REGISTRATION STATEMENT CLAIM OF BENEFICIAL USE

SWR 226

Monte L. Lund is the operator and manager of the property for which this Registration is requested. He lives about one mile down Yellow Creek, ~~at~~ this property. His address is HC 84, Box 13YC2, Myrtle Point, OR. 97458. His telephone number is 503-572-5130. His mother, Mrs. Dorothy Lund, lives on the ranch. The ranch is in the name of a trust. This water project appears to have changed very little from pre-1909; except that the older methods of water conveyance have been replaced with plastic pipe.

Sources: Twelve of the sources, PODs, as shown on the accompanying map are springs. Two sources are for stream bank watering. Springs 6 and 12 dry up in late summer. The two streams dry up to intermittent pools in the creek bed in late summer.

Diversion Points: Most PODs are fenced off from the stock and have a low dam, less than two feet high, or a concrete culvert tile dug into the ground at the water source. In addition, POD 13 has a 1 000 gal. storage tank about 400 ft. from the source.

Motors and Pumps: None. All sources are higher than the place of use.

Pipe: All pipe was 3/4" diameter and about 6000 ft. total length on the day of this inspection.

Uses: Stock watering and domestic for one family, with irrigation of 1/2 acre of lawn and garden.

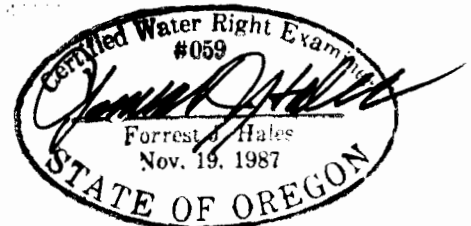
Head: POD# 13 is about 300 ft., POD # 6 is about 60 ft. and all others are about 10 to 20 ft.

Calculations: Domestic with 1/2 acre of lawn and garden for one family is 0.005 CFS. 385 cows and 400 sheep at 0.005 per hundred is 0.040 CFS. for a total use of 0.045 CFS OR ABOUT 20 gals per minute.

Points of beginning: All coordinates of water sources were measured on Mr. Lunds Soil Conservation aerial photo map.

Remarks: This land could support more live stock if there was more water available.

This Final Proof Survey and Inspection of the use as found to be completed under the terms and conditions of the Pre-1909 Water Registration Act was completed by me on November 11, 1992 and the facts contained in this report and accompanying Pre-1909 Surface Water Registration Map are correct to the best of my knowledge.

