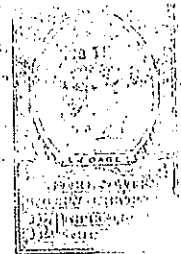

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That **MOLALLA IRRIGATION COMPANY**, a corporationof **Molalla**, State of **Oregon**, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of**Molalla River**
a tributary of **Willamette River** for the purpose of **Irrigation**
under Permit No. **204** of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from **December 8, 1909**;that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed **9.26 cubic feet per second**;

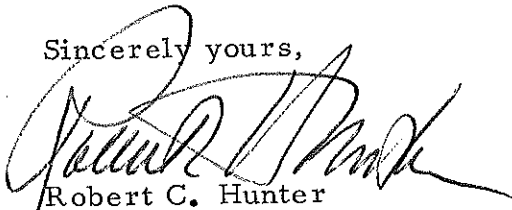
Reference is made to my telephone conversation of April 13, 1966, with Mr. Trevor Jones of your office.

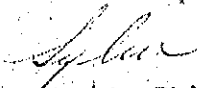
Enclosed are photo-static copies of 2 pieces of property that were purchased seperately which now make up the present Camp Onahlee site.

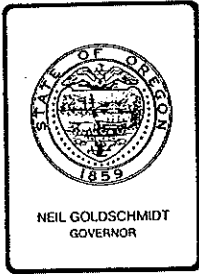

RE: Location of irrigated land under Water Right Permit 204

Gentlemen,

Recently, while regulating water use from the Molalla River I became aware of a situation involving the Molalla Irrigation Company's system. Land not covered under the Company's permit is being irrigated from the ditches within the Company's system. I spoke with one of these users and informed him that his land was not covered by the Company's water right. He was sure I was mistaken and assured me that he had purchased "shares" from the Company. Purchasing shares does not establish a water right. That can only be accomplished through the permit process as described in Oregon Water Laws. Users of the Company's system must be made aware of this fact. Lands not covered by the Company's permit must be filed on if water use on that land is to continue.

A problem that must be solved before the unauthorized uses can be filed on, is the exact location of the lands covered by the Company's permit. The water right certificate describes the location by forty acre tracts, however there is not a map that gives the exact location of all acreages within the forty acre tracts. The location of these lands must be established before the next irrigation season. If you do not submit a map locating these lands, I will make the determination as to their location the next time any regulatory action is necessary on the Molalla River. That location will be official and use of water will be allowed only on those lands.

I am willing to meet with you, discuss the situation and assist in the preparation of a map. This matter requires immediate attention. The Molalla River is receiving more public attention every year and regulation on that system will become more frequent.

Dear Mrs. Porter:

I do not have information of purchase of water rights in regard to price but there are other considerations.

A water right is appurtenant to the lands on which water was under when the right was perfected. To change the place of use requires application to the State Engineer and approval of the application before using water at the new location. The application must be made by the owner of the land to which a valid right is appurtenant.

ORS 537.280 reads "In any valuation for rate-making purposes, or in any proceeding for the acquisition of rights to the use of water and the property used in connection therewith, under any license or statute of the United States or under the laws of Oregon, no value shall be recognized or allowed for such rights in excess of the actual cost to the owner of perfecting them in accordance with the provisions of the Water Rights Act."

I think it is probable that the discussion you had involved shares in the ditch or assessments paid to the Molalla Irrigation Company for carrying capacity in the ditch. Ownership of shares in the ditch does not necessarily carry with it the right to irrigate any specific amount of land.

A water right was perfected under the name Molalla Irrigation Company for irrigation of 748 acres as evidenced by the certificate recorded at page 7609, State Record of Water Right Certificates, for a number of properties. To the extent the use of water has been continued without a lapse of five consecutive years the right is valid. I do not have names and addresses of any of the directors of the Irrigation Company but I'm sure this information is easily obtainable in the neighborhood. I suggest you contact a director regarding carrying capacity.

If you can arrange to use the ditch for transporting water to your land you can make application for a permit to appropriate water for the Molalla River, or if an owner of a valid right intends to discontinue irrigation he could make application for a change in place of use to your lands.

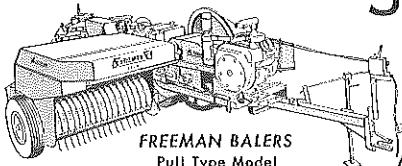

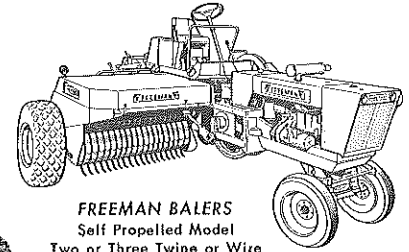

Dear Mr. Wheeler:

In behalf of the Molalla Irrigation Co., I am replying to your letter of Aug. 14th, which requests that we construct a head gate and a measuring device where the water is diverted from the Molalla River.

