

Dear Mr. Favares:

Thank you for your letter requesting water rights information.

As mentioned in my letter of September 10, 1974, the certificate that was issued to the District evidences the right to the use of water from Crabtree Creek for irrigation purposes. Our records show that your two acres was found to be irrigated, among other lands, when we made our final proof inspection in 1964; therefore, a quantity of not to exceed 0.03 cubic foot of water per second from the Creek could be appropriated to irrigate this piece if the right is still valid.

The right to the use of water from Crabtree Creek for the irrigation of your two acres will continue to be valid but all or any portion of it can be lost through intentional abandonment or through nonuse for a period of five successive years. In other words, if you wish to retain your whole water right, the water must be used at least once every five years on the entire two acres.

A copy of certificate 31898 and a print of a portion of the map made in connection with the final proof survey is available upon request and on receipt of a copying fee of \$1.60. This certificate describes the project found irrigated in 1964 and does not include any changes in the places of use of water since our survey. A superseding certificate showing these changes will be issued to the District at a later date.



Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter dated August 5, 1966, and legal description requesting water right information appurtenant to the land described by the legal description.

It appears that the bulk of the land described by the legal description is covered by rights in the name of Lacombe Irrigation District. The Lacombe Irrigation District's filings are covered by permit No. 19629, and certificate 31898 has been issued in evidence of this completed right with priority dates of January 20, 1932, and December 22, 1938.

The certificate of water right allowed 25.2 acres in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and 25.8 acres in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 21, T. 11 S., R. 1 E., W. M. I believe the district is presently proposing to transfer some of this to other areas within their district and have obtained signed statements of permission. The transfer application is not yet complete and the transfer may be from lands just north of those you inquire about.

I am enclosing a portion of the final proof survey map for the Lacombe Irrigation District which shows the area that you would be interested in.

Ayers, Secretary-Treasurer of the Lacombe Irrigation District has handed to me your letter dated the 2nd inst., where you call attention to the requirements that the district must show some documentary evidence as having complied with Oregon laws relative to the appropriation of waters within the district's boundaries in connection with its application for an easement crossing C & C lands.

Please be advised that the Lacombe Irrigation District has two applications on file with the State Engineer for appropriation of waters for irrigation of lands within their district. One of these was filed on January 20, 1932 for the appropriation of 62½ cubic feet per second of water of Crabtree Fork of Santiam River for the irrigation of an area not to exceed 5000 acres.

The other application was filed in the State Engineer's office on December 22, 1938 and has appropriation of waters of Carter Creek and unnamed streams flowing through the Lacombe Irrigation District, seepage return and overflow waters from the district's system, and water finding its way into the main canal between the intake in the NE¼ SE¼, Section 25, Township 11 south, Range 1 east, W. M., and the east boundary of the district. in the amount of 25 second feet.

These applications are in good standing and are being held up by this office pending certain field investigations to determine the quantity of water available during a low water flow. While the delay in the issuance of the permits may seem somewhat irregular, it is our experience that in the development of irrigation projects the size of that included within the Lacombe Irrigation District that it is common practice to withhold the issuance of a permit until more definite information is obtained as in this case.



If the necessary surveys have been completed so that a map can be prepared and the above information can be added to the application, I will be glad to return the application to you for completion, endorsed so that in order to retain its priority it may be returned within any reasonable time limit.

As you of course know, the application still stands in your name on the records. No doubt it should be assigned to the Lacomb Irrigation District, and in order that this may be done it will be necessary for you to submit an assignment of the application to the district for recording in the Miscellaneous Records of the State Engineer. I am enclosing a form which may be used for this purpose, the fee for recording of which is \$1.00.

The fees required for the use of water for 2,000 acres are as follows:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 6th inst.

It is my understanding that the irrigation district to which you refer includes the lands which are covered by the above application in the name of H. C. Pyle, Trustee for a group of Lacombe farmers, for permit to appropriate the waters of Crabtree Creek, a tributary of the South Fork of Santiam River. This application is being held in this office pending the applicants furnishing a detailed description of the lands to be irrigated.

