Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Application History

Permit R-14883 was issued by the Department on October 7, 2010. The permit specified completion of construction by October 7, 2015, and complete application of water to beneficial use by, October 7, 2015. On September 16, 2021, Devin Cooper, member of Alldevale Properties, LLC submitted an Application for Extension of Time for Permit R-14883. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(2), on November 16, 2021, the Department issued a Proposed Final Order proposing to extend the time to complete construction from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024, and the time to apply water to full beneficial use from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024. The protest period closed December 31, 2021, in accordance with OAR 690-315-0060(1). No protest was filed.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Department adopts and incorporates by reference the findings in the Proposed Final Order dated November 16, 2021.

At time of issuance of the Proposed Final Order the Department concluded that, based on the factors demonstrated by the applicant, the permit may be extended subject to no additional conditions.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The applicant has demonstrated good cause for the permit extension pursuant to ORS 537.230, 539.010(5) and OAR 690-315-0040(2).

ORDER

The extension of time for Application R-87488, Permit R-14883, therefore, is approved. The deadline for completing construction is extended from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024. The deadline for applying water to full beneficial use within the terms and conditions of the permit is extended from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024.

Please read this Proposed Final Order in its entirety.

In summary, the Department proposes to:

- Grant an extension of time to complete construction of the water system from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024.
- Grant an extension of time to apply water to full beneficial use from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024.¹

This Extension of Time request is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 537.230 and 539.010(5), and Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 690, Division 315

¹ Pursuant to ORS 537.230(5), upon the completion of beneficial use of water allowed under the permit, the permit holder shall hire a certified water rights examiner to survey the appropriation. Within one year after the complete application of water to a beneficial use (or by the date allowed for the complete application of water to a beneficial use), the permit holder shall submit a map of the survey and the claim of beneficial use.

AUTHORITY

Generally, see ORS 537.230 and OAR Chapter 690 Division 315.

ORS 537.230(2) provides in pertinent part that the Oregon Water Resources Department (Department) may, for good cause shown, order an extension of time within which irrigation or other works shall be completed or the right perfected. In determining the extension, the Department shall give due weight to the considerations described under ORS 539.010(5) and to whether other governmental requirements relating to the project have significantly delayed completion of construction or perfection of the right.

ORS 539.010(5) instructs the Director to consider: the cost of the appropriation and application of the water to a beneficial purpose; the good faith of the appropriator; the market for water or power to be supplied; the present demands therefor; and the income or use that may be required to provide fair and reasonable returns upon the investment.

OAR 690-315-0040 provides that in order to approve an application for an extension of time to complete construction or apply water to full beneficial use, the Department shall make the findings in OAR 690-315-0040(1) including a finding that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. OAR 690-315-0040(2)-(4) contains the factors that the Department must consider to make findings that support a "good cause" determination.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- On October 7, 2010, Permit R-14883 was issued by the Department. The permit authorizes the storage of up to 13.0 AF of water in Betty's Reservoir from an unnamed stream, tributary to Rock Creek, for multiple purpose. The permit specified construction shall be completed, and the permitted annual volume of water shall be stored within five years of the date of permit issuance, being October 7, 2015.
- On September 16, 2021, Devin Cooper, member of Alldevale Properties, LLC, submitted an "Application for Extension of Time" (Application) to the Department, requesting the time to complete construction and the time to apply water to full beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit R-14883 be extended from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024. This is the first permit extension requested for Permit R-14883.
- On October 12, 2021, notification of the Application for Permit R-14883 was published in the Department's Public Notice. No public comments were received.

Review Criteria [OAR 690-315-0040]

In order to approve an Application for an Extension of Time to complete construction and/or apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to ORS 537.230 or 537.630, or to begin construction, pursuant to ORS 537.248, the Department must make the findings in OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a) – (d).

Complete Extension of Time Application [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a)]

 On September 16, 2021, the Department received a completed Application and the fee specified in ORS 536.050 from the permit holder.

Start of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and 690-315-0040(5)]

5. Construction of the water system or reservoir began prior to permit issuance. The permit holder states, construction began prior to the issuance of Permit R-14883, with the excavation of the downstream side of the reservoir and construction of the cut-off trench.

Based on Findings of Fact (FOF) 5, the Department has determined the permit holder began construction prior to October 7, 2015.

Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department must find that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. In making a "good cause" finding, the Department shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

In order to make a finding of "good cause" to approve the extension, the Department shall consider whether the applicant has demonstrated "reasonable diligence" in previous performance under the permit. OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a). In determining "reasonable diligence", the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors: a) The amount of construction completed within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension; b) The amount of beneficial use made of the water during the permit or previous extension time limits; c) Water right holder conformance with the permit or previous extension conditions; and d) Financial investments made toward developing the beneficial use of water.

Amount of Construction [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(a)]

The amount of construction completed within the time allowed in the permit or previous extension.²

6. Construction of the reservoir began prior to October 7, 2015.

² "Actual Construction" is defined in OAR 690-315-0020(3)(d)(A)and(B) as physical work performed toward completion of the water system which demonstrates the water right permit holder's good faith and intention to complete the project with reasonable diligence. Actual construction does not include planning a diversion system, formulating a business plan, securing financing, letting contracts, purchasing but not installing equipment, surveying, clearing land or planting crops.

 During the original development time frame under Permit R-14883, construction of the dam was completed, and the required staff plate was installed.

The Application provides evidence that progress of physical work, enough to qualify as the minimum necessary, has been made towards completion of the water system for the Department to find good cause and reasonable diligence towards complete application of water to a beneficial use.

Compliance with Conditions [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(c)]

The water right permit holder's conformance with the permit or previous extension conditions.

8. The Department has considered the permit holder's compliance with conditions, and has identified the following concern, the record does not show that the outlet pipe has not been installed in the dam.

Based on FOF 8, the Department has determined that the permit holder has not demonstrated compliance with following permit conditions as required by Permit R-14883:

• "The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe (with a minimum diameter of 8" for any in-channel reservoir).

In order to legally perfect the use of water under this permit, the permit holder must demonstrate that all conditions of the permit have been satisfied.

Beneficial Use of Water [OAR 690-315-0040(3)(b)]

The amount of beneficial use made of the water during the permit time limits or previous extension time limits.

 A maximum volume of 9.5 AF of water has been stored from the unnamed stream, tributary to Rock Creek in Betty's Reservoir.

The Department has determined that beneficial use of water, in compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit, has not yet been demonstrated under this permit because not all permit conditions were satisfied by October 7, 2015.

<u>Financial Investments to appropriate and Apply Water to a Beneficial Purpose [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(b),(3)(d),(4)(d)]</u>

10. The permit holder has invested approximately \$120,260, which is about 71 percent of the total projected cost for complete development of this project. The permit holder anticipates an additional \$50,000 investment is needed for the completion of this project.

Based on FOF 10, the Department has determined that the permit holder had made an investment, which provides evidence of good cause and reasonable diligence towards the complete application of water to a beneficial use.

Reasonable Diligence of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(a)]

The Application provides evidence of progress towards completion of the water system; a financial investment has been made; the permit holder has not demonstrated compliance with all permit conditions, and; beneficial use has not been demonstrated. The Department has determined the applicant has demonstrated the minimum necessary for the Department to find reasonable diligence towards complete application of water to a beneficial use.

The Market and Present Demands for Water [OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f)]

The Department's determinations of market and present demand for water or power to be supplied shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a-f). In accordance with OAR 690-315-0040(4), the Department shall consider, but is not limited to, the following factors when determining the market and the present demand for water or power to be supplied:

- (a) The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows;
- (b) Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d);
- (c) The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife;
- (d) Economic investment in the project to date;
- (e) Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project; and
- (f) Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demands for water and power.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(a)

The amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows.

- 11. A review of the amount of water available to satisfy other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows was determined at the time of issuance of Permit R-14883; furthermore, water availability for other affected water rights and scenic waterway flows after the permit was issued is determined when an application for a new water right is submitted.
- Current Water Availability Analysis for the Pudding River, (Tributary of Molalla River) above Mill Creek (watershed ID 151) show that no water is available during the months of July, August, September, and October at the 50% exceedance level.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(b)

Special water use designations established since permit issuance, including but not limited to state scenic waterways, federal wild and scenic rivers, serious water management problem areas or water quality limited sources established under 33 U.S.C. 1313(d).

- The point of diversion is located on unnamed stream, tributary to Rock Creek, and is located within a Withdrawn Area.
- 14. Rock Creek is not located within or above a/the state or federal scenic waterway.
- 15. The point of diversion is not in a location listed by the Department of Environmental Quality as a water quality limited stream.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(c)

The habitat needs of sensitive, threatened or endangered species, in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

16. Rock Creek is located within an area ranked "high" for stream flow restoration needs as determined by the Department in consultation with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and is located within a Sensitive, Threatened or Endangered Fish Species Area as identified by the Department in consultation with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(d)

Economic interests dependent on completion of the project.

