Permit No. 8449, in the name of City of Eugene, describes the appropriation of 2200 cubic feet per second of water of McKenzie River for power. This permit bears the priority date of March 5, 1926.

On January 24, 1955, you filed an application for a permit to appropriate an additional 300 cubic feet per second from the McKenzie River.

Mr. C. A. Cummings of this office made a measurement of a power canal a short distance above the spillway at the last road bridge before the canal crosses under the highway. This was within the NW\$\frac{1}{2}\$ NW\$\frac{1}{2}\$. Section 6. Township 17 South, Range 2 East. He measured the water at 2340 cubic feet per second with the water stage lacking about 1 inch of flowing ever the spillway crest. He estimated that the canal would carry an additional 50 cubic feet per second before the water would reach the spillway crest. This indicates the passing at this point as being 2390 cubic feet per second, or to round out the figure, 2400.

It appears then, that the final proof form for permit No. 23958 should be reduced from 300 cubic feet per second to 200 cubic feet per second so the combined permits would total 2400 cubic feet per second. Before we prepare these forms, I would appreciate receiving your comments on this.

On November 5 this office received a telegram from the Eugene Water and Electric Board requesting that they be permitted to reduce minimum flows in the McKenzie below the intake of the Walterville Canal to 300 cfs. and indicating that unless conditions improve, they would make a similar request at Leaburg Dam. The Fish Commission of Oregon received a similar telegram.

The Fish Commission and the Game Commission recognize the serious situation in regard to electric power brought about by lack of rain and resulting low river flows. However, they did not feel that the minimum flow of the McKenzie should be reduced by such a great amount at the Walterville Canal. Instead, similar telegrams were sent by both Commissions to the Eugene Water and Electric Board agreeing that the minimum flow now set by temporary agreement at 500 cfs. below Walterville be reduced to 400 cfs. and that the present minimum flow below Leaburg Dam now set at 500 cfs. by stipulation be reduced to 400 cfs. Both of these reductions were to be agreeable to the Fish and the Game Commissions during the period from November 5, 1952 until January 1, 1953.

This letter will confirm the telephone conversation on this matter now between you and Mr. Campbell of our staff on November 5.

There is a rider on our Leaburg Permit No. 8449 which stipulates that we shall at all times maintain a residual flow in the McKenzie River of 500 c.f.s.

The above stipulation was modified, however, by the statement that a lessor flow would be permitted should the Fish Commission accept the modification.

On November 4th we wired the Fish Commission and the Game Commission requesting them to agree for the residual flow at Walterville to be reduced to 300 c.f.s. We also stated that we might later make a similar request with respect to the flow at Leaburg. You will understand that the DEPA, under the present hydro situation in the Northwest, are urging all utilities to furnish every kilowatt hour they possibly can to the Northwest systems.

This morning we received identical wires from the Fish Commission and the Game Commission in which they stated that they would agree to a reduction in the flow at Leaburg and at Walterville from 500 c.f.s. to a 400 c.f.s. residual in the river from November 5 through December 31, 1952. We are proceeding to adjust the river flow to the lower limit. We trust that your office will approve this arrangement.



Please refer to our correspondence of August through October, 1950, regarding this permit and the extension of time which you granted us on October 23, 1950. The investigation by biologists of the Fish Commission referred to in our letter of August 24, 1950, have just now been started. During the week of September 1st, we varied the flow in the river below our Walterville diversion as requested by them, and observations of river conditions were made on three successive days with four different flows. So far as we know this is the first definite action to determine required minimum flows at Walterville and, hence, at Leaburg which is covered by Permit No. 8449.

We note in your letter (Form No. 119) dated August 15, 1950, that our permit is in good standing until October 1, 1950. We wish to explain that we will use all the water which is intended to be used under this appropriation by October 1, 1950, unless the river flow is inadequate to furnish our complete appropriation and at the same time to satisfy the requirements of the Fish and Game Commissions.

At a joint meeting with the Fish and Game Commissions, which was held in Portland some weeks ago, the Commissions agreed to do some experimental work to determine:

- 1. If they actually required 1,000 c.f.s. to be left at the Walterville diversion during the month of June,
- 2. If 900 c.f.s. were required in July, and
- 3. If 500 c.f.s. were required during the months of August and September.

They believed that they could determine with some exactness their actual water requirements. This was to be done because we objected to giving up more than 500 c.f.s. of our 1,600 c.f.s. invested right appropriation at any time.

Since the appropriation for Leaburg carries a stipulation that not less than 500 c.f.s. shall be left in the river at the Leaburg diversion at all times unless it is agreed between the Board and the Commissions that 500 c.f.s. is not needed for fish, we would like to

I found a memorandum made by Mr. McClain which leads me to think that there may be something we should do to complete or protect our water rights with respect to the Leaburg power project.

The idea I get from the memorandum is that something might be required to complete the records with respect to the complete utilization of the water for the Leaburg plant. I think our application for that project is No. 10626, permit No. 8449.

Now, of course, we have not changed the conditions with regard to the utilization of water at Leaburg during the last year or two, due to the shrinkage of power consumption, but still we wish to protect our right to install an additional wheel at the Leaburg plant, whenever the need of power justifies it.

When the plant was built we fully believed that the second unit in the Leaburg plant would be required before or about this time, but conditions have changed. We would, therefore, like an extension if such is required and permitted. Please check up and see if we are required to do anything at the present with regard to that project.

Dear Sir:

We are returning herewith, with the proper fees, the "Annual Statement of Water Power Claimant" for both our Leaburg and Walterville plants. We have taken the liberty of adding on line No. 1, after City of Eugene, the words "Walterville Plant" and "Leaburg Plant" respectively in order to distinguish the two reports. On the statement for the Leaburg plant we have made in ink a correction in Item No. 9. The erroneous description of point of diversion in Item No. 9 is probably due to confusion of the point of diversion with the point of utilization or location of the power house, and was probably obtained from Item No. 10 (d) of the application to appropriate water, in which this information is given. The point of diversion is five miles from the power house.

Noting this error we examined the application in detail. This led to discovering that the "Notice of Beginning of Construction" of the Leaburg project had not been filled in and returned to your office. We regret that this has been overlooked and we are sending it now filled out, and trust that it will be self-explanatory.

In the construction of the Leaburg plant there has naturally been some changes from the original idea so that the plant as actually constructed does not always agree with the information given at the time of application for the water right. We are wondering if it is required or necessary to officially note these changes. For instance see Item No. 7 (b) of the application No. 10626 for permit to appropriate water, and permit No. 8449. The headgate as actually built is a concrete structure with two openings, each 24 ft. wide, closed by two 24 foot steel broome gates, and under Item 8 (a) the depth of water for the canal as actually designed will be something over 10 ft. Under Item 12, the actual cost will, of course, be different from the estimated cost. Otherwise the application and the execution of the work are in practical agreement. If it is your practice to require corrections in such matters we will be glad to file a definite statement.


