





- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract No. U&I 96-7 dated July 19, 1986, or a satisfactory replacement, between Douglas County and the water user, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate tish screening as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The use shall confirm to such reasonable notation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer

The list may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream staters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract No. U&I 96-1 dated July 19, 1986, or a satisfactory replacement, between Douglas County and the water user, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

In the event of a request for a change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or alteration of the appropriation facility associated with this authorized diversion, the quantity of water allowed herein, together with any other right, shall not exceed the capacity of the facility at the time of perfection of this right.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.



COUNTY AND CUSTOMER AGREE:

1. TERM AND RENEWAL:

- 1.1. The initial term of this contract shall begin on March 16 , 2018 and end on December 31, 2027, unless it is sooner terminated as provided herein.
- 1.2. As used in this contract, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, "term" or "term of this contract" shall mean both the initial term and any extension.
- 1.3. Customer shall have the right to extend the term of this contract for five successive periods of ten years each upon the following conditions:
 - 1.3.1. Approximately ninety days prior to expiration of the contract term, County shall notify Customer in writing that Customer has the right to extend the term at the price set pursuant to section 11.
 - 1.3.2. Customer may elect to extend the contract term by written notice to County within thirty days after County gives notice of the right to extend. Concurrently with written notice of extension Customer may request the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price of water in accordance with subsection 11.4.
 - 1.3.3. No other act or agreement shall be required of the parties to effect the extension after Customer gives proper notice of election to extend the contract term.
 - 1.3.4. Each extension shall commence on the day following the termination date of the initial term or the preceding extension.
- 1.4. The provisions of this contract shall apply to any extension except for changes in the purchase price pursuant to section 11; modifications required to comply with federal or state statutes, regulations, or administrative rules; or modifications required to comply with any contract between County and the United States concerning the Galesville Project.
- 1.5. Customer shall not be entitled to extend the term of this contract if Customer is in default under this contract at the time extension is requested by Customer.

2. AUTHORITY OF PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR:

- The Director of the Douglas County Public Works Department (the Director)
 has authority to administer this contract on behalf of County.

4. PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES OF WATER RIGHTS:

4.1. County shall file and maintain any reservoir water right permit and/or certificate to store water in the Galesville reservoir allocated for the Customer's use, as required by the State of Oregon Water Resources Department or its successor ("OWRD").

4.2. Customer, at Customer's expense, shall be responsible for obtaining any permit and/or certificate of water rights for use of the stored water allocated under this contract as required by the OWRD.

4.3. Within 6 months after the effective date of this contract, Customer shall provide County with a copy of the application map provided to the State.

5. RELEASE OF WATER:

5.1. Subject to the provisions of this contract, County will release into the natural channel of Cow Creek water comprising the allocation described in section 3. Water released for Customer's allocation shall be measured and delivered to Customer's point of diversion of record by County with equipment installed and maintained by County.

5.2. County shall report to the OWRD all allocated water stored and distributed to Customer's point of diversion of record, including reasonable losses. Customer shall report all water use as described on Customer's water right of record to the County no later than November 30th each year and as may be required by the State.

5.3. The obligations of County to allocate capacity may be restricted by any lawful order, regulation, or ruling of any governmental agency or provisions of a contract between County and the United States. Such legal restrictions may impair the County's ability to perform its obligations under this contract. In that event, County shall be relieved of its obligations to the extent necessary to comply with the legal restrictions. Customer's payments under this contract shall be reduced proportionally to any reduction in Customer's allocation resulting from such legal restrictions.

5.4. Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, County may suspend release and delivery of water to Customer upon written notice to Customer if Customer fails to make any payment for such water when due.

6. DIVERSION AND USE OF WATER:

6.1. Customer shall be wholly responsible for taking, diverting, conveying, and utilizing its water and shall bear all losses from Customer's point of diversion 2 8 2018

6.2. Customer shall divert the water it is entitled to receive under this contract in accordance with schedules developed by the Customer and County.

6.3. The water diverted by Customer may be measured by County at the point of diversion. The point of diversion shall be accessible for inspection and measurement of water at all reasonable times by County. Any easement necessary for County to gain access to the point of diversion shall be provided by Customer when requested by County.

6.4. The water shall be utilized for industrial-commercial or multiple purpose use. Customer shall utilize the water only for the uses and only on the real property

described in Customer's permit and certificate.

6.5. Customer shall be responsible for purchase and installation of a meter or other suitable measuring device if required by the OWRD. Once installed, it shall be the Customer's responsibility to maintain such device in good working order. If requested by the OWRD, Customer shall maintain a record of the amount of water used and report water use on such periodic schedule as may be established by the OWRD.

6.6. If required, Customer shall purchase, install, maintain, and operate fish screening equipment and by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the diversion. Any required screens and/or by-pass devices shall be in place, functional, and approved

prior to the diversion of any water, under this contract.

- 7. QUALITY OF WATER: County shall operate and maintain the Galesville dam, reservoir, and related facilities in a reasonable and prudent manner, and shall endeavor in good faith to take adequate measures to maintain the quality of raw stored water at the facilities. County is under no obligation to construct or furnish water treatment facilities to maintain or improve the quality of water. COUNTY MAKES NO WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, REGARDING THE QUALITY OF WATER RELEASED AND DELIVERED FROM GALESVILLE DAM, RESERVOIR, AND RELATED FACILITIES.
- 8. WATER SHORTAGES: In any year in which a water shortage in the Galesville reservoir occurs, County shall apportion the available water supply among Customer and other users who are entitled to receive water from the reservoir. The quantity of water to be furnished for irrigation shall first be reduced as necessary, but not greater than 15%. Any further reduction in the reservoir water supply shall be shared by Customer and all other users entitled to water from the reservoir in the same proportion that the entitlement of each user, including Customer's entitlement under this contract, bears to the total entitlements of all users.