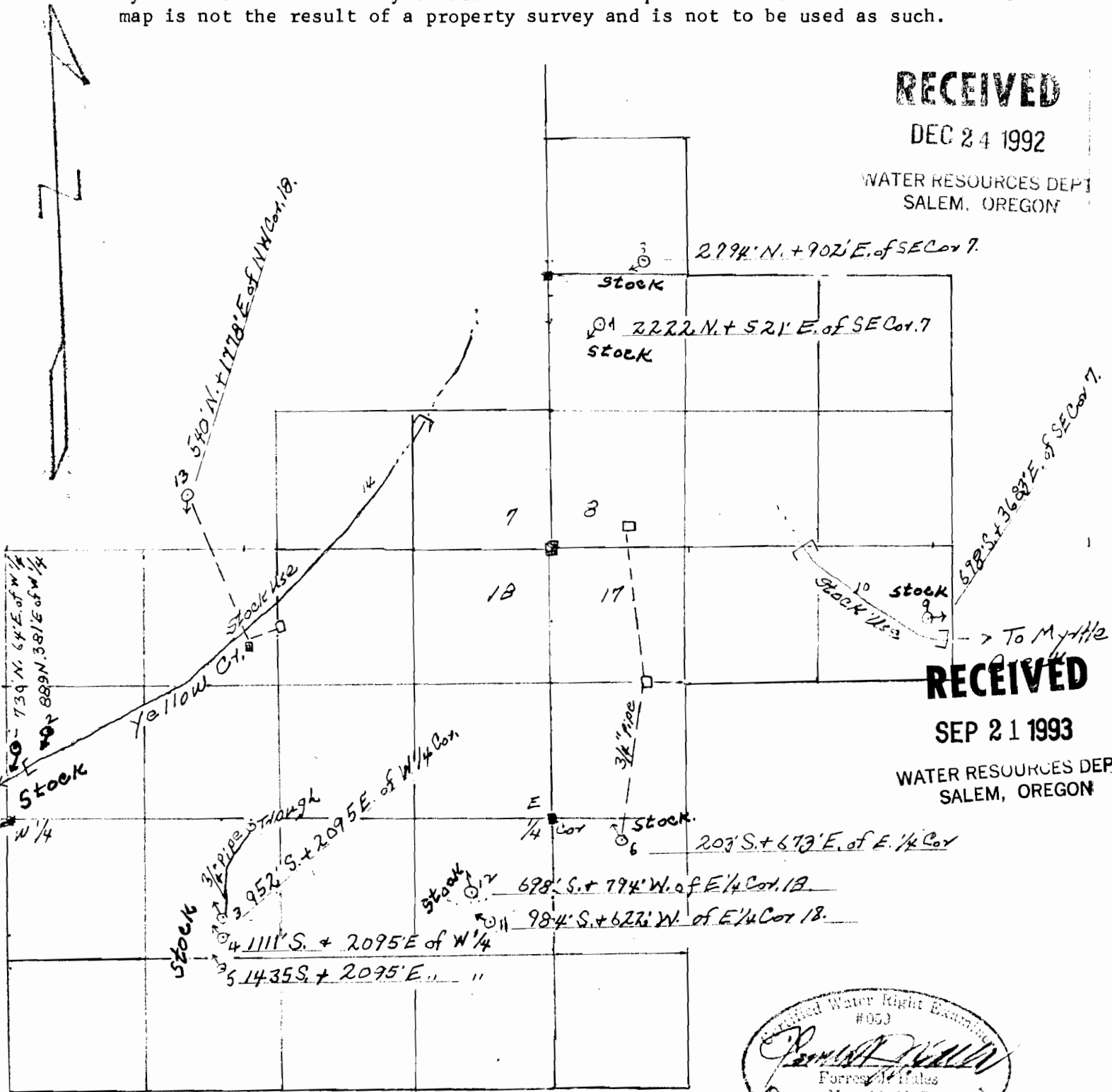

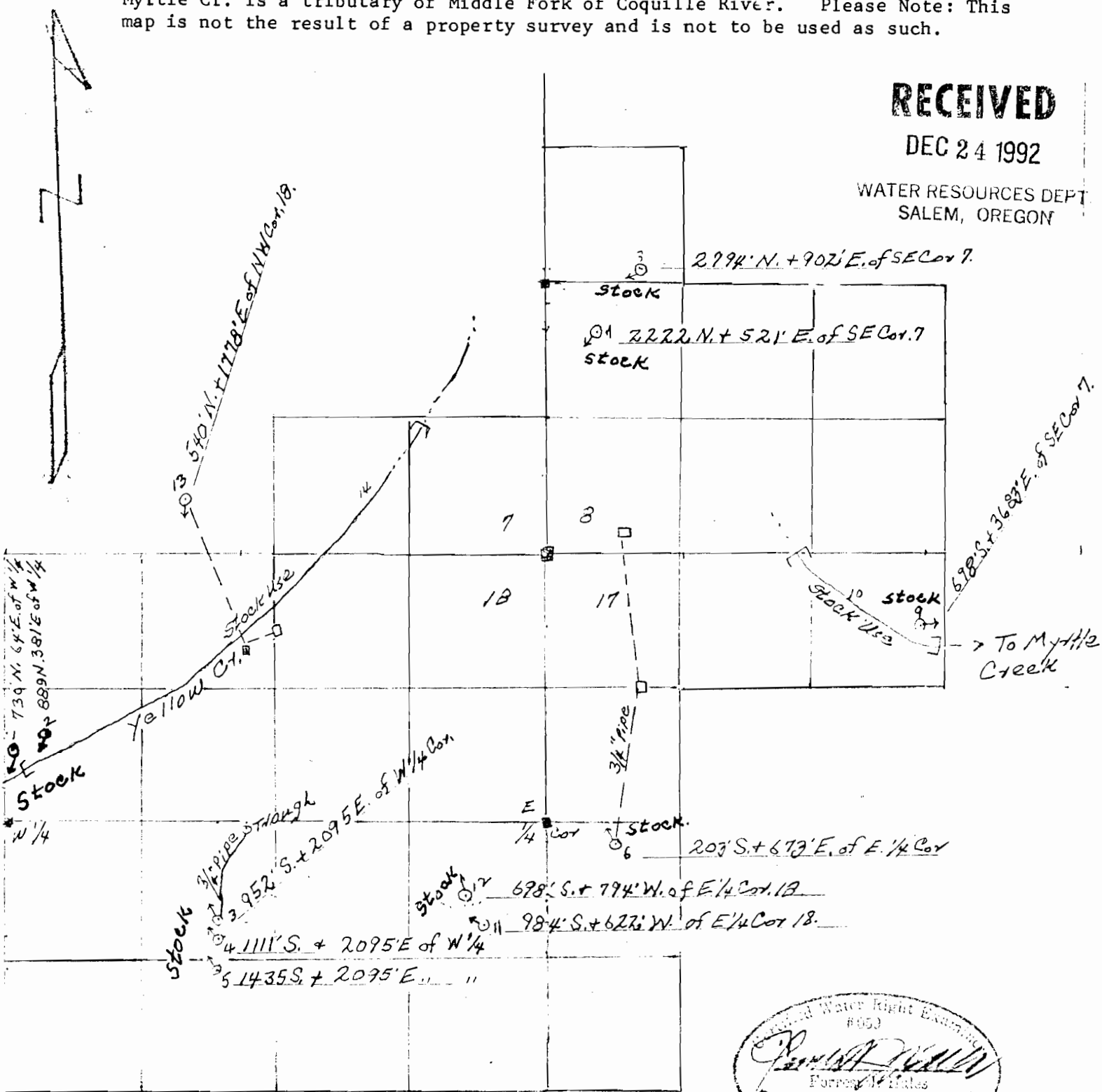

My name is Monte Lund. My father's name was Louis W. Lund. He was born in 1895 on this ranch and died in 1972. His father's name was Ole Lund. His mother's name was Anne Samuelson. Her two brother's names were Lars and Ole Samuelson.

The following information is what my father told me along with information from deeds, obituaries and photographs:

Lars Samuelson came to this country from Norway prior to 1887. Ole and Ann Samuelson came to this country in 1887 and joined their brother, Lars on his homestead southwest of Bancroft, Oregon, on the headwaters of Yellow Creek. Ole also started homesteading land. (See Exhibit 1 through 7) The area they had selected had some natural prairie and much open land. They wanted land that could grow grass so they could raise cattle to make a living. Much of the area they homesteaded had been burned by a huge forest fire in the mid 1800's (See exhibit 8 & 9).

Lars was killed about 1890.

Anne married Ole O. Lund in 1890. He homesteaded some land adjacent to the Samuelson's and built a house and established a home (see exhibit #3). They built barns and cleared fields to raise hay and crops (see Exhibit 9) for their livestock. When their children became of school age they established a home in Coquille and divided their time between the two places, helping Ole with the homestead.

In 1913 Ole Samuelson died and Anne Lund inherited all of her brothers property. My dad attended school through the 8th grade. He moved back to the Yellow Creek ranch for several years while the other kids went on to schools. Then his father and brother Ed took over until his father died in 1927. My father married Dorothy Hartley in 1934. I was born in 1935. Our family has owned and operated this land as a livestock ranch since 1987, and I still operate it as such today.

My name is Orlin Lett. I was born in 1907.

My grandfather and father homesteaded land on Myrtle Creek, just over the hill from Yellow Creek where Lund's ranch is and the two ranches joined.

Our family as well as the Lund family raised cattle for a living. They raised beef cattle and we, dairy cattle. I remember how our cattle got mixed sometimes and since the Lunds didn't have a phone, either Louie or my father and I would go over to check the cattle out. I was 12 years old or less..old enough to tag along after my father over the hills. This was during the time Grandpa and Louie were on the ranch alone. They had a barn for their hay, a house and much fields for their cattle, as well as springs to water them.

I have lived in the area all my life and have known the Lunds, as they married and the children grew up. They have always raised livestock..

Whereas *Ole Samuelson of Was County, Oregon*

