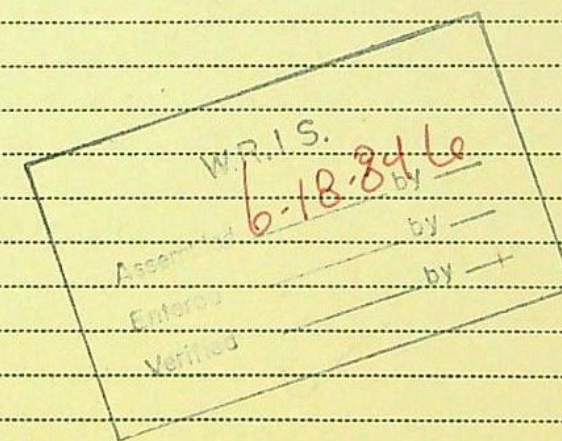

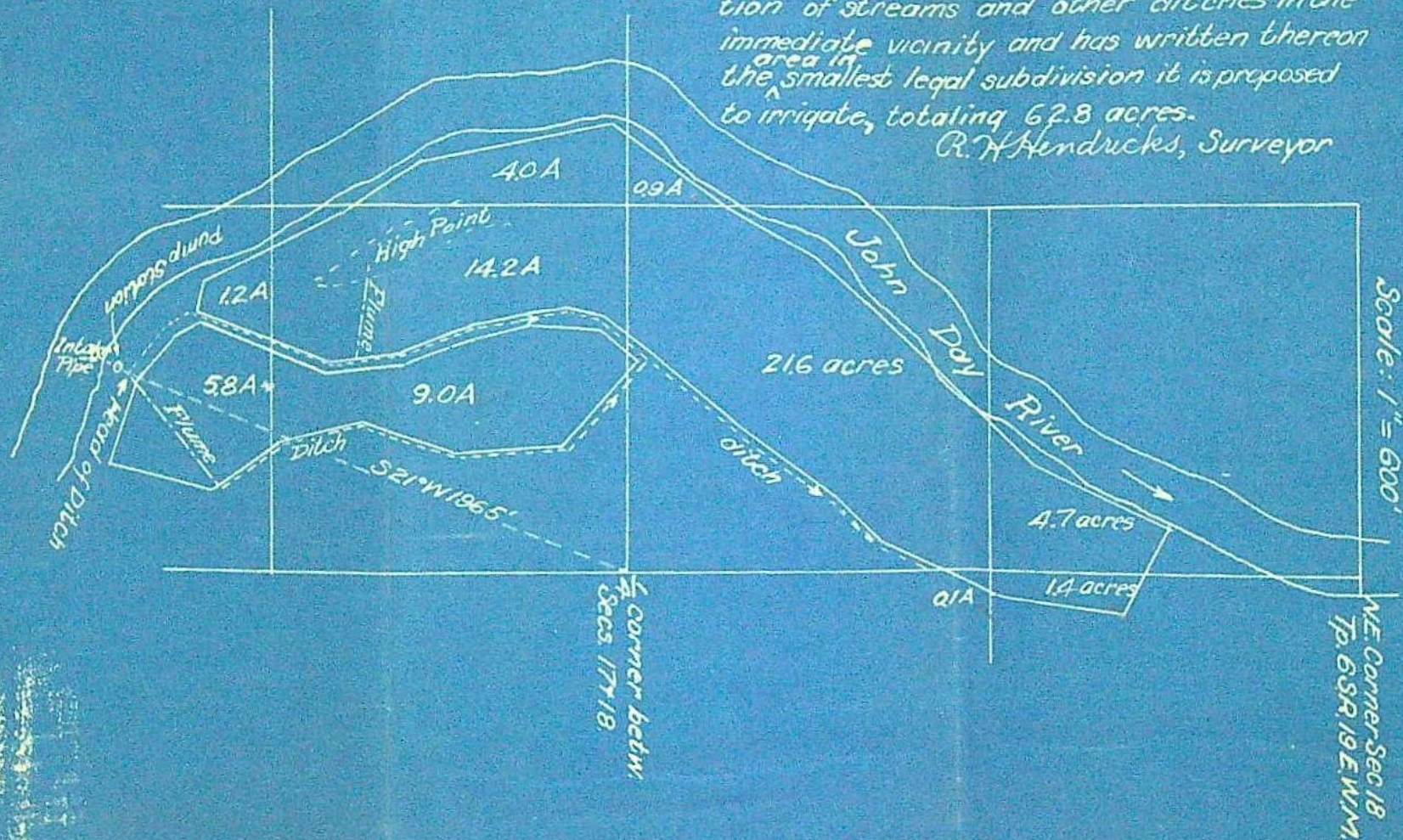

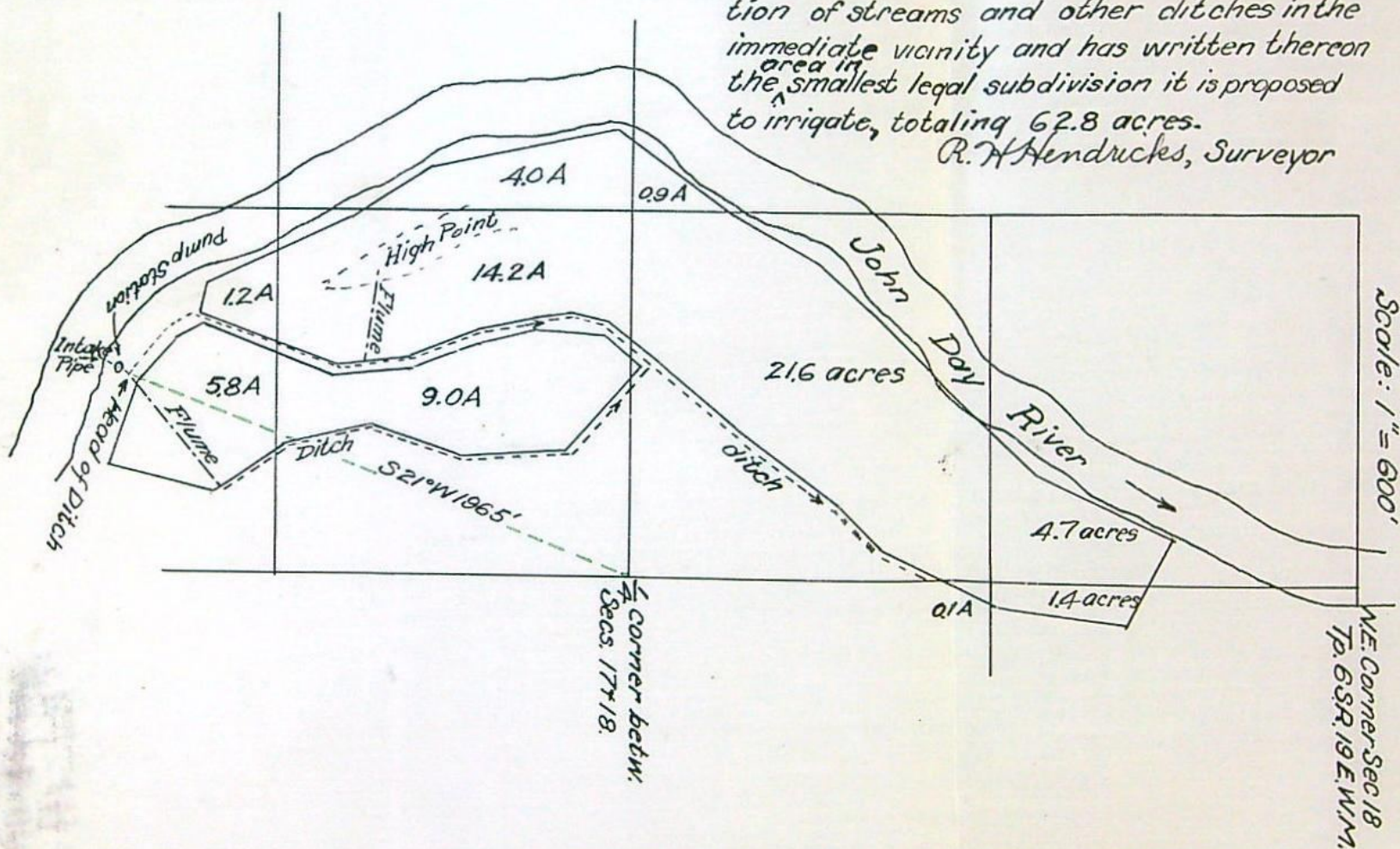

I am part owner of the Butte Creek Land, Livestock and Lumber Company, and have been delayed in making report on our Permit No. 4364 for the reason that the papers in the matter, the permit and map got misplaced, but the Company found them to-day in the Bank among a lot of deeds.