If Customer is not satisfied with the action of the Board of Commissioners, Customer may rescind their election to extend the contract term and cancel the contract by written notice to County within sixty days after Customer requests the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price.

12. PAYMENT:

12.1. Customer shall pay County the annual price established by section 11 for the allocation stated in section 3 regardless of whether Customer uses any or all of the water allocated. Except as provided in subsection 12.2, payment shall be made no later than March 31 of each year.

12.2. If this contract is dated after March 2 in the year for which water is first to be released, then the amount due for the first year only shall be payable within 30 days

County under this contract, if such failure results from lack of appropriation of funds necessary to perform such obligation pursuant to ORS 294.305 et seq. (Local Budget Law).

13.3. In no event shall County be liable to Customer for any indirect, special, or consequential damages even if Customer previously advised County of the possibility of such damages.

14. DEFAULT:

14.1. There shall be a default under this contract if either party materially fails to comply with any provision of this contract within thirty days after the other party gives written notice specifying the breach. If the breach specified in the notice cannot be completely cured within the thirty day period, no default shall occur if the party receiving the notice begins curative action within the thirty day period and thereafter proceeds with reasonable diligence and in good faith to cure the breach as soon as practicable.

14.2. If a default occurs, the party injured by the default may elect to terminate this contract and pursue any equitable or legal rights and remedies available under Oregon law, except that Customer's remedies shall be subject to the limitations on

damages stated in section 13.



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



On August 15, 1996, RIVERS WEST DEVELOPMENT INC submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on July 29, 1997. The protest period closed September 12, 1997, and no protest was filed.





Proposed Final Order

Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Additional Information Required: According to Department records, there is an existing water right, Certificate 73635, for Irrigation on the lands requested under this application. Before a permit may be issued for this application part or all of this existing right may need to be canceled or transferred.

Application History

On August 15, 1996, RIVERS WEST DEVELOPMENT INC. submitted an application to the Department for the following water use permit:

- Amount of Water: 5.0 ACRE-FEET (AF)
- Use of Water: RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK
- Source of Water: GALESVILLE RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-9964, A TRIBUTARY OF COW CREEK
- Area of Proposed Use: DOUGLAS County within SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 5 WEST, W.M.
- Water Delivery System: According to the application, no diversion works are to be installed. The pump will be placed directly in the bottom of an existing pump site. There will be a submersible 1 horsepower, 19 gallon per minute pump. The pump will feed a 1 ½ inch PVC Schedule 80 pipe. This pipe will be underground protruding 4 feet from the river bank into the river, then running underground 150 feet to the water filtration system.

On 1/23/97, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that the use of 5.0 AF for Industrial Use to supply a 150 unit commercial recreation vehicle park, from stored water only released from the Galesville Reservoir under a valid Douglas County Contract, may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract. The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.

On 2/11/97, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the proposed final order.

No written comments were received within 30 days.

On February 19, 1997, an amendment to the application, requesting to change the location of the point of diversion, was received from the applicant.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- comments by or consultation with another state agency
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record
- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- Additional Public Interest Standards for New Appropriations (OAR Chapter 690, Div. 33)
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The Umpqua Basin Program allows the following uses: INDUSTRIAL USE FOR A 150-UNIT COMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK FROM STORED WATER ONLY. The South Umpqua River is withdrawn from further appropriation, except for a few limited uses, during the period July 15 through September 30. However, the use of stored water is allowable during this period.

Senior water rights exist on THE SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER AND GALESVILLE RESERVOIR, TRIBUTARY OF THE UMPQUA RIVER, or on downstream waters.

THE SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER AND GALESVILLE RESERVOIR, TRIBUTARY OF THE UMPQUA RIVER, are not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.

Water may be appropriated from storage Year Round, or as further limited by contract with Douglas County.

The Department finds that no more than 5.0 AF would be necessary for the proposed use. The amount of water requested, 5.0 AF, is allowable.

There is no evidence in the record of the presence of game fish at the described point of diversion.

In accordance with OAR 690-33-330, an interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on sensitive, threatened and endangered fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from

the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff.

The interagency team did not recommend that any additional conditions of use be imposed on this application.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the Umpqua Basin Plan.

No preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water is available for the proposed use.

The proposed use will not injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use complies with the State Agency Agreement for land use.

For these reasons, the required presumption has been established.

Once the required presumption has been established, under the provisions of ORS 537.153(2) it may be overcome by a preponderance of evidence that either:

- (a) One or more of the criteria for establishing the presumption are not satisfied; or
- (b) The proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as demonstrated in comments, in a protest . . . or in a finding of the department that shows:
 - (A) The specific public interest under ORS 537.170(8) that would be impaired or detrimentally affected; and
 - (B) Specifically how the identified public interest would be impaired or detrimentally affected.

