NOTICE OF CERTIFICATE ISSUANCE

Attached are certificates that confirm water rights established under the terms of permits issued by this department. The water rights are now appurtenant to the specific place where the use was established as described by the certificates. The water rights are limited to a specific amount of water, but not more than can be beneficially used for the purposes stated within the certificates.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within **60 days of the mailing date stated above** as specified by ORS 183.484(2).

This statement of judicial review rights is required under ORS 536.075; it does not alter or add to existing review rights or create review rights that are not otherwise provided by law.

Under ORS 537.260 and 537.270, a water right certificate may be contested before the Water Resources Department within three (3) months of the date it is issued. If a certificate is contested, the qualifying contestant shall be offered an administrative hearing.

Oregon law does not allow the Director to reissue a certificate because of a change in the ownership of the appurtenant place of use. The water must be controlled and not wasted. To change the location of the point of diversion, the character of use, or the location of use requires the advance approval of the Water Resources Director.

If any portion of this water right is not used for five or more consecutive years, that portion of the right may be subject to forfeiture according to ORS 540.610. Land enrolled in a Federal Reserve Program is not subject to forfeiture during the period of enrollment. Other exceptions to forfeiture are explained in ORS 540.610.

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND LRM RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-6128 WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE SUPPLY TO BE APPROPRIATED FROM CAMPBELL CREEK AND RESERVOIR NO. 1 CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-6159, tributaries of TUALATIN RIVER, for the purpose of OUT OF SEASON IRRIGATION OF 51.8 ACRES.

This right has been perfected under Permit 43174. The date of priority is MARCH 10, 1977. This right is limited to 0.65 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The use allowed herein may be made any time between October 1 and April 30 when water can be put to beneficial use by irrigation for immediate crop growth.

exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the period of May 1 to September 30, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.0 acre-foot per acre for each acre irrigated during the period from October 1 to April 30, provided further that the right allowed herein shall not exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated in any one year. The use of water during the period from October 1 to March 31 as authorized herein shall not establish priority of right as against future appropriations of surface water for beneficial uses or for storage for such beneficial uses, other than similar rights for irrigation from October 1 to March 31. The water user shall record and submit annually a report of all water used for irrigation during the period of October 1 through April 30 of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.




I have received your request to complete the processing of Transfer Application No. T-7050, on behalf of Mr. Malensky.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

Pursuant to a request by Mr. Verboort, I reviewed the Claim of Beneficial Use, Site Report and Map (Report) submitted to determine if the use of water was perfected under the terms and conditions of the Order of the Water Resources Director approving Transfer Application T-7050. A Proposed Certificate of Water Right along with instructions in regards to petitioning the Director to reconsider the contents of the proposed is enclosed.

At the time of issuance of Certificates confirming the original use of water under Applications G-5800 and 49266, Certificates 51806 and 51797 inadvertently described land which was to be deleted in favor of a right issued in approval of Application G-10319. This was authorized by a statement included in the remarks section of Application G-13019. The map attached to Certificates 51806 and 51797 does not illustrate the land in question, however due to an over site by staff, the land was not deleted from the final certificates. Please note the land in question described by Certificate No. 51806, is now described by the remaining right Certificate 75273, the portion of Certificate No. 51806 not modified by the order approving Transfer No. T-7050.

I have prepared an affidavit, when properly completed and returned to this office, will authorize the Director to enter orders canceling the rights as evidenced by Certificates 75273 and 51797, in conflict with Certificate 62491. If requests, authorizing cancellations of the portions of the rights in conflict are not received, you are required to exercise your oldest priority right and all other rights shall be diminished to supplemental (Oregon Administrative Rule 690-015-0045).

The quantity of water associated with the remaining right Certificate No. 75273 issued due to the approval of Transfer No. T-7050 and the order was prorated based upon the number of acres of the original right of 139.6 acres. The Department will entertain a request to correct the quantity of water associated with the order approving Transfer No. 7050 along with the executed, submitted affidavit authorizing the cancellation of the conflicting water right under certificates No.'s 51797 and 75273.