I hope that you will be able to keep us alive on the project. We have long since had the lower ditch project done, and have raised some good crops on the land. All the land under that ditch as shown on the map is in alfalfa.

The higher ditch we never could get to someday, and we will have to let it go, and sometime if we think it will pay to lift the water that high, we can make a new application.

Any time you will send up an engineer to look it over, the work we have in operation, we will help him to get to the land. There is a poor road part of the way from here.

You might deputize Keyes Donnelly to examine it and make report for you. He lives 20 miles from here. Address Service Creek.

I am very glad indeed to have your letter of the 27th inst. relative to the Squaw Creek situation.

I note that matters are not progressing very satisfactorily but trust that an adjustment may be worked out, which will avoid litigation. I believe that while it would have been far better to have included the so-called old rights in the vicinity of Sisters in the Squaw Creek District, I believe the organization of a new district including these rights will be an improvement over the present condition. I hope that the people on the Plainview ditch will again see their way to join the Squaw Creek district and that we may be able to unite the interests of the Squaw Creek district, the Cloverdale, Plainview and McAllister ditches.

I have heard from some of the Plainview people who have requested the removal of their names from the petition and do not believe that there is any serious objection upon their part. I hope to have Mr. Luper visit that section again shortly, and make another effort to get the various conflicting interests together. In the meantime I would be glad to have you advise as to whether or not the Squaw Creek district signed the arbitration agreement.

I appreciate the attitude of the Squaw Creek Irrigation District and feel sure that in the course of time it will result in the benefit of the entire community.

In reply to your communication of the 16th will endeavor to enlighten you as to the present status of your plan for co-operation of the Squaw Creek water users.

The directors of the Squaw Creek Irrigation District after meeting with their water users agreed to take in all water users under the Squaw Creek water shed providing all would agree to go in. This all of the users adjacent to Sisters, or those holding riparian rights refused to do, and they took immediate steps towards the organization of a separate district of their own. Their petition was favorably approved by the County Court and no doubt your office is in possession of notice of same.

When Mr. Luper left Sisters he informed me that the necessary petition to enlarge the district would be returned by him to me. This has never reached me so that further action on my part for the district would have been held up had every thing else been satisfactory.

Again: quite a number of the Plainview water users and signers of the petition sent Registered notices to the Squaw Creek District, through their Attorney, requesting that their names be stricken from the petition.

In the face of all these difficulties if you can figure where the Squaw Creek Irrigation District had any right to proceed further in the matter we would be very glad to hear

At no time since the organization of the Squaw Creek Irrigation District have the directors of same shown anything but a willingness to cooperate with any and all interests in community welfare, and at one time took up, at their own expense, the same line as you recommended and tried to put in operation. They met with opposition and were forced to abandon the work.

I am really surprised at your taking stock in unfounded complaints of individual water users who attempt to tell you of the extravagant use of water by the district. The measurement records together with the fact that since the organization of the Squaw Creek District more acreage has been added to the alfalfa fields every year and by rotating and conservative use of water better results have been attained and the users within the district are cooperating and working for a better system of irrigation at all times, should be sufficient proof that the district is more than doing its part.

Experience and time has proven that the individuals who are always complaining about some one else are the ones who require the most watching to prevent them from stealing water that belongs to their neighbors. Only about a week ago one of these was caught changing headgates and stealing water.

While I am acting as Secretary of the Squaw Creek Irrigation District I am in business here and am directly interested in the welfare and upbuilding of the whole community, and particularly in the securing of better water conditions of those who are short and do not want you to gain the idea that I am