In this application, all criteria for establishing the presumption have been satisfied, as noted above. The presumption has not been overcome by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The Department therefore concludes that water is available in the amount necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use will not result in

injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

This letter is to inform you of the potential limitations to your proposed use of water and to describe some of your options. Based on the information you have supplied, the Water Resources Department has reached the following conclusions:

Initial Review Determinations:

- 1. Your application is complete and not defective.
- The proposed use is not prohibited by law or rule.
- 3. The use of water from South Umpqua River, tributary to Umpqua River, for INDUSTRIAL USE (COMMERCIAL USE) is limited to October 1 through April 14 by rule [OAR 690-516-001(1)(e)], the Umpqua Basin Program; however, use of water released from STORAGE, namely from Galesville Reservoir, for INDUSTRIAL USE (COMMERCIAL USE) may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract with Douglas County.
- 4. The use of 5.0 ACRE-FEET (AF) for INDUSTRIAL USE TO SUPPLY 150-UNIT COMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK, under a valid Douglas County Contract for stored water from the Galesville Reservoir, may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract.
- The maps submitted to the Department with the application each appear to show different locations for the proposed point of diversion. A revised application map needs to be submitted to the Department. The revised map must clearly identify and show each of the required elements described in the enclosed Department Map Requirements. This includes identifying the coordinates, from a recognized public land survey corner, to the proposed point of diversion. The map must also show the location where

If applicable, the map must also show the location of main canals, ditches, pipelines or flumes. The map scale must also be clearly identified on the application map. Failure to submit a map with requested information within 30 days may result in rejection of this application.

6. There appears to be existing water rights for Irrigation on some of the same lands requested under this application. Before any permit may be issued for this application the existing water rights may need to be cancelled or transferred. This will be determined based upon the revised application map.

Summary of Initial Determinations

The use of 5.0 acre-feet for INDUSTRIAL USE TO SUPPLY 150-UNIT COMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK, from stored water only released from the Galesville Reservoir under valid Douglas County Contract, may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract.

Because of the Departments determination, your application can be moved to the next phase of the water rights application review process. However, due to #5 and 6 above your application will likely be limited as summarized above.

Please reference the application number when sending any correspondence regarding the conclusions of this initial review. Comments received within the comment period, will be evaluated at the next phase of the process.

At this time, you must decide whether to proceed or to withdraw your application as described below.

Withdrawal Refunds:

If you choose not to proceed, you may withdraw your application and receive a refund (minus a \$50 processing charge per application.) To accomplish this you must notify the Department in writing by FEBRUARY 6, 1997. For your convenience you may use the enclosed "STOP PROCESSING" form.

To Proceed With Your Application:

If you choose to proceed with your application, you do not have to notify the Department. Your application will automatically be placed on the Department's Public Notice to allow others the opportunity to comment. After the comment period the Department will complete a public interest review and issue a proposed final order.

If A Permit Is Issued It Will Likely Include The Following Conditions:

- 1. Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:
 - A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
 - B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
 - C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.
- You may be required to install fish screens at the diversion to meet Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications for adequate protection of aquatic life.
- 3. The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract No. U&I 96-1 dated July 19, 1996 or a satisfactory replacement between the Douglas County and the applicant, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.
- 4. The priority date for this application is August 15, 1996.
- 5. In the event of a request for a change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or alteration of the appropriation facility associated with this authorized diversion, the quantity of water allowed herein, together with any other right, shall not exceed the capacity of the facility at the time of perfection of this right.

WARNING: This initial review does not attempt to address various public interest issues such as sensitive, threatened, or endangered fish species. These issues will be addressed as the Department reviews public comments and prepares a proposed final order. You should be aware that, if significant public interest issues are found to exist, such a finding could have an impact on the eventual outcome of your application.

OREGON WATER RESOUCES DEPARTMENT ADMINISTRATIVE RULES CHAPTER 690 DIVISION 516 UMPOUA BASIN PROGRAM

Classifications

690-516-001

- (1) The maximum economic development of this state, the attainment of the highest and best use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin, and the attainment of an integrated and coordinated program for the benefit of the state as a whole will be furthered through utilization of the aforementioned waters only for domestic, livestock, municipal, irrigation, temperature control, power development, industrial, mining, recreation, wildlife, fish life uses, and pollution abatement; and the waters of the Umpqua River Basin are hereby so classified with the following exceptions:
- (a) Preference shall be given to human consumption, livestock consumption and irrigation of non-commercial gardens not to exceed one-half acre in area for all the waters of the Umpqua River Basin over any other beneficial uses.
- (b) The waters of the natural lakes of the Umpqua River Basin are classified only for the utilization of water for domestic, livestock, power development not to exceed 7-1/2 theoretical horsepower, and in-lake uses for recreation, wildlife, and fish life purposes.
- (c) The waters of Roberts Creek and its tributaries were withdrawn by Water Resources Commission's Order of Withdrawal on October 4, 1991.
- (d) The unappropriated waters of Lookingglass Creek and tributaries are withdrawn from further appropriation except for domestic and livestock watering uses under 5,000 gallons per day per appropriation and water legally stored and released from storage from June 1 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated August 5, 1983.
- (e) The unappropriated waters of the South Umpqua River and tributaries, excluding Lookingglass and Roberts Creeks, are withdrawn from further appropriation except for human consumption, livestock consumption, irrigation of up to 1/2-acre non-commercial garden and water legally released from storage from July 15 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated April 29, 1985. This limitation shall not affect the withdrawals previously enacted by the Board for the waters of Roberts and Lookingglass Creeks.
- (2) Applications for the use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin shall not be accepted by any state agency for any purposes contrary to the classifications herein specified, and the granting of applications for such other purposes is declared to be prejudicial to the public interest, and the granting of applications for such other use would be contrary to this water-use program.

(3) Structures or works for utilization of the waters in accordance with the aforementioned classifications are also declared to be prejudicial to the public interest unless planned, constructed and operated in conformity with the applicable provisions of ORS 536.310; and any such structures or works which do not give cognizance to the multiplepurpose concept are further declared to be prejudicial to the public interest.

