Dear Sir:

With further reference to your petition for a change in point of diversion of water, you are advised that after an investigation made by a representative of this department, it appears that there is some merit in the objections filed by Mr. Mayotte, and that some damage would be caused to his property should the change be made.

Under these circumstances, we cannot approve the change until you have made some arrangement with him so that he will withdraw his objections. We will therefore hold the matter in abeyance until hearing further from you, and if you can submit a statement signed by Mr. Mayotte to the effect that he no longer objects to the change, we will enter an order approving it.
