FINAL ORDER  
APPROVING THE STORAGE OF  
SURFACE WATER

**Authority**

The application is being processed in accordance with Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.409, which establishes the process by which an application to store waters of the public may be submitted. This statute can be accessed here:

In accordance with ORS 537.409, the Department shall conduct a public interest review of an application submitted to store water in a reservoir that has a storage capacity of less than 9.2 acre-feet or a dam or impoundment structure less than 10 feet in height.

The review shall be limited to issues pertaining to:

- (a) Water availability;
- (b) Potential detrimental impact to existing fishery resources; and
- (c) Potential injury to existing water rights.

In addition, the Department will review ORS Chapter 538 to determine if the source of water has been withdrawn from further appropriation and will conduct a review consistent with ORS Chapter 390.835 – Oregon's Scenic Waterway laws – to determine whether the use is prohibited.

Following this review, the Department shall issue a final order granting or denying the permit or granting the permit with conditions.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is a final order in other than contested case. This final order is subject to judicial review under ORS 536.075 and ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the final order must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075, ORS 183.484, and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

ORS 537.409 does not provide an opportunity to request a contested-case hearing. Appeal rights on this final order approving the application are limited to the above procedures.



### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On January 30, 2023, Ryan R. Beyerlein submitted an application for a permit to store water pursuant to ORS 537.409.

Storage Volume: 0.918 ACRE-FOOT

Dam Height: 9.0 FEET

Source: QUARTZ CREEK, TRIBUTARY TO JUMP OFF JOE CREEK

County: JOSEPHINE COUNTY

Reservoir Location: SECTION 5, TOWNSHIP 35 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

2. The required examination fees were paid, and the minimum application requirements were met.
3. On February 7, 2023, the Department provided public notice of the application in the Department's weekly public notice. A 60-day comment period followed.
4. The Department did not receive public comment related to the possible issuance of the attached permit.
5. An assessment of water availability at 50% exceedance for the proposed use was completed using the Department's Water Availability Reporting System. A copy of this assessment is in the application file. This review is done consistent with OAR 690-410-0070(2)(a). The assessment established that water is available December 1 through March 31 of each year for the proposed use.
6. The Department relies on the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's review and recommendations in determining whether a proposed use would pose a significant detrimental impact to existing fishery resources. The Department has determined that, if limited to February 1 through March 31, and as conditioned, the proposed use will not pose a significant detrimental impact to existing fishery resources.
7. The Department has determined that the proposed use, as conditioned, will not injure other water rights.
8. The Department has determined that the proposed source has not been withdrawn from further appropriation under ORS Chapter 538.
9. The proposed reservoir is not prohibited under ORS 390.835.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. Application R-89330 contains the information required by ORS 537.409(1)-(3).
2. The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest as described in ORS 537.409.

## PERMIT SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

1. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
2. **Water Use Measurement, Recording, and Reporting:**
  - A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter, or other suitable measuring device as determined by the watermaster, at each point of diversion. The permittee shall maintain the device in good working order.
  - B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the device; provided however, where any device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
  - C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the volume of water diverted, and may require the permittee to report water-use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
  - D. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring and reporting procedures for review and approval.

3. **Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Rules:**

The permittee shall comply with basin-specific Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Rules described in Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 603-095. The permittee shall protect riparian areas, allowing site capable vegetation to establish and grow along streams, while providing the following functions: shade (on perennial and some intermittent streams), bank stability, and infiltration or filtration of overland runoff.

4. **Fish Stocking:**

Per ORS 498.222 and OAR 635-007-0600, all persons transporting fish in Oregon shall have a fish transport permit issued by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). The permittee shall not stock fish in the reservoir without a fish transport permit issued by ODFW. As part of the permitting process, the permittee shall also screen the inlet and outlet of their pond to ensure that fish cannot escape into public waters and/or to keep wild fish from entering the pond.

5. **In-Water Work:**

Any in-water work related to construction, development, or maintenance of the proposed use shall be conducted during the preferred work period of June 15 through September 15, unless an alternate time period is approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.



**6. Off-Channel Stored Water Releases:**

The permittee shall not release polluted water from this off-channel reservoir into waters of the state except when the release is directed by the State Engineer to prevent dam failure.

**7. Water Quality:**

- a. The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream waters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.
- b. All water use under this permit shall comply with state and federal water quality laws. The permittee shall not violate any state and federal water quality standards, shall not cause pollution of any waters of the state, and shall not place or cause to be placed any wastes in a location where such wastes are likely to escape or be carried into the waters of the state by any means. The use may be restricted if the quality of source stream or downstream waters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards. Permittee is responsible for obtaining any necessary state and federal permits.

**8. Riparian Area Restoration:**

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with ODFW's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR 635-415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR 635-415, shall be followed.

**9. Fish Screen and By-Pass Device:**

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion while by-pass devices provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screen and by-pass devices are to be in place and functional, and approved in writing by ODFW prior to diversion of any water. The permittee may submit evidence in writing that ODFW has determined screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary.

**10. Live Flow:**

Once the allocated volume has been stored, permittee shall pass all live flow downstream at a rate equal to inflow, using methods that protect instream water quality.

**11. Scenic Waterway Flows:**

Diversion of water under this permit is contingent on designated scenic waterway flows being met downstream. The user is required to monitor streamflow at Rogue River near Agness, OR gage 14372300, and discontinue diversion when the flows specified below are unmet at the gage. At the



discretion of the Director, the location and nature of streamflow monitoring required to protect scenic waterway flows is subject to change. In addition, the watermaster may regulate diversion under this right if it is determined by the Department that the flows listed below are unmet at the gage.

12. The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe (with a minimum diameter of 8" for any in-channel reservoir). This requirement may be waived if the Department determines other means have been provided to evacuate water when necessary.
13. The permittee shall pass all live flow outside the storage season described above.
14. The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish, unless the permittee has requested and been granted a fish passage waiver by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission. The permittee is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.
15. This permit allows an annual appropriation (not to exceed the specified volume). This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for out-of-reservoir uses, the maintenance of the water level or maintaining a suitable freshwater condition. If any water is to be used for out-of-reservoir purposes, a secondary water right is required. If any additional live flow is to be appropriated to maintain either the water level or a suitable freshwater condition, an additional water right is required.

#### STANDARD CONDITIONS


1. This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
2. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
3. The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.



## DEVELOPMENT AND COMPLETION TIMELINE REQUIREMENTS

1. Construction of the water system shall begin within five years of the date of permit issuance. The deadline to begin construction may not be extended. This permit is subject to cancellation proceedings if the begin construction deadline is missed.
2. The permitted volume of water shall be stored within five years of the date of permit issuance. If additional time is needed, the permittee may submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.
3. Within one year after storage of water, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use to the Oregon Water Resources Department.
4. The claim of beneficial use shall be prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner in conformance with the requirements of OAR 690-014 if an associated secondary permit exists for the use of stored water under this permit, or if the reservoir capacity is equal to or greater than 9.2 acre-feet.
5. If no secondary permit exists and the reservoir capacity is less than 9.2 acre-feet of water, the claim of beneficial use need not be prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner. The information submitted to the Oregon Water Resources Department shall include:
  - a. the dimensions of the reservoir;
  - b. the maximum capacity of the reservoir in acre-feet; and
  - c. a map identifying the location of the reservoir prepared in compliance with Water Resources Department standards.

## Water-Use Permit Application Processing Steps

### Oregon Water Resources Department

#### Alternate Review Process for a Reservoir Applications:

After a completed application has been received by the Department, the Department must make public notice of the application within 60 days. Applications are noticed to the public every Tuesday and can be accessed from the Department's website: <https://www.oregon.gov/owrd>.

The Department does not notify individual, neighboring landowners of an application, unless they are identified in the application as affected landowners. The public notice is to ensure that any person may submit detailed information requesting the Department deny an application based upon whether the proposed use causes injury to existing water rights or poses a significant detrimental impact to an existing fishery resource. All comments must be submitted within 60 days of the public notice.

Following the 60-day public comment period, the Department can issue a Final Order. Alternate Reservoir applications typically take between 3-5 months to process, depending upon the number of pending applications in the queue.