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE OF THE REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at *Roseburg, Oregon*

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Ole Samuelson* according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for

the South East quarter of the South West quarter and the South West quarter of the South East quarter of Section eight, and the North East quarter of the North West quarter and the North West quarter of the North East quarter of Section seventeen in Township thirty South, of Range eleven West of Willamette Meridian in Oregon, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the OFFICIAL PLAT of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said Tract... has been purchased by the said *Ole Samuelson*

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said *Ole Samuelson* and to *his* heirs, the said tract... above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Ole Samuelson* and to *his* heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

1. The Holder shall comply with the applicable Federal and State laws and regulations concerning the use of pesticides (i.e. insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, rodenticides, and other similar substances) in all activities/operations under this Grant. The Holder shall obtain from the authorized officer approval of a written plan prior to the use of such substances. The plan must provide the type and quantity of material to be used; the pest insect, fungus, etc., to be controlled; the method of application; the location of or storage and disposal of containers; and other information that the authorized officer may require. The plan should be submitted no later than December 1 of any calendar year that covers the proposed activities for the next fiscal year (i.e., December 1, 1983, deadline for a fiscal year 1985 action). If need for emergency use of pesticides is identified, the use must be approved by the authorized officer. The use of substances on or near the right-of-way shall be in accordance with the approved plan. A pesticide shall not be used if the Secretary of the Interior has prohibited its use. A pesticide shall be used only in accordance with its registered uses and within other limitations if the Secretary has imposed limitations. Pesticides shall not be permanently stored on public lands authorized for use under this Grant.
2. The Holder shall indemnify the United States against any liability for damage to life or property arising from the occupancy or use of public lands under this grant.
3. Holder is subject for any damage to U.S. Government lands resulting from the construction, maintenance or repair of the pipeline. Holder shall repair any damage to the satisfaction of the Authorized Officer.
