There may be some real problems with this SWR. This may not be a claim that can be substantiated. The following is a summary of my thoughts regarding this claim using the Department's standard format which solicits watermaster comments.

This is a claim for domestic use and 11.5 acres of irrigation from East Fork Coquille River.

For the reasons listed below, I do not think that this claim is supportable.

1. DO YOU KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT THIS WATER USE?

and

2. HAVE THERE BEEN ANY DISTRIBUTION PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS CLAIM?

Beginning in 1983 this office established a standard gauging station on W. Fk. Brummit Creek, a tributary to Brummit Creek, which is tributary to E. Fk. Coquille River. Since then, I have traveled the Coos Bay Wagon Road within 50' of the claimant's POU for domestic use and have seen no use occurring at that location. Photographs taken by my assistant, James A. Simpson, this year, show buildings on the property as being uninhabitable and in an advanced state of dilapidation. A small camp trailer photographed at the same time was assumed to have a self contained water source as no pipes or hoses were observed leading to the trailer and no pump was observed in E. Fk.

Regarding irrigation use, I have not observed water being applied on the claimed acreage.

E. Fk. Coquille River has been regulated for the instream rights in 1980, 1987, and 1992. No irrigation use has ever been observed on claimed property. Irrigation on the claimed acreage during distribution would have been the cause for some note in that prior to Mr. Stinson's 1992 surface water registration claim, any irrigation observed would have been considered as illegal water use and dealt with accordingly. Additionally, if, as has been claimed, the Stinson property was for some time leased by and irrigated by Calvin Laird, I would have taken more particular note. Mr. Laird had been somewhat troublesome during the 1980 and 1987 distribution season and I would have been on alert for any illegal water use associated with Mr. Laird's operation. I therefore have neither recollection or documentation of any water use on the Stinson property.

3. DO YOU HAVE REASON TO BELIEVE THAT THIS CLAIMED PRIORITY DATE IS NOT ACCURATE?

I have no reason to believe that the claimed priority date is not accurate.

4. DOES THE QUANTITY OF WATER CLAIMED LOOK UNREASONABLE FOR THE USES NAMED.

The quantity of water would look reasonable for a valid claim.

- 5. DOES THE PLACE OF USE LOOK TO BE ACCURATELY DEPICTED BY THE CWRE MAP ENCLOSED?

- 6. DO YOU KNOW IF THERE HAS BEEN A PERIOD OF MORE THAN FIVE YEARS OF NON-USE?

I have reason, as stated above, to believe that water has not been in continuous use from E. Fk. for domestic use and irrigation of 11.5 acres.

On Ø7-14-92 at 10:15 AM, I spoke with Mrs. Louise Pace T28S R10W Sec.10 TL 1500 about a claim for a Vested Right that has been filed on the Stinson property T28S R10W Sec.10 TL 1400. I let Mrs. Pace view an aerial photo # 19-33-33 of the Sitkum area, and also a copy of our distribution map for T28S R10W Sec.10 with the Stinson property highlighted. When asked if she had ever witnessed the Stinson property to be irrigated, Mrs. Pace stated that she has lived in her present home for three years and has observed no water use of any kind on tax lot 1400.

On 07-14-92 at 1:00 PM, I met with Mr. Calvin Laird T28S R10W Sec. 10 TL 600. I presented Mr. Laird the same aerial photo and map that Mrs. Pace observed. When asked about irrigation on the Stinson property Mr. Laird went on to explain that he had irrigated tax lot 1400 until about 3yrs. ago, and that there was never really any irrigation on the property until 1947.

On Ø8-11-92 I returned to the Sitkum area and spoke with Mr. Dan Dewey T28s R1ØW Sec.1Ø TL2ØØ who has lived in Sitkum for 19 yrs. and has resided in the close proximity of tax lot 14ØØ. After introducing myself I presented Mr. Dewey the same materials used to familiarize the other residents of the Stinson property. When I informed Mr. Dewey of the vested claim and then asked him about any irrigation on tax lot 14ØØ, Mr. Dewey replied that Mr. Calvin Laird was the only person that he had witnessed irrigating that parcel. Mr. Dewey went on to explain that Mr. Laird ran his own water line to irrigate tax lot 14ØØ. This indicates that the Stinson property was being irrigated from a different point of diversion than what is being claimed.



