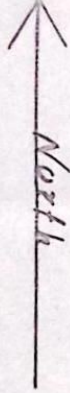

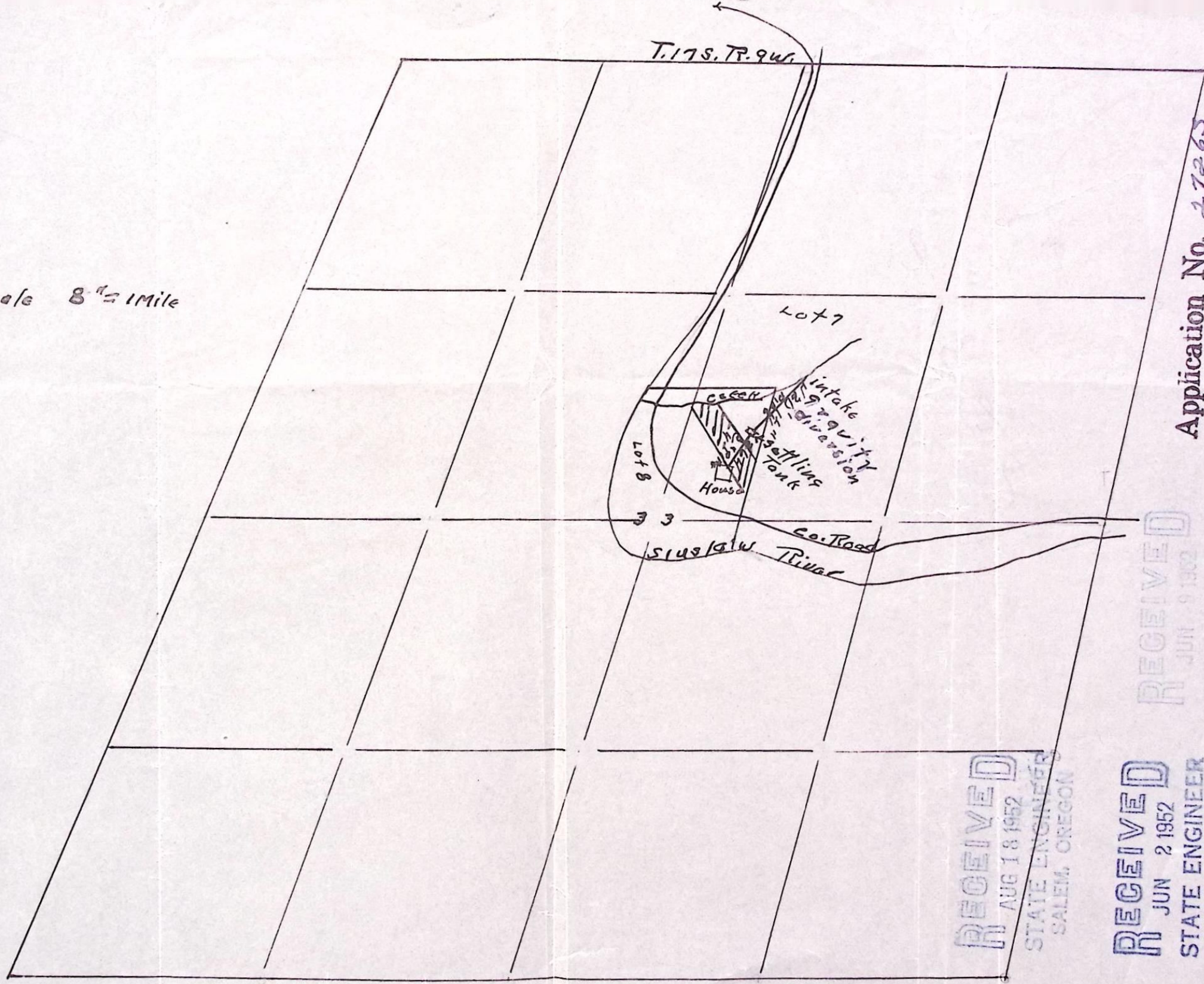

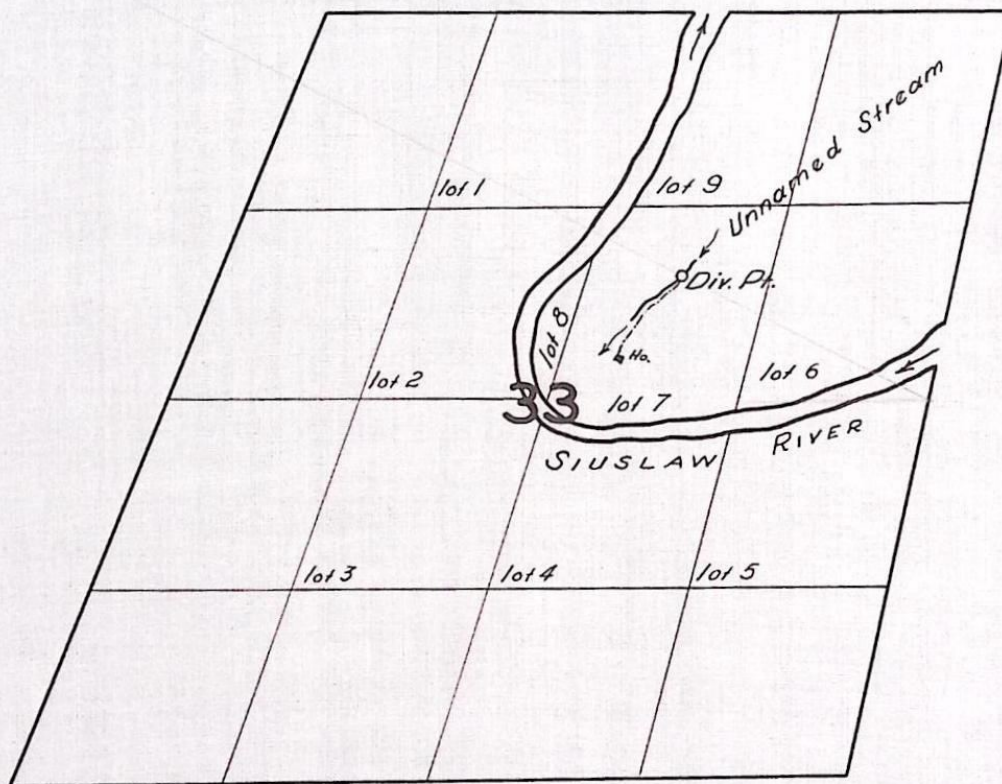

Dear Mr. Simington:

On October 4, 1965, I made an investigation of the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Siuslaw River, within Lot 7 (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$) Section 33, Township 17 South, Range 9 West, W.M., the water rights of record from this source being Certificate 24233, in the name of Fred McCornack for use of 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic use of one family; Certificate 26882, in the name of Louis and Nora Olson for domestic use for two houses and Certificate 31181, in the name of Norman Kieffer, for domestic use of one family.

At the time I was there, sufficient flow was passing your diversion to satisfy the other rights of record, however I was informed that previously the entire flow of this stream was being diverted into your system, and that more than one dwelling was being served by your pipeline for domestic purposes. If you have been diverting in excess of the 0.01 cubic foot per second, and/or serving more than one family domestic, you are exceeding your water right and causing injury to other rights from this stream.