Above, I have referenced the record holders of Permit No.'s G-8144, G-8145, G-8585, 43172 and 43174. Enclosed are assignment forms for use to request the change in ownership of the permits. Please consider which permits belong in which names or variations thereof and submit the requests to this office along with the required fees and our records will reflect the new owners accordingly.

Permit No.'s G-8145, 43172 and 43174 contain the following condition:

"Provided further, the permittee shall record and submit annually a report of all water used for irrigation during the period of October 1 through April 30 of each year."

In review of the files, I find no evidence the permittee has complied with this requirement. Enclosed are forms to report when the water was applied for the use of water. If it is not possible to provide the information since use was made, I am requesting a statement, in writing, that beneficial use of water was made during the periods of October 1 through April 30, and you are aware of the requirements of submitting annual reports and will make every effort to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit requiring annual reports of the water use for out of season irrigation use.

With the thought you will address the issues described in this letter, I am enclosing proposed certificates of water right, in addition to Transfer No. T-7050, for Permits No. G-8144, G-8145, G-8585, 43172 and 43174. If you comply with the requirements of this letter I will consider making a recommendation to the Director to issue Certificates as proposed or as modified by approved petitions for reconsideration.

On March 10, 1977, we received your various maps, total fees of \$424.40, and eight applications requesting permits.

Applications numbered 55460 and G-7909 request a permit to use 0.37 cubic foot of water per second from Campbell Creek, an unnamed drain ditch, and a reservoir for primary irrigation and a well for supplemental irrigation of 29.77 acres throughout the entire year. Application numbered 55641 requests a permit to use 1.46 cubic feet of water per second from an unnamed stream and a reservoir for supplemental irrigation of 116.6 acres outside of the normal irrigation season.

Application numbered 55642 is requesting a permit to use 1.37 cubic feet of water per second from Campbell Creek and a reservoir and 0.67 cubic foot of water per second from an unnamed stream and reservoir for supplemental irrigation outside of the normal irrigation season for 163.2 acres. Application numbered G-7912 is requesting a permit to use 780 gallons of water per minute from a well for supplemental irrigation outside of the normal irrigation season for 279.8 acres.

Application numbered G-7906 requests a permit to use 0.88 cubic foot of water per second from four wells for irrigation of 70.15 acres throughout the entire year. Application numbered G-7907 requests the use of 0.88 cubic foot of water per second from four wells for irrigation of 65.11 acres throughout the entire year, and 0.22 cubic foot of water per second from well number 4 for fish culture. Application numbered G-7908 requests the use of 600 gallons of water per minute from a well for fish culture in LRM Pond.

You may recall that there has been some delay in issuing permits in approval of these applications because of the request for irrigation outside of the normal irrigation season. I am sure you are aware that the normal irrigation season in your vicinity begins May 1 and concludes September 30. It has been substantiated that on many years it may be necessary to begin irrigation in the Tualatin Basin as early

as mid-March and often times through April. This is especially true for shallow seeded or shallow rooted plants.

Much of the data which we collected to substantiate beneficial use outside of the irrigation season indicated a need to apply water for chemical distribution. The use of water for chemical distribution is not classed as irrigation and if water is needed for chemical distribution, a permit should be requested specifically for this purpose.

Another use which was requested as irrigation was storing water in the soil for future use. It has been determined that permits for irrigation to build the soil moisture profile within the Willamette Valley would not be issued. Fall rains normally begin in mid-September and end by mid-November. Soil is often at its maximum storage capacity. Additional water placed on the soil either runs off or percolates into a ground water body.

Of the data collected, irrigation for immediate crop growth outside of the normal irrigation season has been determined to be the only beneficial use of water as irrigation. Therefore, your applications which have requested out-of-season use or year-round use, together with your existing rights, would allow for use of water from the various sources for beneficial use or immediate crop growth at any time that such use is beneficial.

