


Dear Sir:

Enclosed is the final proof in connection with the incomplete water right represented by your permit No. 20288 granting a right to the use of 0.21 c.f.s. of the waters of South Umpqua River, for irrigation.

The data contained in the proof, which is based on an inspection and survey of your project made by a representative of this department, defines the extent to which your water right has been completed within the terms of the permit. The proof should be dated, and signed by you on the bottom of the page.

Upon receipt of the signed proof accompanied by the statutory recording fee in the amount of \$1, a certificate of water right will be issued confirming the right thereunder and will be forwarded to you after recording in Douglas County.

Dear Mr. Brown:

In response to your letter of recent date regarding Permit No. 20288, please be advised that according to the records in this office, your permit is in good standing as you have filed all of the forms and reports necessary at this time.

Action on the permit is being held pending the final proof survey by a representative of this office for the purpose of determining the number of acres actually irrigated and the quantity of water applied. After this survey, final proof may be made and a certificate issued.

Since there are a great number of surveys before the office and our personnel is limited, it is impossible to state exactly when the survey will be made. However, the permit you hold is valid evidence of your right, so long as you continue to use the water, until such time as the survey can be made and the certificate issued.



Dear Mr. Brown:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of June 3rd and your check in the amount of \$15 for which our official receipt No. 2669 is enclosed.

From a further examination of your application it is noted that you propose to transfer a 0.7 acre water right from the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, W. M., under your water right evidenced by a certificate recorded at page 9818 in the name of Mrs. J. O. Metz. From an examination of this certificate of water right issued to Mrs. Metz it appears that the right is for the irrigation of 5 acres in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and 5 acres in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, said Section 9. The 0.7 acre may be transferred from either the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ or the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the application should be amended accordingly. For your convenience in making such amendment the application and map are being returned herewith.

With reference to that part of your letter relative to your permit to appropriate additional water from South Umpqua River for the irrigation of 16.2 acres, your brief outline of the present status of your permit is substantially correct. In other words, you have filed all necessary forms required and the matter is being held in abeyance pending a survey of the lands involved by a representative of this office.

This acknowledges receipt of Form C, being notice of complete application of water under your Permit No. 20288.

Pursuant to your report and in line with the general practice of this office, a survey will be made at a later date for the purpose of checking the acreage actually irrigated. 