17. An approximate total of \$120,260 has been invested in the project.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(e)

Other economic interests dependent on completion of the project.

18. Other economic interests dependent on the completion of the project have been identified. Fifteen employees at Willamette Nurseries, and an additional 40 seasonal employees rely on the employment provided by the use of the water stored under this permit.

OAR 690-315-0040(4)(f)

Other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power.

 No other factors relevant to the determination of the market and present demand for water and power have been identified.

Fair Return Upon Investment [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(f)]

20. The use and income from the permitted water development will likely result in reasonable returns upon the investment made to date.

Other Governmental Requirements [OAR 690-315-0042(2)(g)]

21. Delay in the development of this project that was caused by other governmental requirements have not been identified.

Unforeseen Events [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(h)]

22. Unforeseen events extended the length of time needed to fully develop and perfect Permit R-14883, in that the fine-grained soils required longer than expected to dry out, delaying the construction of the reservoir.

Denial of an Extension Would Result in Undue Hardship [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(i)]

23. The water authorized for storage under this permit is the source for Permit S-54836.

Good Faith of the Appropriator [OAR 690-315-0040(2)(c)]

24. The Application provides evidence of good faith of the appropriator under Permit R-14883.

Based on FOF 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, and 17, the Department has determined that the applicant has shown good faith and reasonable diligence.

Duration of Extension [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c)]

Under OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c), in order to approve an extension of time for water use permits the Department must find that the time requested is reasonable and the applicant can complete the project within the time requested.

25. As of September 16, 2021, the permit holder states the remaining work to be completed consists of completing construction of the water system and applying water to full beneficial use.

Given the amount of development left to occur, the Department has determined that the permit holder's request to have until October 1, 2024, to complete construction of the reservoir and to accomplish the application of water to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of Permit R-14883 is both reasonable and necessary.

Good Cause [OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d)]

The Department must find that there is "good cause" to approve the extension. In making a "good cause" finding, the Department shall consider the requirements set forth under OAR 690-315-0040(2).

The Department has considered the reasonable diligence and good faith of the appropriator, the cost to appropriate and apply water to a beneficial purpose, the market and present demands for water to be supplied, the financial investment made and fair and reasonable return upon the investment, the requirements of other governmental agencies, and unforeseen events over which the permit holder had no control, whether denial of the extension will result in undue hardship to the applicant and whether there are no other reasonable alternatives for meeting water use needs, any other factors relevant to a determination of good cause, and has determined that the applicant has shown that good cause exists for an extension of time to complete construction and apply water to full beneficial use pursuant to OAR 690-315-0040(1)(d).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Applicant has submitted a complete extension application form and the fee specified in ORS 536.050, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(a).
- The Applicant complied with construction timeline requirements to begin construction as required by ORS 537.230, OAR 690-315-0040(1)(b) and OAR 690-315-0040(5).
- Based on Finding of Facts 5, through 24, completion of construction and full application of water to beneficial use can be accomplished by October 1, 2024³, as required by OAR 690-315-0040(1)(c).
- The Applicant can complete the project within the time period requested for the extension on the project.
- 5. The Applicant has demonstrated good cause for the extension.

³Pursuant to ORS 537.230(5), upon the completion of beneficial use of water allowed under the permit, the permittee shall hire a certified water rights examiner to survey the appropriation. Within one year after the complete application of water to a beneficial use (or by the date allowed for the complete application of water to a beneficial use), the permittee shall submit a map of the survey and a new or revised claim of beneficial use as deemed appropriate by the Department.

PROPOSED ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Department proposes to issue an order to:

Extend the time to complete construction of the water system under Permit R-14883 from October 7, 2010, to October 1, 2024.

Extend the time to apply water to beneficial use under Permit R-14883 from October 7, 2015, to October 1, 2024.

In the interim, we have a 15-hp pump that can be used to pass live flow.

The extension to 2024 is intended to provide time to meet any new conditions contained in a time-extension order. In addition, this time span is requested in case precipitation is limited in 2022 and/or 2023 and we are unable to store the full volume of water authorized by the permit.

We have a secondary use permit to use the stored water for nursery uses (Application S-87905, Permit S-54836). If the time extension is not authorized, we will lack water for a critical part of our nursery operations.

(Explain in detail, consider other potential sources of water, and describe their feasibility) NO. There are no other sources available to irrigate the 24.1 acres authorized by Permit S-54836 (Application S-87905) other than this reservoir and another small reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-14882 (Application R-87487). Groundwater is not available in the area for irrigation and there are no municipal systems or irrigation districts serving the area.

