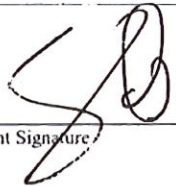

NOTE: A Water Availability Statement Form completed by the local watermaster, Land Use Information Form completed by the local Planning Department, fees and site map meeting the requirements of OAR 690-305-0010 must accompany this request. The fee for this request is **\$280** for the first point of diversion plus **\$30** for each additional point of diversion. Please review the Department's fee schedule to view fees required to request a limited license for Aquifer Storage and Recovery testing purposes or for Artificial Groundwater Recharge testing purposes.

Failure to provide any of the required information will result in return of your application. The license, if granted, will not be issued or replaced by a new license for a period of more than five consecutive years. The license, if granted, will be subordinate to all other authorized uses that rely upon the same source, or water affected by the source, and may be revoked at any time it is determined the use causes injury to any other water right or minimum perennial streamflow.

If a limited license is approved, the licensee shall give notice to the Department (Watermaster) at least 15 days in advance of using the water under the Limited License and shall maintain a record of use. The record of use shall include, but need not be limited to, an estimate of the amount of water used, the period of use and the categories of beneficial use to which the water is applied. During the period of the Limited License, the record of use shall be available for review by the Department upon request.

Water will be used to flush cuttings and cool the drill bit during exploration. To accomplish this, water is proposed to be pumped from Brownlee Reservoir using a portable pump temporarily submerged below the water line. Water usage is estimated at 5,000 gallons per day, and 60,000 gallons for the entire project.

Hi Kresta,

A few months ago, Idaho Power provided approval for withdrawal of water from Brownlee Reservoir for a proposed mining exploration project near Huntington. Due to some delays with the drillers the applicant will not be able to withdraw water from Brownlee Reservoir within the previously expected timeframe. The applicant would like to ask for approval from Idaho Power for a different window (7/11/2026-11/7/2026)

Details of the proposed exploration are the same as before; drilling is expected to take 12 total days. The daily pumping rate would be about 5,000 gallons per day, for a total of 60,000 gallons from the reservoir to be used for the project. They anticipate the project could occur over 12 days between the July 11 and November 7, 2026 window. The pump size will be 6 inches and the tanks will be

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2,500 gallons. With a total of 60,000 gallons to be used, it would require filling the tanks about 24 times for the project over 12 days of drilling.

We have a new water availability statement from the watermaster in Baker and a new signed land use form from the Baker County Planning Department. We will be resubmitting the limited use license application to OWRD for approval if this request to Idaho Power is authorized.

Hi Kresta,

Thank you for the call this morning. I am working with Bayhorse Silver to apply for a limited use license from OWRD for temporary diversion of water from Brownlee Reservoir for exploration drilling at the Bayhorse Mine in Baker County, Oregon. Drilling will be completed at up to eight locations to maximum depths of 200 feet below ground surface (bgs). The proposed drilling locations are situated entirely within the patented Bayhorse and Rapid mining claims on the Oregon side of the reservoir. Water will be needed to flush cuttings and cool the drill bit during exploration. The proposed diversions would be located from two points in the reservoir in T13S, R45E, Section 9. I have attached maps showing the locations of the proposed points of diversion.

Exploration drilling is expected to take 12 total days. The daily pumping rate would be about 5,000 gallons per day, for a total of 60,000 gallons from the reservoir to be used for the project. They would like to start April 1, 2026, and understanding authorizations and drill rig availability may take longer, they anticipate the project could occur over 12 days between an April 1 and July 10, 2026 window.

We have the water availability statement from the watermaster in Baker and a signed land use form from the Baker County Planning Department. We will be resubmitting the limited use license application to OWRD for approval if this request to Idaho Power is authorized.

