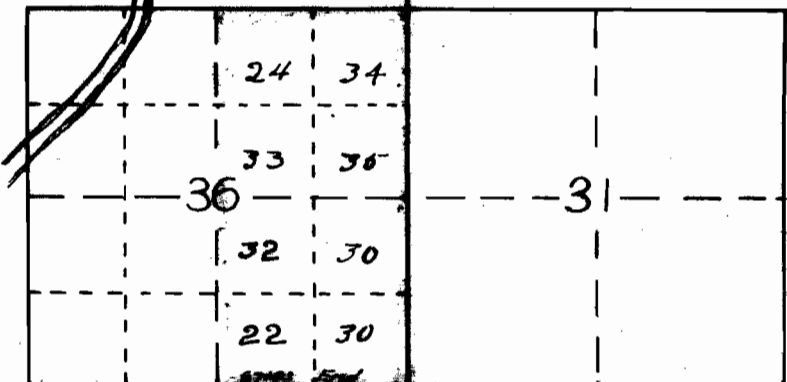

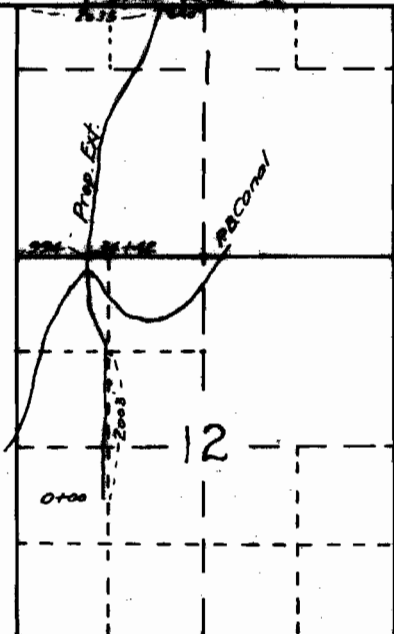

I note from the records of this office that the notices of completion of construction work or the notices of complete application of water have not been filed under permits No. E 76, E 77 and E 84, in the name of the Deschutes Reclamation and Irrigation Company, although the time for the completion of construction work under these permits expired June 1, 1916, and the time for the complete application of water to the proposed use expired October 1, 1915.