This process delayed us for more than a year because the soils could only be excavated in late summer and then incorporated into the dam in 2012.

In addition, there have been financial limitations. We have been concurrently conducting work under three other permits: Permit R-14882 (Application R87487), Permit S-54836 (Application S-87905) and Permit G-17412 (Application G-17680), which went through a protest and settlement agreement. There also have been difficulties in constructing the reservoir authorized by Permit R-14882 (Application R-87487) as described below.

We missed the condition requiring the installation of the outlet pipe and had believed the spillway was adequate for passing live flow. We will be installing the outlet pipe in the dam as soon as possible, but this will be weather dependent.

The delay in completing construction of the reservoir authorized by this permit was also related in part to completion of a separate reservoir authorized by Permit R-14882 (Application R-87487). The final design for transferring water from the two reservoirs to the irrigation authorized under Permit S-54836 (Application S-87905) was contingent on completion of both reservoirs. A pumping system dedicated to Permit R-14883 (Application R-87488) has now been installed.

The pandemic in 2020 and 2021 affected our operations. We had a number of employees out sick due to COVID at times. The general economic slowdown and our focus on the COVID workplace health and safety requirements delayed filing this time extension application.

(*Explain in detail*) The income from the water will ensure the ability to grow crops on the entire acreage. With an additional 13 acre-ft of water roughly 4 acres of nursery stock can be produced. One acre of nursery production will generate gross sales of between \$60,000-\$120,000. Using an average of \$90,000 gross sales per acre and a profit margin of 20%, the gross profit per acre would be \$18,000 per acre. Four acres of increased production would result in \$72,000 of additional gross profit. With the total project costing approximately \$170,000 the payback period would be 3 years.

Willamette Nurseries provides employment for 15 people year-round with benefits including health insurance. In addition, we employ approximately 40 people seasonally for 8 months of the year. All of these employees depend on Willamette Nurseries for their livelihoods. Many of them, both seasonal and full-time employees, have worked at Willamette Nurseries for over 20 years and have valuable knowledge about our operations.

During a site visit on September 16, 2010, I inspected the existing reservoir and dam structure associated with Permit #1424 (Certificate #22820) on the unnamed tributary to Rock Creek for the need to provide fish passage and diversion screening. ODFW determined that native migratory fish were not currently nor were historically present in the unnamed tributary at or immediately below the existing reservoirs associated with both applications (R-87487 & R-87488). Therefore, ODFW does not require fish passage or diversion screening for use of the water from either reservoir.



I am writing this letter in reference to Water Right Application #R-87487 & R-87488 in the name of Alldevale Properties, LLC. During a site visit on September 16, 2010, I inspected the existing reservoir and dam structure associated with Permit #1424 (Certificate #22820) on the unnamed tributary to Rock Creek for the need to provide fish passage and diversion screening. ODFW determined that native migratory fish were not currently nor were historically present in the unnamed tributary at or immediately below the existing reservoirs associated with both applications (R-87487 & R-87488). Therefore, ODFW does not require fish passage or diversion screening for use of the water from either reservoir.

Findings of Fact

 On JUNE 30, 2009, ALLDEVALE PROPERTIES LLC submitted an application for a permit to store water pursuant to ORS 537.409:

Storage Capacity: 13.0 ACRE FEET Dam Height: LESS THAN 10 FEET Source: UNNAMED STEAM, TRIBUTARY TO ROCK CREEK Location: CLACKAMAS COUNTY IN SECTION 18, TOWNSHIP 5S, RANGE 1E, W.M.

- 2. The required examination fees were paid and minimum application requirements were met.
- The Department provided public notice of the application in the Department's weekly public notice on July 14, 2009. A 60-day comment period followed.
- The Department has not received public comment related to the possible issuance of the attached draft permit.
- The Department has determined that the proposed source has not been withdrawn from further appropriation.

APPEAL RIGHTS

Appeal to a circuit court: This is a final order in other than a contested case. Any party affected by a final order in other than a contested case issued by the Water Resources Commission or Water Resources Department may appeal the order to the appropriate circuit court (ORS 536.075). A petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484 (2).