This application is for the appropriation of 62.5 second-feet of water for the irrigation of 5,000 acres of land, Section 47-502 Oregon Code 1950 reads as follows:

"If for agricultural purposes, it shall give the legal subdivisions of the land and the acreage to be irrigated, as near as may be."

The Rules and Regulations of the State Engineer require that a permit shall show the acreage to be irrigated in each smallest legal subdivision. A legal subdivision is a 40-acre tract, a lot, or block, or in case the lands have been platted, the smallest subdivision of this plat would be the smallest legal subdivision.

Our courts have held that where water is appurtenant to a smallest legal subdivision, that such water can be used on any part of that subdivision. For example, if there are 40 acres in the subdivision and 10 acres of water right, this water can be used on any part of this 40-acre tract. However, if an owner has 40 acres of land which are situated part in each of two different forties, and only 10 acres of water right, he must set out in the permit the acreage to be irrigated in each of these forties, or in each of the two legal subdivisions; then such water can only be used to irrigate the stated area in each of such legal subdivisions. For example, if a man owns the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of a certain section, township and range and he has a 10-acre water right in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and a 10-acre water right in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , he could not use all of this water on 20 acres in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  or 20 in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ . However, he could use 10 acres of water right on any 10 acres in each of the respective 40-acre tracts.

It is suggested that in your application under the paragraph headed "Remarks" that you set forth a statement to the effect that while the application asks for water for the irrigation of certain acreage within certain forty-acre tracts, it is the intention not to irrigate in any one year acreage in excess of that set out but it is the intention to apply this water to any of the lands within the smallest legal subdivisions as above set forth, or some such language, in order to show the intent.

After the district has been organized, Mr. Pyle should then assign his application to the district.

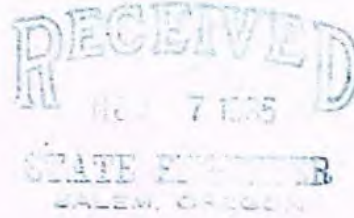

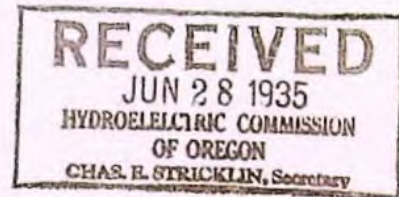

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 12th requesting a clarification of some of the points which were discussed at our meeting at Lacomb last Saturday evening.

The question before your people is whether or not they desire to organize an irrigation district. Assuming that it is their desire to organize a district for the purpose of borrowing Federal funds to construct the irrigation works, then the first problem is to work out a description of the boundaries of the district. This can follow section lines or any description which a surveyor could go out and locate the boundaries. It might be found desirable to include lands within the boundaries which are not irrigable, however it would be my opinion that you should not extend the area so as to include lands which are not irrigable unless it shortens the description.

After the district is organized and it is found desirable to issue bonds and you decide to issue limited liability bonds, then the lands which are to be irrigated, and which it is desired to place under the bond lien, are selected. The usual procedure in selecting the lands is for the Board of Directors of the district to sit down with each landowner and determine the amount of lands which he desires to irrigate, then the lien docket only prescribes those lands which are to be irrigated. For example: If you have 160 acres of land and you only desire to irrigate 40 acres, the lien is placed against the 40 acres which you desire to irrigate, the balance of the land is in the district, but is not subject to assessments for the payment of interest and principal or operation or maintenance.

After the lien docket has been made out by the Board of Directors it must be submitted to the State Reclamation Commission for their approval and then the Board of Directors sits as a board of equalization to hear the objections of the landowners for the inclusion or exclusion of lands to be placed under the bond lien. After the period of hearing objections has expired, the Board of Directors file this lien docket with the County Clerk, and within a certain

length of time the landowners can appeal to the circuit court of the county in which the lands lie if they are not satisfied with the Board of Directors findings.

You may have 2,000 acres of land within an irrigation district and in that area it is possible to irrigate only 1,000 acres, and where the limited liability bonds are issued, only those lands which are to be irrigated and placed under the lien docket are subject to assessments.

