Nathan,

Sorry for the delayed response.

I have talked this permit over with Jonnine. Below are my comments and responses to your questions:

If the Manor does not intend to claim reservoir 3 (0.2 acre feet), please reference this in the variations section of the Claim. Based on your description, it sounds they have abandoned the reservoir.

Based on your description, it sounds like the Manor utilizes reservoirs 1 (6.1 acre feet) and 2 (2.6 acre feet) for aesthetics under this permit as well as using the reservoirs as a component (bulge) of their delivery system for their irrigation system. This is not a problem as long as the storage in the reservoirs does not exceed the volumes authorized by the permit outside of the irrigation season. If the volume rises above the capacity of the individual reservoirs, that water would the water they are bulging. The Watermaster would be the best person to talk with to confirm the limits for using a bulge.

As for moving forward, if the water was timely stored and the conditions were timely met, you can certainly move forward with the Claim.

I plan to be available tomorrow (Wednesday) if you have any items that you would like to discuss further.



Dear Permit Holder:

This letter is in regard to your water use permit as referenced above. Your permit required you to complete the development of your water use by October 1, 1999.

In order for the Department to consider issuance of a certificate of water right, you are required by law to hire a certified water right examiner to prepare and submit a claim of beneficial use that includes a final proof survey map of the development. The map and claim of beneficial use were to have been submitted to our Department within one year of October 1, 1999. The fee for submitting a claim of beneficial use is \$230.00. Please see the enclosed 'Resource Sheet' for our current database of CWRE's.

If you are not finished with the development of your permit, you need to file an application for an extension of time to complete your development. The fee for filing an extension of time is \$780.00. Please see the enclosed 'Resource Sheet' to access the extension of time form.

In the event that you are no longer using water as allowed by this permit, you should cancel it so that we may clear our records. Please see the enclosed 'Resource Sheet' to access the cancellation form, if you are interested in this option.

If you have not submitted either a Claim of Beneficial Use or a request for an extension of time for your permit within 60 days of the date of this letter (March 1, 2024) the Department may issue a Final Order to cancel your permit without further notice. If the Department issues a Final Order to cancel your permit, and you request reconsideration of the final order and reinstatement of your permit, there is a \$610.00 reinstatement fee that is charged in addition to the claim of beneficial use or extension of time fee.

Application for Permit Extension of Time

An Extension of Time is a process in which the Department can approve additional time for a permit holder to perfect the beneficial use of water as authorized by the permit. An Extension of Time may be approved if the permit holder has demonstrated reasonable diligence in developing the beneficial use of water as authorized under the permit and the Department can find good cause to do so. Bach Application is reviewed on a case-by-case basis. An Extension of Time may provide the ability for a permit holder to extend their completion of construction date (B-date) and complete application of water date (C-date).

Assignments

Requirements for Small Pump Screens

In accordance with ORS 469.371,498.248, and other rules, pump screens must be installed on all pumps where the possibility of game fish ingestion exists. Technical requirements for pump screens of less than 0.5 cfs (225 gpm) are summarized in simplified form below:

1 Screen Construction & Materials

- 1.1 The minimum amount of wetted (submerged) screen surface area required is 1 square inch of screen for each gallon per minute (gpm) of flow. In terms of cubic feet per second (cfs), 3 square feet of screen area are required for cfs). The screen shall be designed so as to uniformly admit water through it, without a disproportionate amount of the water coming through any localized portion of the screen.
- 1.2 The screen mesh shall have 1/8" maximum size holes or slots, measured in their smallest dimension. There is no restriction on the length of slits or slots.
- 1.3 The screen surface shall have a minimum of 40% open area.
- 1.4 The screen material may be wire mesh, perforated plate, or other suitable material.
- 1.5 Any gaps in the screen assembly through which fish might pass shall not exceed 1/8".
- 1.6 There shall be no sharp edges or surfaces exposed which could injure fish. Sharp edges are herein defined as edges of less than .010 inches radius.
- 1.7 Durable material (plastic, stainless steel, brass, etc) is recommended to ensure continued usefulness and ease of maintenance.