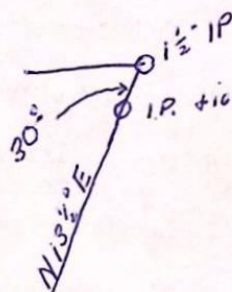
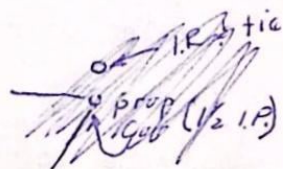

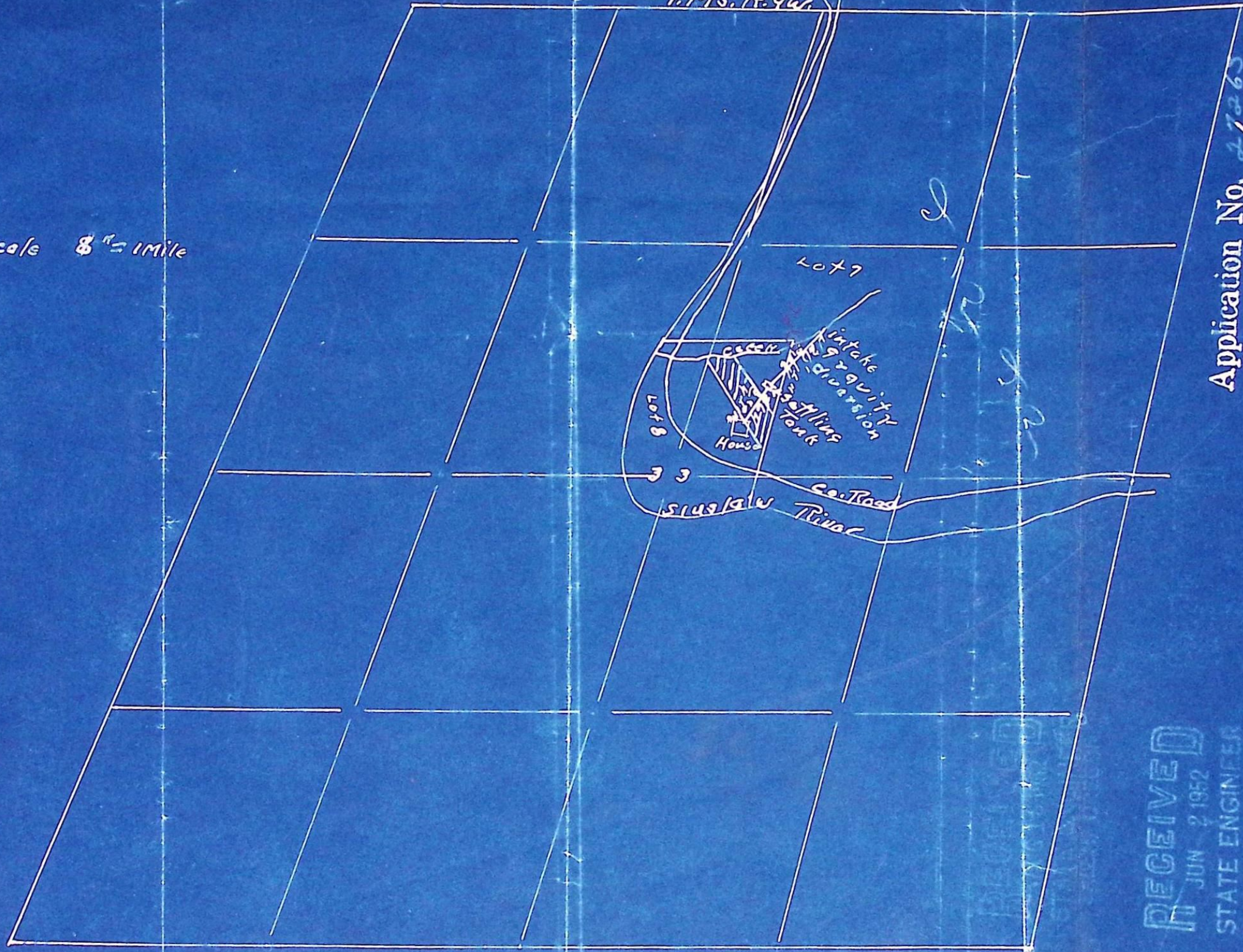

Dear Mr. Simington:

There is no statutory provision for reissuing certificates to show subsequent owners of the property described. No assignment is considered necessary, as the right is appurtenant to the land and travels with it regardless of ownership unless specifically reserved in the deed.




Dear Mr. McCornack:
