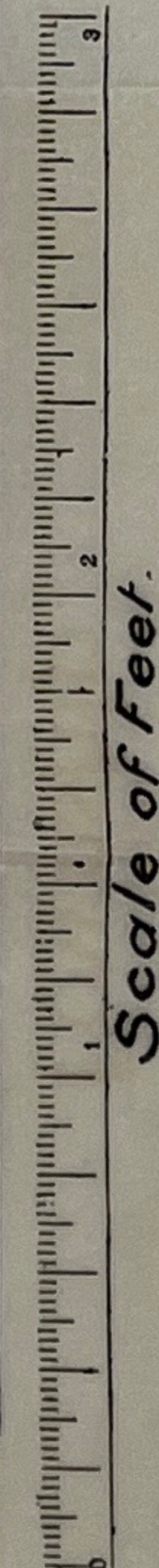
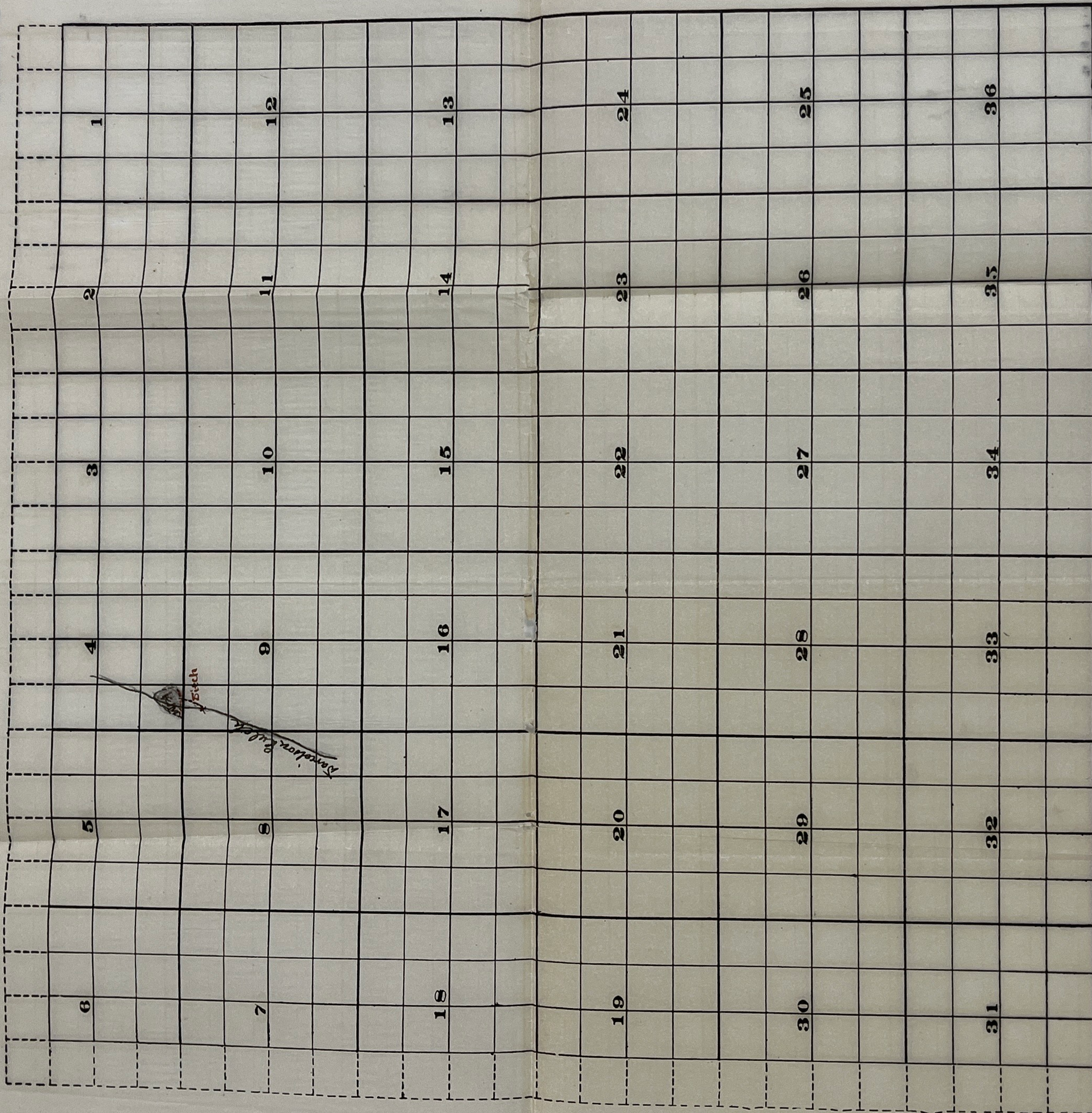

