Dear Sir:

This acknowledges receipt of your application for permit to appropriate 1.0 second-foot of water from an unnamed spring brook for domestic supply and fish pond, together with your remittance in the sum of \$13.00 as fees. Receipt No. 17624 is enclosed. The application has been filed, given No. 15455, and is being returned for some additional information.

I presume that the lawn, garden and orchard to be irrigated will be for domestic use and will not comprise more than two acres, but if the garden and orchard are to be for commercial purposes or will comprise more than two acres, it will be necessary to collect the statutory recording fee of \$4.50 for irrigation use.

A general description of the main pipe line or ditch should be given under Item 5 and the length, size and fall of the pipe line or ditch should be given under "remarks". The location of the place of use should be shown under Item 9, indicating the smallest legal subdivisions or forty-acre tracts within which it will lie and also showing the number of acres to be irrigated. The general location of the main pipe line or ditch should be shown on the map and the place of use should be indicated.

The application has been endorsed so that in order to retain its priority it must be returned within thirty days, or on or before September 4, 1934.