Ditch or stream?

Several years ago the ditch running through the Shady Dell area was open at the main river. Because of damage done by several floods at different times, the Federal Government installed a dyke and buried the culverts beneath the dyke to keep this stream flowing as it had in the past. This stream flows through Shady Dell, and the Molalla where Irrigation Co. has a cement dam with boards that can be raised and lowered. The Irrigation ditch comes off in two separate 4 ft. head gates making a weir, each of which is 4 ft. wide, with a cement floor and cement sides. In each of these we have head gates that can be raised and lowered to control the flow of the water into the ditch. Mr. Ed Kylo, a member of the Molalla Irrigation Co., normally handles this and makes every effort to keep the flow as even as possible. As you know it is quite difficult with the river height changing as it does, but he has controlled this very well, for a good many years.

I inspected the dam Sunday and checked on the head gate. As close as I could measure, it looked like it was raised about 6 inches, on a 4 ft. head gate. The other gate was closed, however, there was a certain amount of seepage. In checking today with a Hydraulics Engineer I was advised that a 6 inch opening on a 4 ft. head gate, would be approximately 4.59 cubic ft. per second.

As mentioned earlier and as you can see, we do not know exactly how to measure this water or what is expected of us. We would appreciate knowing just exactly what type of equipment we should have at the head gate openings, and if a print is available or the name of some equipment we should have, we would be most happy to comply. The dam is more than 30 years old and has been servicing the community quite well for all these years, and was put in, to replace a wood dam, that washed out at that time. We will await your reply, advising us specifically what equipment we should install.

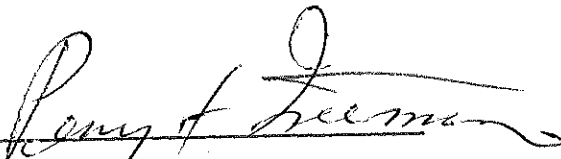

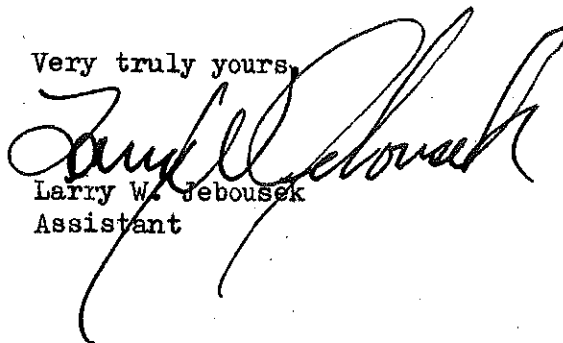

Dear Mr. Hunter:

There are no rights of record for the Camp Onahlee area as indicated on the map you submitted. The Campfire Girl Council could make application for a permit to construct a reservoir for the storage of water for a swimming pool and application for a permit for summertime flow to maintain the pool on either of the high water channels or slough channels through the camp.

I think in the summer most of the water in the principal channel running through the park is diverted from the Molalla south of the Shady Dell by the Molalla Irrigation Co. Although they divert from the old channel on the west side of Shady Dell in a ditch leading off to the west, there are rights immediately south and north of the camp ground by individuals.

If you were to make application for a permit perhaps it would be better to cite the old or high water channel as the principal source of water and the Molalla River as a source during part of the summer, and then contact whoever represents the Molalla Irrigation Co. for some arrangement with them to insure getting water down to the camp.

If your use was only for a swimming pool you would only require water to offset seepage due to evaporation and this should not interfere to any great extent with rights further along the channel. I don't know who to suggest you contact connected with the irrigation company, but inquiry in the immediate neighborhood of the camp should turn up this information.

In reply to your letter of the 2d instant in regard to the condition of your water right under application No. 438, permit No. 204, in the name of the Molalla Irrigation Company, you are advised that this permit covered the use of 20.75 second foot of water from the Molalla River for the irrigation of 1660 acres of land. According to the terms of the permit construction work was required to begin on or before Feb. 14, 1911, be completed on or before Feb. 14, 1912, and the water applied to the irrigation of this land on or before Feb. 14, 1913.

Notice of beginning construction work indicating that this requirement of the permit had been complied with has been filed in this office. However, you will note that construction work under the permit should have been completed on or before Feb. 14, 1912, and the water applied to the proposed use on or before Feb. 14, 1913. You are advised that you will be allowed to submit final proof under the permit covering the irrigation of all land that was actually irrigated prior to Feb. 14, 1913, and final proof books will be forwarded you for execution in the course of a few days.