Minimum Perennial Streamflows

690-516-002

- (1) For the purpose of maintaining minimum perennial streamflows sufficient to support aquatic life, no appropriations of water except for human consumption, livestock consumption and irrigation of non-commercial gardens not to exceed one-half acre in area and waters legally released from storage shall be made or granted by any state agency or public corporation of the state for the waters of the following streams when flows are at or below the levels specified in Table 1.
- (2) The minimum perennial streamflows established by the October 24, 1958, Umpqua Basin program shall remain in effect over appropriations issued from October 24, 1958, to March 26, 1974.

Storage

690-516-003

All applications for appropriation of water for storage in structures impounding more than 3,000,000 gallons of water shall be reviewed by the Water Policy Review Board prior to approval. During the review, the Water Policy Review Board may establish additional minimum flows on the natural flow of the stream to support aquatic life or minimize pollution.

Out-of-Basin Appropriations

690-516-004

To support present and proposed Umpqua River Basin water resource development, no out-of-basin appropriation of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin shall be made or granted by any state agency or public corporation of the state without the prior approval of, and following a public hearing by, the Water Policy Review Board.

Water Quality

690-516-005

Rights to use of water granted by any state agency in accordance with this water-use program shall be issued only on the condition that any effluents or return flows from such uses shall not interfere with other beneficial uses of water.

NOTE: The Umpqua River Basin is delineated on State Water Resources Board Map 16.6, dated 1969, available from the Water Resources Department.



- (2) Basin programs are administrative rules which establish water management policies and objectives and which govern the appropriation and use of the surface and ground water within each of the respective basins. The rules classify surface and ground waters according to the uses which are permitted, may establish preferences among uses, may withdraw surface and ground waters from further appropriation, may reserve waters for specified future uses, and may establish minimum perennial streamflows. These rules are in addition to rules with statewide applicability which govern the allocation and use of water.

 - (c) Sandy Basin (Included in Division 502)

 - (h) Grand Ronde Basin (Division 508)
 - (i) Powder Basin (Division 509)
 - (j) Malheur Owyhee Basins (Division 510)
 - (k) Goose and Summer Lakes Basin (Division 513)
 - (1) Rogue Basin (Division 515)
 - (m) Umpqua Basin (Division 516)
 - (n) South Coast Basin (Division 517)
 - (o) Mid Coast Basin (Division 518)
 - (p) Columbia River (Division 519)

Definitions

- (8) "Pollution abatement use" means the use of water for pollution abatement or prevention water use as defined in OAR 690-11-010 and public uses related to pollution abatement as defined in OAR 690-77-010.
- (9) "Power or power development use" means the use of water for power development water use as defined in OAR 690-11-010.
- (10) "Recreation use" means the use of water for recreation water use as defined in OAR 690-11-010 and public uses related to recreation uses as defined in OAR 690-77-010.
- (11) "Wildlife use" means the use of water for wildlife use as defined in OAR 690-11-010 and public uses related to wildlife uses as defined in OAR 690-77-010.

COUNTY AND CUSTOMER AGREE:

1. TERM AND RENEWAL:

VATER RESOURCES DEPT.

- 1.1. The initial term of this contract shall begin of ALEM, OREGON , 19 96 and end on December 31, 2006, unless it is sooner terminated as provided herein.
- 1.2. As used in this contract, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, "term" or "term of this contract" shall mean both the initial term and any extension.
- 1.3. Customer shall have the right to extend the term of this contract for five successive periods of ten years each upon the following conditions:
 - 1.3.1. Approximately ninety days prior to expiration of the then current contract term, County shall notify Customer in writing that Customer has the right to extend the term at the price set pursuant to section 11.
 - 1.3.2. Customer may elect to extend the contract term by written notice to County within thirty days after County gives notice of the right to extend. Concurrently with written notice of extension Customer may request the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price of water in accordance with subsection 11.4.
 - 1.3.3. No other act or agreement shall be required of the parties to effect the extension after Customer gives proper notice of election to extend the contract term. Each extension shall take effect on January 1 after Customer gives notice of extension.
 - 1.3.4. Each extension shall commence on the day following the termination date of the initial term or the preceding extension.
- 1.4. The provisions of this contract shall apply to any extension except for changes in the purchase price pursuant to section 11; modifications required to comply with federal or state statutes, regulations, or administrative rules; or

modifications required to comply with any contract between SALEM, DAEGON and the United States concerning the Galesville Project.

1.5. Customer shall not be entitled to extend the term of this contract if Customer is in default under this contract at the time extension is requested by Customer.

2. AUTHORITY OF PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR:

- 2.1. The Director of the County Public Works Department (the Director) has authority to administer this contract on behalf of County.
- 2.2. The Director may delegate authority to administer this contract to the Manager of the County Public Works Department, Natural Resources Division, (the Division Manager), except for authority to establish the price of water under section 11 of this contract. The Director shall retain the right to supersede any decision of the Division Manager in the administration and interpretation of this contract.
- 2.3. References to the Director in this contract shall be deemed to include the Division Manager, to the extent the Director has delegated authority to the Division Manager.
- 3. WATER ALLOCATION: Each year during the term of this contract, County shall allocate 5 acre feet of storage capacity in the Galesville Reservoir for Customer.

4. PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES OF WATER RIGHTS:

- 4.1. County shall file and maintain any reservoir water right permit (County's permit) and certificate to store water in the Galesville reservoir (County's certificate) allocated for the Customer's use, as required by the State of Oregon Water Resources Department or its successor (the State).
- 4.2. Customer, at Customer's expense, shall be responsible for obtaining any permit (Customer's permit) and certificate of water rights (Customer's certificate) for use of the stored water allocated under this contract as required by the State.
- 4.3. Within 6 months after the effective date of this contract, Customer shall provide County with a copy of the application map provided to the State.

