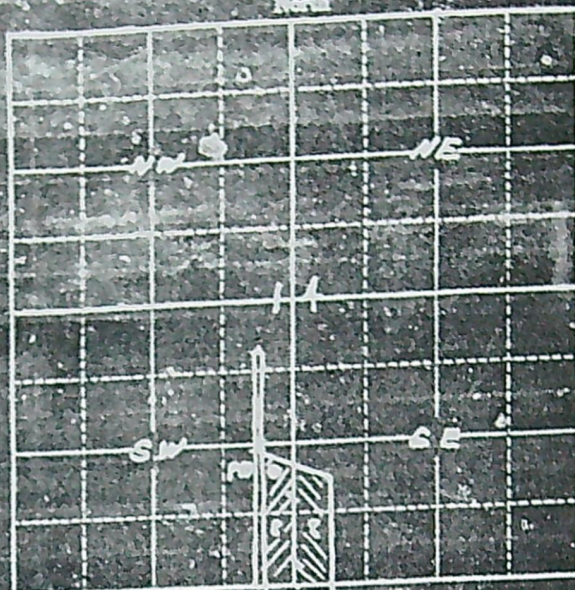

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:

Your Registration Statement and the attached Certificate of Registration have been recorded in this office. You should hold this original document as evidence of your claim for water rights.

The Registration Statement and the Certificate of Registration are each a part of the same document. The Certificate of Registration is found on the last page of the Registration Statement.

As provided in ORS 537.610, you, the registrant, are now, prima facie, entitled to the right to appropriate the ground water and apply it to beneficial use to the extent and in the manner disclosed in the recorded Registration Statement until such time as the final water rights are determined by adjudication.

Each holder of a Certificate of Registration is required by law to file an annual well report with this office. This report must give water level measurements, an estimate of the quantity of water pumped, and other information concerning our ground-water resources. For your convenience, we are transmitting a report form so that you will be able to record the necessary information as it is obtained. These reports must be filed at the end of the water year, which is September 30 of each calendar year. Additional report forms for next year will be mailed to you at a later date.

If your land is sold, an assignment of this registration document to the new owner should be recorded in this office. Assignment blanks will be furnished upon request.