2 Larger Screens: For all other screens (i.e. dams, gravity diversions), and for all pump screens larger than 0.5 cfs, contact the ODFW Fish Passage Program at 229-6967 x466 for further information.

3 Self-Certification: ODFW does not usually inspect small pump screens of less than 225 gpm (.5 cfs), but simply furnishes the above screening information to the water right applicant. We then require a certification from the Water Right Applicant that the above criteria have been met. After certification, present this letter to the Oregon State Water Resources Department as evidence of meeting ODFW screening requirements:

Certification: I certify that my small pumped diversion of less than 225 gallons per minute meets the fish screening criteria stated above, and that I will maintain it to comply with regulatory criteria. I also understand that should fish screening standards change that I may be required to modify my installation to meet applicable standards.



Bear Creek is a heavily impacted stream system with struggling populations of fall chinook and coho salmon, summer and winter steelhead and rainbow trout. Winter flows in low water years are often insufficient for returning adult salmonids. Additional winter water withdrawals when flow is below normal will further exacerbate upstream migration problems.

Because one or more species of game fish are present at the described POD, ODFW will require the applicant to provide fish screening pursuant to ORS 498.248. Therefore, ODFW requests WRD add the following condition to those already proposed:

The permittee shall install and maintain a fish screening device as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional <u>prior to</u> diversion of any water.

ODFW also requests the following condition relating to inchannel obstructions be included as a permit condition:

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream.

Because the subject diversion is less than 0.5 cfs, ODFW will not request requiring inspection and approval of the fish screening device by ODFW personnel as a condition of the permit. Instead, we request the applicant be given (and required to complete) the attached self-certification form to be returned to WRD as proof of compliance. The reverse side of the form contains information that should ease the task of screening the diversion.

We have received your notice that complete application of water has been made under your permit .

In order to obtain a certificate of water right, you are required by law to hire a Certified Water Right Examiner (CWRE) to conduct the final proof survey of the completed use if stored water is 9.2 or more acre feet. If you store less than 9.2 acre-feet and if there is no secondary water right that permits the diversion of water from the reservoir you may be able to prepare your own claim of beneficial use. Either way, this must be done within one year after the use is reported as being complete or within one year after the beneficial use date allowed in the permit, whichever occurs first. Accordingly, the map and claim of beneficial use must be received in this office on or before October 1, 2000. A list of Certified Examiners is available upon request by calling the above number, extension 320.

The Department requires that the CWRE has a copy of the permit or transfer order to compile the claim of beneficial use. All permit conditions need to be addressed in the claim and map you submit.

Upon receipt of the map and claim of beneficial use, the information will be reviewed and a brief field inspection may be conducted by a representative of this office. Following that, a proposed certificate of water right will be mailed to you for review.

In the meantime, the permit you hold is valid evidence of your right to use the water.





Summary of Recommendation: The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.

Application History

On June 24, 1992, ROGUE VALLEY MANOR submitted an application to the Department for the following water use permit:

- Amount of Water: 8.9 acre-feet, being 6.1 acre-feet in Reservoir #1, 2.6 acre-feet in Reservoir #2, and 0.2 acre
 - foot in Reservoir #3
- Use of Water: Aesthetics
- Source of Water: Bear Creek, a tributary of Rogue River
- Area of Proposed Use: Jackson County within

 Water Delivery System: Water is pumped through 850 feet force main to reservoirs.

The Department mailed the applicant notice of its Technical Review, December 29, 1993, determining that diversion of water for storage may be allowed December 1 through March 31. The 60-day objection period closed March 11, 1994.

No objections were received.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- comments by or consultation with another state agency
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty for the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights of record

- the Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

The Rogue River Basin Program allows the following use: Storage of water for Aesthetics. The Bear Creek Withdrawal Order may allow storage of water during the period November 1 to March 30 from Bear Creek and its tributaries, 690-515-003 (1) (a).

