There needs to be several amendments to the previously filed Pre-1909 Claim of Adjudication by Ray S. and Bessie Waterman. The first change is the ownership of the property described above. The property is now under the ownership of Franklin A. and Traci Waterman, P.O. Box 799, Bandon, Oregon 97411.

We need to amend the location of the diversion and point of use for the domestic water/livestock water on diversion point 12. This water right has been used continuously. We will be building a new single family dwelling and the older single family dwelling will be removed. Therefore the location of the house will be changed thus changing the point of diversion provides a more efficient place to pull the water out. The new point of diversion is located northwest of the existing POD #12. The amount of usage for a single family dwelling will remain the same at five gallons per minute.

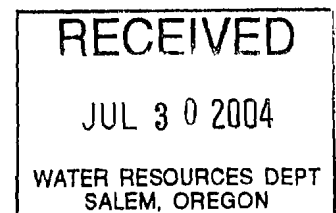

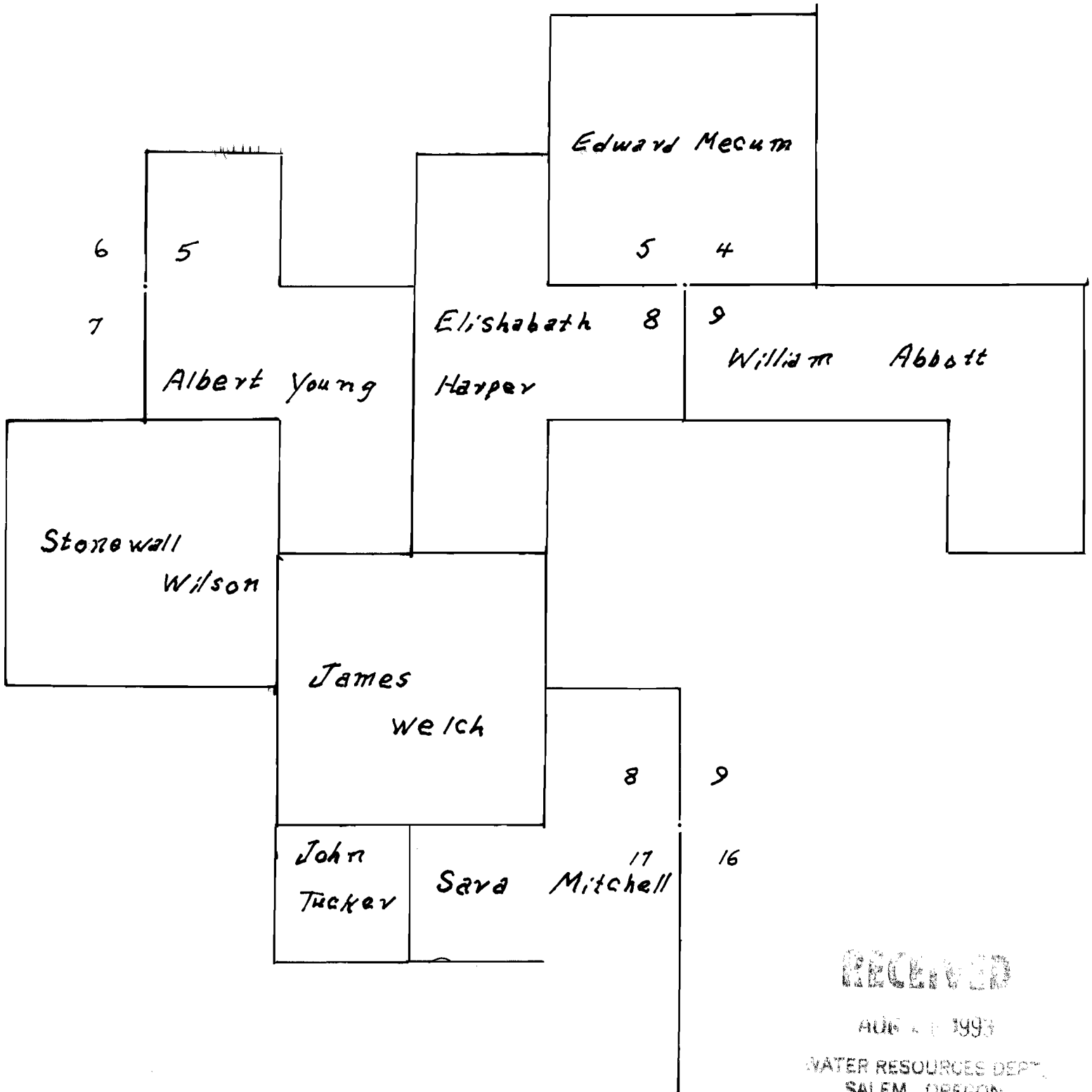

REGISTRATION STATEMENT CLAIM OF BENEFICIAL USE

INFORMATION: Ray and Bessie Waterman own and reside on the ranch property for which this Registration Statement is requested. Their son, Charlie Waterman is acting as their agent for this Registration effort; His address is Route 1, Box 1518-B, Bandon, OR. 97411; his phone No. is 347-3453.

The land use is for stock pasture. The ownership is contiguous except for the three forties in Sec. 6, the former James Abbott homestead claim. The ranch consists of nine former homesteads in Sections 4; 5; 6; 7; 8 and 17 all in Township 30 South, Range 14 West, in Coos County. This property is all within the drainage area of Four Creek. This Registration Statement is for twelve specific diversions of water plus stock watering from stream banks. The domestic need is for four families with one half acre of lawn and garden for each, for a total domestic need of 0.020 CFS. The livestock need is for 1,250 animal units or 0.0625 CFS for a total need of 0.0825 CFS. These diversions are described in more detail below.

Source: For all diversions described below: An unnamed stream, a tributary of Four-mile Creek, a tributary of Pacific Ocean.

DIVERSION POINTS: POD 1 is in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 5 and described in the chart on map 1 it is a place above the road where water is dipped from a pool in the creek and carried by bucket to the ranch house. Live stock drink directly from the creek below the road.

POD 2 is in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8, a 4 ft. diameter tile 4 ft. deep has been dug into the ground to catch the water from a spring. This is a gravity system, the POD is about 150 ft. above the place of use. This system serves the Waterman residence plus a watering trough at the barn nearby. About 5,000. ft. of 1" plastic pipe carries the water to the place of use.

POD 3 is in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 17, it is a sump about 6 ft. deep, 8 ft. wide and 20 ft. long at a spring, the livestock drink directly from the sump.

POD 4 NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 17, a 4 ft. by 4 ft. deep concrete tile is dug into the ground to catch the water. About 1,300 ft. of 3/4" plastic pipe carries the water to a watering trough which is 100 ft. below the POD.

POD 5 is in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8, it is a sump hole 6 ft. deep by 8 ft. wide and 20 ft long at a spring; 100 ft. of 1" plastic pipe carries the water to a trough 25 ft. below the POD.

POD 6 is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, it is a 3 ft. of concrete tile 5 ft. deep dug into the ground at the source of a creek; 1" plastic pipe carries the water about 300 ft. to a watering trough 50 ft. below the POD.

POD 7 is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 4; it is a 4 ft. by 4 ft. deep concrete tile dug into the ground to catch the water from a spring. The water flows through 100 ft. of 1" plastic pipe to a watering trough 30 ft. below the POD.

DIVERSION 8 is for stream bank watering from any stream bank within the Ray Waterman ownership.

POD 9 is a sump hole about 6 ft. deep and 20 ft. in diameter at a spring. About 100 ft. of 1" plastic pipe carries the water to a watering trough 40 ft. below the POD. *in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 9*

POD 10 is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 9, it is a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. concrete tile 3 ft. deep. about 100 ft. of 1" plastic pipe carries the water to a watering trough 40 ft. below the POD.

POD 11 is in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8 it is a 3 ft. by 3 ft. deep concrete tile and is about 1000 ft. from the old Waterman homestead, which was unoccupied on the day of this inspection. The POD is about 150 ft. above the place of use for domestic and a watering trough.

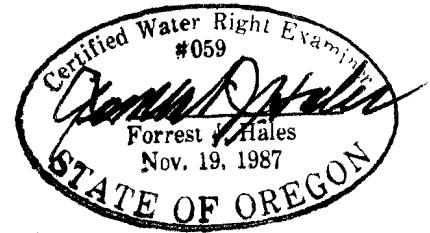

POD 12 is a 4 ft. by 6 ft. by 2 ft deep wooden box at a spring, about 400 of 3/4" plastic pipe carries the water to a residence. This is a gravity system for one family domestic use., The place of use is about 50 ft. below the POD.

