INFORMATION: Mr. Murray

SOURCE OF WATER: Weaver Creek, a tributary of the South Myrtle Creek.

DIVERSION POINT: The present diversion points are pump sites with electrical services. Site #1 serves the house site, while Point of Diversion (POD) #2 is used for the irrigation system

MOTOR AND PUMP #1: 1 Hp Sta-rite, single phase, 3450 RPM, direct drive to Sta-rite model JHE-63, 1.25" inlet x 0.75" outlet centrifugal pump.

MOTOR AND PUMP #2. 5 Hp A O Smith, single phase, 3500 RPM, direct drive to Sta-rite Model A3-J1, 2.5" inlet x 2" outlet centrifugal pump.

PIPE: There is buried 1" plastic pipe from POD #1 to the house. Three hundred and fifty feet of 2" plastic irrigation pipe and 600 feet of 3" aluminum pipe are used for irrigation.

SPRINKLERS: There are 15 sprinklers with 5/32" X 5/32" nozzles. The claimed usage is 10 sprinklers with the 5 hp system.

USES: Hay, pasture, lawn, and garden are irrigated from POD #2. The area of irrigation encompasses all that part of the land as shown on the final proof per permit #31775 that could be irrigated by gravity from the original ditch. The use of water from POD #1 is for domestic, including 1/2 acre lawn and garden

LIFT: The lift for both irrigation and domestic is 30 feet.

CALCULATION OF MAXIMUM WATER RATE: Given 10 sprinklers operating at 30 psi delivering a total of 76 gpm. Lift head = 30 feet. Residual head = 69.3 feet (30 psi). Friction loss through pipe estimated to be 30 feet. Total Dynamic Head (TDH) = 130 feet. Theoretical power requirement is 2.2 hp @ 76 gpm at 120 feet TDH. The efficiency (2.2 hp/5 hp= 44%) is realistic. This system will satisfy the allowable rate of 20.2 gpm for the 3.6 acres of the claim.

The domestic system will easily deliver 4.48 gpm since the claimed rate is about 20% of the irrigation system and the horse power available on the domestic system is 20% of the irrigation system.

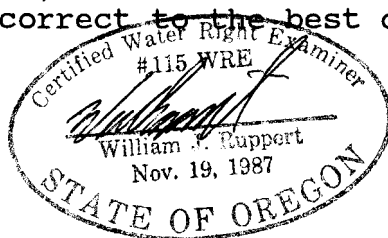

EVIDENCE AT THE ORIGINAL DIVERSION POINT: The record location for the original diversion point is taken from the appropriation notice by A. L. Ady, August 29, 1906, per Appropriation of Water, Book 1, pages 43 and 44 of Douglas County Clerk's Office (certified copy attached). The ditch is still quite evident at the original record diversion point although there is no remaining evidence of the diversion works. At the record diversion point, there is also a ditch on the east side of the creek from which water appears to have been flumed across the creek, East to West. The diversion point for the ditch on the east side of the creek would have been upstream from the record diversion point.

EVIDENCE OF DITCH: An old ditch is evident from the area of the record diversion point to the north end of the irrigated field. It is also visible for about 150 feet along the western edge of the irrigated field. Approximate ditch measurements were taken because this ditch varies and is in disrepair. The ditch is approximately 1 foot deep with a flat bottom about 1.5 feet wide. The slope is approximately 1 foot per 1000 feet.

SURVEY TIE: The survey is tied to features per final proof survey Permit #31775.

CERTIFICATION: By William J. Ruppert, Certified Water Right Examiner No. 115. The survey and inspection of the above use was completed by me on November 11, 1992, the facts contained in this report and the accompanying map are correct to the best of my knowledge.

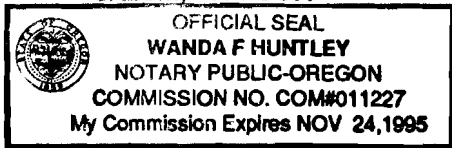

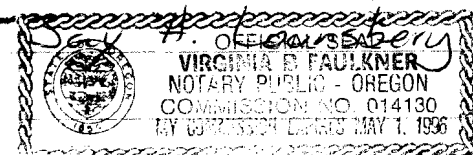
I am a 78 year old man who lived on the property next to the Murrays - I lived there for 42 years.

