NOTICE OF COMPLETE APPLICATION OF WATER TO A BENEFICIAL USE

I, Thomas C. Beymer, the holder of Application No. 3409, being Ditch Permit No. 1891, issued by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon for the appropriation of second feet of the waters of Willow Creek in accordance with the tenor of such permit and the limitations endorsed thereon by the State Engineer, completely applied the water to a beneficial use, on the 26th day of April, 1914 being the time limitation as fixed in said permit or extended by the State Water Board for the complete application of water to a beneficial use.

Beymer, holder of Application No. 3409, being Ditch Permit No. 1891, issued by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon, for the appropriation of second feet of the waters of Willow Creek in accordance with the tenor of such permit and the limitations endorsed thereon by the State Engineer, have completed the construction of the works described therein the 15 day of April, 1914 being within the time limitation as fixed in said permit or extended by the State Water Board for the completion of construction work.

Beymer, the holder of Application No. 3409, being Ditch Permit No. 1891, issued by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon, for the appropriation of 0.2 second feet of the waters of Willow Creek in accordance with the tenor of such permit and the limitations endorsed thereon by the State Engineer, began the actual construction of the works described therein on the 12 day of Feb., 1914, being within the time limitation as fixed in said permit for the beginning of construction work.

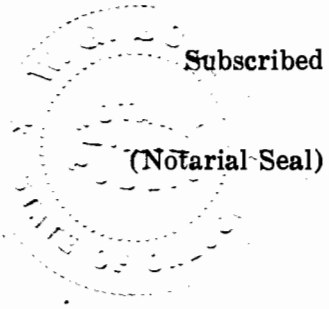

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of November 24th in regard to the water right under application No. 3409, Permit No. 1891, under which certificate has been issued.

It would appear from your letter that you have secured the right of way through the ditch belonging to other parties, for the appropriation of water. You would be entitled to water under your permit, so long as there was water in the source of supply sufficient for your right, together with the rights of all prior appropriators, and if the ditch is large enough to carry your water in addition to the amount required by the owners of the ditch, you would be entitled to receive water at the same time the owners are using water, and would not be compelled to wait until the other appropriators have received their share.

It is probable however, that the best manner of using this water would be for you to make some arrangements with the other parties on the ditch, whereby you would receive the entire amount of water appropriated for a certain length of time in rotation. By so doing you would be able to irrigate the whole of your land within a very few days, and then the other parties would be entitled to the entire amount of water diverted by this ditch.

Trusting you will find this satisfactory, and that you will advise if we can be of further service, I remain,
