Dear Sir:

Enclosed please find two Annual Report on Wells and a Report on Completion of Well. We have completed repairs of well #2 under permit U-193. Since we have completed these repairs and have both wells producing near what we believe their ultimate capacities, we desire to get all the permits and ground water rights and certificates in order. We believe that Eastern Oregon Canning Co., the original owners of this property and permits had the permits duly processed. We also believe that these rights and permits were signed over to us, but we have no permits or their copies in our files. Your letters requesting annual reports are the only records we have of these permits. However, we believe there are some changes to the permits which we would like to request.

File U-213, Permit U-193 is for 3.0 second-foot of water from a well for canning and freezing fruits and vegetables. We desire the usage to be extended to include irrigation and supplying the City of Weston with water for public use. The reason we desire the permit to include irrigation is ~~that~~ to eventually dispose of our waste water from the plant by irrigating it. As you understand land disposal by irrigation is the only adequate and economically feasible method of disposing of pea sewage water of the gallonage we have. Therefore, if we grow crops by sewage irrigation in June and July we will have to pump fresh water in August and September to keep the crops growing.

As to supplying the City of Weston with water, we do that now at times, and as the city replaces some of the mains, it will become more economically advantageous to both parties to do this more often.

File U-182, Permit U-171 is for 2.0 second foot of water from a well for canning and freezing fruit and vegetables. We desire the quantity of water increased from 2.0 second foot to 3.0 second-foot, and the usage to include irrigation and supplying the City of Weston with water for public use. The reason for increasing the quantity of flow is that we require more water than that for our processing, that the well can easily supply this quantity, and that at the present time we are using well over 2.0 second-foot of water from this well. The reasons for extending the usage is the same as for the other well.



Considerable of your correspondence addressed to the captioned corporation borrower has been forwarded to our office by our watchman in connection with two wells located at these facilities. On a few occasions your office has written to us directly. We believe these wells are covered by permits No. U-171 and No. U-193.

Several months ago we advised your office that the RFC acquired all of the assets of Eastern Oregon Canning Company, Inc., in connection with the foreclosure of our mortgage on these facilities, and indicating that we would appreciate your corresponding directly with us as to any requirements of your office with respect to the wells. Apparently, our letter has gone astray inasmuch as we continue to receive form letters addressed to the cannery and forwarded to us by our watchman. The last of your form letters was under date of January 13, 1950, received in this office on March 30. This letter states that unless you hear from the addressee within 60 days, permit No. U-193 will be canceled without further notice.

This cannery has not been in operation since the summer of 1948 and was involved in a liquidation program up to July 19, 1949, at which time we acquired the facilities. Since the summer of 1948, a continuous effort has been made to sell the plant. It is expected that a sale will be closed shortly by this office.