Notice is hereby given, that J. A. L. Addy, a citizen of the United States over the age of Twenty-one years, residing at Huggins, Douglas County, Oregon, do hereby appropriate 1000 runner inches of water of the stream known as Weaver Creek, said stream being located and running through Sections Nos. 4, 9, and 16 in Township No. 29 Range 3 West of Willamette Meridian in Douglas County Oregon, said water to be taken by a ditch from the point of diversion which said point is located as follows to wit forty five (45) rods east and six (6) rods north from the center of Section sixteen, and being in the aforesaid Township and range. 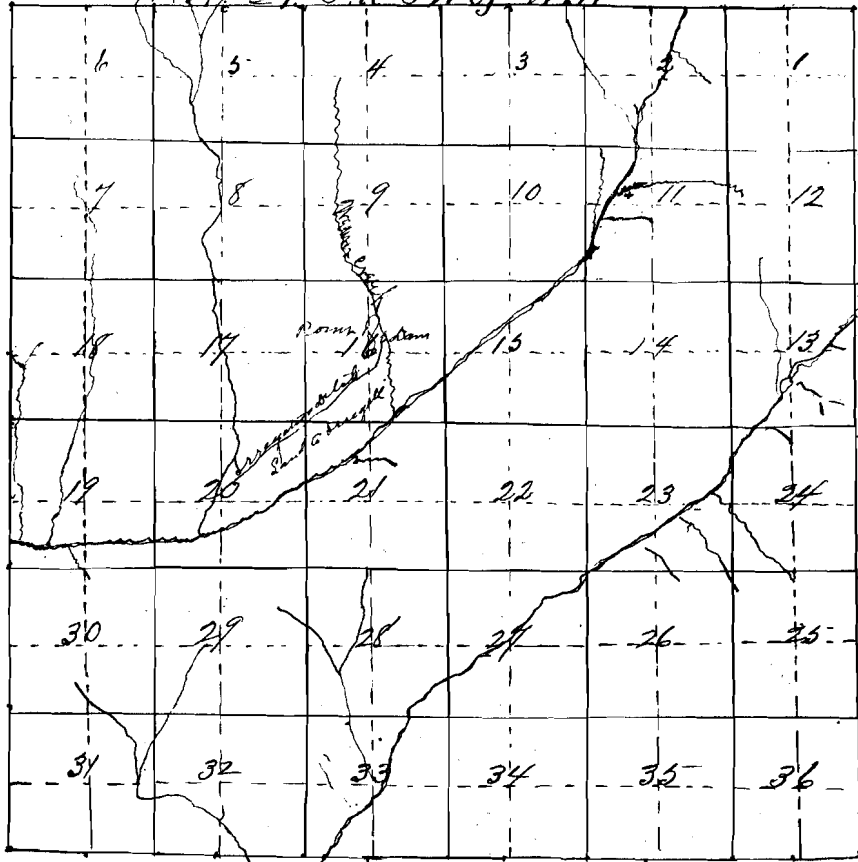

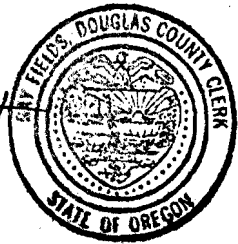

Dear Messrs. Brownson:

On behalf of Governor Barbara Roberts, thank you for your letter of July 22 regarding water rights in the Myrtle Creek area. Senator Mark Hatfield also forwarded your concerns to us. I am aware that Don Knauer, our department's Adjudications Specialist, responded to your letter to us in late July. However, I would like to offer a further explanation about the nature of pre-1909 water right claims which are awaiting adjudication and describe what is happening in your area.

Before 1909, Oregon law did not require a state-issued water right before individuals could make use of water. When a new water rights procedure was set up in 1909, it included provisions to recognize and honor water uses that had been established before 1909. As a result, these pre-1909 claims are viewed as existing rights, rather than mere applications. Only a state court, through the adjudication process, can decide whether these claims remain valid today.

For that reason, the Oregon Attorney General's office has advised our department that we may not regulate for or against pre-1909 claims. This means that we do not respond to calls for water from a claimant by shutting off junior water rights upstream (as you allege in your letter). Conversely, we do not shut off a claimant when calls for water are made downstream. I believe this position toward a pre-1909 claim of continuous water use appears fair while waiting until the local court determines the validity of the claim through the adjudication process.

In your situation, the watermaster is responding to a senior water right holder downstream of both your diversion and that of the claimant. The claimant is continuing to take the amount in his adjudication filing because the water is in the creek going through his property.

This situation may continue to occur in drought years until such time as the Umpqua Basin or South Myrtle Creek is adjudicated. At that time, the claimant's pre-1909 water right may be awarded. If the claim is finalized by the court at that time, a water right certificate will be issued and the holder then has the right to make a call on the water. I cannot give you an accurate forecast of when the adjudication for this basin will occur, but the current workload suggests that it will not be for several years.

It seems that Roy Anderson filed an application claiming water rights dated prior to 1909. However, as to this date we have seen no proof of this. He apparently is waiting for a legal process known as "adjudication proceeding". However in the interim of this court date, he has been granted full water rights and left the remainder of us with no water. Keeping in mind that this adjudication proceeding could be postponed for several years is a great concern to all of us.

Am I right to understand that this is the legal process? At this time there is no indication that he will be granted these rights by a court of law. It hardly seems fair that an awaiting "application" could have this much power.

Please give this matter your valuable attention as we feel that this situation is grossly unjust.