The Department recommends applicants not schedule excavation work or otherwise expend financial resources until an ODFW fish passage plan and the alternate reservoir application have been approved. Also note that other permits may be required for any construction activities in waterways, wetlands, or riparian areas.

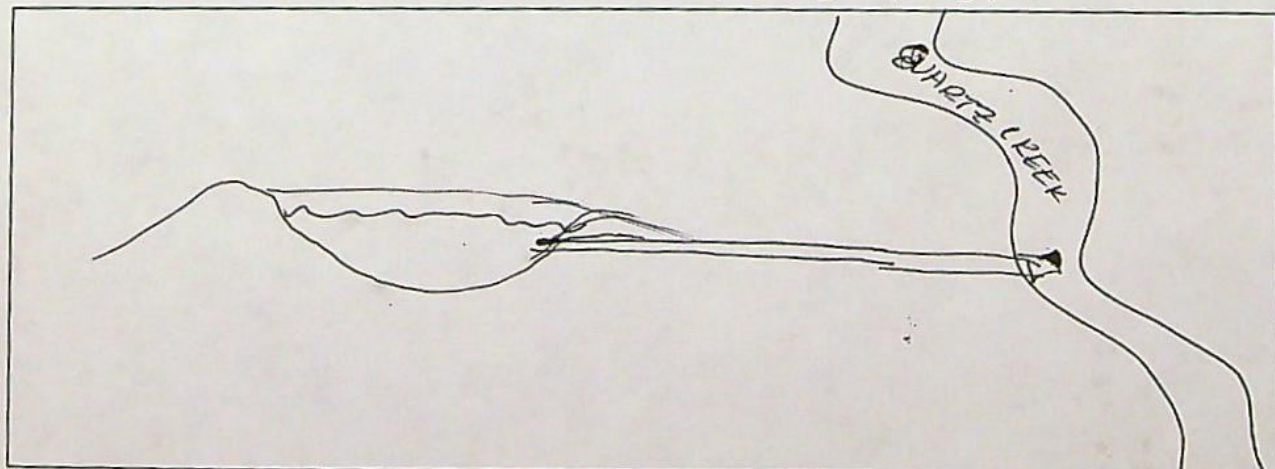

ESA-listed fish (Coho Salmon), sensitive species (spring Chinook Salmon, summer steelhead, and Pacific Lamprey), and other game fish (fall Chinook Salmon, winter steelhead, and Coastal Cutthroat Trout) may be present in Quartz Creek, Jumpoff Joe Creek, and/or the Rogue River during the period of impact. ODFW has identified biologically necessary flows not captured in an instream water right (e.g., flows in a Basin Investigation Report, Persistence Flow Determination, Seasonally Varying Flow prescription, or other flow analysis) that would benefit fishery resources at the Point of Diversion or downstream.

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Based on parameters assessed by ODFW, instream flows are currently below those essential to support the biological needs of an existing fishery resource during April 1-January 31. In addition, ODFW reviewed available information (Rogue River Basin Temperature TMDL; DEQ 2008) regarding water quality impairment and determined that the proposed use would impair water quality that supports existing fishery resources (e.g., habitat) at or downstream of the Point of Diversion. The proposed pond is in the Rogue River basin and subject to the Rogue River Basin Temperature TMDL (DEQ, 2008), which identifies the critical period for temperature as April 1-October 31. Diminished flows from the proposed withdrawal could impact temperature impairments in the Rogue River during this period.

Because of these reasons, the proposed use will diminish water quality, physical habitat, and/or alter the flow regime to which fish are naturally adapted. These changes will negatively affect their distribution, productivity, and abundance. Therefore, a further reduction in flow or alteration of habitat from the proposed use would result in a significant detrimental impact to an existing fishery resource without appropriate conditions and/or mitigation.



- ☒ **Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Rules:** The permittee shall comply with basin-specific Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Rules described in Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 603-095. The permittee shall protect riparian areas, including through irrigation practices and the management of any livestock, allowing site capable vegetation to establish and grow along streams, while providing the following functions: shade (on perennial and some intermittent streams), bank stability, and infiltration or filtration of overland runoff.

- ☐ **b5** The water user shall install and maintain adequate treatment facilities meeting current DEQ requirements to remove sediment before returning the water to the stream.




