I note from the records of this office that you have not filed the notices of beginning construction work under the following permits, although the time fixed in the permits for the beginning of construction work was Royamber 13. 1916:

Application No. 2592, parmit No. 2697, covers 1000 account fest of water from Nogue Niver for the development of 2500 horsepower.

Application 30. 2780, permit 30. 2702, covers the use of 250 second feet from Graves Creek and Graves Creek Reservoir and Jump 01f Joe Reservoir for mining, the irrigation of 20,000 acres, and development of 5,000 H. P.