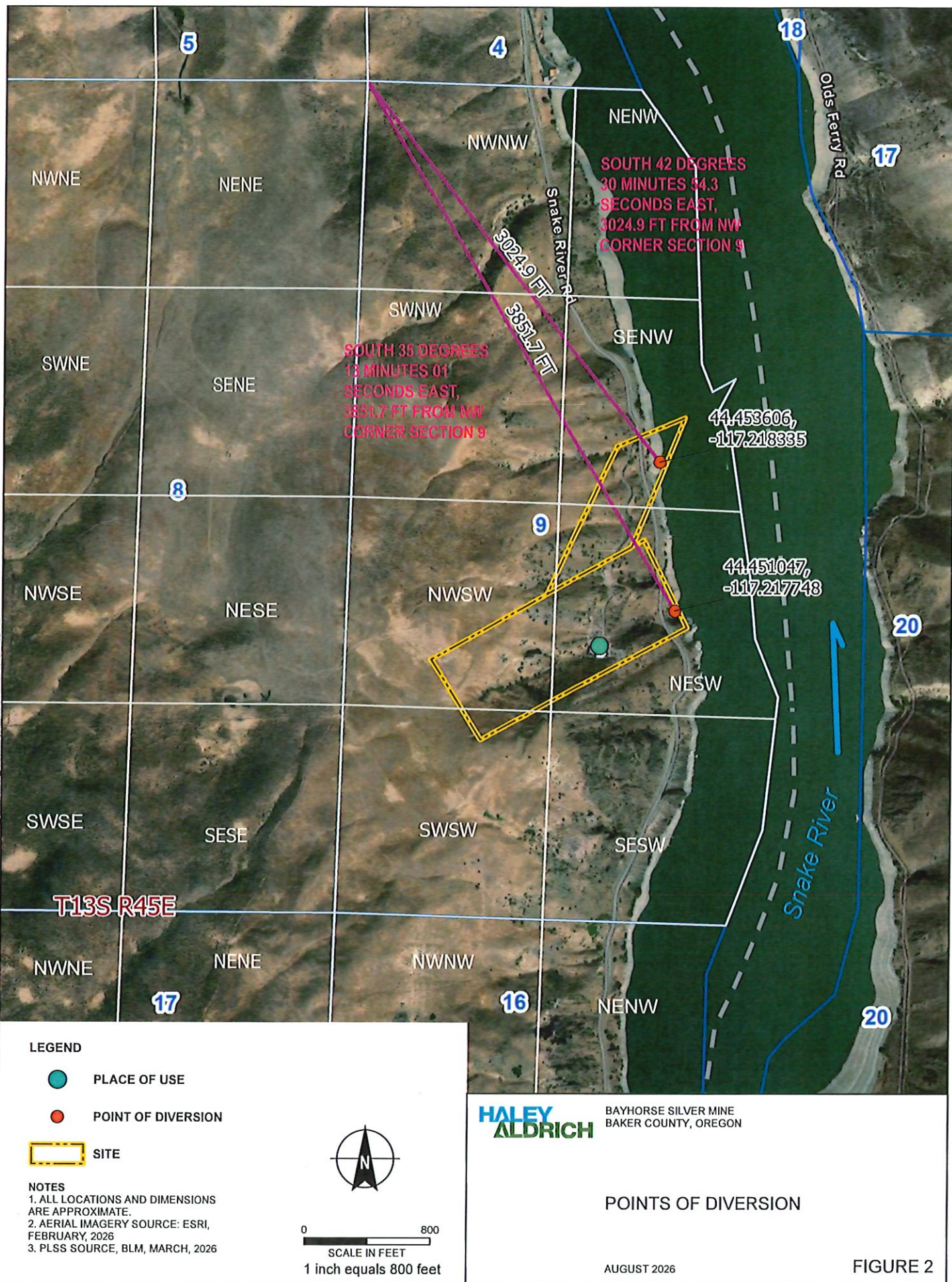

SURVEYOR'S NARRATIVE & CERTIFICATE

THIS SURVEY WAS MADE AT THE REQUEST OF BAYHORSE SILVER, INC. FOR THE PURPOSE OF RETRACING THE EXISTING BOUNDARY OF A PARCEL OF LAND KNOWN AS TAX LOT 500 OF TAX MAP 13545E ALSO KNOWN AS BAYHORSE QUARTZ MINE CLAIM NO. 37, M.S. NO. 135, AS DESCRIBED IN DEED BOOK "Y" PAGE 563, DEED RECORDS OF BAKER COUNTY, OREGON.

CONTROL FOR THIS SURVEY IS BASED ON THE NORTHWEST AND SOUTHWEST SECTION CORNERS OF SECTION 9 AS SHOWN. THE BASIS OF HEARINGS FOR THIS SURVEY IS THE (NAD 83) OREGON STATE PLANE COORDINATE SYSTEM, NORTH ZONE 3601 BASED UPON A STATIC OBSERVATION PROCESSED THROUGH (NCS/OPS). ALL HEARINGS AND DISTANCES ARE GRID.

