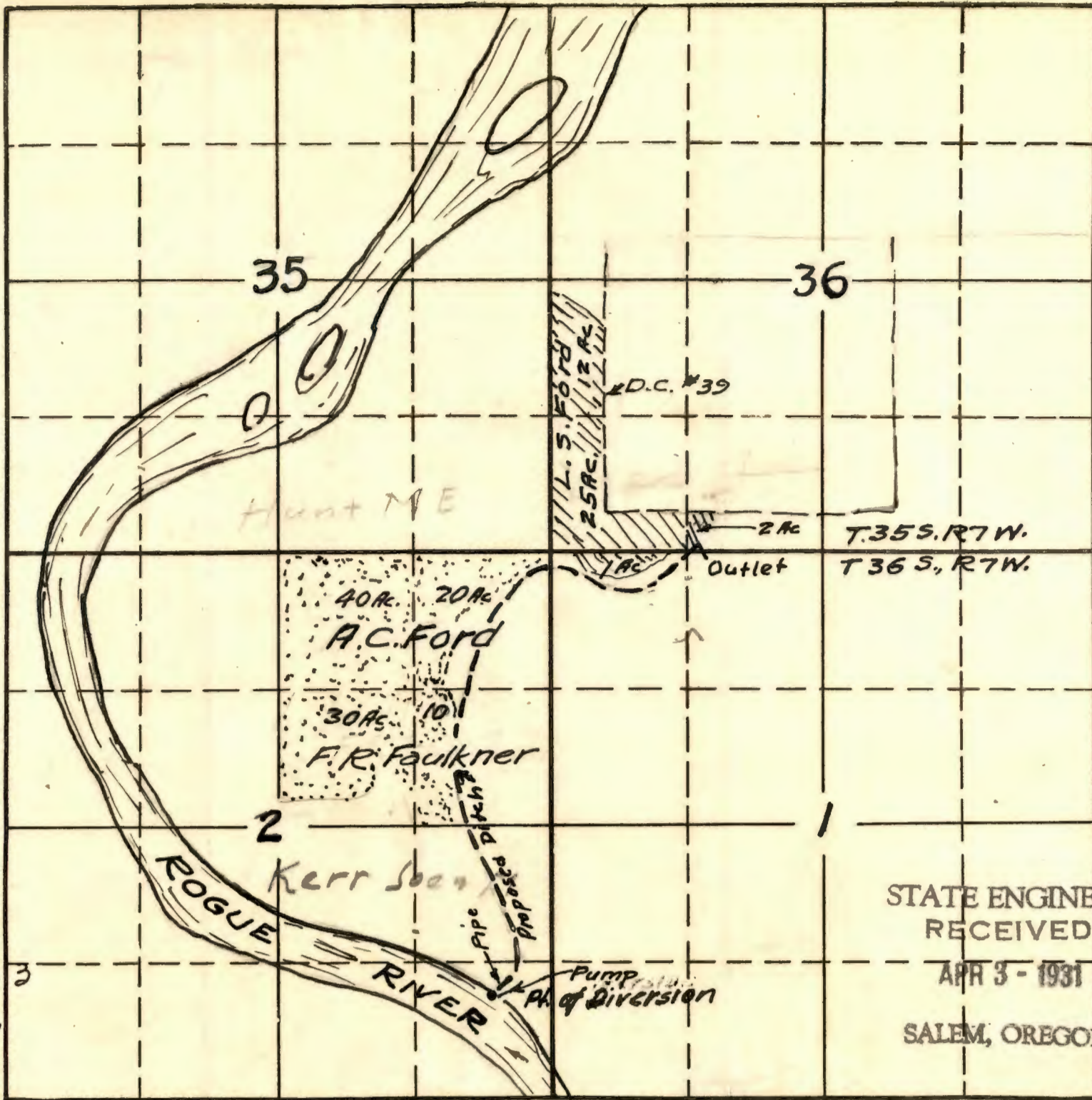

ABSTRACT OF CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT NO. 9926

A. C. Ford, L. S. Ford and F. R. Faulkner of Grants Pass, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Engineer of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Rogue River

a tributary of *Rogue River* for the purpose of Irrigation

under Permit No. 10111 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from April 3, 1931;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.75 cubic feet per second.

The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 2, Township 36 South, Range 7 West, W. M. The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant (if for irrigation or any other purpose) is as follows:

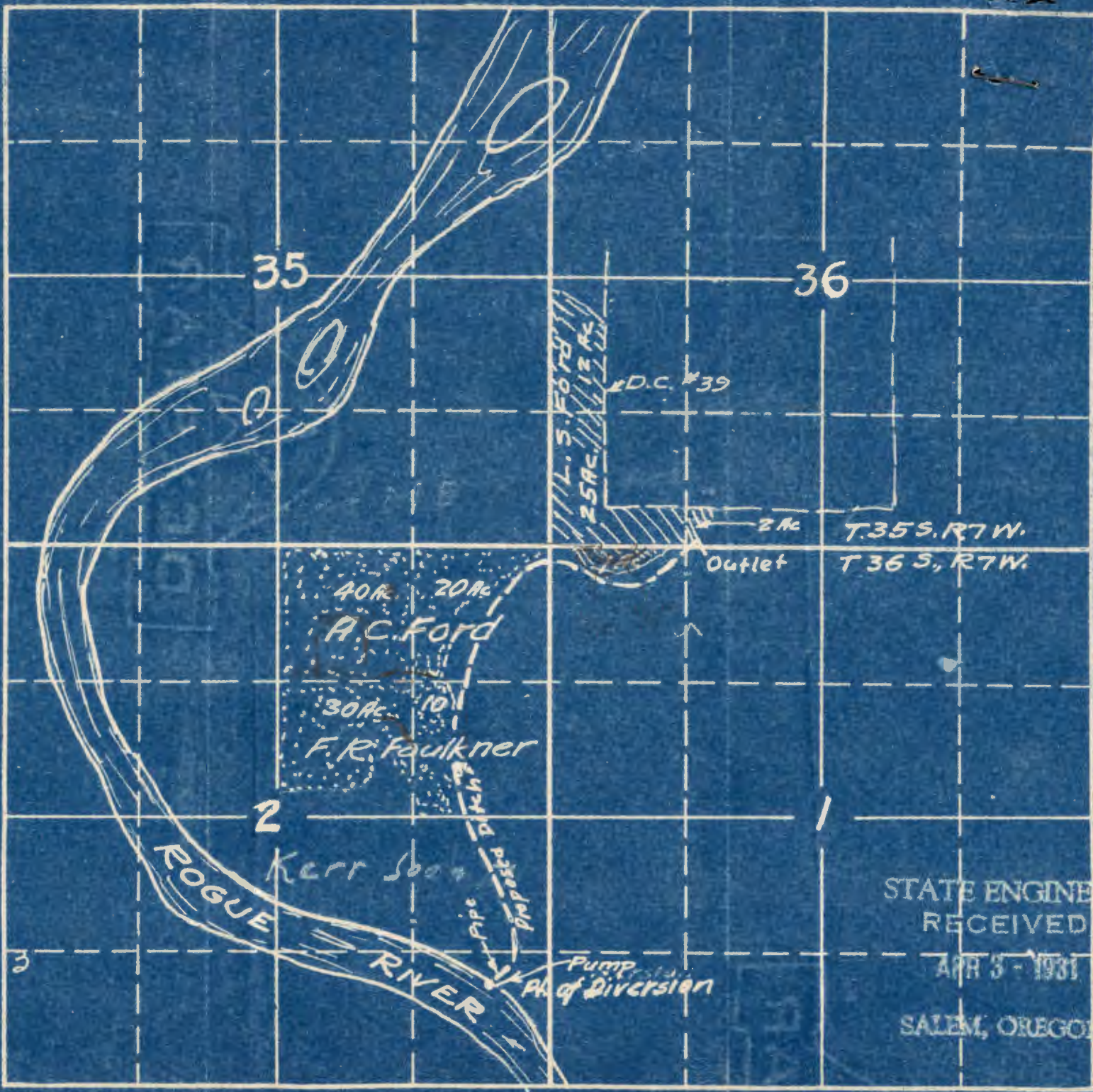

Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 5, with which you submitted the original Permit No. 10111 for comparison with our records, in which you requested that the quantity of water be corrected so as to allow 1.8 cubic feet per second instead of 0.75. We are also in receipt of a letter from Mr. Pearce in regard to this matter, in which he states that you have completed the appropriation to the extent of irrigating the entire 140 acres and in which he recommends that the correction be made if legally possible.

The quantity of water allowed per acre under this permit was limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated. This is the usual quantity allowed for the irrigation of land in the Rogue River Valley, and since it is evident the total quantity necessary for the irrigation of 140 acres under this limitation would amount to 1.75 second-feet, it is evident that an error was made when the permit was issued. I believe, therefore, that since the matter has been called to the State Engineer's attention previous to the issuance of a water right certificate that we may properly make the necessary correction. In view of the fact that Mr. Pearce has advised us that no other appropriator can possibly be injured by such action I do not believe there can be any objections to the making of such correction since it is evident that the State Engineer's intentions were to limit the original permit in an aggregate amount based on the limitation of 1/80th second-foot of water per acre.

An order has been written, therefore, making such correction, a copy of which is inclosed and we will proceed with the issuance of a water right certificate on that basis in the near future.

Dear Sirs:

I had occasion to call on Messrs. A. G. & L. S. Ford and F. R. Faulkner and advised them to send their original application and Permit No. 10111 to the State Engineer, in order that it may be checked.

Apparently your records specify the amount of water, under this Permit, to be 0.75 sec.ft.

The applicants were really desirous of obtaining 4 or 5 sec.ft. for their present and future needs but when I explained the statutes, regarding an appropriation for more than 2 sec.ft. they decided to cut their acreage so that the application would call for an amount of water of nearly the 2 sec.ft. They have more land, ready for water, than the application calls for.

The appropriation is from Rogue River, at a point below all other diversions for irrigation of large tracts. It is not probable that anyone could derive benefits by having this Permit limited to an insufficient supply of water. I strongly recommend, if legally permissible, that the 1.75 sec.ft. be allowed.

Mr. Ford said he would have the boys write to you, sometime in the near future.

Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of the final proof under Permit No. 10111 in the name of A. C. & L. S. Ford and F. R. Faulkner, together with your remittance in the sum of \$1.00 as the certificate recording fee. Receipt No. 15851 is inclosed.

The proof appears to be in satisfactory form with the exception of the quantity of water specified under Item 4 of the form and the amount recommended in your report. I note you have changed the quantity of water under Item 4 from 0.75 second foot to 1.75 second feet. I have checked the proof with the copy of the permit on file on our records and find that the copy of the permit specifies 0.75 second-foot. The original application was for 1.8 second-feet of water and it would appear that possibly an error has been made in copying the permit which was issued, or it may also be possible that an error was made in issuing the permit since it seems reasonable to assume that the permit would be limited to 1.75 second-feet of water for the irrigation of 140 acres.

In order that we may check this matter and make whatever correction may be necessary, it is requested that you advise the permittees to send their original permit to this office if it is available. If the original permit granted only 0.75 second-foot of water I do not believe that the State Engineer can increase the amount at this time unless it is evident that an error was made in the typing of the original permit.
