long, 70 feet of it is 4 to 6 feet deep and 90 feet of it is 1 to 4 ft deep. It does not appear to have an inlet or outlet. It had no water in it. I found this channel again about 1000 feet NW and again near a park near the intersection of Park Wood and Lake Side (N 44.09901, W 123.07416), the ditch is about 5 feet deep and runs from the intersection to the NW. I also found the channel about 800 feet West of Well site # 12, in all cases the bottom was dry.

This drainage system does not appear to even be an intermittent stream, though it may sometimes be wet.

Conversely, the channel which runs from the South Central part of Section 17, near Benson Street and South of and between well sites 8 and 9, was flowing about 100 gpm (ocular estimate) during my visit. The channel is deeply incised (about 9 feet deep). This channel flows Northwest to Dodson Slough. Dodson Slough is historic surface water channel that was once mined for grave and is now a lake area which still drains to the Willamette River.

These are my notes from my inspection of the slough next to the McKenzie: On November 18, 2004, I met Tim Hanley of Rainbow Water District and we walked most of the slough that shows up in T 17 S, R 4 W, section 15. This is no longer a water body. I found no flowing water. The only place I even saw standing water was in the bottom of a borrow pit next to a dike road in the North 1/4 of section 15. I took 7 pictures in the slough, on the dike, of the dike, of the slough outlet. I do not believe water has been in this channel since the 1996 flood event. It looks like the river has down cut and is significantly lower than this channel bottom. There are no surface water rights which would use this channel that we need to concern ourselves with.



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
