As of this date, April 23, 1952, the sump is complete, and power line is approximately 50% complete. When the power line is complete, this will constitute almost complete installation, since it is a sprinkler system, and connecting the pipes and placing the pump will finish the installation.

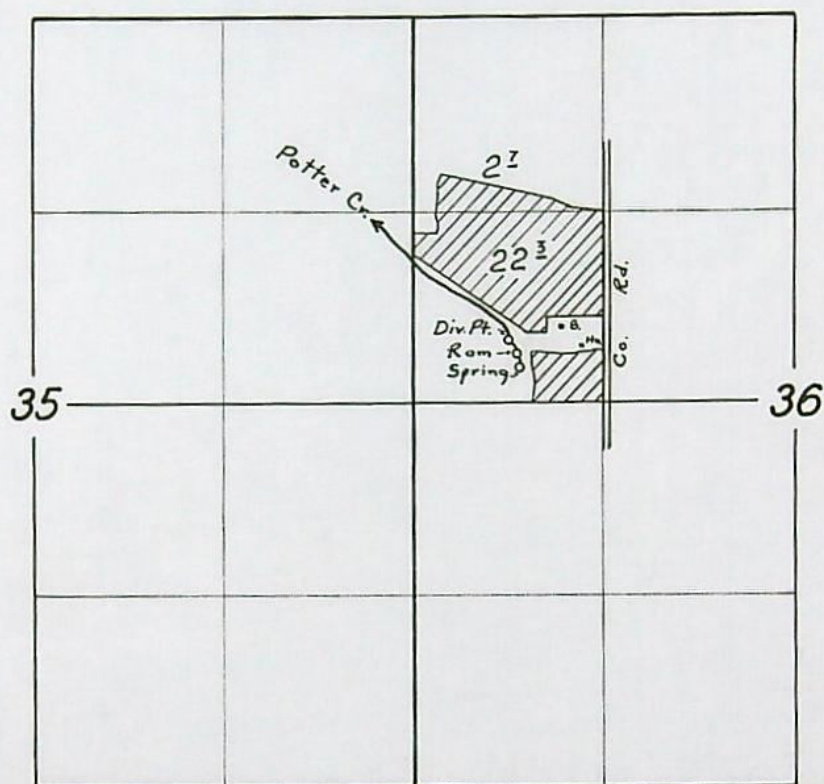

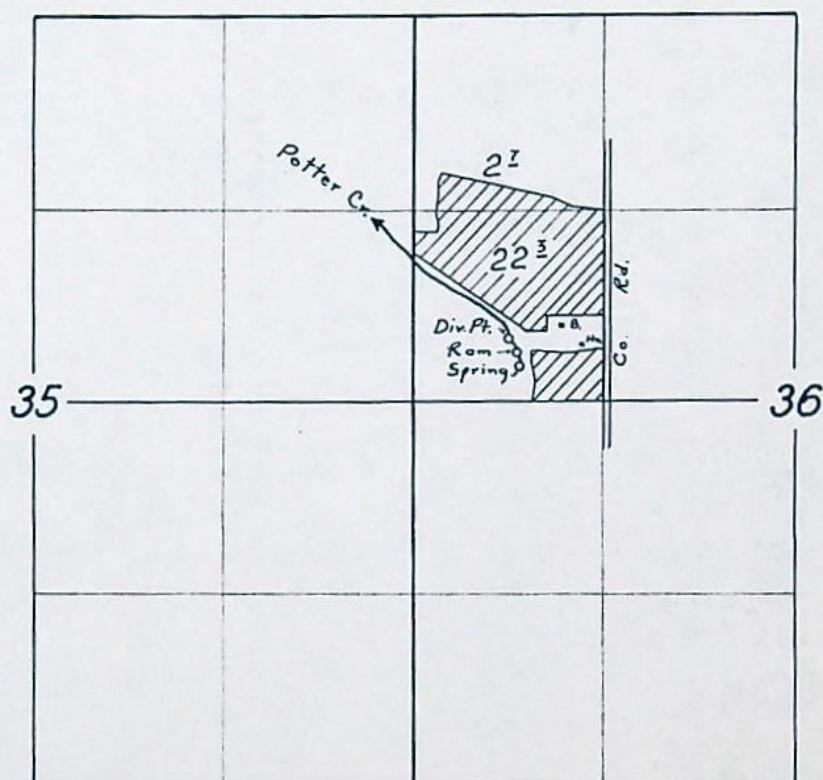


Dear Sir:

We are enclosing herewith for completion, final proof in connection with the incomplete water right represented by your Permit No. 20005 granting a right to the use of 0.35 cfs of the waters of Potter Creek, for irrigation, domestic and operation of hydraulic ram.

