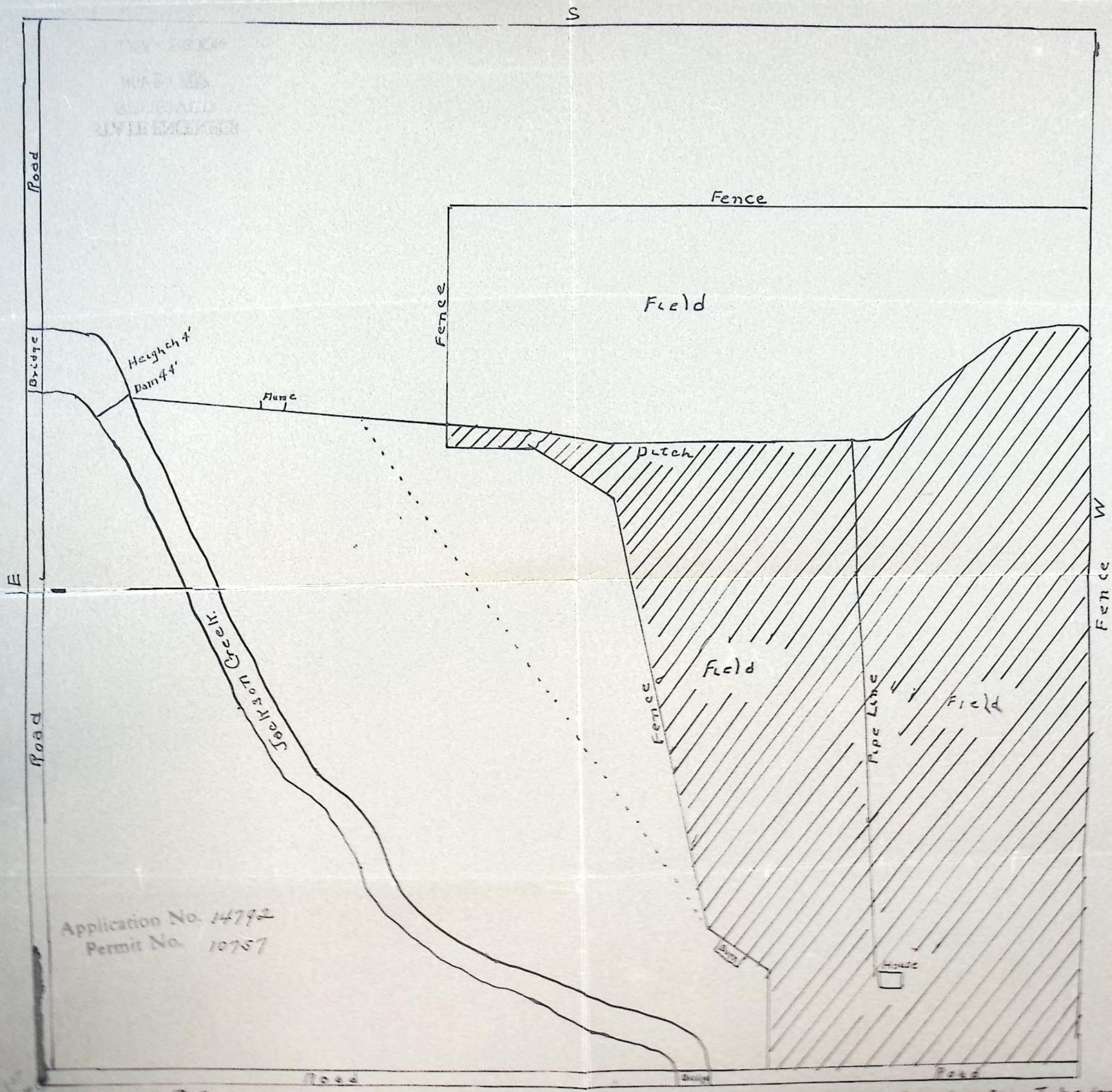

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That **HAROLD JOHNSON**
of Route 1, Colton, State of Oregon, has made proof
to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of
Jackson Creek
a tributary of Milk Creek for the purpose of
Irrigation and domestic
under Permit No. 10757 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby
confirmed dates from November 1, 1932;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed
0.2 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream,

The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 36, Township 4 South, Range
3 East, W. M. or its equivalent in case of rotation.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second
per acre,

and shall
conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right
is appurtenant, is as follows:

14 acres in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$,
Section 36,
Township 4 South, Range 3 East, W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.

After the expiration of fifty years from the date of this certificate or on the expiration of any
federal power license issued in connection with this right, and after not less than two years' notice in
writing to the holder hereof, the State of Oregon, or any municipality thereof, shall have the right to
take over the dams, plants and other structures and all appurtenances thereto which have been con-
structed for the purpose of devoting to beneficial use the water rights specified herein, upon condition
that before taking possession the State or municipality shall pay not to exceed the fair value of the
property so taken, plus such reasonable damages, if any, to valuable, serviceable and dependable prop-
erty of the holder of this certificate, not taken over, as may be caused by the severance therefrom of
the property taken in accordance with the provisions of section 47-508, Oregon Code 1930.

This will acknowledge receipt of your Application No. 14792, together with the tracing showing the proposed works.

The application appears to be in satisfactory form but I note you have stated under "Remarks" there will be five acres available for irrigation whenever the land can be cleared. It would appear from the map that the area which you have crosshatched would approximate 15 acres and that the area between the dotted line and the fence would be an additional five acres. If this is true the application should be made for the irrigation of 20 acres instead of 15.

I will be glad to make the necessary correction on the application upon your authorization to do so if my assumption is correct. Upon your advice in the matter the application will be placed in line for approval and issuance of a permit.

There is an overpayment in the amount of fees of 50 ¢ which amount will be returned to you when the permit is issued.

Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of your application for permit to appropriate $\frac{1}{2}$ second-foot of water from Jackson Creek for irrigation and domestic supply, together with your remittance in the sum of \$15.00 as fees. Receipt No. 15637 is enclosed. The application has been filed, given No. 14792, and is being returned for additional information.

A general description of the main ditch should be given under Item 8 (a) and (b), and if a pipe line is to be used in conveying water for domestic use, a general description of it should be given under Item 8 (c). The location of the lands to be irrigated and the place of use for domestic should be shown under Item 9 and also the number of acres which you intend to irrigate. Items 9 (a) and (b), 12, 13, 14 and 15 should be filled out, and your signature and that of at least one witness must be attached to the application. It is also requested that you advise us under "remarks" the number of families you propose to serve for domestic use.

The map submitted with the application is not entirely satisfactory in that it does not indicate clearly the lands which are to be irrigated. The simplest method of showing this is to shade that portion upon which water is to be applied.

It is impossible to compute the necessary fees due until you have informed us of the number of acres which you intend to irrigate. Upon receipt of this information the fees due will be computed and if there is a balance remaining in your favor, such amount will be returned to you.

The application has been endorsed so that in order to retain its priority it must be resubmitted to this office within 30 days, or on or before December 2nd.