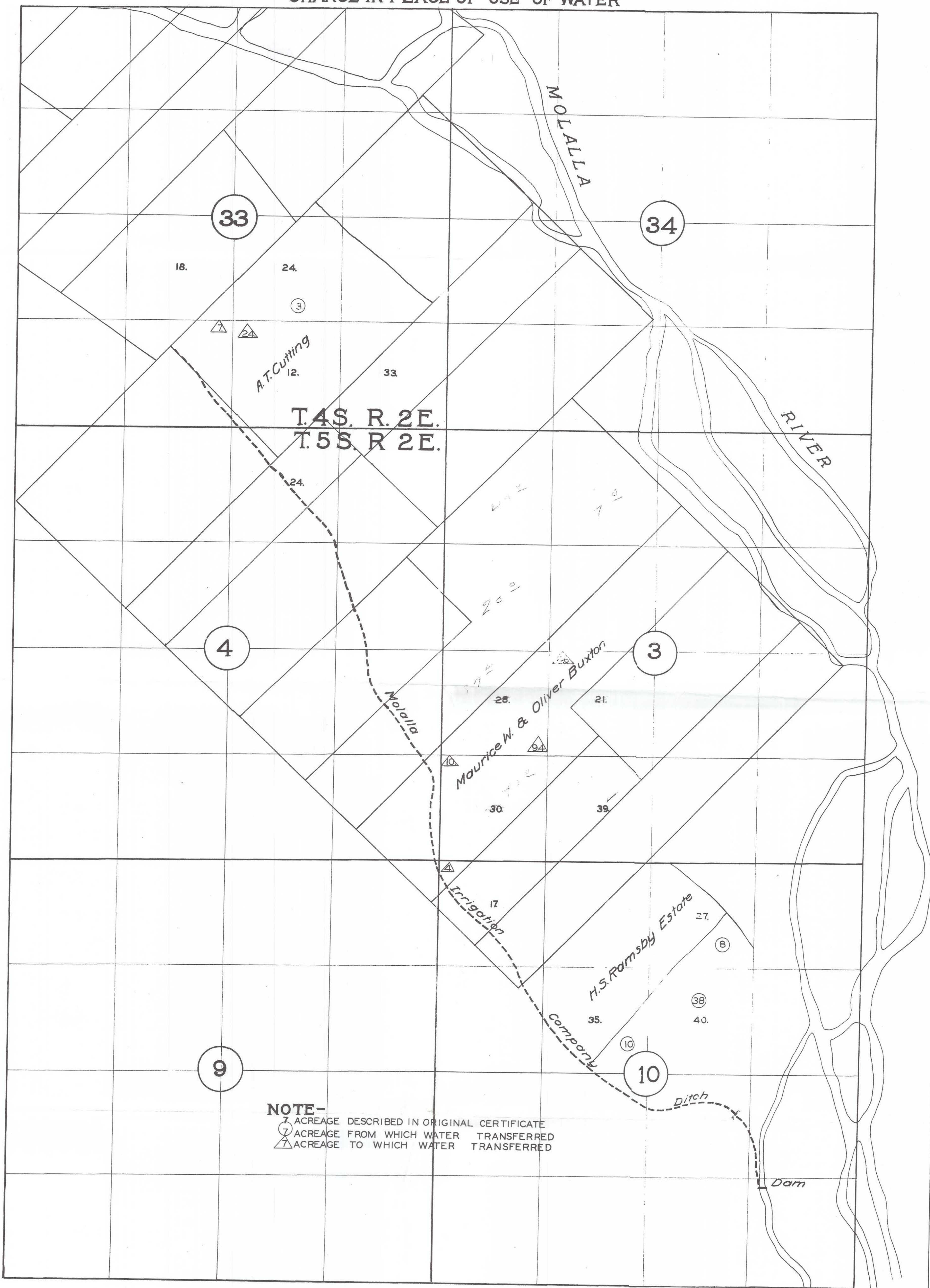

