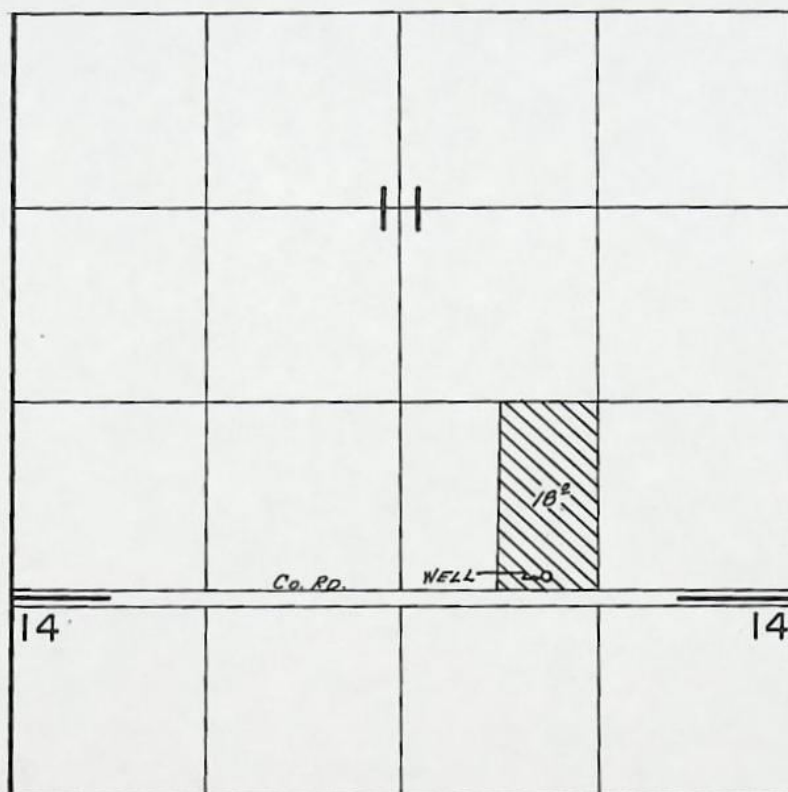

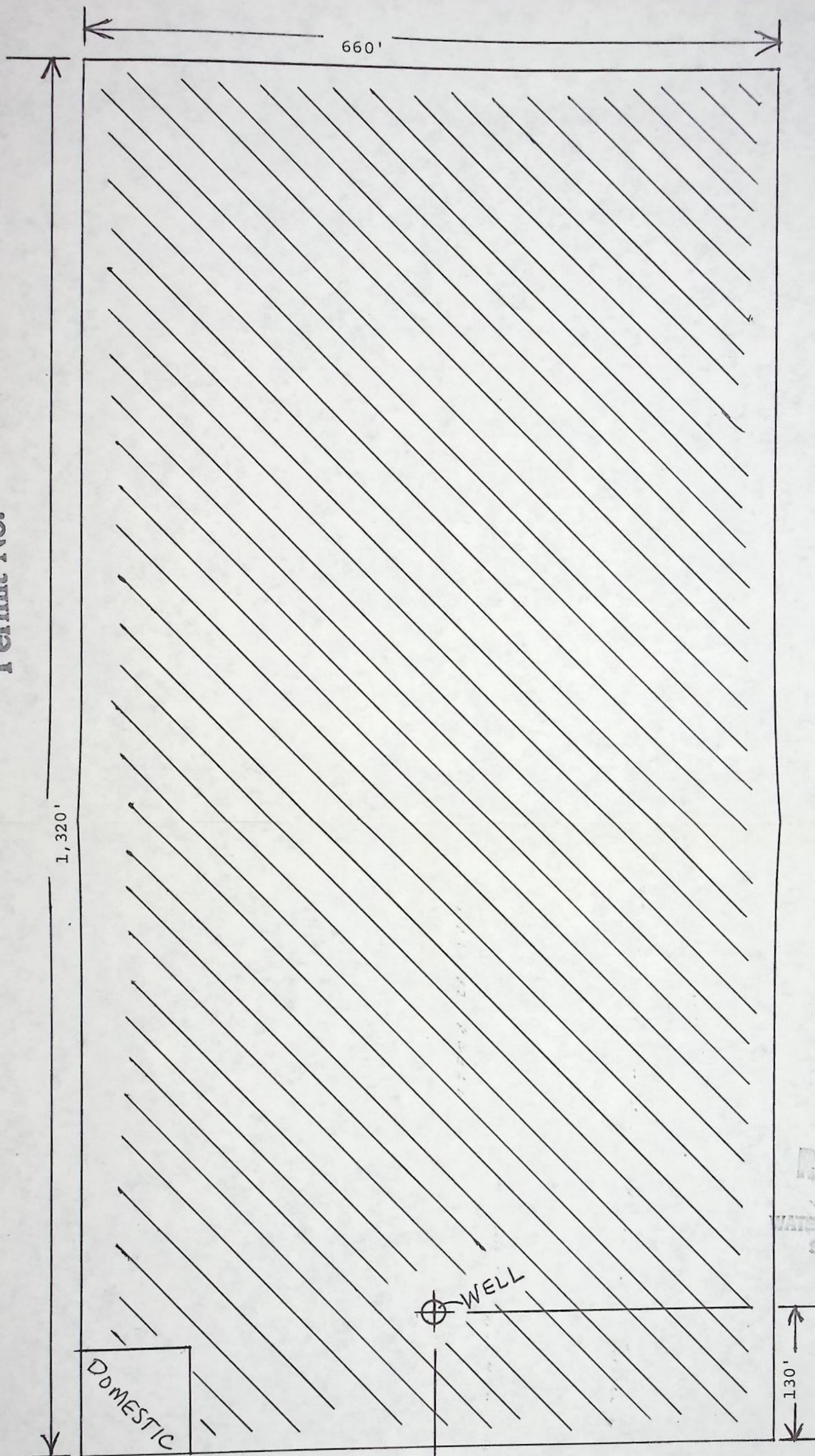

Your Application G-11091 describing the proposed use of 200 gallons of water per minute from an underground water source for the irrigation of 20.0 acres and domestic use for one family, together with the deed copy and four copies of a drawing, has been reviewed.

Apparently you were furnished the wrong application form since it appears that you are proposing the use of water from a well. If you do, in fact, propose the use of water from a well, the enclosed application for a permit to appropriate ground water (blue form) needs to be properly completed and submitted as a superseding application. If the superseding application is submitted, it will also be necessary for you to return your original application which was prepared on the white form in order to retain the tentative date of priority you have established.

The drawing prepared to the scale of one inch equals 110 feet does not meet our requirements. The map to support your application must be prepared to a standard even scale of not less than four inches equal to the mile. Scales such as one inch equals 100 feet or one inch equals 400 feet may be used. In addition to the information illustrated on the drawings you submitted, it is necessary to note the distances from the reference corner to the well site and note the number of acres to be irrigated to be in agreement with the information supplied in Items 2 and 3 of your application.

A legal description of the property upon which the water will be used is needed to verify the place of use. This legal description may be copied from your deed, title insurance policy, or sales contract. This information may be supplied in the Remarks Section of the application or on a separate sheet.

The use of ground water for domestic purposes in an amount not exceeding 15,000 gallons per day is exempt from permit requirements. A permit is not necessary and cannot be issued for such exempted uses of ground water. Therefore, if only one family will be supplied water, the domestic use should be omitted from Item 7 of your ground water application form.

The Water Resources Department has information that the water table in your area appears to be declining in response to current pumping withdrawals. Current annual pumping appears to be approximately equal to ground water recharge in the basin.

If in fact the ground water levels are declining or the available ground water supply in the area in question is being or is about to be overdrawn, the Water Resources Director will be required to protect the ground water resource from overappropriation.

This would be accomplished by prohibiting further drilling of wells in the affected ground water reservoir and, if necessary, controlling or shutting off the use of water from existing wells, based on priority date, until a stable ground water level is established.

A permit issued in approval of your application would in no manner guarantee the availability of ground water and would, of course, add to the total pumping withdrawals already legally taking place in the basin. You are cautioned that in the future the use of water under such permit may be restricted or terminated by order of the Water Resources Director.

