NOTE: A completed water availability statement from the local watermaster, Land Use Information Form completed by the local Planning Department, fees and site map meeting the requirements of OAR 690-340-030 must accompany this request. The fee for this request is \$150 for the first point of diversion plus \$15 for each additional point of diversion. Failure to provide any of the required information will result in return of your application. The license, if granted, will not be issued or replaced by a new license for a period of more than five consecutive years. The license, if granted, will be subordinate to all other authorized uses that rely upon the same source, or water affected by the source, and may be revoked at any time it is determined the use causes injury to any other water right or minimum perennial streamflow.

If water source is a well, well logs or adequate information for the Department to determine aquifer, well depth, well seal and open interval, etc. are required. The licensee shall indicate the intended aquifer. If for multiple wells, each map location shall be clearly tied to a well log.

If a limited license is approved, the licensee shall give notice to the Department (Watermaster) at least 15 days in advance of using the water under the Limited License and shall maintain a record of use. The record of use shall include, but need not be limited to, an estimate of the amount of water used, the period of use and the categories of beneficial use to which the water is applied. During the period of the Limited License, the record of use shall be available for review by the Department upon request.

Whychus Creek Restoration Project at Camp Polk Preserve

Background

In an effort to prevent flooding, the U.S Army Corps of Engineers channelized approximately 1.5 miles of Whychus Creek as it flows through the Camp Polk meadow in the 1960s. The channelization effort moved the creek from its naturally meandering path through the meadow to a straightened and deepened channel along the margins of the canyon. The result was a net loss of approximately 0.5 mile of stream length, an increase in erosion and a significant loss of instream fish habitat, wetlands and floodplain area.

The Deschutes Land Trust (DLT) acquired the Camp Polk Meadow Preserve in October 2000. Since acquisition, the DLT has been interested in restoring the channelized reach of Whychus Creek by relocating the creek to its natural dimension, pattern and profile through the meadow. In 2004, the Upper Deschutes Watershed Council began working on behalf of DLT to design the comprehensive restoration of Whychus Creek at the Preserve. The project design and implementation have been funded and peer reviewed by a team of partners including Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, US Fish and Wildlife Service, The Nature Conservancy, Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Portland General Electric and many others.

Whychus Creek was historically one of the most important spawning areas in the upper Deschutes Basin, responsible for up to 40% of the steelhead spawning, with the potential for up to 9,000 spawning fish (ODFW 2000). Historical accounts of spawning in Whychus Creek have identified the Camp Polk reach as one of the most productive spawning areas on Whychus Creek prior to the development of the dams and the channelization of the creek (ODFW 2000). However, in its current condition, Whychus Creek provides very poor habitat because the channelization has decreased quality fish habitat, increased channel incision and eliminated the connection between the stream channel and the floodplain. Without significant stream channel restoration, Whychus Creek will not reach its full potential for spawning fish.

Creek Restoration Project Description

The Whychus Creek restoration project at Camp Polk Meadow proposes to enhance approximately 1,500 feet of the current channel alignment on Whychus Creek, and construct approximately 7,300 feet (1.4 miles) of highly sinuous new channel and approximately 1,000 feet of new side channel. The total channel restoration project length will be approximately 8,800 feet (1.7 miles).

The project will allow peak flow to access approximately 500 feet of existing relic channels. Additional side channels could develop naturally in the future when riparian vegetation has become well established across the valley.

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It is anticipated that a significant portion of the water directed into the new channel will return to the existing channel once a stable water table level between ground water and surface water is reached. This will occur either via ground water flow or surface flow through the newly constructed channel where it flows back into the existing channel at the end of project. The US Fish and Wildlife Service, a major project funder, technical reviewer and project partner, has finalized their Biological Assessment completed under the ESA Section 7 provisions. The Biological Assessment concluded that no significant impacts to Steelhead trout are anticipated during the four year period (Phase I) where water will be flowing through both the existing and the new channel. The Biological Opinion from the National Marine Fisheries Service is due out in April 2009.

Phase II: Old Channel Elimination (2013)

Phase II will be initiated after riparian vegetation along the length of the newly constructed meadow channel has developed a strong root system that is stable enough to withstand the entire creek streamflow. Phase II is anticipated to begin in the spring of 2013. The first portion of Phase II implementation will involve the removal of the temporary piping system and water will no longer be diverted into the pipe from the existing channel. The beginning of Phase II will mark the end of this limited license. Phase II will involve plugging the existing channel of Whychus Creek and the entire creek flow will be directed into the new channel.