POD 13 at the time of this inspection was undeveloped, the water followed the natural channel of the creek to a culvert under the county road to a ditch along the southerly R/W line of the county road. The ditch is for stock watering, it is about 1,320 long and 6 ft wide and 3 ft deep.

This final proof survey and inspection of the use as found to be completed under the terms and conditions of the pre-1909 Water Registration Act was completed by me on June 2, 1993, and the facts contained in this report and accompanying Pre-1909 Surface Water Registration Act Map are correct to the best of my knowledge.



We, Ray and Bessie Waterman and Charlie Waterman agree to the findings of the CWRE and do submit this site report and map as our claim of Beneficial Use of the water as provided under the terms and conditions of the Pre-1909 surface Water Registration Act.



To Whom It May Concern:

I have completed my documentation for Pre 1909 Water Rights. I have given to you an overall view of the history of my property. I have not included all the documents because that would mean sending you reams of paper. I have given you the document number and where they were found. I also have all the back taxes from the time I owned the places for which I am applying for water rights. Ray Waterman also has back taxes for the land which I purchased from him. If you want any of this documentation, please contact me and I will send you the Schedule F's and property taxes for the years you want.

We are presently trying to get the original homestead application from the Archives at Suitland, Maryland as they will document improvements and living on the places at the time of the homestead. We need these to date back two pieces of property as you will notice in your review. It is our understanding, after researching the conditions of the Homestead Act, that they must live on the property for 5 years and make certain improvements before receiving a deed. We have contacted one source in order to get them to you on a more timely basis but have not got a confirmation from them. If this source falls through, it will be two months before these documents will be in our hands as there is a tremendous waiting list for these materials.

I also am in the process of getting several affidavits. Three will deal with the River Ranch. Mr. Kistner, Mr. Edwards, and Mr. Deftleson will attest to the fact that cattle were run on that ranch. I also will have an affidavit from one of the DeHaven children who lived on the Walker place in the 1930's.

If you feel at any point there are voids not covered by affidavits, documentation, etc., please contact us and we will try to fill them for you.

Every person who, having taken an oath before a competent tribunal, officer, or person, in any case in which a law of the United States authorizes an oath to be administered, that he will testify, declare, depose, or certify truly, or that any written testimony, declaration, deposition, or certificate by him subscribed is true, willfully and contrary to such oath states or subscribes any material matter which he does not believe to be true, is guilty of perjury, and shall be punished by fine of not more than two thousand dollars, and by imprisonment, at hard labor, not more than five years; and shall, moreover, thereafter be incapable of giving testimony in any court of the United States until such time as the judgment against him is reversed. (See Sec. 1760.)

NOTE.—In addition to the above penalty, every person who knowingly or willfully in any way procures the making or publication of any false or fraudulent affidavit pertaining to any matter within the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior, is punished by fine or imprisonment.

I, Ray S. Waterman, Being duly sworn, depose, and say that I purchased the lower place from Virgil Anderson in 1946 and have run livestock on that place continuously since that date. He lived in the house on the property and ran livestock there. They had a garden near the house. Prior to that Fred Guerin owned the place. He also lived in the house and ran livestock (milked cows). About a year after he bought it, the old house burned down and Fred built a new one which is still in use today. My father leased the property when I was two years old. He milked cows there and we lived in the house on the property. (1916). We got water from the spring right by the house and the livestock got their water from the creek.

C. F. Waterman willed the Young place to me in 1948. I have ran livestock on this place continuously since then. Prior to 1948, my father owned and operated the ranch. (Dairying since 1917). We lived in the house on the place. The water for the house, garden, and livestock came from the springs and creek.

I bought the Wilson Place in 1950 from Don Wilson. I have ran livestock on this place continuously since that date. Don Wilson had cattle and the old folks, who owned it prior to Don, had cattle and some sheep plus a horse. Don Wilson's father who owned the property before him was called "Hackadaddy." His grandfather was "Jack" and he owned the place earlier. The Wilsons owned this property when my father came to Coos County in 1911. They had a good little garden by the house. They got the water from the springs and the creek. Don's mom would can 200 quarts of blackberries back in those days.

