On October 17, 1977, a representative of this office inspected the lands involved in the incompleated water right Permit G-4595 in your name. The information obtained by the field engineer was that you had sold the property to Tom Davis of Alvord Ranch, Princeton. The field engineer reported that the well which you had called the Little Alvord Well has now been abandoned and no longer being utilized. Therefore, the Permit G-4595 could not be issued a certificate without encumbering it as supplemental to the abandoned well. The reason for this is the rights of record are still on the books for the abandoned well. We need an affidavit from the property owner to cancel the old water right, thereby allowing us to issue a certificate under the new permit as the primary source for those lands.

I have sent two letters to Mr. Davis indicating this requirement along with an assignment form for him to contact you and get the permit assigned into his name. There have been no responses from those letters. Since you are still the holders of the permit, the choice is yours whether to assign it or cancel the permit. I am enclosing forms for each purpose so that you may choose the method in which you want your permit handled. Please do so at your earliest convenience and return to this office. The assignment form must be accompanied with a statutory fee in the amount of \$2 in order for us to mark the records. If you have any information relative to the present ownership of the property please let us know so we may be able to properly conclude the provisions of this permit.

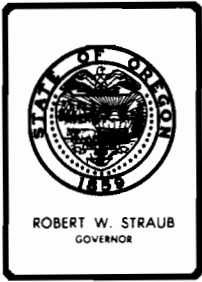

We've not received a response from my July 20, 1979, letter regarding the Constance and Robert Wilson permit G-4595. A copy of that letter is enclosed for your convenience.

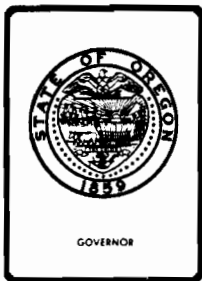

Dear Mr. Davis:

On October 17, 1977, a representative of this office inspected the lands involved in the incompleted water right in the name of Constance and Robert Wilson, permit number G-4595. The field engineer informs me that you are the present land owner of this property. I am enclosing and assignment form for your use, which when signed by Constance and Robert Wilson, should be submitted to this office along with a \$2.00 recording fee. We will then be able to assign permit G-4595 into your name and correspond with you to reach a logical conclusion of the water right.

This permit cannot be presently issued a water right certificate since it is in conflict with certificate number 34030 which was issued to the Wilson's for the use of the waters of the Little Alvord well on a part of the land in Section 15, which your presently supplying from the well appurtenant to G-3595 which you call the Airport Well. The Little Alvord well having been abandoned, still appears as a water right of record and you as a property owner should authorize the cancellation of that water right under certificate number 34030, so that we may issue a water right certificate for the Airport Well for those lands. A partially completed format of an affidavit to be signed by the property owner is enclosed. Please have an affidavit made out with the information shown on this one for you to sign before a notary public so that we can eliminate the Little Alvord Well certificate.

Upon receiving the cancellation affidavit and the assignment into your name, we will then be able to proceed toward issuing the water right certificate for the lands involved under permit number G-4595. I am sending you a preliminary copy of final proof survey map for this project with the lands which were involved under certificate number 34030 shown thereon in red cross hatching. I hope that this is enough information for you to be able to see the situation we are presently involved with.

We will hold further action on this file for a reasonable length of time pending your reply.

