- Diversion point: 1 1/2 inch pvc pipe placed in small pool in Silver Creek.
- 2) Pipe: The system consists of 1 1/2 inch pvc pipe main feeder line from spring as shown on Water registration map with smaller feeder lines approximately 1 inch to the place of use.





BEGINNING at a point on the Westerly line of the Southeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter of Section 5, Township 20 South, Range 11 West of the Willamette Meridian, said point being on an existing East-West fence line, said point also being North 0° 47' East 397 feet more or less from the Southeast corner of the Southeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter of said Section 5; thence along said Westerly line North 0° 47' East 762.3 feet to an existing fence line; thence along said existing fence line and its projection South 89° 38' East 135 feet more or less to the center of South Canary Road; thence along the center of South Canary Road South 86° 11' East 177.9 feet; thence South 16° 50' East 457.5 feet; thence South 5° 30' East 338.8 feet to the projection of an existing East-West fence line; thence along said existing fence line and its projection Morth 87° West 488.6 feet more or less to the point of beginning, in Danalas County, Oregon. EXCEPT any portion lying within South Canary Road. in Douglas County, Oregon. EXCEPT any portion lying within South Canary Road.

Robarts and L. Roscoe

The tug L. Roscoe was owned by O. W. Hurd and was built at Gray's Harbor. The tug was 90 feet long, 22 foot beam, 9½ feet deep, her gross tonnage 117 and her net tonnage 75. The boat was named for Hurd's son, Roscoe.

The tug Robarts was owned by Kyle and Sons. It was built at Eel River in 1886. It was 80 feet in length and had 100 horsepower in steam.

Both of these tugs were used on the river for towing boats in and out over the bar, and for anything necessary in conducting the business of the two companies.

First Bridge at Ten Mile

The first bridge across Ten-Mile Creek was built in 1912. Until that time, long before there was a Coast Highway, the few travelers coming that way had to ford the creek. That year, 1912, lumber was sawed at the Porter Mill in Florence. The heavy timbers and all were cut the right length, then rafted, and the tug Roscoe towed it up the coast to the mouth of the creek and cast off. It drifted ashore where it was picked up and a bridge built a little up stream from the present day bridge. It was there until recently. D.S.H.

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THE WILKES FAMILY

Ada Wilkes Cleveland Tells Story of Arrival in 1889 and of the Many Years of Pioneering Near the Mouth of Fiddle Creek

We came to the Siuslaw in the spring of 1889, from Eugene. Father had farmed in the Willamette valley for several years, but hearing so much about the Siuslaw he decided to go down and see. He filed on 160 acres south of Glenada, and a short time after, we moved down. We hired a team and wagon to take us as far as Seaton, and from there went on the little river steamer, Mink, to Florence.

They shipped the organ, sewing machine, and most of the heavy pieces, by train from Eugene to Yaquina, now Newport, then to Florence by boat, and then hauled out from Glenada to the new home on a sled, I suppose, as the roads were mostly trails."

Most of the land from Glenada to Woahink Lake was homesteaded that spring.

Fred Anderson had taken up land in the area where North Beach is now, and another place near the mouth of Fiddle Creek. The pre-emption law was going out of effect so he couldn't hold both places, and wanted to sell one. Father bought the Fiddle Creek place and we moved there in March 1890.

Mr. Anderson had a very good house for those days. It was built of lumber he had gathered at the beach, towed up the outlet and

on across the lake with a row boat, then hauled it on a sled, half a mile, to the building place. The house had a large living room, two bedrooms, and an attic room. Father built a kitchen and woodshed, and mother papered the rooms with newspapers. It was very cozy, even to a fireplace. We lived in that little house for fourteen years.

I was too small to remember about moving, but I can remember the skunk cabbage was blooming and I thought it was so pretty, so bright and yellow. I still think it is pretty at a distance.

Father bought four cows and a horse from Mr. Anderson. The cows were scared of mother and us girls for they had never seen anyone but Mr. Anderson, and didn't know what we were.

Mr. Anderson had cleared a small patch for a garden, and father cleared some more and set out an orchard and berries. Then it was more like a home.

Several families moved on Fiddle Creek about the time we moved there: Mr. Mitchell, the Houghtons, Gibsons, Youngs, Miles, Darius and Chas. Vanderberg, and there may have been some I haven't mentioned.

It was truly pioneer days with no roads or school. But it wasn't long until a school was organ*In 1927 I purchased the Wilkes ranch and began dairy farming. This was the place the first Ada Post Office originated having been named after Wilkes' young daughter, Ada.

On August 21, 1925 Millie and I got another big husky son we named Merle Dean. He is a college graduate and a pretty sharp fellow. He has a wife, Shirley (Whitman) Miles and a daughter, Teresa Lorraine.

On April 2, 1931 we got a daughter, Elsie Marie that we admire very much. Our last was a beautiful little girl that looked very much like her mother and died at birth on October 19, 1932.

October 1942 I got a call from Reedsport to come file saws up Loon Lake for Jack Baldrich at \$15.00 a day which was \$5.00 a day more than I had been getting. There was a time about then that tiges got up to where a man had a little left over at the end of the month that the cost of living and taxes didn't gobble up. During this time I was able to pay my ranch off. Except for the time I worked at Loon Lake while my son, Dannie ran the ranch, I both worked out full time in the woods and ran the ranch. Part of that time we had some hired help.

Dan, Jr. and I started gyppo logging in the spring of 1945 and continued for fifteen years.

On July 6, 1959 Millie was killed by a logging truck. On February 14, 1960 I married Edna (Fountain) Johnson whom I had known since 1914 but hadn't seen often except at the Siuslaw Pioneer picnics. Earl Johnson, her first husband and I were very good friends before he married and worked his way in the woods up the Wildcat and finally settled at Vaughan.

Edna and Earl had three boys, Arthur the oldest, Wayne and then Larry. Wayne and Larry both served in World War II. At that time Arthur already had a wife and daughter and was looking for a son to showed up a beautiful daughter and still is. Their next was also a beautiful daughter. Wayne started his family with a beautiful daughter and then got a fine son who is a good preacher and also teacher at Junction City, Oregon. Larry and Lola have a son and a daughter who both married fine partners and have their own families.

The spring of 1966 Edna and I sold the farm to Mr. and Mrs. Karl Hensen. We moved to Glenada buying the Gallo home which also is the place my father loved when he died and where my brother Ed once lived.

We are enjoying life at our home surrounded by flowers, shrubs, garden and a shop and hope to spend a few more years here.