I bought the Harper place in 1936 on an unrecorded contract from B. L. Tracey and have run livestock continuously on the place since it's purchase. This is the place where we have lived since that time. We have had a garden below the house. We get our water for the house from springs and the livestock get their water from springs and the creek. I remember the "Billy" Cox had sold the land to Tracy. Tracy had about 200 head of sheep that he ran on the place, plus about 15 head of cattle. "Billy" Cox lived in the house when he owned the property. I remember dad telling about when dad came here there was a lady in the house and dad would take her to town with him when he went to town. Ira Anderson ran dairy cows on the place prior to Billy Cox.

I purchased the Mecum Place from B. L. Tracy and the Mecum Estate in two parcels in 1943 and 1960. I have used the property to run livestock since it's purchase. The livestock get their water from Tracy's place from the springs and they get their water from the Mecum place from the creek and springs. Tracy ran sheep on the place. Mecum had a few cows. Tracy bought this place from "Billy" Cox. Billy Cox ran dairy cows on this place and the Harper place.

I bought the Sara Mitchell place in 1953 from John Truman. I have ran livestock on this land continuously since it's purchase. There was a house and electricity there at the time of purchase. The spring that was used for that house was transferred to the house that I lived in to provide more house water. Sara Mitchell lived in the house for as long as I can remember until her death. She ran cattle and some pigs. She fed the pigs apples from the 2 apple orchards on the place. The livestock drank out of the creeks and springs. After she died, Hans Christenson ran cattle on that place for several years.

I bought the Abbott Indian Allotment from Tracy in 1937 in an unrecorded contract. I have run livestock on this place since its purchase. The livestock get their water from the springs. Tracy also ran sheep on the Allotment. Dad made hay up on that place when James Cope owned it. After Mrs. Cope died, Dad moved into the house on the Cope place and that was where I was born. He worked on the ranch for Cope. He made butter, took it to town, and shipped it to San Francisco.

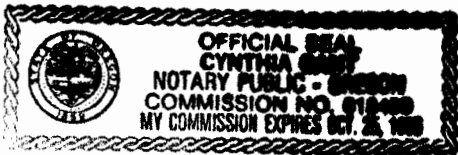

Persons interested in receiving a mailed copy of a PFO must pay a statutorily-required fee of \$10. (Any person paying \$10 to receive a PFO by mail will also receive a copy of the Final Order when it is issued.) PFO's may be viewed for free at the Department's Salem Office or at the district watermaster office nearest the proposed use. Those disagreeing with the Department's decision as expressed in the PFO have 45 days to file a protest.

The protest deadline for proposed final orders appearing in this public notice is 5pm, Friday, September 24, 2004.

The protest filing fee is \$250 for everyone except the applicant. Detailed requirements for filing a protest will be sent with copies of the PFO. Persons who support the PFO may file a "standing" fee of \$50 to retain the ability to participate in future proceedings relating to an application. Before participation is allowed, an additional \$200 will be required at the time of the proceeding.

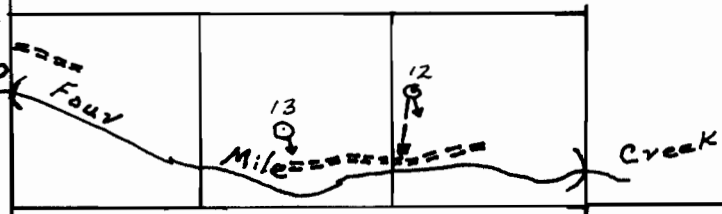

REVISED STATUTES OF THE UNITED STATES. TITLE LXX.—CRIMES.—CHAP. 4.

Sec. 5392. Every person who, having taken an oath before a competent tribunal, officer, or person, in any case in which a law of the United States authorizes an oath to be administered, that he will testify, declare, depose, or certify truly, or that any written testimony, declaration, deposition, or certificate by him subscribed is true, willfully and contrary to such oath states or subscribes any material matter which he does not believe to be true, is guilty of perjury, and shall be punished by fine of not more than two thousand dollars, and by imprisonment, at hard labor, not more than five years; and shall, moreover, thereafter be incapable of giving testimony in any court of the United States until such time as the judgment against him is reversed. (See Sec. 1760.)

