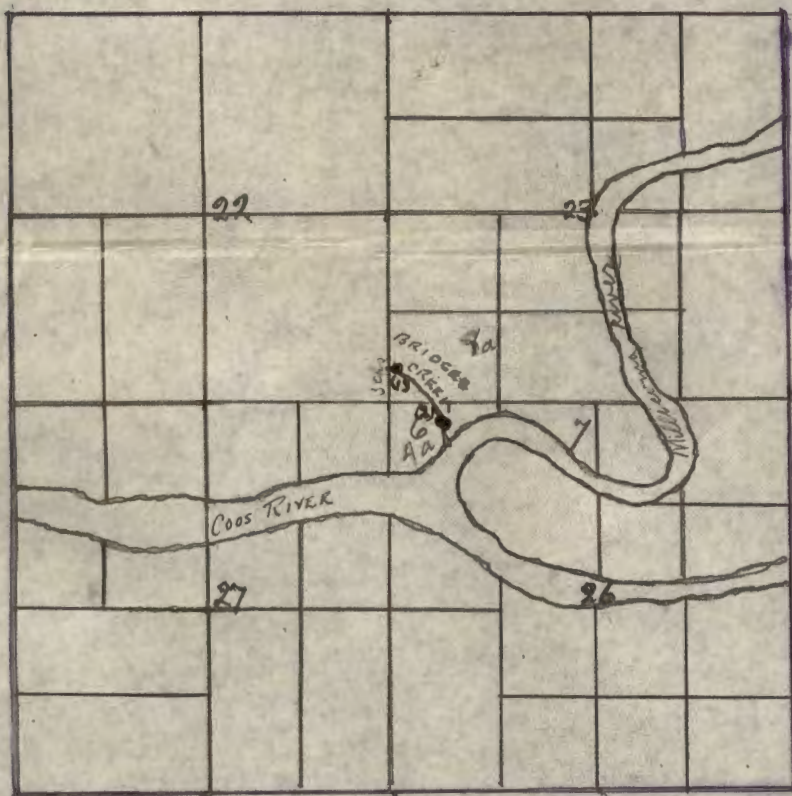

I note from the records of this office that you have not filed Notices of Beginning of Construction, Completion, or Complete Application of Water under your Permit No. 5878, which covers appropriation of 0.2 second foot of water from Bridges Creek for domestic use and for the irrigation of 12 acres, although the time for the completion of this water right, as fixed in the terms of the permit, expired October 1st, 1926.

I have your letter of April 6th in which you state that no construction work was necessary under your permit No. 5878, and that you have irrigated from Bridges Creek for several years.