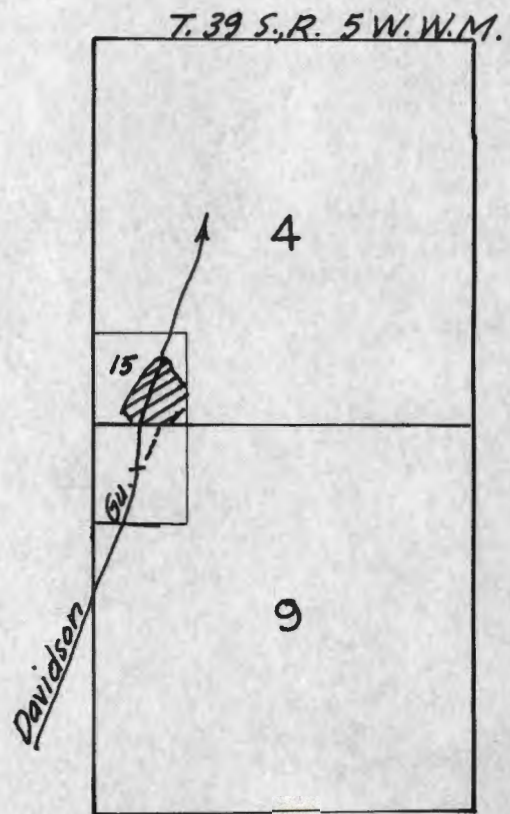

Corner of Section 9, being within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, Township 39 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority for irrigation of a certain 13.0 acres within SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

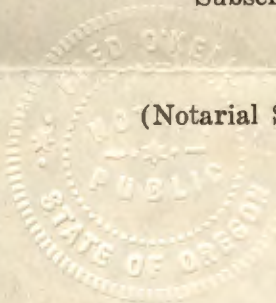

Dear Mr. Harrison:

This will acknowledge return of your transfer application No. T-3417 and map. To date, the transfer application No. T-3359 filed by John R. Palmer has not been returned to this office.

As mentioned in my letter of June 17, 1976, addressed to Mr. Palmer, a copy of which was mailed to you, the certificate No. 31683 evidences the right to the use of 0.17 cubic foot of water per second from Davidson Gulch for the irrigation of 13.0 acres. Our records presently locate this 13.0 acres under the right in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 5 West, W. M., which according to information recently submitted, is erroneous.

Before we can consider approval of transfers involving the aforementioned right, the total acreage claimed by interested parties can not exceed the 13.0 acres allowed. Since our records do not define ownership of the right, it will be necessary for the parties claiming this right to be in agreement as to its location.

Therefore, we will hold action on your proposed transfer No. T-3417 and the transfer No. T-3359 proposed by Mr. Palmer until we have received an agreement or other legal article advising us of the interest each party has in the water right evidenced by the certificate No. 31683.

I, John R. Palmer know the water has been used beneficially on this land for many consecutive years. The tax records show that in 1975 alone 400 bales of hay was taken off the property which could not possibly have been done without irrigation. Davidson Gulch runs right through the property and is the only possible source of irrigation there could have been.

I request that you correct your records to reflect the place of use of this water as being in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ instead of in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$.

This will acknowledge return of the transfer application No. 3359 in the name of John R. Palmer along with the map and affidavits advising of the location of Davidson Creek.

If the lands irrigated, point of diversion and Davidson Gulch were erroneously located in the right perfected under the permit No. 2783, only a change in point of diversion may be intended by Mr. Palmer.

I am enclosing a print of the inchoate map which shows a point of diversion from a draw located 275 feet South and 1,800 feet West from the northwest corner of Section 9, Township 39 South, Range 5 West. If this is the location of the point of diversion perfected under the terms of the permit No. 2783 for lands East of the Gulch, this point should be located as such in item No. 4 of the transfer form.

If the acreage irrigated was erroneously located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ instead of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Item No. 5 should be amended to list the 13.0 acres in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$.

We will also need a statement from John R. Palmer advising us of his knowledge of use of water from Davidson Gulch along with his request to correct our records. This information may be supplied on a separate sheet or in the remarks section of the application.

Your application for a change in point of diversion of water from Davidson Creek has been filed as transfer number 3417. The map and fees of \$35.00 were also received.

According to your map, the present point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9 instead of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ presently noted in item 4 and the acreage you intend to irrigate is within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4 instead of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ presently noted in item 5. If the map is correct, item 5 may be amended to be in agreement.