Since the irrigation season has been set by certain Court Decree, it has been determined that out-of-season irrigation rights shall not have priority against other rights for beneficial use but shall establish priority only against similar rights for irrigation. However, since many Court Decrees throughout the Willamette Valley begin the irrigation season on April 1, beneficial use of water for irrigation during the month of April will establish priority as against all other rights from the same source.


We have further concluded that it would be very difficult to prove beneficial use of water in order for a Certificate to be issued. Therefore as a condition of your out-of-season permits and year-round permits, it will be necessary that you submit a report annually of all beneficial use of water for irrigation outside of the normal irrigation season. If annual reports are not made, the right for out-of-season use will not be confirmed.

All of your applications as referred to herein are satisfactory and

Dear Sir:

A. We request that we be allowed to irrigate our crops, between Sept. 30th. and May 1st. of each year, as well as the rest of the year.

Currently our major crops are black raspberries, 120 acres, strawberries, 60 acres and grain crops. Our row crops are routinely rotated over all our property, so this request is for all of our irrigable property included under various water rights.

The needs are as follows:

1. Black Raspberries:

It is recommended that potassium fertilizer be put on in the months of February or March. The purpose of this is to avoid winter leaching of the fertilizer. Substantial water is required to leach the fertilizer into the root zone by the first part of April. Some years that are not near as dry as the winter of 1976-1977 would require irrigation as a supplement to rainfall to leach the fertilizer.

Black raspberries begin to grow in March of each year. The most critical period for production is between March 15th. and April 20th. During this period of time the fruit spurs are formed, and the vigor of the plant determines the number of fruit spurs, the number of blossoms and the size of the fruit. We also put on about 100 pounds of actual nitrogen between March 15th. and April 20th. The fertilizer is ammonium nitrate, which is very fast acting. This cultural practice helps give the plants a strong boost during this period of time.

Water is an absolute NEED prior to May 1st. The moisture content of the soil must be high during March and April, and water, either rain or irrigation - has to leach the ammonium nitrate into the root zone at this critical period.

Lack of adequate moisture as required during March and April - in a year like 1977 - could reduce our crop potential by as much as 40%. It is not unusual for our fields to yield 2 tons per acre. A 40% loss would be a 1600 pound reduction at an expected cannery price of 50¢ a pound. It is very possible that not being able to irrigate our black raspberries prior to May 1st. in some years could cost us \$800. an acre! We absolutely need the right to irrigate this crop prior to May 1st. of each year.

2. Strawberries:

This crop has a critical need for moisture from March through Sept. We have experienced that strawberries require good moisture at all

times down to a depth of at least 2 feet. If the top 6" gets dry at any time between March and July 1st., the size of the fruit is definitely affected. It is also very possible the number of fruit spurs would be reduced if the plant becomes short of moisture in March and April. We would estimate that lack of moisture between March and May 1st., could reduce our strawberry crop between 20% to 40%. The economics is not only the loss of the potential crop of about (20% x 6 tons x 25¢ lb.) \$600 - \$1200 per acre, but also the problem of keeping pickers to pick the smaller and fewer berries.

3. Wheat:

Wheat may be short of moisture, and may run out before May 1, 1977. If we could put approximately 4" of water per acre, we could fertilize our wheat one time at a near normal rate. Based on facts stated at the meeting Feb. 16, 1977 at the Hillsboro Junior High School, we could anticipate an additional yield of at least 20 bushels of wheat per acre and up to 28 bushels per acre. This would give us additional income of between \$60 and \$84 per acre on the irrigated wheat. We realize we could not irrigate all of our wheat in any given year but our wells and ponds would allow us to irrigate a substantial acreage.

4. Planting - Strawberries and Black Raspberries:

We always plant strawberries as early in the spring as the weather allows. March or early April is very desirable because the plants respond to the cooler weather. Black Raspberries are normally planted in April. Both transplanted berries require adequate moisture in the top one foot of ground for the first two months to become well established.

Our normal cultural practice is to plant, fertilize and put on weed chemicals which require up to 2" of water immediately after they are applied. The weed chemical and irrigation must be done within one to two weeks of planting, otherwise a very serious and expensive weed problem will occur.