Senior water rights exist on Bear Creek and on downstream waters.

Bear Creek is above a State Scenic Waterway.

Water is available for further appropriation (at 50 percent exceedance probability) for the period December 1 through March 30.

The Department finds that no more than 8.9 acre feet would be necessary for the proposed use. The amount of water requested, 8.9 acre-feet, is allowable.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has advised that one or more species of game fish are present at the described point of diversion.

An interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on declining fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff. The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

The inlet at the point of diversion shall have a fish screen.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the a 50 Basin Plan.

No preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).

Water is available for the proposed use.

The proposed use will not injure other water rights.

The proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

The proposed use complies with the State Agency Agreement for land use.

For these reasons, the required presumption has been established.

Once the required presumption has been established, under the provisions of ORS 537.153(2) it may be overcome by a preponderance of evidence that either:

- (a) One or more of the criteria for establishing the presumption are not satisfied; or
- (b) The proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as demonstrated in comments, in a protest . . . or in a finding of the department that shows:
 - (A) The specific public interest under ORS 537.170(8) that would be impaired or detrimentally affected; and
 - (B) Specifically how the identified public interest would be impaired or detrimentally affected.

In this application, all criteria for establishing the presumption have been satisfied, as noted above. The presumption has not been overcome by a preponderance of evidence that the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The Department therefore concludes that water is available in the amount of water necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use will not result in injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that the attached draft permit be issued with conditions.



AS THE RESULT OF OUR TECHNICAL EVALUATION, WE HAVE DETERMINED THAT YOUR APPLICATION SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TECHNICAL REVIEW.

Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established-by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.
- 5. Water use development requirements:
 - A) Begin construction by (one year from issuance of permit).
 - B) Complete construction by October 1, 1995.
 - C) Completely apply the water to beneficial use by

October 1, 1996.

- 6. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of the permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
- 7. The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
- The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
- 9. The total area proposed to be submerged by the reservoir, when full is 2.2 acres; the proposed maximum depth of water is 11 feet; the maximum height of the dam is 9 feet.
- 10. The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.
- 11. Use under this permit is limited to the reservoir area. This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for maintaining the water level or maintaining a suitable fresh water condition.





Dear Mr. Szramek:

In response to the technical review of our permit application (R 72484) to appropriate and store water in the ponds located on the Quail Point Golf Course, we are submitting the following information to clarify our intended use of the ponds.

During the Medford Irrigation District (MID) irrigation season, which usually runs from April 1st through October 31st, reservoirs 1 and 2 are used for in-line storage of irrigation water. This water is either appropriated from Bear Creek under our existing irrigation water right, or is purchased from the City of Medford public water supply. Water from these sources is pumped into the reservoirs during the day, and used the same night for irrigation of the golf course and the Rogue Valley Manor community.

Water use restrictions during the non-irrigation season do not allow appropriation and use of Bear Creek water for irrigation use. It is our understanding that if we wish to irrigate during the off season, the only non-restricted water source is the City of Medford. Water purchased from the City of Medford would pass through the in-line system, and would not be considered stored water, even though it is passing through the ponds.

Based on our meeting with Al Cook, the Regional Watermaster for Jackson and Josephine Counties, and conversations between you and Dan Murphy of EMCON Northwest, Inc. (EMCON), it is our understanding that water appropriation and application under the above conditions does not require a reservoir permit nor a secondary permit from the Water Resources Department to use the water passing through the ponds.

Our intention in filing for a storage permit for reservoirs 1 and 2 was to appropriate water to fill the ponds during the winter months to maintain the aesthetics of the golf course. This condition was approved in the technical review of our application. During the winter months the only water used for irrigation will be water obtained from the City of Medford. Since the water taken

from Bear Creek is appropriated for pond storage and is not used for irrigation, it is our understanding that a secondary permit is not required.

We are currently preparing the following information requested in your technical review cover letter, dated December 29, 1993:

- A map corrected by a Certified Water Rights Examiner identifying the point of diversion from Bear Creek.
- A legal description of the Rogue Valley Manor property which encompasses the golf course and the reservoirs.
- 3. Documentation of ownership of the property on which the reservoirs are located.
- A copy of written authorization or easement permitting access to land not owned by the Manor.

We have not included the following requested information:

- 1. A secondary permit application for the use of stored waters, based on the reasons cited above.
- 2. A map showing the location of irrigation areas, based on the reasons cited above.



IRRIGATION PIPELINE EASEMENT AGREEMENT

SECTION ONE RIGHT OF WAY

In consideration of promises made by Grantee to improve the aesthetic and recreational qualities of certain properties adjoining the Bear Creek Greenway, and other valuable consideration, Grantor hereby grants, sells, and conveys to grantee, its successors and assigns, a right of way for the purposes of laying, constructing, operating, inspecting, maintaining, repairing, replacing, relocating, and removing a pipeline <u>10</u> inches in diameter for the transportation of irrigation water only. Grantee further agrees to pay any and all damages to trails, landscaping, fences and other recreational amenities that may arise from the construction, maintenance, and operation of such pipeline. The arbitrator shall be an attorney acceptable to Grantor and grantee, or attorncy(s) selected according to AAA rules.

Grantee shall be fully liable for all injuries to persons or damage to property resulting from the construction, maintenance, or operation of its pipeline in the pipeline right of way.

Grantee agrees to indemnify grantor against all claims, suits, costs, losses, and expenses that may in any manner result from or arise out of the laying. maintenance, renewal, repair, use, or existence of any pipeline constructed pursuant to this instrument, including the breaking of such pipeline or the leaking of any substance therefrom.

SECTION NINE DEFAULT BY GRANTEE

This agreement and all rights of Grantee under 11 shall, at the option of Grantor, Lerminate on the failure by Grantee to remody any default in the performance of any term or condition of this instrument within ten days after service of written notice of such breach.

General Comments

According to OAR 690-77-026 (1), WRD "shall undertake a technical review...and prepare a report." This subsection further lists 8 [(a) - (h)] mandatory criteria which, as a minimum, must be assessed during the technical review. ODFW has concerns with the apparent level of assessment relative to subsection (c):

OAR 690-77-026 (1) (c) --Assessing the proposed instream water right with respect to conditions previously imposed on other instream water rights granted for use of water from the same source.

In the 115 subject reports of technical review, WRD is proposing to condition each application to exempt human and livestock consumption from regulation in favor of these instream rights as follows:

This instream right shall not have priority over human or livestock consumption.

Instream water right certificates in the North Coast basin based on conversion of minimum perennial streamflows generally contain similar conditioning language giving preference to the listed uses.

By rule, WRD's technical review process includes <u>assessing</u> conditions previously imposed on other instream water rights from the same source. If found to be appropriate, WRD may propose that new instream water rights contain the same exemption. There is no <u>requirement</u> that this exemption be automatically included as part of a technical review.

When ODFW reviewed WRD files on some of these applications for documentation of assessments of prior conditions, we found nothing to indicate that any such assessments had been done. -ODFW, therefore, assumes that the required assessments were not done and, therefore, objects to the routine placement of the proposed exemption on any of these applications on the grounds that to do so would be contrary to the public's interest in maintaining fish populations in North Coast basin streams. OAR 690-11-195 (4d).

Specific Comments

Application # 70948

Section 5, Proposed Conditions, is missing from this Report of Technical Review.

Application # 71241

For the month of December:

- The minimum flow level recommended by ODFW in the North Coast basin Environmental Investigation Report is 88 cfs.
- The reported estimated average natural flow for December here is 131 cfs.
- WRD is proposing in the Report of Technical Review to allocate 80 cfs.

ODFW believes the proper amount to be protected during December is 88 cfs.

Application # 71258

Here, the estimated average natural flow is less than the minimum flow recommended by ODFW for the entire year. Because this is the only instance where this has happened to date, the occurance is suspect. ODFW requests that the water availability analysis for this reach of Miami River be reexamined.

Application # 71280

The recommended flow numbers listed for September through April in the Application Information and Technical Review sections of the Report of Technical Review do not agree. Those listed in the Application Information section are correct. North Coast Basin IWRs February 17, 1994 Page 3



WHAT: New legislation regarding ponds (HB 2153)WHO: Owners of existing ponds without water rightsWHEN: Beginning November 4, 1993

What is the new law?

The "ponds bill" (House Bill 2153) was enacted out of recognition that many existing man-made ponds throughout the state do not have water rights. The owners of these ponds may not have realized that, with few exceptions, a water right is required to store or use water in a reservoir or constructed pond, even very small ones. Prior to HB 2153, Oregon water law required the Water Resources Department to prevent the storage or use of water until a water right permit is obtained. The bill creates a temporary "amnesty" that allows owners of existing ponds to apply for a water right and continue the use of water while a decision is being reached on the application. It also exempts certain existing ponds from water right requirements.

This sheet explains the basic content of this new law and how it will be implemented until the Department has the chance to develop full informational materials, forms, and administrative rules.

Does my existing pond need a water right?

If you have a small, off-channel pond, you may be exempt from the requirement to obtain a water right. Your pond qualifies as exempt if it:

- Was constructed before January 1, 1993
- Stores less than 9.2 acre-feet of water and has a dam less than 10 feet high
- Does not divert water from a natural stream, lake or other on-channel source
- Is located off-channel and outside riparian areas. "Off-channel" is defined narrowly—see below.

If you believe your pond qualifies, you must provide notice to the Water Resources Department by January 1, 1995. The notice must include: a map indicating the location of the reservoir, the amount of water stored, and the source of water used to fill the reservoir. In some cases we may need to ask you for additional information. "Off-channel" means outside a natural waterway of perceptible extent which, during average water years, seasonally or continuously contains moving water that flows off the property owned by the applicant and has a definite bed and banks which serve to confine the water. If you have already filed a water right application, simply refer to your application number in a short letter explaining that you believe your reservoir is exempt under this legislation.

My existing pond does need a water right. How do I apply?

If your pond or reservoir was constructed before January 1, 1993 and is not exempt, you need to file a water right application by January 1, 1995. You may then continue to use the water until a decision is reached on your application, provided no senior water rights are injured. HB 2153 does not guarantee that you will receive a water right for your existing pond, but it does assure that you will not be penalized for illegal use, as long as you file your application before the deadline. All applications filed under this legislation will have a priority date of January 1, 1993.

The Water Resources Department is developing rules to fully implement this bill. However, we will accept applications in the interim. You may submit your application on the existing reservoir application forms. Clearly mark your application across the top "HB 2153." In addition to the normal information required, include a statement of when the reservoir was constructed. If the reservoir stores 9.2 acre-feet or more and has a dam 10 or more feet high, a map prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner will be required before a permit is issued.

We may need to ask you for additional information in order to process your application. In addition, the application procedures may change some once rules are adopted. If you're beginning the application process after May 1994, please check first with the Department for updated information, forms, etc.

What if I do nothing about my existing pond?

As described above, this legislation provides a window of time for you to either notify us about an exempt pond or to file an application if your pond needs a water right. If you do not take the appropriate action before January 1, 1995, your pond will be considered illegal under Oregon water law. The Department may require you to drain the pond and/or pay fines.

We are reviewing the application you submitted for Rogue Valley Manor for a water storage permit. The application is incomplete. Before we can process the application further, you need to provide us with additional information, documentation, an additional application and fees.

