



The Oregon Water Resources Department ("OWRD") and James Butsch ("Applicant"), referred to collectively as "the Parties" and each individually a "Party," do hereby stipulate and agree in this "Settlement Agreement" as follows:

Stipulations

- I. On July 22, 2004, Applicant submitted Application R-86054 for the storage of 147.0 acre feet of water from Butte Creek for multi-purpose use and Application S-86055 for the use of 147.0 acre feet of stored water for irrigation use on 950.2 acres, both being in Butte Creek Basin, Marion County.
 - On August 6, 2004, Applicant submitted Application G-16288 for the storage of 147.0 acre feet of groundwater from drain tiles and for the use of 147.0 acre feet of stored groundwater for irrigation use on 950.2 acres, being in Bochsler Creek Basin, Marion County.
- II. On March 29, 2005, OWRD issued Proposed Final Orders ("PFO's") recommending Applications G-16288, R-86054, and S-86055 be approved with conditions.
- III. On May 13, 2005, Applicant timely filed protests to the PFO's for Applications G-16288, R-86054, and S-86055.
- IV. OWRD and Applicant agree that all issues raised in Applicant's protests to the PFO's for Applications G-16288, R-86054, and S-86055 are resolved solely on the following terms.

Terms of Agreement

- 1. In signing this Settlement Agreement, Applicant withdraws his protests and any requests for contested case hearing to the PFO's for Applications G-16288, R-86054, and S-86055 with prejudice.
- 2. Regarding water right Applications G-16288, R-86054, and S-86055, Applicant hereby expressly waives all right and opportunity to file a protest or request for contested case hearing, request for reconsideration, exceptions, or to seek judicial review of the Final Orders or Permits, in addition to waiving any right and opportunity challenge to this Settlement Agreement.

- 3. After Applicant signs this Settlement Agreement, he will mail the signed original back to Oregon Water Resources Department, ATTN: Mike Reynolds, 725 Summer St. NE, Suite A, Salem, OR 97301-1266.
- 4. Within 30 days after OWRD receives the original Settlement Agreement signed by OWRD and Applicant, along with the required \$250.00 permit recording fee for each application, for a total of \$750.00, OWRD will issue Final Orders and Permits that are consistent with the Draft Final Orders and Draft Permits attached to this Settlement Agreement. The Final Orders will incorporate this Settlement Agreement by reference and as an attachment.
- 5. Each Party to this Settlement Agreement represents, warrants, and agrees that the person who executes this Agreement on its behalf has the full right and authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of that Party and bind that Party to the terms of this Settlement Agreement.
- 6. Each Party to this Settlement Agreement certifies that they have had a reasonable opportunity to review and request changes to the Settlement Agreement, and that they have signed this Settlement Agreement of their own free will and accord. Each Party to this Settlement Agreement also certifies that they have read the entire Settlement Agreement, Draft Final Orders, and Draft Permits, and understand and fully agree with the contents thereof.
- 7. As mentioned above, permit recording fees in the total amount of \$750.00 must be paid prior to issuance of the permits. If Final Order and/or Permit issuance are delayed due to failure of the Applicant to pay any required fees, this will not constitute breach of the Settlement Agreement by OWRD.
- 8. This Settlement Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same Settlement Agreement.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter, or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director, for measuring the quantity of water appropriated from East Butsch Reservoir. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

If the number, location, source, or construction of any well deviates from that proposed in the permit application or required by permit conditions, this permit may not be valid.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2010. If the water is not completely applied before this date, and the permittee wishes to continue development under the permit, the permittee must submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).



Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may

require the permittee to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

- B. Before water use may begin under this permit, a staff gage that measures the entire range and stage between full reservoir level and dead pool storage must be installed in the reservoir. The staff gage shall be United States Geological Survey style porcelain enamel iron staff gage style A, C, E or I. Additionally, before water use may begin under this permit, if the reservoir is located in channel then weirs or other suitable measuring devices must be installed upstream and downstream of the reservoir, and, a gated valve outlet must be installed. A written waiver may be obtained from the local Watermaster if in his judgment the installation of the weir(s) will provide no public benefit.
- C. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device, and the staff gage; provided however, where the meter or measuring device, or the staff gage are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The permittee shall develop a detailed and accurate area-capacity curve for the reservoir.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The required screen is to be in place and functional, and approved in writing by ODFW prior to diversion of any water. The permittee may submit evidence in writing that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with ODFW's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR 635-415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR Chapter 635, Division 415, Section 030 adopted November 13, 1991 shall be followed.

Dam Conditions

All construction shall be performed under the supervision of a registered professional engineer licensed in Oregon.

No embankment fill shall be placed until preparation of the foundation is complete. No fill materials shall be placed in the core trench until the excavation has been examined in entirety by the engineer of record, or by the Water Resources Dam Safety Engineer, or both.

The constructed works shall conform to the approved plans and specifications on file with the Water Resources Dam Safety program. The engineer of record shall notify the Water Resources Dam Safety program before making any significant change to the approved design prior to or during construction.

No water shall be stored until the Water Resources Department receives written certification from the engineer of record that construction has been completed in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. If final construction deviates from the approved design a set reproducible as-constructed drawings, including a revised reservoir capacity graph or table, must accompany the engineer's letter of completion.

Routine maintenance or repair of the dam, its spillway and all appurtenant structures shall be performed to include, but not limited to, the removal of woody vegetation or debris, prompt restoration of areas of erosion or to replace defective equipment necessary for the continued safe operation of the project works.

Except for routine repair and maintenance, design plans and specifications must be prepared by an Oregon licensed professional engineer and approved by the Water Resources Dam Safety program prior to any enlargement, modification, or alteration of the dam, its spillway or any appurtenant structure.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Use under this permit is limited to the reservoir area. This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for maintaining the water level or maintaining a suitable fresh water condition.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of a fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.