NOTE.—In addition to the above penalty, every person who knowingly or willfully in anywise procures the making or presentation of any false or fraudulent affidavit pertaining to any matter within the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior may be punished by fine or imprisonment.

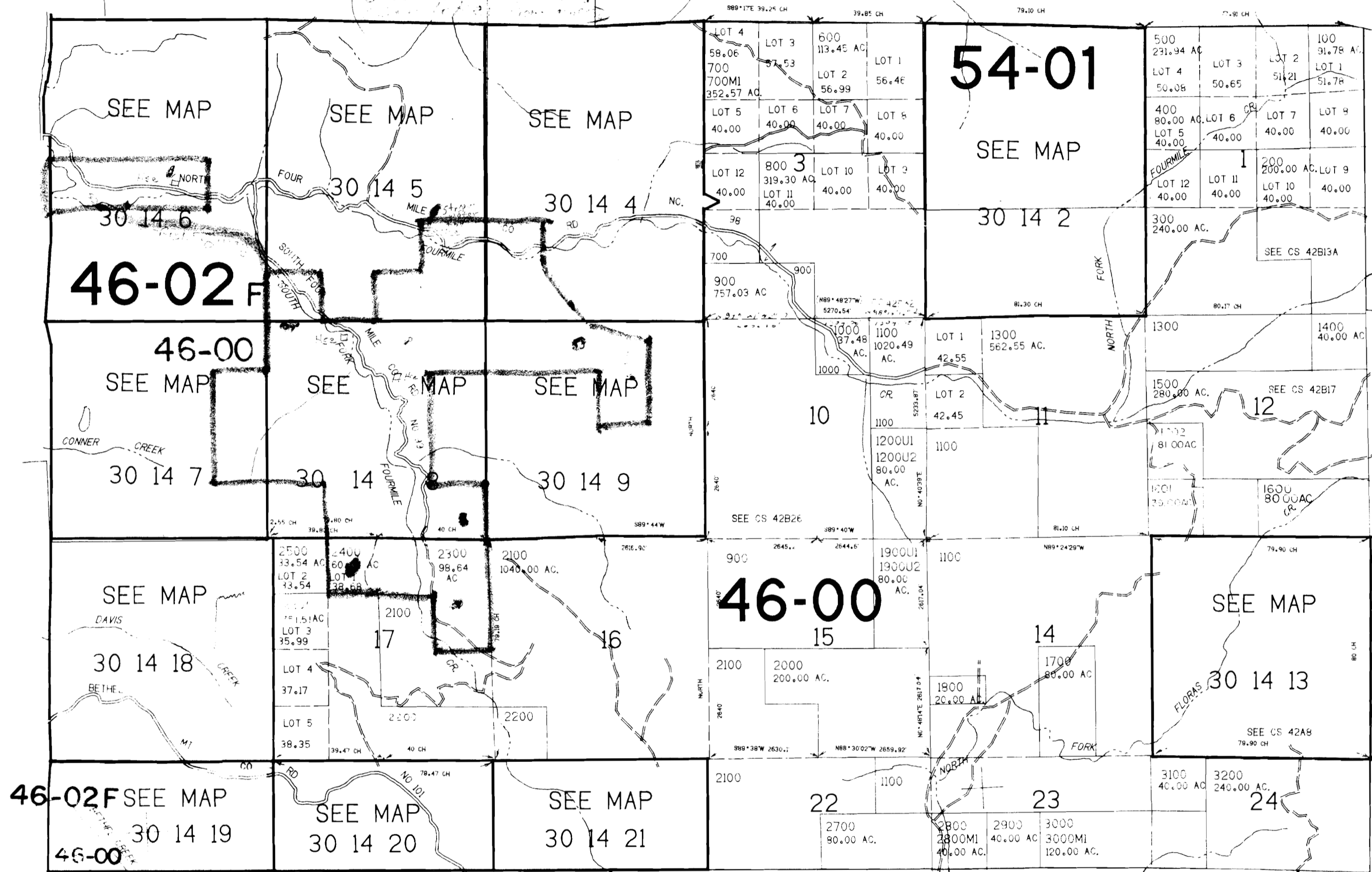
