#### Pre-1909 Claim of Beneficial Use and Site Report August 2, 1993

#### **INFORMATION:**

Permittees:

Stanley Solomon, Jr.

I met Gerald at the site. He indicated that there had been no deviation in use (irrigation and stock watering) from the date water development was initiated in December of 1894.

#### **SOURCES:**

The primary sources of water are three (3) unnamed streams. Two (2) of the unnamed streams flow through a sump. The third flows through the fields. All of the unnamed streams are tributaries of Catching Slough.

#### **DIVERSION POINTS:**

The P.O.D. is located south 294' and east 1552' from the NW corner of Section 5, Township 26 South, Range 12 West, W.M. The P.O.D. is an electric pump located stream side and adjacent to a 24' x 37' x 3' sump. The stream flows through the sump, which is used solely for pumping.

#### MOTOR/PUMP:

The pump is a one (1) horsepower Century Electric pump, 3450 rpms, with a 1 1/8" ID intake and a 1" ID out flow.

#### PIPE:

The pipe is portable and is constructed of ABS plastic. The pipe is one (1") inch inside diameter and four hundred (400') feet in length. Four (4) to six (6), 3/4" laterals come off of the mainline. These laterals are fifty (50') in length and feed the MELNOR size 25 Rainbird sprinkler heads.

#### **USES:**

P.O.D.'s primary use is irrigation of pasture land. A supplemental use is for a stock water trough. The unnamed streams on the property were generally accessible for stock watering.

#### **HEADS:**

Irrigation - six (6) sprinklers @ 25 PSI 1/8" size from sprinkler/nozzle

Discharge Chart = 2.2 gpm/sprinklerTotal Discharge = 6(2.2) = 13.2 gpm

#### LIFT:

The irrigated area ranges in elevation from +20 feet to a - 5 feet above an below the P.O.D. The upper 1/5 of the irrigated area slopes from 0 to +20' above the P.O.D. The lower 4/5 of the area slopes from 0 to a - 5 feet below the P.O.D. The elevation differences were obtained by using a clinometer.

#### **SURVEY TIE:**

The P.O.D. was tied to a property corner, a 3/4 inch iron pipe. The bearings and distance are N 89E for 225' from the monument to the P.O.D. They were obtained by using a hard compass and string chain. The monument is tied to the NW corner of Sec. 5. These bearings and distances were calculated from an assessors map 25-12-32. They are from the corner to the monument S 77° 19' 33"E for a distance of 1361.15'.

Claim of Beneficial Use = 13.52 gpm

The final proof survey and inspection of pre-1909, SWR - 523 was completed on July 14, 1993 and the facts contained in this report and accompanying final proof map are correct to the best of my knowledge.



We, Stanley Solomon Jr. and Gerald E. Hammett, agree to the findings of the CWRE and do submit this site report and map as our claim of beneficial use of the water as provided under the terms and conditions of our SWR-523.



Published 1952 Binfords & Mort During the years the plan has been changed somewhat. Coquille is now the center for the Southwestern Oregon Dairy Herd Improvement Association. Field men work out from there in the standard association set-up and in what is known as the Owner-Sampler Association. The dairyman does his own sampling and weighing. A fieldman leaves the sample bottles one day and gathers them up the next morning, and takes the samples with the barn sheets and weights to the central laboratory in Coquille for testing and computing.

Much credit is due the county agents, who have been well trained, understanding, and cooperative - J. L. Smith in 1913, followed by C. C. Farr, C. R. Richards, Harvey S. Hale, and in 1930 George Jenkins, who has served continuously down to the present time.

For many years Coos Bay was handicapped by the lack of veterinary service. Veterinarians were on the Coquille side of the county but none in either Marshfield or North Bend, meaning considerable delay and expense in calling one over to this area. The result was when a cow became sick, it received home treatment. Sometimes the animal recovered and often it did not. Sometimes it was as much of a problem for the animal to recover from the effect of the medicine administered as to recover from the ailment for which she was treated. In 1935, Dr. J. H. Bennett located in Marshfield and from that time on skilled veterinary service has been available to the Coos Bay dairyman. In time, others located in Marshfield so that for a number of years there were four college-trained veterinarians on Coos Bay - Doctors Morgan, Hannawalt, and Werth in addition to Dr. Bennett. Coos County is a T. B. accredited area and progress is being made each year toward a Bangs-free area for the county.

Probably no single item has undergone a more radical change than the matter of feeding the dairy cow. The custom formerly prevailed of drying up the cow about Christmas and having her freshen not earlier than March. Often, during this "rest period," the cow was allowed to run in the hills except in extra severe weather. Expense of wintering the herd was reduced to the minimum. If the

hills had been slashed, burned and seeded, the cows often came through the winter in fair condition. But at other times they were thin and not in proper condition for freshening. Thus many dairymen concluded it was much better to feed the cow well during her rest period, having her in top condition when she came fresh. Also much more winter milking has been done in recent years.

Helping to bring about the change is the availability of baled hay, especially alfalfa. Another is the feeding of grain. The Coos Bay area does not produce much grain and the idea once was that it did not pay to buy it. Now, however, it is figured that the market justifies a reasonable grain ration. The amounts of outside hay and grain bought and fed to dairy cows, have increased many times in the past 40 years.

The silo began to make its appearance as early as 1900. Early ones were on the Elmer Bessey farm, South Coos River (now owned by H. F. Heep); on the George Ross Sr. farm on Catching Inlet (now owned by Bert Smith); on the Bay View Dairy farm on Catching Inlet; and on Blokes Harry Walker's farm at Cooston. For C. C. Johnson of Gunneil Cooston (on the farm now owned by Frank Rood Jr.) Charles Kaiser of North Bend constructed a concrete silo which received considerable publicity because of the fine workmanship it represented. It would no doubt still be standing if the barn hadn't burned down; the heat cracked it and it had to be razed. By the time of World War One, silos had become quite general on dairy farms on the inlets and on Coos River — mostly of wood, some hoop-and-stave, and many of the Wisconsin type called the "Coquille" in this county. Silage was sometimes clover and green grains but most commonly corn. The cost of labor was a big item; silo-filling time was when the rains had started to make it a very disagreeable job; often the silage did not keep well and molded. So dairymen became dissatisfied and discontinued their silos. Recently they are being revived, with use of a much better type -metal. Field cutters pulled by tractors reduce the labor required. With improved equipment and the use of molasses, silage is economically made.
