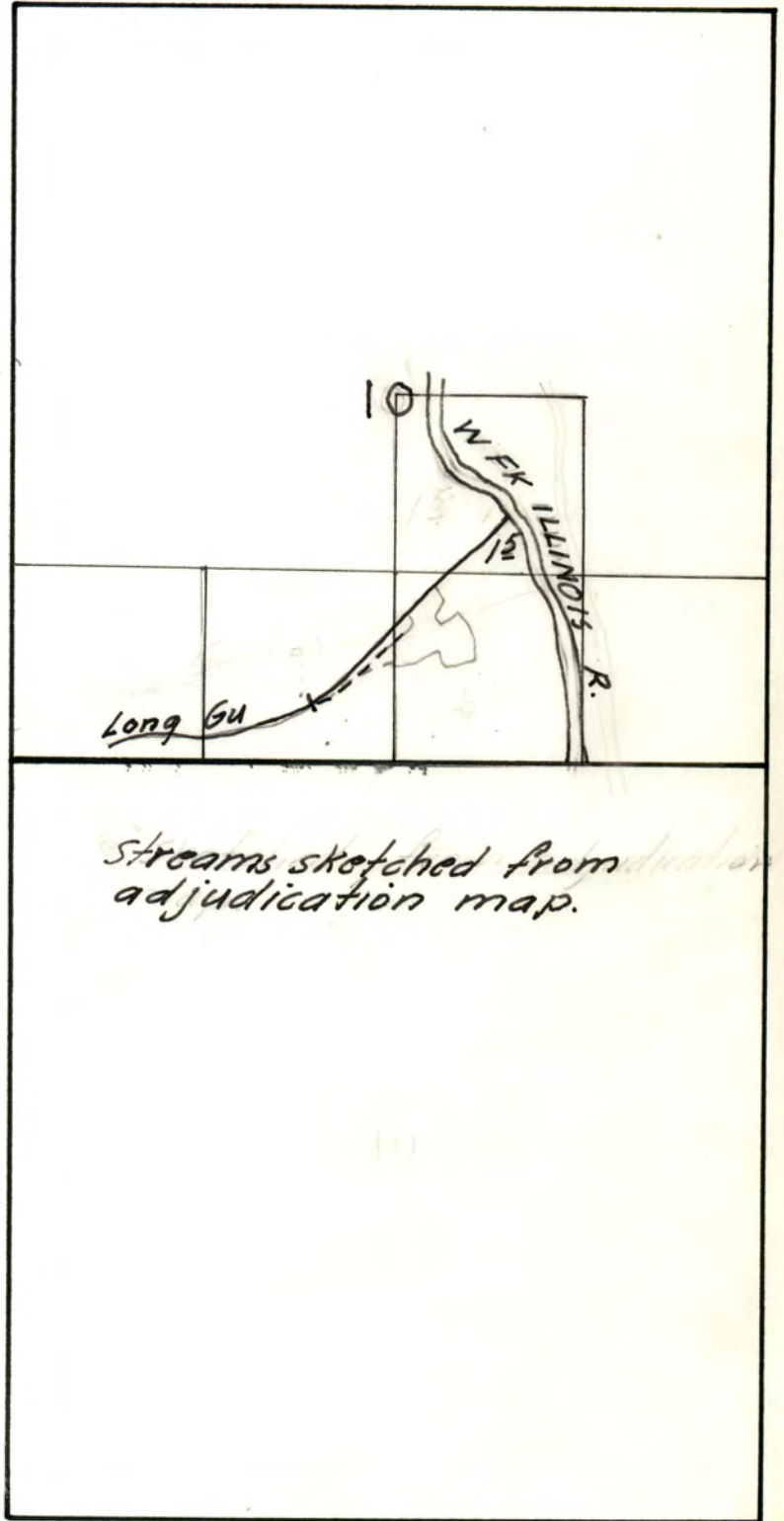

Your letter of the 15th instant to the State Water Board in regard to your application No. 2587, permit No. 1388, has been referred to this office for reply. According to the records of this office your permit covers the appropriation of 0.48 second foot of water from Long Gulch Creek for the irrigation of 38 acres and construction work was required to begin on or before Jan. 27, 1914, be completed on or before June 1, 1915, and the water applied to the proposed use on or before October 1, 1915. In view of the fact that this water right should have been completed in 1915 and several years have elapsed before an extension of time was requested, there may be some question as to the prosecution of work with diligence under the permit. I would suggest that your final proof covering the irrigation of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land be allowed to stand and that you make a new application covering the irrigation of the remainder of the land. Under a new permit you will then be allowed approximately the three years within which to apply the water to the remainder of the land.

I am enclosing application blanks and a copy of instructions for your use in case you desire to take this course.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of yours of the 15th., enclosing final proof blank under your permit No. 1388. I note that you have been unable to irrigate all the land covered by the permit and that if allowed additional time, you will be able to put more land under irrigation. You will understand, of course, that if you make proof at this time, your right would be limited to the amount of land that has been actually irrigated, which appears from your proof, to be $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres. I have therefore referred your letter to the State Engineer as an application for an extension of time. In case the State Engineer sees fit to recommend that your time be extended, you will then be able to withhold making proof until the expiration of the additional time allowed and will, no doubt, be able to irrigate the balance of 28 acres covered by your permit. Your application for an extension of time will receive consideration at the next Board meeting, which will probably be some time in November. You will be promptly notified of the action taken.