5. RELEASE OF WATER:

5.1. Subject to the provisions of this contract, County will release into the natural channel of Cow Creek water comprising the allocation described in section 3. Water released for Customer's allocation shall be measured and delivered to

- 5.2. County shall report to the State of Oregon all allocated water stored and distributed to Customer's point of diversion of record, including reasonable losses. Customer shall report all water use as described on Customer's water right of record to the County no later than November 30th each year and as may be required by the State.
- 5.3. The obligations of County to allocate capacity may be restricted by any lawful order, regulation, or ruling of any governmental agency or provisions of a contract between County and the United States. Such legal restrictions may impair the County's ability to perform its obligations under this contract. In that event, County shall be relieved of its obligations to the extent necessary to comply with the legal restrictions. Customer's payments under this contract shall be reduced proportionally to any reduction in Customer's allocation resulting from such legal restrictions.
- 5.4. Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, County may suspend release and delivery of water to Customer upon written notice to Customer if Customer fails to make any payment for such water when due.

6. DIVERSION AND USE OF WATER:

- 6.1. Customer shall be wholly responsible for taking, diverting, conveying and utilizing its water and shall bear all losses from Customer's point of diversion.
- 6.2. Customer shall divert the water it is entitled to receive under this contract in accordance with schedules developed by the Customer and County.
- 6.3. The water diverted by Customer may be measured by County at the point of diversion. The point of diversion shall be accessible for inspection and measurement of water at all reasonable times by County. Any easement necessary for County to gain access to the point of diversion shall be provided by Customer when requested by County.
- 6.4. The water shall be utilized for industrial-commercial uses. Customer shall utilize the water only for the uses and only on the real property described in Customer's permit and certificate.

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- 7. QUALITY OF WATER: County shall operate and maintain the Galesville dam, reservoir, and related facilities in a reasonable ACES DEPT. and prudent manner, and shall endeavor in good faith to take LEM, OREGON adequate measures to maintain the quality of raw stored water at the facilities. County is under no obligation to construct or furnish water treatment facilities to maintain or improve the quality of water. COUNTY MAKES NO WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED REGARDING THE QUALITY OF WATER RELEASED AND DELIVERED FROM GALESVILLE DAM, RESERVOIR, AND RELATED FACILITIES.
- 8. WATER SHORTAGES: In any year in which a water shortage in the Galesville reservoir occurs, County shall apportion the available water supply among Customer and other users who are entitled to receive water from the reservoir. The quantity of water to be furnished for irrigation shall first be reduced as necessary, but not greater than 15%. Any further reduction in the reservoir water supply shall be shared by Customer and all other users entitled to water from the reservoir in the same proportion that the entitlement of each user, including Customer's entitlement under this contract, bears to the total entitlements of all users.
- 9. WATER CONSERVATION: Customer acknowledges the critical need for water conservation in the Umpqua River basin. Customer shall implement reasonable and prudent water conservation measures for industrial activities.
- 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW: This contract will be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of Oregon. Each party shall perform its obligations in accordance with all applicable state, federal and local laws, rules and regulations now, or hereafter in effect.

11. PRICE OF WATER:

- 11.1. During the initial term, the price for the allocation stated in section 3 shall be \$ 350.00 per year.
- 11.2. For each discrete ten year extension of the contract term, Customer shall pay the then current rate as established by County in accordance with this section. Notice of the right to extend under subsection 1.3.1 shall state the price of water during the extension.
- 11.3. The Director shall periodically review and adjust the price for water taking into account the following factors:
 - 11.3.1. The current cost of operating and maintaining the Galesville dam, reservoir, and related facilities;
 - 11.3.2. The projected costs for operating,

maintaining, and replacing Galesville water storage and OHEGON

11.3.3. The price of water sold by similar facilities for similar uses.

- 11.4. Customer may request the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price of water established by the Director. Such request shall be in writing and shall be given with the notice of Customer's election to extend the contract term. After considering the factors listed in subsection 11.3, the Board of Commissioners may reduce or affirm the price established by the Director. If the Board of Commissioners fails to take any action on Customer's request to review and reduce the price of water within 30 days after Customer makes the request, the request shall be deemed denied. If Customer is not satisfied with the action of the Board of Commissioners, Customer may rescind Customer's election to extend the contract term and cancel the contract by written notice to County within sixty days after Customer requests the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price.

12. PAYMENT:

- 12.1. Customer shall pay County the annual price established by section 11 for the allocation stated in section 3 regardless of whether Customer uses any or all of the water allocated. Except as provided in subsection 12.2, payment shall be made no later than March 31 of each year.
- 12.2. If this contract is dated after March 2 in the year for which water is first to be released then the amount due for the first year only shall be payable within 30 days after the date the contract is signed by County.
- 12.3. Interest shall accrue on late payments at the rate of eighteen percent per annum commencing the day after the date payment is due. Customer shall pay all interest upon the request of County.

13. LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY:

- 13.1. County shall not be liable for damages or other expenses sustained by Customer resulting from shortages in the quantity of water available for release, or interruptions in water deliveries to Customer, if such shortages or interruptions in deliveries are caused partially or entirely by hostile diversion, accidental damage to County facilities, operational failure of County facilities, or any cause beyond County's control.
 - Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract,

13.3. In no event shall County be liable to Customer for any indirect, special, or consequential damages even if Customer previously advised County of the possibility of such damages.

