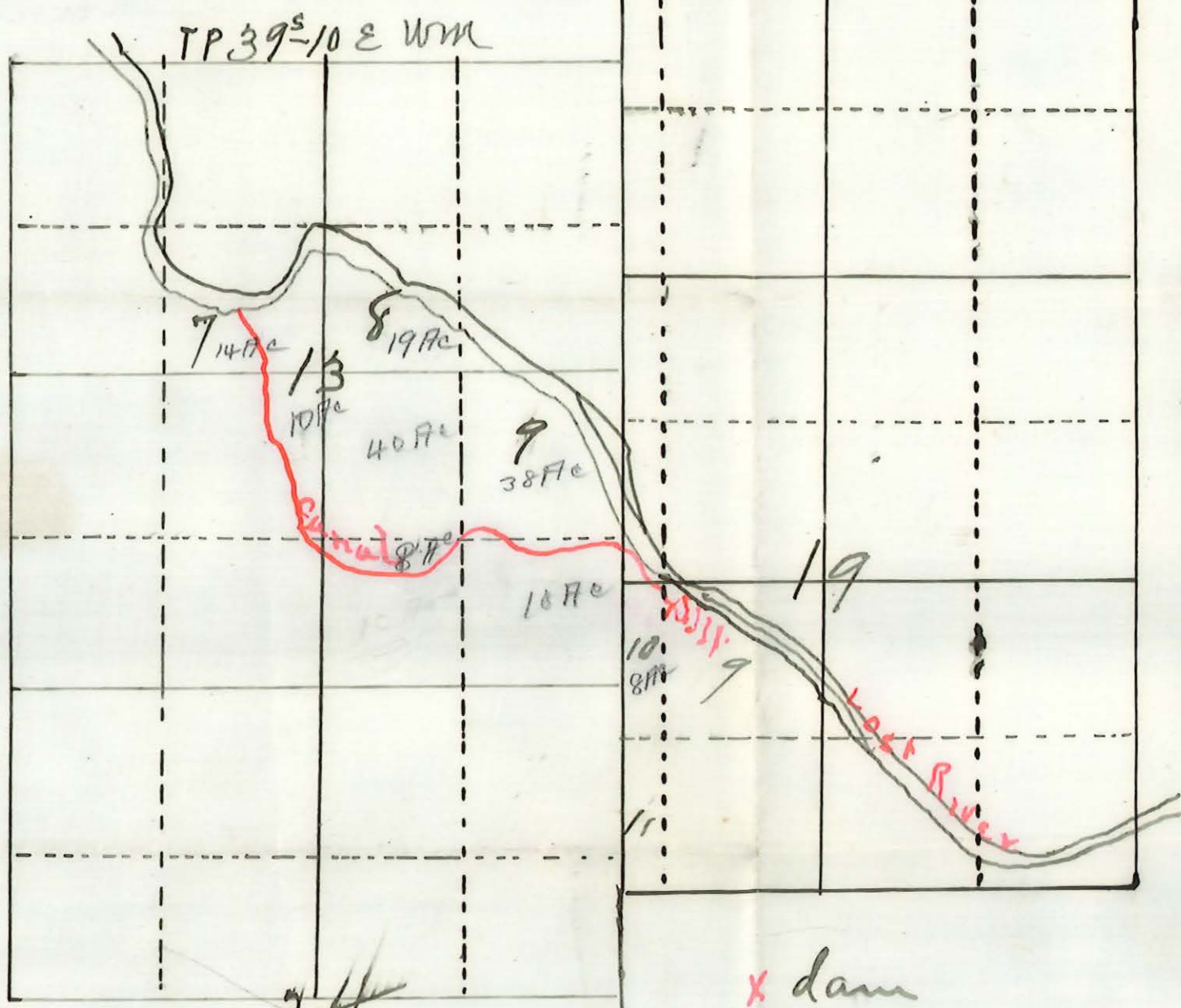

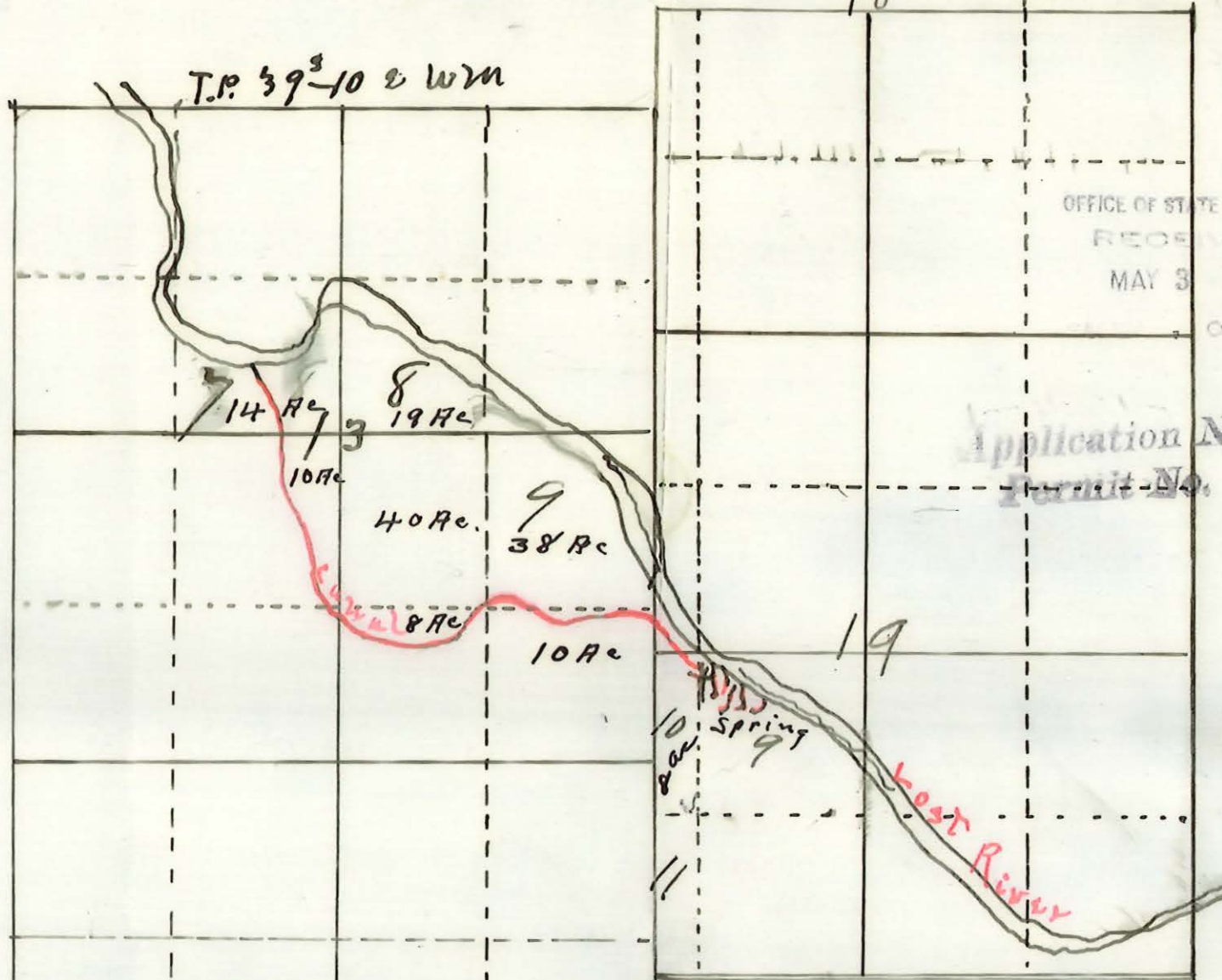

I am in receipt of yours of the 27th., transmitting final proof under permit No. 1618.

I note you have irrigated to date, only about 25 acres of the 147 acres covered by the permit. and that you intend to irrigate more land after you get it cleared and leveled. I presume therefore, that you do not wish to abandon your right to the acreage in excess of the 25 acres now irrigated. You will understand that your final water right certificate, if issued at this time, would cover only the land to which water has actually been applied. I note that you have until October 1, 1918 in which to completely apply water to the proposed use under this permit and I would suggest therefore that you withhold your proof until that time. If at that time you have not irrigated all the land for which you desire a water right, you should make application to the State Engineer for an extension of time.

I am enclosing herewith a notice, "Form C", which you should fill out and forward to this office at such time as you are prepared to make final proof on all the land you desire a water right certificate for.

I am enclosing Application Form "C" for extension of Permit, No. 1618, for the reason that I have not as yet compleeted I have the ditch compleeted and have plowed and irrigated 60. acres and raised crop on same this year I could have applied the water to the entire area but that I had to have it cleared and farmed . not knowing that I could apply the water for a pastureage purpose as the ground is uneven and cut up by Sloughs it will take some tim and a large amount of money to prepare it for Cultivation but by making a few laterals it can be made to produce a good lot of pasture and I believe it will be more beneficial for that class of land than for purely aggricultural as out side range is a thing of the past in most places and pasture is becoming more valuable each year.

I therefore desire an extension of time until Sept. 1st, 1919, in which to compleete my laterals and utilize the entire area of the land.