August 26, 1992 we attended a meeting by Water Resources people about the Pro 1909 Adjudication of water rights for the Uniguar Basin. We were given an application claim package, told what the fees would be and that we had to file before Dec. 31, 1992.

I spent many hours researching our place back to the Carson homestead 1889. But logs said water wasn't pumped up over a small hill in those days. So we didn't apply.

Now 8/28/94 most of the legal water right holders on South Myrtle Creek have been shut off. ^{7/14/94} Denied water use, except those who made claim application. The Douglas County water master says he's been instructed by Salem to supply these applicants even tho they have No Priority or Right. Because of back log it could be 6 to 8 years before they get to court. And letter writing is useless because theres more to this law or Bill than we were told.

It would appear there was a great deal of information withheld!

So if we had put up some \$, filled out some papers, mailed them before Dec. 1992. We'd have state enforced, unlimited water use for what could be several years and to hell with the legal water right holder be it 20, 30, 40 years priority.

What on earth is happening? Why would documented legal water right holders be denied, penalized, restricted for the benefit of a non-existent, possible water claim?

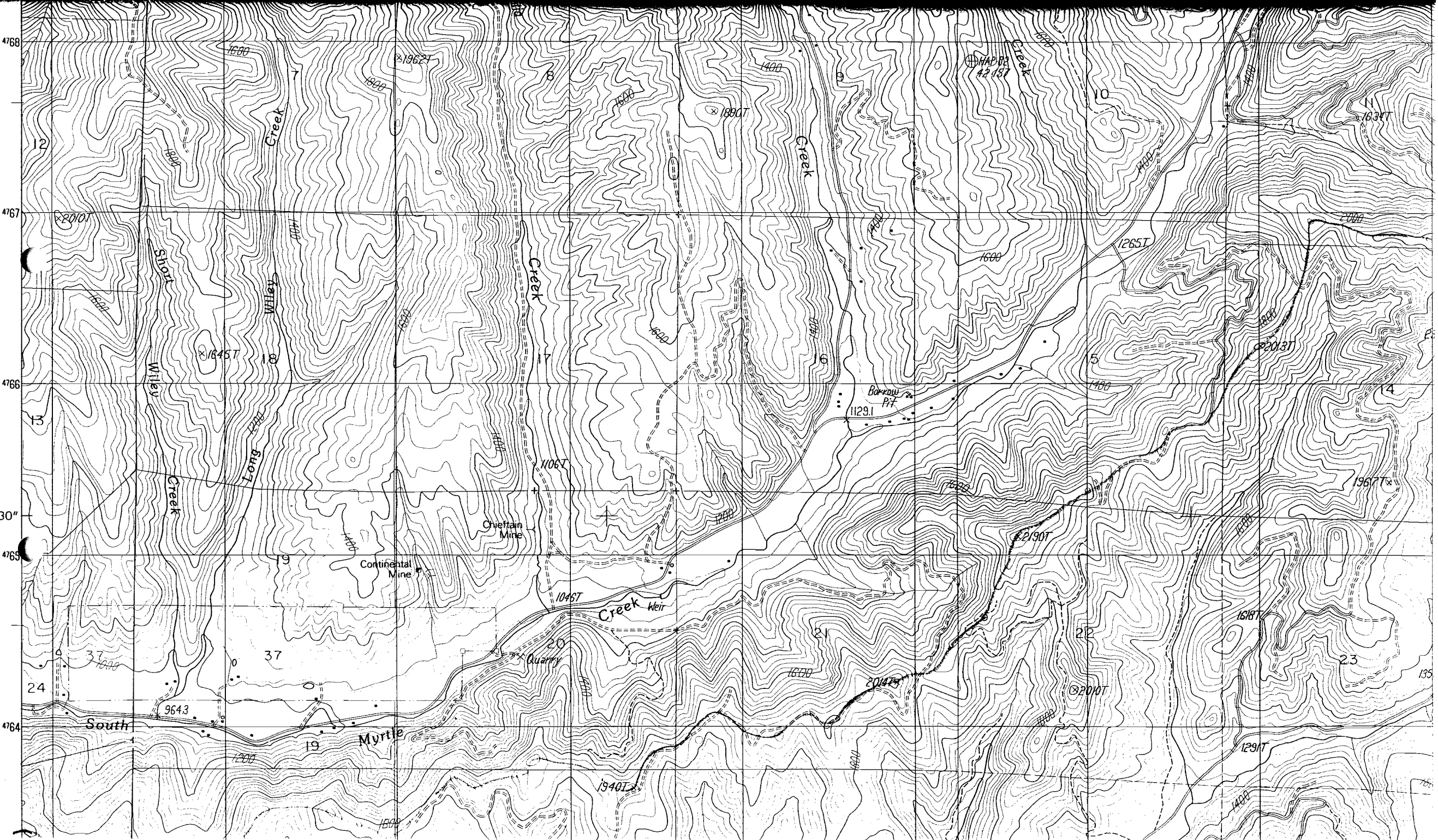


