





**This Is to Certify, That** MRS. J. O. METZ and W. FRANK BROWN

of Canyonville, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of South Umpqua River a tributary of Umpqua River for the purpose of irrigation under Permit No. 7666 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from November 16, 1926

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.13 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

On March 5, 1987, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Tommy M. and Nadean E. Smith for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from South Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 24474, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the names of Mrs. J.O. Metz and W. Frank Brown, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.065 cubic foot per second from South Umpqua River for irrigation of 4.2 acres in NE 1/4 SW 1/4 and 0.8 acre in Lot 14 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, with a date of priority of November 16, 1926.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located North 53 degrees 55 minutes East, 3309 feet from the Southwest Corner of Section 9, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom to a point located 235 feet South and 2260 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 9, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, and to change the place of use to irrigation of 5.0 acres in NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of said Section 9.

Gary L. Ball, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion are approved, without loss of priority.

Approval of a water right transfer application does not confirm the status of the right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water appropriated at the new well, together with that appropriated at the old well, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old well under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.065 cubic foot per second. POD

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install measuring devices:

That the pump system shall include an access port for measuring the water level;

That the pump system shall include an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

*not req'd*

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the subject water right is hereby severed from the place of use described in Certificate 24474, and shall be beneficially used as authorized by this order on or before October 1, 1988.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the right to appropriate water from the well described in Certificate 24474 is hereby canceled, and water shall be appropriated from the new well on or before October 1, 1988.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 24474, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.







Under the circumstances outlined at considerable length in your letter dated September 1st I believe the best procedure is to grant you an extension of time of one year within which to make complete application of water under Permit No. 7686. The record indicates that at least a part of the land has been irrigated and you are unquestionably exercising reasonable diligence in the completion of the appropriation.

You have asked for an extension of time of two years for the reason that your present tenant does not take active interest in the development and he will have possession of the place for about another year. It probably would not be advisable for you to allow the matter to remain dormant for the whole year, but rather it would be advisable to take whatever steps are necessary to make the application of water to all or a part of the land during the coming summer. The point I would like to impress upon you is that you should exercise reasonable diligence and the indisposition of your tenant to proceed in the matter is not a valid excuse for delay.

You are correct in your understanding that it is not necessary to construct any dams or ditches if these are not necessary in making the appropriation. Blanks for the purpose of furnishing a description of dams and ditches are included in the form so that the form will be applicable to projects where such works are utilized. In making proof it is only necessary to describe in detail the works which are actually constructed for the purpose of utilizing water.

This will advise you that we are extending the time for complete application of water under this permit until October 1, 1931.

Dear Sir, - I'm in a quandary, and while it is not my way to burden, or bore strangers with my troubles, I know of no other way to get my case before you.

Since my husband's death nearly three years ago, I have made my home in Portland. have not been on the ranch many times since his death.

In the fall of 1928 the tenant went along the river while the river was at its lowest, and selected a location for the "irrigating pump" that he thought was a better place than Mr Metz had mentioned in his application for the "water right". I did not suppose it would make any difference to any one granting the "water right" if the pump were changed a little, so I hired it set (where the tenant selected) in <sup>spring</sup> 1929. This summer when I was down I found that the pump had not been set for me. It is set down near the water (where it has to be taken out before high water) and the tenant informed me that it would have to be "changed".

to another location. <sup>It</sup> Needlers to say that I was vexed. But that was not all. I did not have the money. It cost me enough the first time it was set. And the pipe that led the water from the pump to the field, under the road was buried. I presume eight feet in the deepest place. which would have to be taken out.

I think the tenant is an honest, and good man. But no manager. and if he were there ten years I do not believe he would get the water on <sup>all</sup> the ground. he seems to be no hand with machinery. doesn't even drive an automobile.

That pump + pipe has cost me nearly \$800. dollars. beside the power to run it. which we had. we use the tractor.

Now Mr Super, you may think I'm asking a lot, since you have already extended the time one year. to ask for two years extension. The tenants lease expires Oct 1, 1931 (one more year) If I get a man on there when he is gone, who knows how to do things he would not ask me to put that pump in when every thing is there and lined up.

A year ago when I was down the tenant had the pipe (which is an 8 in 20 gage galvanized slip-joint) used on top of the ground laid out 600 feet from where the under ground pipe comes out. And at the end of the pipe the ground showed badly washed out, but I do not know how much ground was really flooded. Then in another place where he had a big potato patch and garden it showed had been flooded. I wrote him last week to see if he could sign as witness for eight or ten acres. He said "that we had not complied with the law, that we hadn't dug titches and run water through the ditches as the law required, or as the papers state must be done."

B.) Refer to Dam construction (C) Head gate (D) canal. He has it in his head that we have to make <sup>showing</sup> on all of these evidently. Ours all comes under (F) am I not right about this?? In reality I feel that as much as has been done that I ought to be able to get my final papers for eight or ten acres, then as the matter is pushed back on the field I could make application for more from Mr. Super. 
*P.S. I do not know the size of pipe a five in pump would require for its out let. The intake would require a six in pipe however. J. O. M.*