The data contained in the proof, which is based on an inspection and survey of your project made by a representative of this department, defines the extent to which your water right has been completed within the terms of your Permit. The proof should be dated and signed by you on the second sheet under the Affidavit of Appropriator and returned to this office.

Upon receipt of the proof, properly executed and accompanied by the statutory fee of \$1, a Certificate of Water Right will be issued confirming the rights thereunder and, after being recorded in the records of Clackamas County, will be forwarded to you.

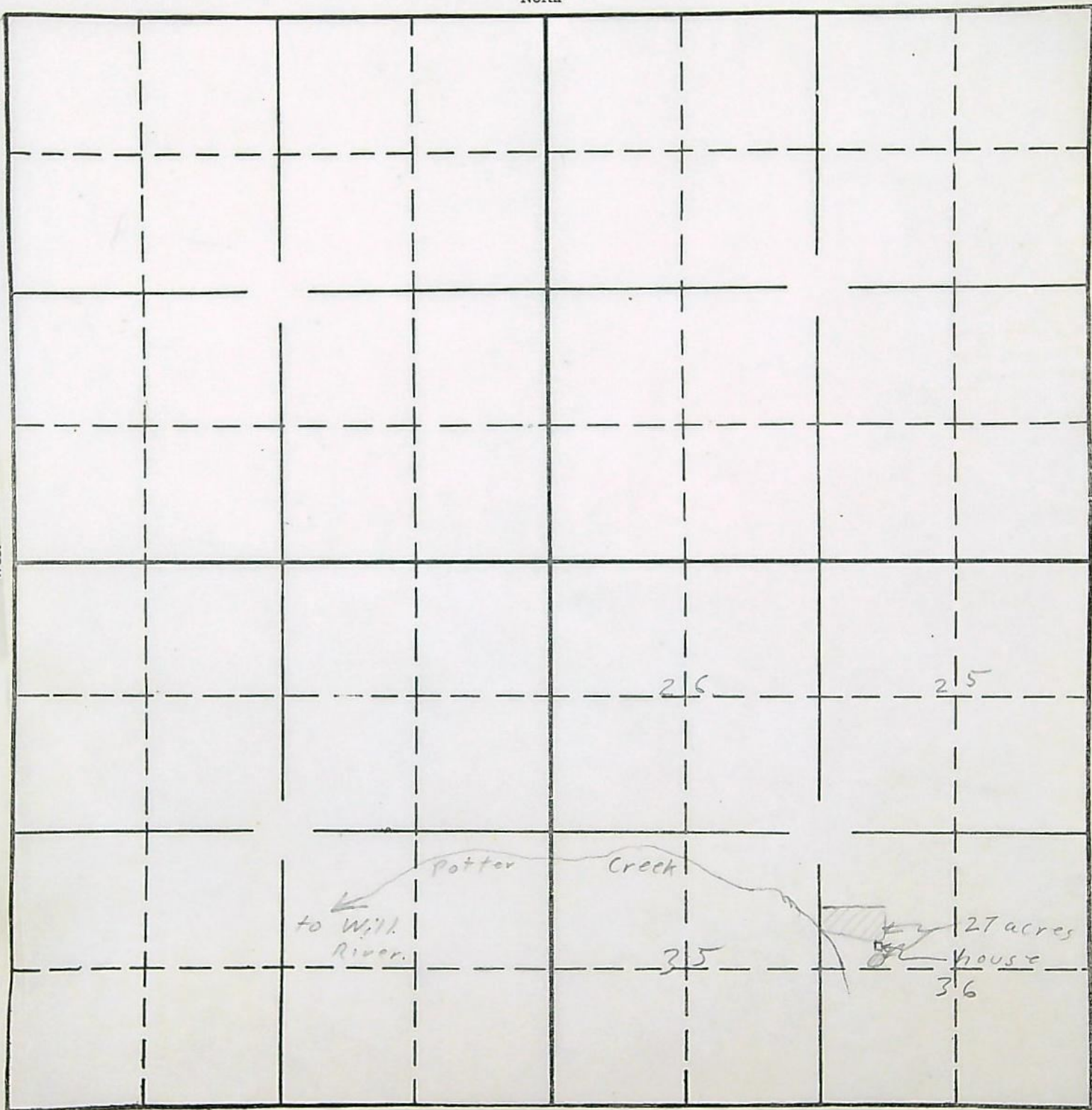



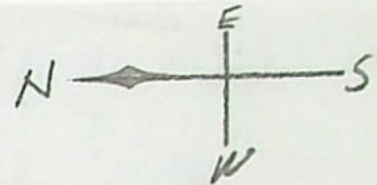