14. DEFAULT:

- 14.1. There shall be a default under this contract if either party materially fails to comply with any provision of this contract within thirty days after the other party gives written notice specifying the breach. If the breach specified in the notice cannot be completely cured within the thirty day period, no default shall occur if the party receiving the notice begins curative action within the thirty day period and thereafter proceeds with reasonable diligence and in good faith to cure the breach as soon as practicable.
- 14.2 If a default occurs, the party injured by the default may elect to terminate this contract and pursue any equitable or legal rights and remedies available under Oregon law, except that Customer's remedies shall be subject to the limitations on damages stated in section 13.
- 14.3. Any litigation arising out of this contract shall be conducted in Circuit Court or District Court of the State of Oregon for Douglas County.
- 15. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of this contract is held to be invalid, that provision shall not affect any other provision of this contract. This contract shall be construed as if such invalid provision had never been included.
- 16. NO WAIVER: No provision of this contract shall be waived unless the waiver is written and signed by the party that waives its rights. Any waiver of a breach, whether express or implied, shall not constitute waiver of any other breach.
- 17. SUCCESSORS: The successors, assigns, and legal representatives of Customer and County shall be subject to all provisions of this contact. Customer shall not assign Customer's rights or obligations under this contract without prior written consent of County.

18. NOTICES:

18.1. Any notice required to be given under this contract shall be in writing and shall be given by personal delivery or

mail, except that any notice required by law shall be given in the manner specified in the applicable law.

 - 19. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This contract is the final and complete agreement of the parties and supersedes all prior and existing written or oral understandings. No modification of this contract shall be valid unless it is in writing and signed by the parties.





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

THIS IS NOT A PERMIT AND IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT NEXT PHASE OF PROCESS

This letter is to inform you of the potential limitations to your proposed use of water and to describe some of your options. Based on the information you have supplied, the Water Resources Department has reached the following conclusions:

Initial Review Determinations:

- 1. Your application is complete and not defective.
- 2. The proposed use is not prohibited by law or rule.
- 3. The use of water from South Umpqua River, tributary to Umpqua River, for INDUSTRIAL USE (COMMERCIAL USE) is limited to October 1 through April 14 by rule [OAR 690-516-001(1)(e)], the Umpqua Basin Program; however, use of water released from STORAGE, namely from Galesville Reservoir, for INDUSTRIAL USE (COMMERCIAL USE) may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract with Douglas County.
- 4. The use of 5.0 ACRE-FEET (AF) for INDUSTRIAL USE TO SUPPLY 150-UNIT COMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK, under a valid Douglas County Contract for stored water from the Galesville Reservoir, may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract.
- 5. The maps submitted to the Department with the application each appear to show different locations for the proposed point of diversion. A revised application map needs to be submitted to the Department. The revised map must clearly identify and show each of the required elements described in the enclosed Department Map Requirements. This includes identifying the coordinates, from a recognized public land survey corner, to the proposed point of diversion. The map must also show the location where

If applicable, the map must also show the location of main canals, ditches, pipelines or flumes. The map scale must also be clearly identified on the application map. Failure to submit a map with requested information within 30 days may result in rejection of this application.

6. There appears to be existing water rights for Irrigation on some of the same lands requested under this application. Before any permit may be issued for this application the existing water rights may need to be cancelled or transferred. This will be determined based upon the revised application map.

Summary of Initial Determinations

The use of 5.0 acre-feet for INDUSTRIAL USE TO SUPPLY 150-UNIT COMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK, from stored water only released from the Galesville Reservoir under valid Douglas County Contract, may be allowed year round, or as further limited by contract.

Because of the Departments determination, your application can be moved to the next phase of the water rights application review process. However, due to #5 and 6 above your application will likely be limited as summarized above.

Please reference the application number when sending any correspondence regarding the conclusions of this initial review. Comments received within the comment period, will be evaluated at the next phase of the process.

At this time, you must decide whether to proceed or to withdraw your application as described below.

Withdrawal Refunds:

If you choose not to proceed, you may withdraw your application and receive a refund (minus a \$50 processing charge per application.) To accomplish this you must notify the Department in writing by FEBRUARY 6, 1997. For your convenience you may use the enclosed "STOP PROCESSING" form.

To Proceed With Your Application:

If you choose to proceed with your application, you do not have to notify the Department. Your application will automatically be placed on the Department's Public Notice to allow others the opportunity to comment. After the comment period the Department will complete a public interest review and issue a proposed final order.

If A Permit Is Issued It Will Likely Include The Following Conditions:

- 1. Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:
 - A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
 - B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
 - C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.
- You may be required to install fish screens at the diversion to meet Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications for adequate protection of aquatic life.
- 3. The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract No. U&I 96-1 dated July 19, 1996 or a satisfactory replacement between the Douglas County and the applicant, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.
- The priority date for this application is August 15, 1996.
- 5. In the event of a request for a change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or alteration of the appropriation facility associated with this authorized diversion, the quantity of water allowed herein, together with any other right, shall not exceed the capacity of the facility at the time of perfection of this right.

WARNING: This initial review does not attempt to address various public interest issues such as sensitive, threatened, or endangered fish species. These issues will be addressed as the Department reviews public comments and prepares a proposed final order. You should be aware that, if significant public interest issues are found to exist, such a finding could have an impact on the eventual outcome of your application.