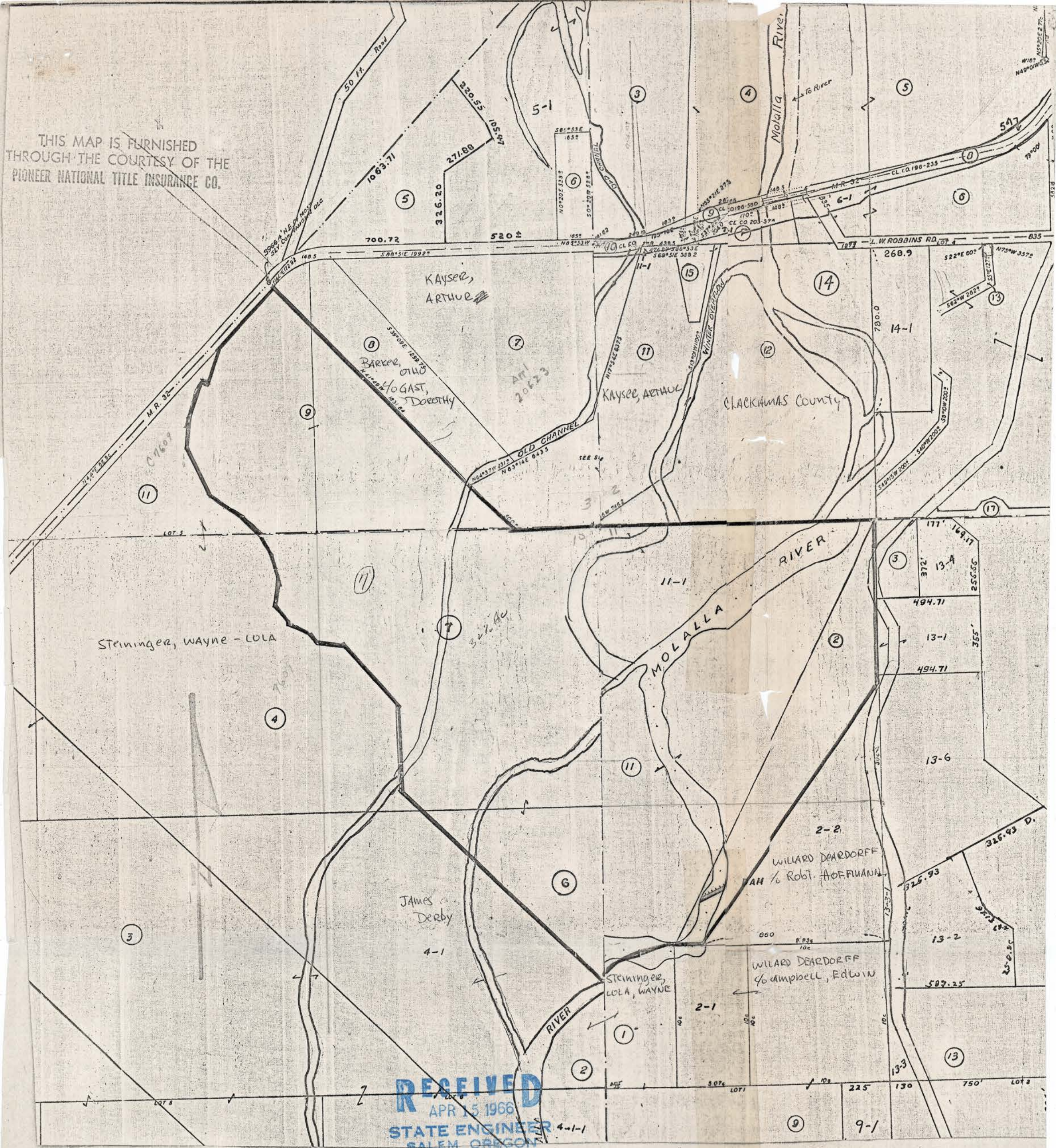

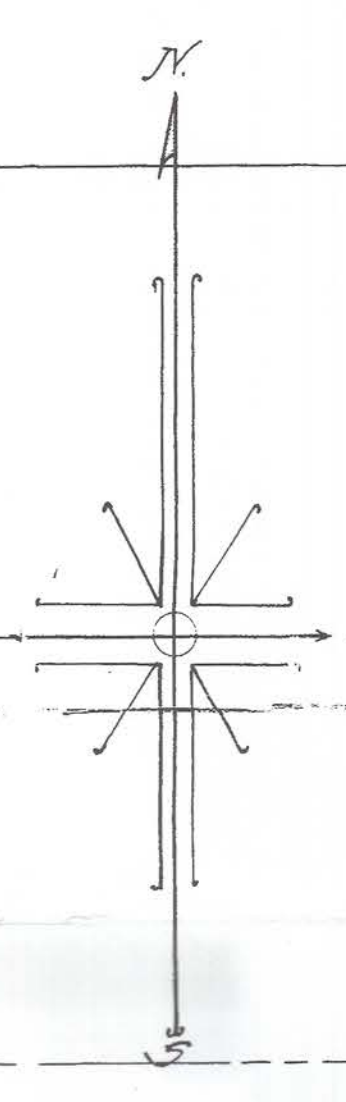