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the Irrigation District Laws of Oregon for 1929 and all supplements thereto. It is suggested that you read these very carefully, particularly as to the method of organizing, and also as to the issuance of limited liability bonds which you will find on Page 31, known as the Bonding Act of 1927 and which act was amended in 1933. I also respectfully call your attention to Sections 1, 2 and 3 on Page 40, which is now codified as Section 48-301, Oregon Code 1930, which provides for the construction of irrigation works and paying for the same by assessments.

You will remember that the question was asked at the meeting last Saturday evening as to what limitations the Board of Directors has as to the amount of the annual assessments which are to be levied against the lands in the district. Upon reading the above act you will note that before the work can be constructed by this method, that the petitions must be filed with the Board of Directors having been signed by the holder or holders of title or evidence of title, representing a majority of the acreage within the district, then an election must be held which must receive a majority vote before the district can proceed under this plan of the construction of the irrigation works.

In answer to your question as to whether the waters can be switched around from one 10 acre-tract to another, it is believed that this can be best illustrated by an example. If you own 40 acres of land within an irrigation district and have a water right for only 10 acres, you would only be permitted to use water for 10 acres. Unless this 10 acres was specifically described in the lien docket, it would seem from our court decisions that you could irrigate any 10 acres within the 40 acre-tract but you could not irrigate the entire 40 acres in one year.

In the issuance of a permit by the State Engineer, the water is made appurtenant, in the above case, to a 40 acre-tract and you would have the right to divert and use the water sufficient to irrigate 10 acres.

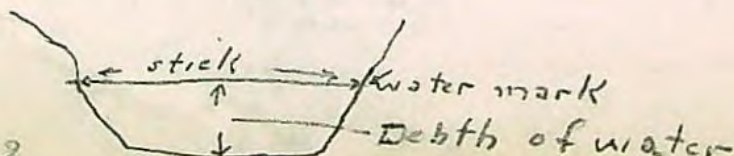

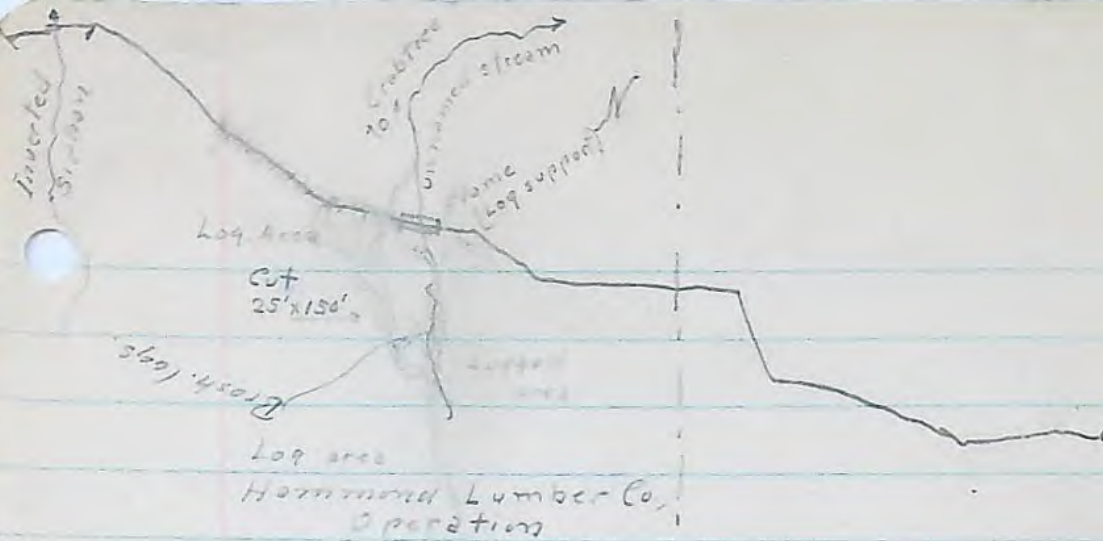