Petition to the Department for Reconsideration of the Final Order: A person entitled to judicial review of this order may also file a petition for the Department's reconsideration of the order. The petition for reconsideration must be filed with the Department within 60 calendar days after the date of the order. A copy of the petition must also be delivered or mailed to all other persons and agencies requiring notification under statute or rule (OAR 137-004-0080). The petition must set forth the specific grounds for reconsideration, and may be supported by a written argument. The petition may include a request for a stay of the order if the petition complies with the requirements of OAR 137-003-0090 (2). The Department may grant or deny the petition by summary order. If the Department takes no action, the petition is deemed denied as provided by ORS 183.484 (2). A final order remains in effect during reconsideration until stayed or changed. Following reconsideration, the agency must enter a new order, which may be an order affirming the existing order (OAR 137-004-0080). Reconsideration cannot be granted after the filing of a petition for judicial review, unless permitted by the court (OAR 137-004-0080 (6)).

ORS 537.409 does not provide an opportunity to request a contested-case hearing. Appeal rights on this final order approving the application are limited to the above procedures.

- 6. The proposed reservoir is not prohibited under ORS 390.835.
- Water is available for the proposed use according to the Department's water-availability model and the watermaster's assessment.
- Because water is available, the Department finds that existing water rights would not be injured by the proposed use.
- Based upon a review by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Department has determined that, as conditioned, the proposed use will not pose a significant detrimental impact to existing fishery resources.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. Water is available for the proposed use.
- 2. The proposed use will not injure existing water rights.
- 3. The proposed use will not pose a significant detrimental impact to existing fishery resources.
- 4. Application R-87488 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.409.

Now Therefore, it is Ordered:

Application R-87488 is approved. Upon payment of the permit recording fee of \$400, a permit shall be issued authorizing the proposed water use. Failure to meet this requirement within 60 days from the date of this Final Order may result in the proposed rejection of the application.

If you need to request additional time, your written request should be received in the Salem office of the Department within 60 days of this Final Order. The Department will evaluate the request and determine whether or not the request may be approved.

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, a staff gage that measures the entire range between full reservoir level and dead-pool level must be installed in the reservoir. The staff gage shall be United States Geological Survey style porcelain enamel iron staff gage style A, C, E or I.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the devices; provided however, where any device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe (with a minimum diameter of 8" for any in-channel reservoir). This requirement may be waived if the Department determines other means have been provided to evacuate water when necessary.

The permittee shall pass all live flow outside the storage season described above.

The Director may require the user to measure inflow and outflow, above and below the reservoir respectively, to ensure that live flow is not impeded outside the storage season. Measurement devices and their implementation must be acceptable to the Director, and the Director may require that data be recorded on a specified periodic basis and reported to the Department annually or more frequently.

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish, unless the permittee has requested and been granted a fish passage waiver by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission. The permittee is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, before beginning construction of any inchannel obstruction.

Notwithstanding that ODFW has made a determination that fish screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary at the time of permit issuance, the permittee may be required in the future to install, maintain, and operate fish-screening and by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion, and to provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

This permit allows an annual appropriation (not to exceed the specified volume). This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for out-of-reservoir uses, the maintenance of the water level or maintaining a suitable freshwater condition. If any water is to be used for out-of-reservoir purposes, a secondary water right is required. If any additional live flow is to be appropriated to maintain either the water level or a suitable freshwater condition, an additional water right is required.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

- 1. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
- 2. This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
- 3. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
- The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
- 5. If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with ODFW's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR 635-415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR Chapter 635, Division 415, shall be followed.
- The use may be restricted if the quality of downstream waters decreases to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

- 7. If the volume of the completed reservoir is 9.2 acre feet or more and a dam is used to impound the water, the height of the dam shall be less than 10.0 feet.
- Construction shall be completed and up to the permitted annual volume of water shall be stored within five years of the date of permit issuance.
- 9. Within one year after storage of water, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use to the Oregon Water Resources Department.
- 10. The claim of beneficial use shall be prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner in conformance with the requirements of OAR 690-014 if an associated secondary permit exists for the use of stored water under this permit, or if the reservoir capacity is equal to or greater than 9.2 acre-feet.
- 11. If no secondary permit exists and the reservoir capacity is less than 9.2 acre-feet of water, the claim of beneficial use need not be prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner. The information submitted to the Oregon Water Resources Department shall include:
 - a. the dimensions of the reservoir;
 - b. the maximum capacity of the reservoir in acre-feet; and
 - c. a map identifying the location of the reservoir prepared in compliance with Departmental standards.

Investigations made August 2, 1951, by a representative of the State Engineer indicate that there is not sufficient water flowing in the stream in question and its tributaries, during the irrigation season, to satisfy existing rights, and it appears that the approval of any more applications proposing use of the <u>direct</u> flow of this stream or its tributaries would conflict with existing rights.