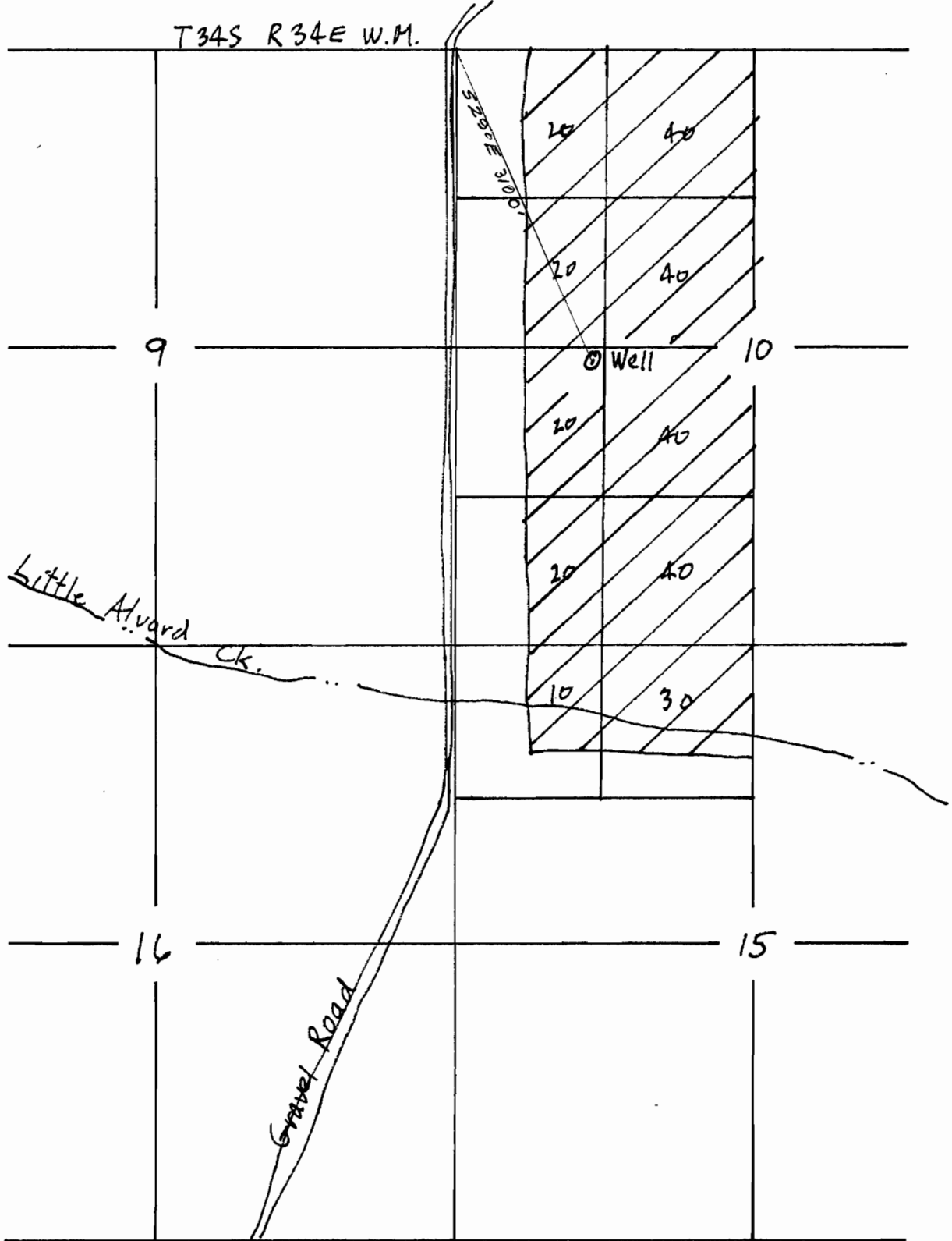

Dear Mr. Anderson:

I have reviewed the contents of your letter and will place it in the Wilson's file. We have in general considered eastern Oregon as ordinary conditions for which the 1/80th cubic foot per second per acre and 3 acre feet per year is a reasonable limitation. In western Oregon, we normally limit a ground water development to 2½ acre feet per acre or less.

In making this limitation of 1/80th cubic foot per second per acre, the restriction is also limited to its equivalent in case of rotation. In most ground water aquifers this permits pumping at a slightly higher rate at times of maximum plant stress, and a correspondingly lower rate during the seasonal period of lower plant demand.

I don't disagree with most of the information contained in your letter, with the exception of item 2 which states that irrigation efficiency is ±70% for sprinkler and ±45% for gravity methods. On good ground water developments, gravity methods should approach the efficiency obtained with sprinklers.

A second factor which you may not have considered that is included in all of the Bureau of Reclamation projects you listed is the matter of main canal losses. With a ground water development the well is located on the farm at the place of use. Consequently the conveyance losses in the diversion canal from the stream to the place of use is not pertinent. The comparable acre foot per year on the project you list vary from 2.28 to 3 acre feet, with the exception of the Vale Project which is 3.4 acre feet per year based on a 55% application efficiency.

I want to assure you that I don't in any sense want to provide limitations which are unreasonably low or prevent a farmer from obtaining excellent production. By the same token, our ground water resources are quite limited and are not adequate to irrigate all of the irrigable land which could be developed. Under these circumstances it is essential that the duty be restricted so as to prevent any undue waste.

This will acknowledge the returned applications No. G-4880, G-4881, G-4882, G-4883 and G-4884 and the maps.

