The data contained in the proof, which is based on an inspection and survey of your project made by a representative of this department, defines the extent to which your water right has been completed within the terms of your Permit. 

The Landolt Brothers have a water right, permit #19839 calling for a .35 second feet water on 28 acres. They wish to increase the acreage irrigated by 35 acres bringing the total project up to 53 acres. This new acreage will be located across the river from the land now under permit. They would like to get a water right on this additional acreage and are interested as to correct procedure. Should this be an amendment to the present right or an application for a new right? One pump and mainline system will irrigate both sides of the creek. They, of course, do not wish to lose the permit which has already been issued.

Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge receipt of your application for a permit to appropriate 0.5 cubic foot of water per second from Kilchis River for the irrigation of 20 acres, together with an accompanying sketch.

The application has been checked over and some discrepancies are noted.

As I interpret the first part of the description of the location of the part of the stream from which you propose to appropriate water, it does not agree with the second part as to location, under Item 4.

The location of the place of use must be described under Item 8 by forty-acre tract, section, township and range, and also by attaching under this item the legal description of the property on which you propose to use water, copied word for word from your deed, abstract or contract.

The location of the corner from which your measurements are made must be identified on your sketch and your reference monuments must be located by distance and bearing ties, as explained on pages 6 and 8 of the enclosed copy of the Rules and Regulations of the State Engineer. The scale to which your sketch is drawn should also be noted.

For your convenience in completing your application and map as suggested, I am enclosing them herewith. On their receipt in this office in completed form, accompanied by the statutory fees in the amount of \$15.00, the application can be filed, as provided by law, and the matter of approval by issuance of a permit can be given consideration, when the next group of permits is issued.