Please send the following:

- <u>1</u> An application for a secondary permit to provide for the use of waters stored in the reservoirs for irrigation. This application will need to be submitted with the required supporting map, land use forms, legal descriptions and fees. The proper application and land use forms are enclosed along with a booklet of instructions.
- In addition to the information presently shown on the map you submitted, it is necessary to locate the point of diversion on Bear Creek by coordinates or by bearing and distance from an established or projected public land survey corner. Also, the location of the acreage to be irrigated must shown along with noting the number of acres to be irrigated in each quarter-quarter section.



Pursuant to your letter of March 11, 1993, advising that the reservoirs are intended for in-system use for irrigation of the golf course and that a storage permit is not required, we are considering it as a request to withdraw from our records the Application R-72484 you submitted for Rogue Valley Manor.

Therefore, the application is to be considered "withdrawn" and will be returned to you at a later date along with a check in the amount of \$100.00 refunding the unearned permit recording fee. The Examination fee of \$200.00 was required to be paid into the State General Fund as an earned fee when the application was filed and is non-refundable.

It may be that the reservoirs in question can be used as bulges in the system (in-system storage) for waters allowed under existing permits during the irrigation season; and, that such a system may be appropriate for proper operation of the golf course. But any existing permits for irrigation purposes that may be appurtenant to the golf course shall not be construed in any sense as providing for storage or holding water in the reservoirs during the non-irrigation season.

The use of water from the well for filling or maintaining the reservoirs is another matter. The use of ground water, even uses exempt from permit requirements, may be regulated if found to be interfering with prior rights or not in compliance with laws or rules. An excerpt (Bear Creek Basin 690-515-003) from the Rogue River Basin Program adopted by the Water Resources Commission is enclosed for your review.

If the proposed use of water from the well has the potential for substantial interference with the nearest surface water source, use of the well may be regulated.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has reviewed the subject water right application and recommends WRD deny the application for the following reasons:

Bear Creek is extremely over-appropriated during the summer and early fall months. Normally, ODFW would recommend or look favorably on storage of winter runoff as a method for getting around periods of non-availability. However, there is considerable evidence that Bear Creek is over-appropriated beyond the usual summer-early fall months. ODFW district personnel have observed that winter steelhead adults returning to Bear Creek each year are suffer from inadequate flows.

At this time, it appears that November and December are the only months where water is available for storage on an average of 8 years in 10. We believe that a water availability analysis will bear this out. If such is the case (that water is available for impounding only 2 months out of the year), ODFW contends this water right to store water is inappropriate.

As an alternative to diverting Bear Creek flow for the stated uses, ODFW recommends the applicant look to the Medford Irrigation District for a year-round supply of water.

If the applicant disagrees with this assessment, ODFW recommends referral of this application to the Water Resources Commission for determination of the public interest. Steve Brown; R-72484 July 31, 1992 Page 2

WaterWatch has reviewed the limited amount of information contained in the public notice of this water right application. Based upon that information, WaterWatch raises the following issues, questions, and concerns:

Is there unappropriated water available for this proposed use? What exceedence level will the Department use when determining water availability?

What effect will this proposed use have on instream flows necessary to protect the public's interest in fish, wildlife, recreation, and a healthy aquatic system?

This water source may suffer from water quality problems. Has the Department consulted with the Department of Environmental Quality to determine the effect this proposed withdrawal will have on water quality?

If this water source provides habitat to native fish during any phase of their life cycle, we request that the Department include conditions requiring the installation and maintenance of fish screening and bypass devices <u>prior</u> to any diversion of water.

Given the importance of surface water sources, and the Department's limited enforcement staff, it only makes sense to require this applicant to measure and record water use. Measurement not only helps the Department carry out its statutory mandate to promote the control of water resources for <u>all</u> beneficial uses, it helps the Department protect the public's interest in assuring the use is within the bounds of the permit. ORS 536.220(1)(a), 537.170(5).

Will this proposed use be compatible with Goal 5 elements of the local comprehensive plan?

It is a high priority of the state to eliminate waste and improve the efficiency of water use. OAR690-410-060(1). 