Application No. G-4881 has been amended from the appropriation of 4.0 cubic feet of water per second from Corn Field Well for the irrigation of 320.0 acres located in Township 34 South, Range 34 East, to the appropriation of 650 gallons of water per minute from Mann Lake Meadow Well for the irrigation of 116.0 acres in Township 32 South, Range 34 East. Due to the extent of the changes made on this application, it has received the new priority date of October 13, 1969.

Application No. G-4882 has been amended to increase the number of acres to be irrigated from 180.0 acres to 182.0 acres. The additional 2.0 acres has received the priority date of October 13, 1969.

Application No. G-4883 has been amended to increase the number of acres to be irrigated from 320.0 acres to 335.0 acres. The additional 13.0 acres has received the priority date of October 13, 1969.

Dear Chris:

We have been working with the Alvord Ranch, east of Steens Mountain in Harney County, for several years on water planning and development. In connection with this work, we have assisted the owners in the recent submission of water right applications. These applications were prepared using the criteria in the Rules and Regulations for Ground Water Appropriation of your office. However, the owners have asked that consideration be given to the opinion that 1/80 cfs per acre is insufficient for irrigation on their ranch as well as in most areas of Eastern Oregon. On page 7 of the Rules and Regulations, it states that "1/80 of a cubic foot per second is, under ordinary conditions, considered sufficient for the irrigation of an acre of ground". We believe, however, that most of Eastern Oregon may not properly be considered "under ordinary conditions", particularly if areas west of the Cascades is the basis of comparison.

In our economic analysis of irrigated hay production at the Alvord Ranch we established the following criteria, based on recognized methods and data such as the Blaney-Criddle and similar formulas, Oregon Experiment Station data, U.S. B.R. studies, soils and topography, etc.:

1. Alfalfa irrigation consumptive use is 20 to 22 inches per season.
2. Irrigation efficiency is $\pm 70\%$ for sprinkler and $\pm 45\%$ for gravity methods
3. Pump diversion requirements are 6 gpm/acre (2.5 AF/Ac/year) for sprinklers and 9 gpm/acre (3.75 AF/Ac/year) for surface irrigation methods.

Our familiarity and experience with other irrigation developments indicates a similar water requirement in excess of the Oregon statutory regulations--both in terms of diversion rate and total seasonal application.

A cursory review of some random Bureau of Reclamation and other planning reports for Oregon project similarly indicates greater water requirements:

Data from older operating Bureau projects, as I am sure you realize, show a comparable situation with respect to water use being in excess of the 1/80 cfs per acre or 3 AF/A/year.

We would appreciate the consideration of your office of this situation at the time that field inspections are made for final proof of beneficial use, and perhaps file a copy of this letter with our clients' pending files (Constance H. and Robert B. Wilson)

We would also welcome any comments you may have on this general matter.

Enclosed are applications Nos. G-4880, G-4881, G-4882, G-4883 and G-4884 together with the appropriate maps. These applications were submitted by Constance H. Wilson and Robert B. Wilson and had been returned for correction and completion with your letter of August 11, 1969.

The applications and maps have been corrected in accordance with the deficiencies noted in your letter of August 11. Application G-4881 for the Corn Field Well has been changed after a decision not to drill in this location. Dear Mr. and Mrs. Wilson:

This will acknowledge receipt of your returned applications No. G-4880, G-4881, G-4882, G-4883 and G-4884, and the transparency map.

Each application requires an additional \$5.00 recording fee.

Item No. 4 on application No. G-4883 should be further completed to designate in which quarter-quarter section the well is located. From the map submitted this would be the NE¹/₄ NE¹/₄ of Section 24, Township 33 South, Range 34 East.

The map submitted with application No. G-4884 indicates there is land to be irrigated in the NE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ of Section 15. No acreage was designated on the map or in item No. 12 on the application for this forty.

In checking the areas indicated as irrigated, I find it does not always agree with the number of acres designated in each forty. The total area shown as irrigated for application No. G-4884, which on the map scales approximately 32 chains wide and 110 chains long, would be approximately 240 acres. Item No. 12 on the application indicates 275 acres are to be irrigated. The applications and maps must be in agreement as to the number of acres irrigated in each forty.

I am returning your applications and maps for correction and completion. The applications are endorsed so that in order to retain their dates of priority, they must be returned to this office on or before October 13, 1967.

appropriate 1800 gallons of water per minute from Airport well for the irrigation of 280 acres, a map and the fee of \$34.50 for which our receipt No. 14329 is enclosed;

appropriate 4.0 cubic feet of water per second from Corn Field well for the irrigation of 320 acres, a map and the fee of \$36.50 for which our receipt No. 14331 is enclosed;