Dear Mr. Stinson:

We have made a preliminary review of your form and map concerning the Surface Water Registration claim number 77 in the name of Wallace R. Stinson. I am returning your form and map for completion and corrections. I will keep copies in the file. There are a few items that need to be clarified or added before we can proceed with your claim.

FORM: You have two uses (irrigation & domestic) but you have only listed one period of use and one quanity. There must be a period of use and a quanity for each use claimed. This is explained in the instruction booklet which is enclosed.

MAP: There are several problems with the map.

- 1. As stated in ORS 539.240 (B) "If the use is for irrigation, the number of acres irrigated within each quarter-quarter section" must be shown. This is also covered in OAR 690-28-025 (4)(d).
- 2. The order approving the request for exception states that Michael J. Stinson be allowed to prepare the map. He should have his name and signature on the map.
- 3. We need to know the date the survey was performed. This is covered in OAR 690-28-025 (4)(a).
- 4. I cannot tell how the water is used for irrigation. Are there ditches, pipelines, sprinklers, etc.? The location of the canals, ditches, pipelines, or flumes should be on the map as covered OAR 690-11-070 (5)(b). See also OAR 690-28-065 (4).
- 5. I am a bit confused about there being two houses

on the map. Are they both involved in the claim? If not, please make such a statement on an accompanying piece of paper.

- 6. The point of diversion is said to be located within the SE¹/₄ of the NE¹/₄ of Section 10. It appears to me that the correct location should be in the NE¹/₄ of the SE¹/₄.
- 7. There are two typographical errors. On the third line from the top, the word "SECTION" is misspelled. On the sixth line from the bottom (POD discription) the word "LOCATED" is misspelled.

Regarding the information mentioned in number 4 above, I am requesting that you or your son provide the information circled on the accompanying sheet titled "REGISTRATION STATEMENT CLAIM OF BENEFICIAL USE." This should answer any questions that we might have about how the water is used on the property. Remember that you have claimed two uses. Make sure to fully describe the particulars involved for each use.

Once again I am enclosing copies of related ORS and OAR for your review.

This letter confirms our telephone conversations earlier today concerning the need to file a Surface Water Registration statement on your property near Sitkum, Oregon.

You indicated that there has been a domestic and irrigation use of water on the property near Sitkum since before 1909. You explained to me that your economic condition was such that it might be impossible for you to hire a Certified Water Right Examiner to prepare your adjudication map. You also told me that your son is a licensed engineer and surveyor.

OAR 690-28-028 (7) states "Requests for exceptions to the mapping standards or for modification of the application form shall be requested in advance of filing. The request may be approved at the discretion of the Director."

Based on this rule I suggested that you might want to write letter to the Adjudication Section Manager, Mr. A. Reed Marbut and request and exception to the mapping standards, specifically OAR 690-28-025 (4) "The required map shall be prepared by a certified water right examiner...".

Your letter might have the following format:

I need to file a surface Water Registration statement on my property near Sitkum, Oregon, however, the current level of my economic resources may preclude me from doing so. With the abstract I have which was prepared April 23, 1924, I believe that I can demostrate historic water usage both for farming and domestic use prior to February 24, 1909. My parents owned this land for most of the last fify years. The various people who owned this property back to 1924 were personal friends to me both when I was a boy and a young man, however, I don't believe any of these people are still living.

In an effort to protect my vested water right, I investigated the expense involved in hiring a C.W.R.E. This expense would cause an economic hardship that could prevent me from protecting my vested water right. Forced to retire by reason of poor health my primary income is from Social Security. Now in my late sixties my health is somewhat improved. My small farm contains a little less than ten irrigable acres. With enough water for the small fruit orchard, a garden, and some feed production for one or two head of stock, it would support my food requirements nicely while helping to assure my future self-sufficiency.

For the reasons stated above, I request that an exception be made to the mapping standards specifically OAR 690-28-025 (4). I request that my son, Michael J. Stinson, be allowed to prepare a suitable map. Said map to be prepared pursuant to OAR 690-28-025 (4) with the exception requested above if approved. Michael attended O.I.T. where he earned two degrees in Civil Engineering and two associate degrees. One of the associate degrees was in Hydrology and the other in Surveying. His employement experience in the field of surveying includes a private Land Surveying firm, B.L.M., and extensive experience with the Oregon State Highway Div. for the past seven years. STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC HARDSL

I DO HEREBY CERTIFY AND DECLARE THAT THE ACT OF PURSUING THE PRESCRIBED PATH TO OBTAIN A WATER RIGHT ON MY PROPERTY AT SITKUM, OREGON, LOCATED IN COOS COUNTY, TOWNSHIP 28 S., RANGE 10 W., SECTION 10, TAX LOT 1400 WOULD CONSTITUTE A SERIOUS ECONOMIC HARDSHIP FOR ME.

