## SUPPLEMENTAL STATEMENT.

On April 11, 1882, Harvey Fields located and filed on 200 inches of water from "Picknick and Dustin Creeks". This was a joint filing, was recorded April 11, 1882, in Volume "B", Record of Water Location Notices, page 34, Grant County Record, and was for use on lands herein described.

The ditches from said two creeks are noted correctly on the State Engineer's Maps. The lands irrigated are not shown correctly, as to area, by the State Engineer's Maps. Thirty-four acres are irrigated in the  $SE_{-}^{1}SW_{-}^{1}$ , said Section 20, and thirty-seven acres are irrigated in the  $NE_{-}^{1}SW_{-}^{1}$ , said Section 20.

A spring at the head of the ditch shown as taking from Dustin Creek was inclosed in cement many years ago. The waters therefrom are conducted in a pipe to the houses of claimants for house use. During the dry season only enough for house use is produced by said spring.

A spring raises near the Highway and on the south side thereof and in the  $NE^{\frac{1}{2}}$  SW $^{\frac{1}{2}}$ , said Section 20. Waters therefrom are claimed and used for irrigation and stock purposes on that part of said  $NE^{\frac{1}{2}}$  SW $^{\frac{1}{2}}$  north of the Highway.

All waters of both Picnic and Dustin Creeks are used for irrigation and domestic use and for the irrigation of garden and orchard on the above described two forties, and all the waters of said Dustin Creek and Picnic Creek are so claimed by claimants.

These two forties are irrigated from five sources, viz: waters from Moon Creek, waters from John Day River through the Blue Mountain Ditch, Dustin Creek and Picnic Creek, and the aforesaid spring near the Highway. These waters are intermingled and it is impossible to say just how much is available from each source. However, claimants claim all the waters of Dustin Creek and Picnic for the above purposes, as heretofore outlined.