The planting year of both strawberries and black raspberries affect all future production years for the respective crops. If a field gets a bad start, it will never become a good producing field for the life of the crop - 3 to 4 years for strawberries; 5 to 8 years for black raspberries.

5. Plantings:

Wheat, clover and other fall seeded crop:

In some years it may be necessary to water various crops if the fall rains do not come soon enough. It is critical that a crop have vigorous growth soon after planting in the fall. This vigorous growth must continue through November and into December.

6. There are no alternatives for irrigation if needed rains are not forthcoming at critical times. All our row crops are predicated on irrigation, and we have invested between \$75,000 and \$100,000 over the years for irrigation. Wheat is not as critical over the years, but if water is available and needed in any particular year, we feel we should have the right to irrigate it.

Most of our waterings are between 2" and 4" of water per acre. We find that frequent light irrigations produce the best results with minimum water runoff. This maximizes the results we can get with the limited water we have available to us.

7. We cannot at this time foresee what crops we will raise in the future. Therefore we cannot name all the needs for irrigation we may have between September 30th. and May 1st. of any given year. We do know that irrigation during this time may be critical for us.
- B. We request that the 30 day waiting period be waived for both the September 30th to May 1st. water right applications and the regular water right applications being currently submitted. We appear to have adequate moisture at the moment, but it may become dry for certain crops prior to May 1st. of 1977.
- C. We specifically request that the September 30th. to May 1st. portion of our water right applications be given an exemption to the 3 year proving period and the 5 year application of irrigation water rules. We request this exemption only on lands that meet the 3 year and 5 year water application rules for the period between May 1st. and September 30 th. of each year and that we have the right to have water applied between May 1st. and September 30th.

The reasons for requesting this exemption are as follows:

1. Only particular crops require that they get irrigation between Sept. 30 th. and May 1st.
2. There is not a need, due to the changing weather, to irrigate any crops between Sept. 30th. and May 1st. in many years.
3. We rotate our crops. It would not be unusual to have an acreage that would not require water during a 5 year period due to the combination of weather (wet fall, dry spring, or dry fall, wet spring) and the crops being raised on that particular acreage. The loss of the September 30th. to May 1st. water right on that particular acreage would jeopardize our desired crop rotation in future years.
4. Allowing this exemption would save us the cost of reapplying for Sept. 30 th. to May 1st. water rights on specific acreages that would not have had water applied on them when required by your department. Your department would also not have to spend time and effort on needless water applications.
5. Two very important factors are that water would be conserved, and electrical energy would be saved. In some years weather makes it a marginal situation as to whether we should irrigate a particular crop or not between Sept. 30th. and May 1st. The 3 year and 5 year water application requirements would force us to irrigate under marginal conditions to save our water rights. This would be a possible waste of water and energy. We would prefer to evaluate a crop dryness situation and be sure that a total substantial economic gain would be achieved upon application of water. Our evaluation would include all our costs, including conservation, energy use, labor and equipment.
6. We anticipate raising high yield crops in the future, along with other rotation crops. If we have water available to us from our irrigation systems, we feel we should have the right to protect our crops at any time during the year.

We do not request the waiving of the 30 day waiting period on request C. - exemption from the 3 year and 5 year application rules. We realize that you


Unfortunately we have kept no written records for the out of season irrigation use allowed by the two referenced permits. However, we have been ready, willing and able to use this water when the need arises.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

Pursuant to a request by Mr. Verboort, I reviewed the Claim of Beneficial Use, Site Report and Map (Report) submitted to determine if the use of water was perfected under the terms and conditions of the Order of the Water Resources Director approving Transfer Application T-7050. A Proposed Certificate of Water Right along with instructions in regards to petitioning the Director to reconsider the contents of the proposed is enclosed.