THE FOLLOWING DISSERTATION IS A SHORT EXPLANATION OF HOW I BECAME ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED AND WHY I DESIRE TO APPROPRIATE WATER FROM THE EAST FORK OF THE COQUILLE RIVER WHICH BOUNDS MY PROPERTY.

My wife of nearly 30 years died after a long battle with cancer which terminated when I was about 63 years old. The group health insurance that I carried was sponsered by my employer, a corporation. The policy did appear to be excellent with all of the coverages clearly stated, however, no mention was made of their maximum allowable fee schedule on which basis all payments for medical proceedures, surgery, hospital stays, etc., were paid. This method of paying claims covered perhaps half of the medical expenses. By the time I paid for the funeral, my resources were reduced to my next pay check.

It seemed reasonable to assume that I could probably work into my early seventies at least. My health began to fail and within two years I was forced to retire. I took the necessary steps to keep my professional license in force to the middle of 1990 when it became apparent that I could no longer hope to resume my practice of pharmacv. Now nearing the age of 69 it seems expedient for me to take what ever steps I can to help assure my future self-suffciency.

My small farm, somewhat less than 10 irrigable acres, was formerly the home of my parents for nearly fifty years so I know its potential very well. With enough water for the small orchard, a garden, and some feed production for one or two head of stock this land will support my food requirements very nicely. I also require a small amount of water for domestic use as my spring will no longer furnish much more the enough water for drinking purposes.

Thank you for your thoughtful consideration in reviewing my claim. With adjudication proceedings pending in my area, I was concerned that it might take place before I could complete a claim leaving me without recourse. With this in mind, I insisted that my son complete the map. He was under a particularly heavy work load at that time. The map was completed in the early morning hours when he was severly fatigued. I personally feel responsible for the errors, but I believed that I had to proceed with all haste to make my surface water registration statement. The map will be corrected and returned with this cover letter.

Although the spring which provides a portion of the domestic water supply is not subject to adjudication proceedings, I would like to digress momentarily in order to clarify my need of continued use of water from the East Fork of the Coquille River for domestic application. The spring first located in about 1916 was always subject to periodic flow fluctuations. The water flow from the spring has steadily diminished for the past 30 years. Now it barely furnishes water enough for drinking and some kitchen use. I am concerned that it may fail completely. The point I want to make is that the spring was never more than an adjunct to domestic water needs at best. I plan to make my property at Sitkum my principle residence, and will require an amount of water usually considered to be adequate by the OWRD for a single family dwelling domestic use. I will reside on said property from Jan. 1 to Dec 31 each year.

When my father made his home on the property he limited the size and type of irrigation equipment to what was adequate for his needs, and suitable to his physical ability to handle such equipment. What was adequate for his needs may very likely differ from my own, although, I have not as yet updated what equipment there is left. Almost two years ago during a period when it was necessary for me to be absent from the property for sometime a considerable amount of looting and vandalism occurred. Fortunately I had stored the pump and motor, however, I now have no other irrigation equipment remaining. The only other part of the diversion system still intact is the single underground line for domestic use. If possible, I would like to defer procuring further irrigation equipment until we know the outcome of the adjudication proceedings. It would be pointless to have equipment capable of handling quantities of water greater than that which maybe allowed. If this is not possible, I am prepared to make a proposal as to motor, pump, pipe, and sprinkler heads.

WATER RESOURCES DEPT.

Perhaps the following information is not pertinent, but at least it may clarify my intentions in regard to irrigation. Historically there has been such crops as potatoes, green beans, and various other minor truck crops produced and sold in commercial quantities. Forage crops have included oat hay, clover hay, grass hay, stock beets, and stock carrots. By intensive alternating use of pastures and applying adequate irrigation enough pasture was produced to graze 13 head of stock. This property was also operated as a dairy for many years. My own intended uses of irrigation includes production of enough forage for 5 head of stock maximum. Further intended uses are the irrigation of an orchard, a vegetable garden, and a small lawn.
