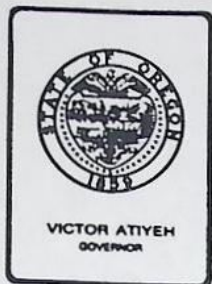

We have completed our usual field inspection for your Water Permits G-7621 and G-8904. In attempting to complete the processing for issuance of the certificates, some problems have surfaced that need to be resolved, as we discussed by phone on June 11, 1985.

According to the report by our field examiner, Well #3 is no longer used to irrigate the lands in Sections 13 and 24, as described under Certificate 52524. He further reports that Well #5 is the only source of water being used for the irrigation of these lands. If this information is correct, you should request a transfer for a change in point of appropriation from Well #3 to Well #5 under Permit G-4160 (Certificate 52524), and thus maintain the May 29, 1968 priority date for those lands. We could then allow supplemental use from Well #5 on these lands to for the additional water being used under Permit G-7621.

It also appears that approximately 70.0 acres of the land described in Certificate 52524 have not been irrigated for some time, and the water right to those acres should be cancelled. Your authorization to cancel this portion of the water right could be included in the transfer request.

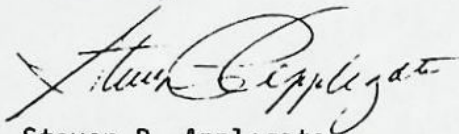
The enclosed, partially completed transfer application form, along with the map of our preliminary findings, should be of help to you. The form must be completed in ink or typewritten and signed by an authorized representative of King Farms, notarized and returned along with the required fees and the map. The fees for the transfer request will amount to \$85.00 plus advance publishing costs of \$120.00 for a total of \$205.00. In any change in point of diversion or point of appropriation of over $\frac{1}{4}$ mile, the Director must publish notice of the requested change over a three week period in a newspaper of your choice with general local circulation. Any unused

We have received the map, fees of \$20.00, and an application submitted by Ray Heimbigner, Ruth Heimbigner, Tom Heimbigner, and Linda Heimbigner Vincent for a permit to use 4,000 gallons of water per minute from a well for irrigation of 900 acres. For reference, the application is numbered G-8222.

A permit can be issued for the proposed use of water, however, I believe the map and application require amendment.

The Water Resources Department adopted new applications forms in March, 1977. The new application form is now required. I am enclosing the form along with our instruction booklet.

As mentioned to you by telephone, the N $\frac{1}{4}$ and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 13 and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 24 are already covered by permit numbered G-4160, which describes the use of water on this land from a well located 1950 feet north and 2550 feet east from the S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner, Section 14.

If the well described by permit G-4160 is to be the source of water for the lands in Section 13 and 24, they should be deleted from the new application. If not, a statement to the extent that use of water will be made under permit numbered G-4160 should be included along with the new application.