Classifications

690-516-001

- (1) The maximum economic development of this state, the attainment of the highest and best use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin, and the attainment of an integrated and coordinated program for the benefit of the state as a whole will be furthered through utilization of the aforementioned waters only for domestic, livestock, municipal, irrigation, temperature control, power development, industrial, mining, recreation, wildlife, fish life uses, and pollution abatement; and the waters of the Umpqua River Basin are hereby so classified with the following exceptions:
- (a) Preference shall be given to human consumption, livestock consumption and irrigation of non-commercial gardens not to exceed one-half acre in area for all the waters of the Umpqua River Basin over any other beneficial uses.
- (b) The waters of the natural lakes of the Umpqua River Basin are classified only for the utilization of water for domestic, livestock, power development not to exceed 7-1/2 theoretical horsepower, and in-lake uses for recreation, wildlife, and fish life purposes.
- (c) The waters of Roberts Creek and its tributaries were withdrawn by Water Resources Commission's Order of Withdrawal on October 4, 1991.
- (d) The unappropriated waters of Lookingglass Creek and tributaries are withdrawn from further appropriation except for domestic and livestock watering uses under 5,000 gallons per day per appropriation and water legally stored and released from storage from June 1 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated August 5, 1983.
- (e) The unappropriated waters of the South Umpqua River and tributaries, excluding Lookingglass and Roberts Creeks, are withdrawn from further appropriation except for human consumption, livestock consumption, irrigation of up to 1/2-acre non-commercial garden and water legally released from storage from July 15 through September 30 of each year, by the Water Policy Review Board's Order of Withdrawal dated April 29, 1985. This limitation shall not affect the withdrawals previously enacted by the Board for the waters of Roberts and Lookingglass Creeks.
- (2) Applications for the use of the waters of the Umpqua River Basin shall not be accepted by any state agency for any purposes contrary to the classifications herein specified, and the granting of applications for such other purposes is declared to be prejudicial to the public interest, and the granting of applications for such other use would be contrary to this water-use program.

1. TERM AND RENEWAL:

- 1.1. The initial term of this contract shall begin of ALEM, OREGON July 19 , 19 96 and end on December 31, 2006, unless it is sooner terminated as provided herein.
- 1.2. As used in this contract, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, "term" or "term of this contract" shall mean both the initial term and any extension.
- 1.3. Customer shall have the right to extend the term of this contract for five successive periods of ten years each upon the following conditions:
 - 1.3.1. Approximately ninety days prior to expiration of the then current contract term, County shall notify Customer in writing that Customer has the right to extend the term at the price set pursuant to section 11.
 - 1.3.2. Customer may elect to extend the contract term by written notice to County within thirty days after County gives notice of the right to extend. Concurrently with written notice of extension Customer may request the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price of water in accordance with subsection 11.4.
 - 1.3.3. No other act or agreement shall be required of the parties to effect the extension after Customer gives proper notice of election to extend the contract term. Each extension shall take effect on January 1 after Customer gives notice of extension.
 - 1.3.4. Each extension shall commence on the day following the termination date of the initial term or the preceding extension.
- 1.4. The provisions of this contract shall apply to any extension except for changes in the purchase price pursuant to section 11; modifications required to comply with federal or state statutes, regulations, or administrative rules; or

1.5. Customer shall not be entitled to extend the term of this contract if Customer is in default under this contract at the time extension is requested by Customer.

2. AUTHORITY OF PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR:

A ...

- 2.1. The Director of the County Public Works Department (the Director) has authority to administer this contract on behalf of County.
- 2.2. The Director may delegate authority to administer this contract to the Manager of the County Public Works Department, Natural Resources Division, (the Division Manager), except for authority to establish the price of water under section 11 of this contract. The Director shall retain the right to supersede any decision of the Division Manager in the administration and interpretation of this contract.
- 2.3: References to the Director in this contract shall be deemed to include the Division Manager, to the extent the Director has delegated authority to the Division Manager.
- 3. WATER ALLOCATION: Each year during the term of this contract, County shall allocate 5 acre feet of storage capacity in the Galesville Reservoir for Customer.

4. PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES OF WATER RIGHTS:

- 4.1. County shall file and maintain any reservoir water right permit (County's permit) and certificate to store water in the Galesville reservoir (County's certificate) allocated for the Customer's use, as required by the State of Oregon Water Resources Department or its successor (the State).
- 4.2. Customer, at Customer's expense, shall be responsible for obtaining any permit (Customer's permit) and certificate of water rights (Customer's certificate) for use of the stored water allocated under this contract as required by the State.
- 4.3. Within 6 months after the effective date of this contract, Customer shall provide County with a copy of the application map provided to the State.

5. RELEASE OF WATER:

5.1. Subject to the provisions of this contract, County will release into the natural channel of Cow Creek water comprising the allocation described in section 3. Water released for Customer's allocation shall be measured and delivered to

- 5.2. County shall report to the State of Oregon all allocated water stored and distributed to Customer's point of diversion of record, including reasonable losses. Customer shall report all water use as described on Customer's water right of record to the County no later than November 30th each year and as may be required by the State.
- 5.3. The obligations of County to allocate capacity may be restricted by any lawful order, regulation, or ruling of any governmental agency or provisions of a contract between County and the United States. Such legal restrictions may impair the County's ability to perform its obligations under this contract. In that event, County shall be relieved of its obligations to the extent necessary to comply with the legal restrictions. Customer's payments under this contract shall be reduced proportionally to any reduction in Customer's allocation resulting from such legal restrictions.
- 5.4. Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, County may suspend release and delivery of water to Customer upon written notice to Customer if Customer fails to make any payment for such water when due.

6. DIVERSION AND USE OF WATER:

- 6.1. Customer shall be wholly responsible for taking, diverting, conveying and utilizing its water and shall bear all losses from Customer's point of diversion.
- 6.2. Customer shall divert the water it is entitled to receive under this contract in accordance with schedules developed by the Customer and County.
- 6.3. The water diverted by Customer may be measured by County at the point of diversion. The point of diversion shall be accessible for inspection and measurement of water at all reasonable times by County. Any easement necessary for County to gain access to the point of diversion shall be provided by Customer when requested by County.
- 6.4. The water shall be utilized for industrial-commercial uses. Customer shall utilize the water only for the uses and only on the real property described in Customer's permit and certificate.