THIS PATENTED MINING CLAIM WAS ORIGINALLY SURVEYED AND MONUMENTED IN DECEMBER OF 1886, BY C.M. POSTER. THE MONUMENTS OF RECORD WERE INDICATED AS A POST AND MARKED STONE. IN 1958 BROWNLEE H.E. DEVELOPMENT (IDAHIO POWER), SURVEYOR L.G. BURNAP RETRACED THIS CLAIM AND SEVERAL OTHERS IN AND AROUND THIS CLAIM. IPOC SHARED SEVERAL MAPS OF THESE CLAIMS (SEE REFERENCE TABLE BELOW) THAT SHOWS RECOVERY OF THE CORNERS AND SETTING OF NEW CORNERS. IN ADDITION TO THIS LATER RE-SURVEY THE MAPS GAVE TIES FROM CLAIM CORNERS TO EXISTING TUNNELS AS SHOWN OF RECORD. IN THE PROCESS OF THIS SURVEY EXTENSIVE CORNER SEARCH WAS COMPLETED, TUNNELS WERE UTILIZED TO VERIFY THE SEARCH AREA, NO MONUMENTS OR EVIDENCE OF THE ORIGINAL MONUMENTS OR THE IPOC MONUMENTS WERE RECOVERED, SEVERAL OF THE AREAS APPEAR TO HAVE HAD EXCAVATION ACTIVITIES AND WERE LIKELY REMOVED. ADJACENT CLAIM CORNERS WERE ALSO SEARCHED FOR WITH NO SUCCESS.

THE BOUNDARY OF THIS CLAIM WAS RE-ESTABLISHED AT RECORD LOCATION BASED ON THE MOST RECENT IPOC RETRACEMENT SURVEY OF TUNNEL DID NOT FIT VERY WELL HOWEVER THE OTHER THREE DID. I FOUND NO EVIDENCE OF ANY MONUMENTS THEREFORE RECORD IPOC DATA WAS USED AS SHOWN. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THE IPOC DATA SEEMS TO CREATE A SUBSTANTIAL 240'-4" SOUTHWESTERLY SHIFT, HOWEVER THIS IS BASED ON THE CURRENT WEST LINE OF SECTION 9, IPOC PROPORTIONED THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THIS SECTION 9 WHICH IS MOST LIKELY THE REASON IT APPEARS TO BE SHIFTED. NOTE IPOC RECOVERED MANY CLAIM CORNERS AND IS THE MOST RECENT SURVEY OF THESE CLAIMS.

MODERN 4X4 TREATED POST WERE RECOVERED AT REPORTED CLAIM CORNERS VERY NEAR COORDINATE VALUES THAT ROUGHLY AGREE WITH BLM/GCDB DATA. THE TRUE ORIGINS OF THESE POSTS ARE UNKNOWN BUT WERE BELIEVED TO BE PLACED BY EITHER A REAL ESTATE AGENT OR A MINE LOCATOR "SURVEYOR". BOTH METHODS WOULD HAVE MOST LIKELY UTILIZED THE GCDB DATA AND THE THEORY/IDEA OF STAKING A LOAD CLAIM RATHER THAN A PATENTED CLAIM/PROPERTY IN FILL. THE GCDB DATA, COUNTY DATA AND DOGAMI DATA ARE ALL BASED ON THE MOST RECENT SURVEY IN THE PUBLIC RECORD BEING THE ORIGINAL 1886 SURVEY. THE IPOC DATA WAS NOT IN THE PUBLIC RECORD BUT IS LOCALLY KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN COMPLETE DURING THE 1958 BROWNLEE H.E. DEVELOPMENT, AS OUTLINED IN THE CURRENT 2009 BLM MANUAL SECTION 6-36, 10-211, LOCAL RECENT SURVEYS OF RECORD CONTROLLED THE LOCATIONS OF THIS SURVEY.

BASED ON ELKHORN TITLE REPORT NO. 18-21844, THE AREA BELOW THE IPOC 208' CONTOUR LINE IS UNDER GOV. REGULATIONS, NO CONVEYANCE OF THIS AREA WAS FOUND OR PROVIDED, ADDITIONALLY NO DOCUMENTS ADDRESSING THE ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY WERE FOUND OR PROVIDED, IT IS SHOWN HERE AS A 200' WIDE RIGHT-OF-WAY BASED ON AERIAL LOCATION COLLECTED IN THIS SURVEY.

THE GENERAL MINE DISTURBANCE EXCAVATION/PROPOSED & EXISTING STOCKPILES ARE AREA COLLECTED ON SITE THAT APPEAR TO BE RECENT GROUND DISTURBANCE AND AREA PLANNED FOR FUTURE STOCKPILE AS DIRECTED BY GRAPHIC ONEILL, CHD OF BAYHORSE SILVER, INC.

THE UNDERGROUND WORKINGS SHOWN HERE WERE SURVEYED BY BAYHORSE EMPLOYEE BILL WILLOUGHBY P.E. (IDAHO). I SPOKE WITH MR. WILLOUGHBY IN DETAIL REGARDING HIS SURVEY AND PROCEEDURE. MR. WILLOUGHBY PROVIDED HIS DATA. I RECOVERED FIVE OF HIS ORIGINAL CONTROL POINTS BOTH OVER GROUND AND UNDERGROUND AND EVERYTHING CHECK. WILL.
