

A STATE COLUMN TO THE STATE OF THE STATE OF

Gentlemen:

I am in receipt of yours of the 17th., with reference to answering question 13 in your proof of appropriation under permit Inasmuch as "Beneficial use is the basis, the measure and the limit of water rights in this State", it would seem that you could not make proof under the law and procure a water right certificate for more water than the amount that has been actually put to heneficial use. You will understand, however, that the limitation placed upon your right will be for a continuous flow of water, and in view of the fact that the water will probably not be used continuously, a luch larger amount could be used for a shorter period of time in cases of emergency: or in other words, to follow the practice similar to that of irrigators who, in order to obtain a larger head of water, use a much greater volume than that to which they are entitled for a correspondingly shorter period of time. Therefore, I think that if you will make proof on the amount of water that has actually been used, say 2 or 3 second feet, you will be able to secure an ample supply of water at all times. and even to release water to the full capacity of your pipe line at various times, without exceeding the limitations of your water right certificate.

However, I notice by your permit that your water right covers, at least in part, uses for municipal supply. If such is the case, I believe you could make proof under this permit, if you so desire for a larger amount of water than that which has been used up to this time, as under the law, cities and towns are given considerable latitude in acquiring water rights, in order that provision may be made for growth of population and cases of emergency. The Section of the law to which I refer is Chapter 279, Session Laws of Oregon for 1913. I am of the opinion that if the water is used for municipal purposes you could secure, under this law, a right to the full extent of your permit.

As mentioned to you before, a personal inspection of the works must be made by the Board's Engineer before the final water right certificate can be issued, on all appropriations of more than 3 second feet. If, however, the issuance of the certificate is delayed on this account your right would not be jeopardized in any way.

Gentlemen:

We have received your letter of March 6th, enclosing proff of appropriation of water under reservoir permit #408, and also return proof under your permit #1740 for further information.

SACRET SALES OF BUILDING

Under application 3151 - permit 1740, we applied for an appropriation for $7\frac{1}{2}$ second feet for the water of Ferry Creek. It was our intention, at that time to complete the reservoir in substantially the form and size in which it now is. Our pipe line was designed for a capacity of $7\frac{1}{2}$ second feet. This is far more than the average flow of Ferry Creek. In factoit closely approaches the flood flow of this stream. We have gauge readings from which we can determine the average flow of Ferry Creek, but we figure the same to be about three quarters of a second foot throughout the year. Our pipe line was designed in its present size to handle any rush needs in case of fire, etc. We figured with our storage and the flow of the creek, it would be well to apply for an appropriation covering this amount.

Our average actual usage has never been gauged. In town and manufacturing plant, however, we are using approximately 250,000 gallons for 24 hours, or about one-third of a second foot Emergencies might arise, however, at any time when we would require the full flow and as we add to our manufacturing plant, we are likely to increase the amount of water used, to possibly three or four times this amount. Thus, in answering question #13 in the proof of appropriation, we feel that we are justified in stating that we are using the full amount of the water applied for.

In passing we may say that we own all of the land covered by this reservoir and stream, save about 60 acres on the extreme upper reaches of the creek.