- 7. QUALITY OF WATER: County shall operate and maintain the Galesville dam, reservoir, and related facilities in a reasonable ACES DEP and prudent manner, and shall endeavor in good faith to take End OREGON adequate measures to maintain the quality of raw stored water at the facilities. County is under no obligation to construct or furnish water treatment facilities to maintain or improve the quality of water. COUNTY MAKES NO WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED REGARDING THE QUALITY OF WATER RELEASED AND DELIVERED FROM GALESVILLE DAM, RESERVOIR, AND RELATED FACILITIES.
- 8. WATER SHORTAGES: In any year in which a water shortage in the Galesville reservoir occurs, County shall apportion the available water supply among Customer and other users who are entitled to receive water from the reservoir. The quantity of water to be furnished for irrigation shall first be reduced as necessary, but not greater than 15%. Any further reduction in the reservoir water supply shall be shared by Customer and all other users entitled to water from the reservoir in the same proportion that the entitlement of each user, including Customer's entitlement under this contract, bears to the total entitlements of all users.
- 9. WATER CONSERVATION: Customer acknowledges the critical need for water conservation in the Umpqua River basin. Customer shall implement reasonable and prudent water conservation measures for industrial activities.
- 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW: This contract will be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of Oregon. Each party shall perform its obligations in accordance with all applicable state, federal and local laws, rules and regulations now, or hereafter in effect.

11. PRICE OF WATER:

- 11.1. During the initial term, the price for the allocation stated in section 3 shall be \$ 350.00 per year.
- 11.2. For each discrete ten year extension of the contract term, Customer shall pay the then current rate as established by County in accordance with this section. Notice of the right to extend under subsection 1.3.1 shall state the price of water during the extension.
- 11.3. The Director shall periodically review and adjust the price for water taking into account the following factors:
 - 11.3.1. The current cost of operating and maintaining the Galesville dam, reservoir, and related facilities;
 - 11.3.2. The projected costs for operating,

maintaining, and replacing Galesville water storage and OHCOMORCE (STORAGE OF COMMISSIONERS TO STORAGE OF COMMISSI

- 11.4. Customer may request the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price of water established by the Director. Such request shall be in writing and shall be given with the notice of Customer's election to extend the contract term. After considering the factors listed in subsection 11.3, the Board of Commissioners may reduce or affirm the price established by the Director. If the Board of Commissioners fails to take any action on Customer's request to review and reduce the price of water within 30 days after Customer makes the request, the request shall be deemed denied. If Customer is not satisfied with the action of the Board of Commissioners, Customer may rescind Customer's election to extend the contract term and cancel the contract by written notice to County within sixty days after Customer requests the Board of Commissioners to review and reduce the price.

12. PAYMENT:

- 12.1. Customer shall pay County the annual price . established by section 11 for the allocation stated in section 3 regardless of whether Customer uses any or all of the water allocated. Except as provided in subsection 12.2, payment shall be made no later than March 31 of each year.
- 12.2. If this contract is dated after March 2 in the year for which water is first to be released then the amount due for the first year only shall be payable within 30 days after the date the contract is signed by County.
- 12.3. Interest shall accrue on late payments at the rate of eighteen percent per annum commencing the day after the date payment is due. Customer shall pay all interest upon the request of County.

LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY:

- 13.1. County shall not be liable for damages or other expenses sustained by Customer resulting from shortages in the quantity of water available for release, or interruptions in water deliveries to Customer, if such shortages or interruptions in deliveries are caused partially or entirely by hostile diversion, accidental damage to County facilities, operational failure of County facilities, or any cause beyond County's control.
 - Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract,

County shall not be liable to Customer for damages caused by failure to comply with any obligation of County under this contract, if such failure results from lack of appropriation funds necessary to perform such obligation pursuant to ORS 294.305 et seq. (Local Budget Law).

13.3. In no event shall County be liable to Customer for any indirect, special, or consequential damages even if Customer previously advised County of the possibility of such damages.

14. DEFAULT:

- 14.1. There shall be a default under this contract if either party materially fails to comply with any provision of this contract within thirty days after the other party gives written notice specifying the breach. If the breach specified in the notice cannot be completely cured within the thirty day period, no default shall occur if the party receiving the notice begins curative action within the thirty day period and thereafter proceeds with reasonable diligence and in good faith to cure the breach as soon as practicable.
- 14.2 If a default occurs, the party injured by the default may elect to terminate this contract and pursue any equitable or legal rights and remedies available under Oregon law, except that Customer's remedies shall be subject to the limitations on damages stated in section 13.
- 14.3. Any litigation arising out of this contract shall be conducted in Circuit Court or District Court of the State of Oregon for Douglas County.
- 15. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of this contract is held to be invalid, that provision shall not affect any other provision of this contract. This contract shall be construed as if such invalid provision had never been included.
- 16. NO WAIVER: No provision of this contract shall be waived unless the waiver is written and signed by the party that waives its rights. Any waiver of a breach, whether express or implied, shall not constitute waiver of any other breach.
- 17. SUCCESSORS: The successors, assigns, and legal representatives of Customer and County shall be subject to all provisions of this contact. Customer shall not assign Customer's rights or obligations under this contract without prior written consent of County.

18. NOTICES:

18.1. Any notice required to be given under this contract shall be in writing and shall be given by personal delivery or

mail, except that any notice required by law shall be given in the manner specified in the applicable law.