At the time of issuance of Certificates confirming the original use of water under Applications G-5800 and 49266, Certificates 51806 and 51797 inadvertently described land which was to be deleted in favor of a right issued in approval of Application G-13019. This was authorized by a statement included in the remarks section of Application G-13019. The map attached to Certificates 51806 and 51797 does not illustrate the land in question, however due to an over site by staff, the land was not deleted from the final certificates. Please note the land in question described by Certificate No. 51806, is now described by the remaining right Certificate 75273, the portion of Certificate No. 51806 not modified by the order approving Transfer No. T-7050.

I have prepared an affidavit, when properly completed and returned to this office, will authorize the Director to enter orders canceling the rights as evidenced by Certificates 75273 and 51797, in conflict with Certificate 62491. If requests, authorizing cancellations of the portions of the rights in conflict are not received, you are required to exercise your oldest priority right and all other rights shall be diminished to supplemental (Oregon Administrative Rule 690-015-0045).

The quantity of water associated with the remaining right Certificate No. 75273 issued due to the approval of Transfer No. T-7050 and the order was prorated based upon the number of acres of the original right of 139.6 acres. The Department will entertain a request to correct the quantity of water associated with the order approving Transfer No. 7050 along with the executed, submitted affidavit authorizing the cancellation of the conflicting water right under certificates No.'s 51797 and 75273.

Above, I have referenced the record holders of Permit No.'s G-8144, G-8145, G-8585, 43172 and 43174. Enclosed are assignment forms for use to request the change in ownership of the permits. Please consider which permits belong in which names or variations thereof and submit the requests to this office along with the required fees and our records will reflect the new owners accordingly.

Permit No.'s G-8145, 43172 and 43174 contain the following condition:

"Provided further, the permittee shall record and submit annually a report of all water used for irrigation during the period of October 1 through April 30 of each year."

In review of the files, I find no evidence the permittee has complied with this requirement. Enclosed are forms to report when the water was applied for the use of water. If it is not possible to provide the information since use was made, I am requesting a statement, in writing, that beneficial use of water was made during the periods of October 1 through April 30, and you are aware of the requirements of submitting annual reports and will make every effort to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit requiring annual reports of the water use for out of season irrigation use.

With the thought you will address the issues described in this letter, I am enclosing proposed certificates of water right, in addition to Transfer No. T-7050, for Permits No. G-8144, G-8145, G-8585, 43172 and 43174. If you comply with the requirements of this letter I will consider making a recommendation to the Director to issue Certificates as proposed or as modified by approved petitions for reconsideration.



confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND LRM RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-6128 WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE SUPPLY TO BE APPROPRIATED FROM CAMPBELL CREEK AND RESERVOIR NO. 1 CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-6159, tributaries of TUALATIN RIVER, for the purpose of OUT OF SEASON IRRIGATION OF 51.8 ACRES.

This right has been perfected under Permit 43174. The date of priority is MARCH 10, 1977. This right is limited to 0.65 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The use allowed herein may be made any time between October 1 and April 30 when water can be put to beneficial use by irrigation for immediate crop growth.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

UNNAMED STREAM AND LRM RESERVOIR - NE 1/4 NW 1/4, AS PROJECTED WITHIN C. LEWIS DLC 51, SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 900 FEET SOUTH AND 2340 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER OF SECTION 31;

CAMPBELL CREEK - LOT 4 (SW 1/4 NE 1/4), SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 2370 FEET SOUTH AND 2790 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF SECTION 31; AND

RESERVOIR NO. 1 - LOT 6 (NW 1/4 SE 1/4), SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 200 FEET SOUTH AND 670 FEET EAST FROM THE CENTER 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 31.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the period of May 1 to September 30, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.0 acre-foot per acre for each acre irrigated during the period from October 1 to April 30, provided further that the right allowed herein shall not exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated in any one year. The use of water during the period from October 1 to March 31 as authorized herein shall not establish priority of right as against future appropriations of surface water for beneficial uses or

for storage for such beneficial uses, other than similar rights for irrigation from October 1 to March 31. The water user shall record and submit annually a report of all water used for irrigation during the period of October 1 through April 30 of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.