I am returning your application and the four drawings for completion. The application is endorsed so that in order to retain its priority date it must be received in this office on or before January 3, 1984.

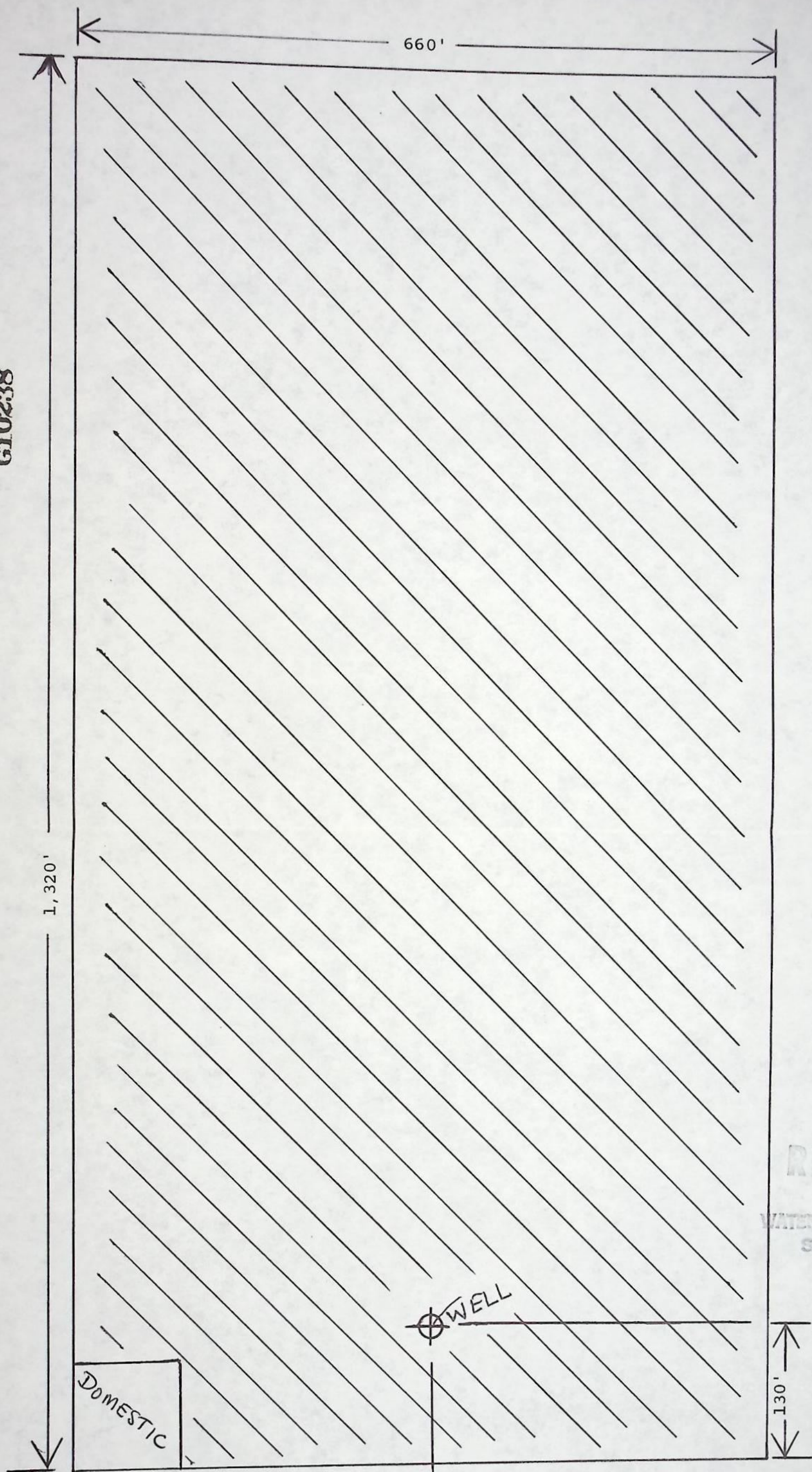

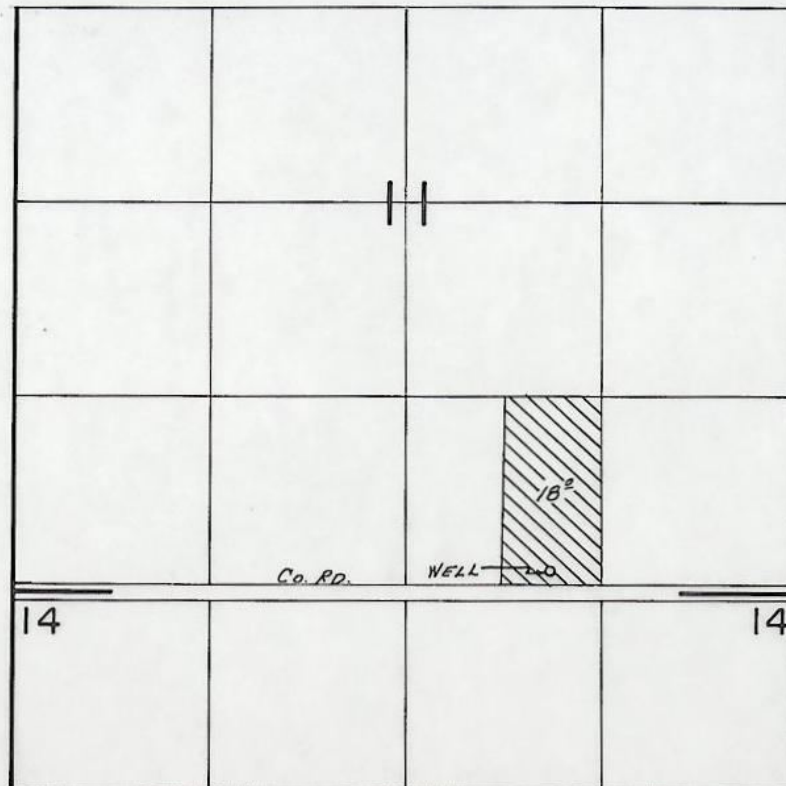

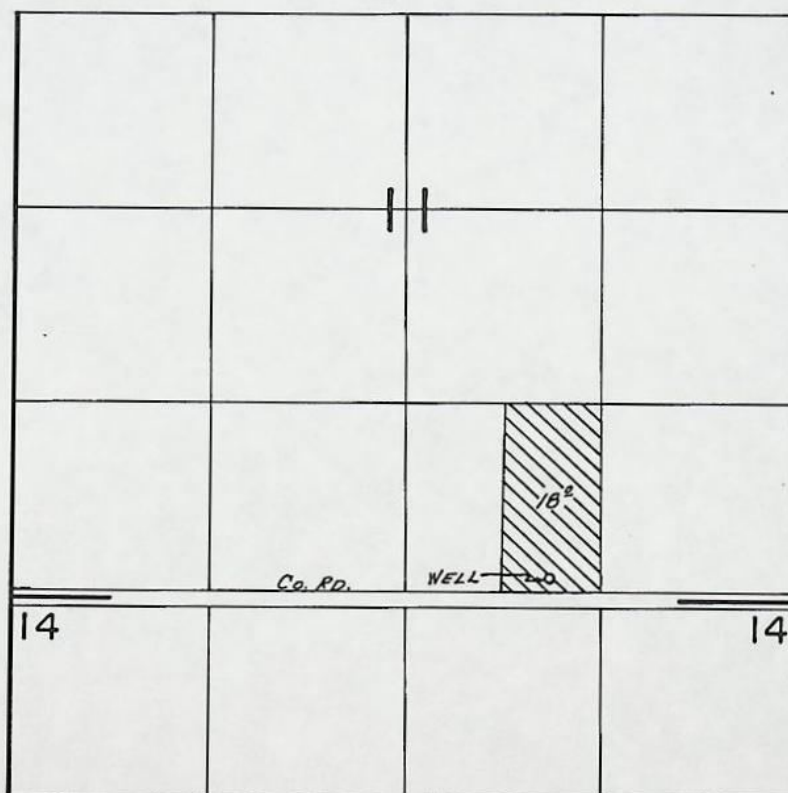
