A fish screened 0.5 Hp submersible pump delivers water via 1-inch ABS buried line to a buried 1500-gallon ABS tank. From tank water is pumped through totalizing flow meter and filtration system to supply the whole house and landscape. The second domestic expanded was not developed.

Regarding OWRD Permit # S-54722, ODFW has determined the fish screen at the point-of-diversion (43.311111, -123.192742) meets current fish protection criteria, and fish bypass devices are not necessary. This approval is contingent on the following: current conditions remain unchanged, screens are installed so effective screen area is submerged during operation, the screen is regularly inspected and maintained to ensure it remains in working order (including debris removal), and the screen is annually inspected when it is not in use. Thank you.
